All resolutions were soundly passed. The only significant votes against were around the re-election of Mr Pockett (almost 10%) and Mr Savvides (almost 5%). ASA has seen similar protest votes against directors in other companies and it seems to relate to increasing Board diversity.

There were a number of questions around climate transition. Underwriting of fossil fuel extraction and the like is around \$1m premium income; the company supports and insures EVs; premiums have increased and underwriting improved around key climate risks.

Other questions were around cyber security, given recent issues, and IAG advised it has spent significantly to put in place multi-layer controls and a skilled cyber defence team. They also garner independent assurance on standards.

Directors standing for re-election spoke well to their performance and application of skills and experience to Board deliberations.

While the remuneration plan passed, following a first strike in the previous AGM, ASA still has improvements it would like to see implemented. CPS 511 (APRA remuneration standards) has an implementation date for this company of 1st July 2023, so we are hopeful further improvement will occur at the next annual review.
