To boost performance, quality, and ROI, organizations need more than training.

What truly drives change is training the right people to be changed agents.

That's the mission of CGIAR Breeding Resources' Knowledge Exchange Program (KEP): reimagining how knowledge flows, so CGIAR and partners lead modernization from within.



KEP has a multiplier effect, beyond individuals



How does it work?

TARGETED, EFFECTIVE TRAINING DRIVES MODERNIZATION

KEP facilitates short-term exchanges by pairing mentees with expert mentors to address real-world technical and operational challenges in breeding programs.

Each exchange delivers **practical, shareable outputs** - such as Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), templates, training materials, or prototypes - that support broader adoption across the breeding community.

Once participants complete the program, they return to their CGIAR Center or National Research Organization **equipped to share and scale what they've learned**, training their own teams, partners, and stakeholders.

The result is a powerful multiplier effect, where knowledge spreads well beyond the individual, accelerating change across organizations and networks.

TO SUSTAIN TRANSFORMATION

Why KEP?

While conventional training builds individual skills, KEP goes beyond by embedding participants in live environments, fostering contextual learning and systemic impact.

For innovation

Accelerates adoption of innovations and tools across organisations

For improvement

Enhances institutional workflows through hands-on problem solving

For collaboration

Builds long-term collaborations across CGIAR and partners

For replication

Leaves behind public goods that others can adopt and adapt



Duration

1 to 2 weeks

Focus

Defined challenge or skill area, co-designed by mentor and mentee via a structured proposal

Sustainability

Yields outputs useful to the broader CGIAR-NARES ecosystem

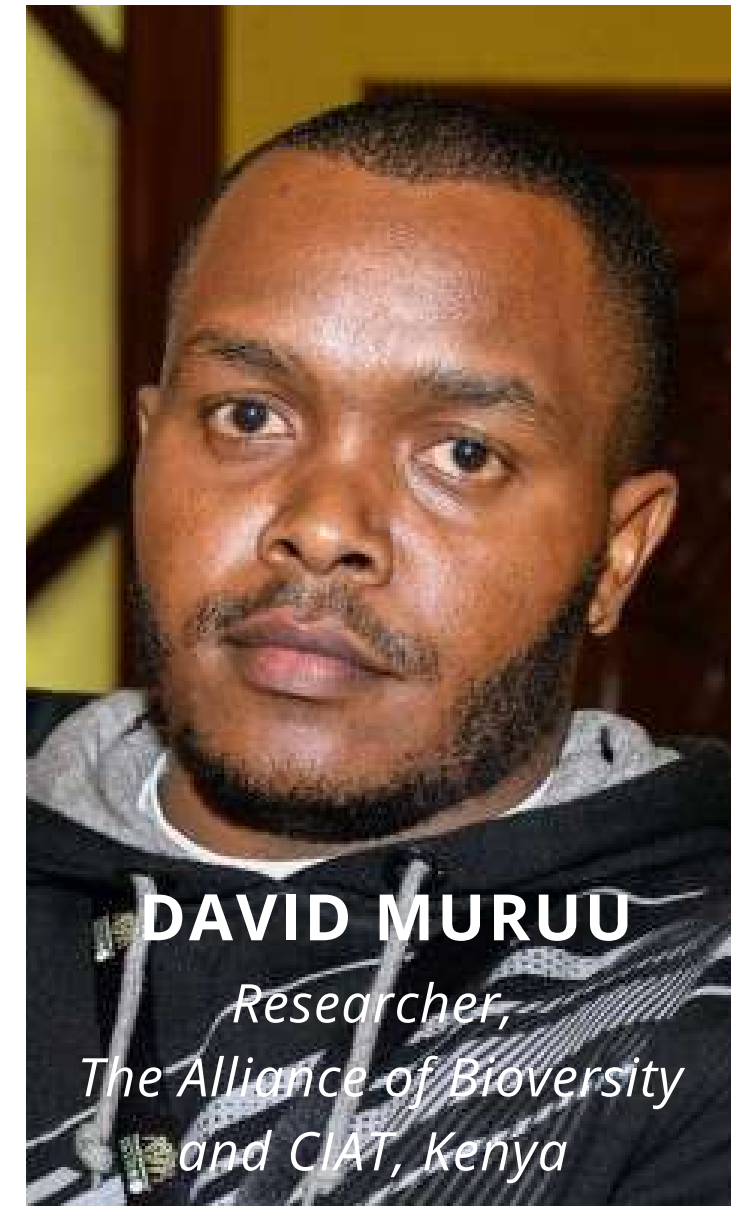
