This year's theme

COMMUNITY SUPERPOWER

Community is the incredible everyday. Ordinary and extraordinary. Simple acts of shared generosity. Kindness multiplied to become an unstoppable force!

Communities can bring people together. Bridging divides and offering support. Spaces of resilience and places for healing.

This Refugee Week everyone is invited to spend time with friends and build new connections in and beyond our neighbourhoods. From communal meals and open air film screenings, to football matches and music making, let's share the feelings of welcome and belonging. Listening, learning, laughing together.

It's amazing what we can do when we move together towards a shared goal. So let's redefine and rediscover our collective power to shape hopeful futures and begin by practicing, celebrating and rehearsing it every day.

CHESTER A-Z TRAIL

We have the A-Z Trail to celebrate and highlight Refugee Week 2025 Chester City of Sanctuary group have collaborated with The Bishops' Bluecoat Church of England High School, Chester to produce an 'A – Z Art Trail'.

The young people have produced 26 display posters to make up an A-Z on the theme of Sanctuary and Refugees. A QR code on the Trail leaflet takes you through to the City of Sanctuary website where more information can be found about the words chosen and the issues faced by Sanctuary Seekers.

Words include Community, Hope, Xenophobia, Understanding. We can't tell you them all as you need to do the trail! Their designs have been professionally printed in A4 size.

The posters are displayed in 17 different locations in the city. An accompanying trail guide details the route to discover the 26 pieces of art and there is a map to also assist people with the route. Locations include High Coffee in Rufus Court – a special Ukrainian connection, Wesley Church Centre – a Church of Sanctuary which was recently featured on the Chester Blog along with Chester Cathedral - a cathedral of Sanctuary.

To encourage children, families, and members of the public to complete a trail booklet, there is the chance to win a prize if they complete the trail and leave their form in the SHARE Shop in the special box.





City of Sanctuary will have a stall in Storyhouse where members of the public can take part in our activity inspired by the theme of Refugee Week 2025 (June 16th -22nd) which is Community as a Superpower; Chester City of Sanctuary Group are inviting members of our local community to show their support for sanctuary seekers by taking photographs of groups or individuals holding A4 posters which say: "We are using our Community Superpower to support those seeking sanctuary from war and persecution" and then posting the photographs on social media using the hashtag #mythbusters. Mediha

Directed by Hasan Oswald

A powerful testament to the human spirit, Mediha follows the remarkable journey of one girl's fight to find her missing family members, revealing the strength of a young survivor. From Executive Producer Emma Thompson, this award-winning film from Hasan Oswald is an incredible story of resilience.

Mediha, a teenage Yazidi girl, turns her camera on herself to process her trauma after surviving captivity from ISIS. Through her personal video-diaries, she confronts her pain, while also initiating investigations into her captors. Mediha's journey is one of courage and determination as she steps towards a future of justice and healing.

The screening on Tue 10 June at 6pm will include a post-screening discussion with founder member and trustee of Chester City of Sanctuary Neil Gibbons and trustee Heather Swainston.

AN EVENING WITH DR WAHEED ARIAN



Born in 1983 in Kabul at the height of the Soviet occupation of Afghanistan, Waheed Arian's earliest memories are of soldiers and bombs. When he was five, his family joined the millions seeking refuge in Pakistan. With the borders closed, they had to make the journey on foot and horseback across remote and

dangerous mountainous terrain, travelling at night to avoid military attack. It was a journey they were fortunate to survive.

His story not just one of a remarkable survival and of passion, resilience, hope and dedication, but of the unbreakable bonds of familial love. A love that began with Waheed's mother and father and grew into compassion for a wounded community, and then the world.

CHESTER CATHEDRAL

Wings of the Sky - 12th June

A new musical play involving a cast of young people from different backgrounds, a Ukrainian opera singer, and an Iranian percussionist, all living in Chester, will be premiered in the city next month as a prelude to Refugee Week events. Wings of the Sky, writen by Richard Wiseman and composed by Mat Baker tells the story of a tribe of people who work the fields in order to eat and survive. Tensions rise as another group of people arrive in the valley seeking a place to live. Whilst the children seem to play happily, hostility between the elders grows. The story, unfolds alongside the river, over which fly the white doves of peace, unable to recognise borders. The story has been inspired by the ideas and experiences of young people, some of whom are facing the challenges of seeking asylum. Mat Baker said, "It can feel as though we are living in an increasingly hostile world. And yet, this project has drawn the very best out of people of very different ages and backgrounds, and shone a very bright light on positivity in community."

It will be performed in Chester cathedral under thousands of paper doves which form part of internationally acclaimed sculptor Peter Walker's installation "Peace Doves".

Seeking Sanctuary Ukrainian dance 12pm and 1.30pm - 14th June

Seeking Sanctuary is a new 20 minute dance performance created by Whispered Tales that shares the story of how Ukrainians were forced to leave their home and seek sanctuary here in England.

3pm Refugee Week Evensong All welcome - 15th June

Refuge Island - 18th June

Refuge Island is an exhilarating 20 minute dance performance that explores stories of female migration and the human capacity to offer a place of refuge. As a lone woman appears on a pedestrian refuge island, images begin to flicker within the bollard and soon we hear why this brave woman was forced to leave her home.


