



PRESENTERS



The Rev. Dr. Fred Anderson is Senior Pastor Emeritus, Madison Avenue Presbyterian Church. First a musician with a professional singing career, Anderson then completed a tour in the United States Air Force before taking M.Div. and D.Min. degrees at Princeton Seminary, where he is now a trustee. Noted pastor and scholar, he has numerous published articles on theology, preaching, hymnody and worship. His hymns and metrical psalm texts appear in U.S., Canadian, and Asian hymnals. His new Psalter will be published in summer 2016. He chairs the board of the Center for Theological Inquiry at Princeton Seminary, and is trustee of the Appeal of Conscience Foundation, an interfaith group dedicated to the furtherance of human rights, religious freedom, and tolerance.



Dr. Wilma Ann Bailey is Minnie Vautrin Professor Emerita of Christian Witness and of Hebrew Bible and Aramaic Scripture at Christian Theological Seminary (CTS). She holds degrees from Vanderbilt University (M.A., Ph.D.), Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary (M.Div.), and Lehman College (B.S.). Prior to CTS, she served on the faculties of Messiah and Goshen Colleges. Bailey was named a Regional Scholar by the Society of Biblical Literature, and is the author of numerous articles and books, including *You Shall Not Kill or You Shall Not Murder?* (2005) and *Lamentations & Song of Songs* (2015). She is a frequent guest lecturer and has served on the Board of Trustees of Eastern Mennonite University. Though ultimately choosing a scholarly career instead of ordination, she was the first woman to receive licensing for ordination in the Indiana-Mennonite Conference of the Mennonite Church. She attends Shalom Mennonite Church in Indianapolis.



Christopher Dekker is Director of Worship and Music at Hillcrest Christian Reformed Church Hudsonville, MI, a position he has held since June 2015. He is responsible for leading, directing, and coordinating the church's many talented musicians, seeking to create diverse, inspired and Christ-centered worship each Sunday. Additionally, he serves as principal organist and pianist most weeks. After graduating from Hope College (B.A.), Chris completed a Masters of Music Degree at Central Michigan University. He is currently working on a doctorate in organ at the University of Notre Dame. Although raised in the Christian Reformed Church, he has served Episcopal, Congregational, and Methodist congregations in both part-time and full-time capacities. Chris continues to travel widely across the U.S. as a recitalist.

PRESENTERS



The Rev. Dr. Gregg A. Mast is President of New Brunswick Theological Seminary. He has served as a pastor in Johannesburg, South Africa; Irvington, New Jersey; and Albany, New York. He has also served as Minister of Social Witness and Worship and as Director of Ministry Services for the Reformed Church in America at different times in his career. He is the author of several books, including *The Eucharistic Service of the Catholic Apostolic Church and Its Influence on Reformed Liturgical Renewals of the Nineteenth Century*(1998), *In Remembrance and Hope* (1998), and *Raising the Dead* (2001). He has published numerous articles in popular and scholarly journals and contributed for several years a monthly column to the *Church Herald*.



The Rev. Marney Wasserman was the convener of the Sacraments Study Group of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) that led to the creation of *Invitation to Christ: A Guide to Sacramental Practices at Font and Table* (2006). For the revision of this resource, she coordinated a committee made up of representatives of the Christian Reformed Church, the United Church of Christ, and the Reformed Church in America, which led to the publication of *Invitation to Christ - Extended*. This document has received wide distribution, guiding many congregations seeking to cultivate deeper sacramental practices. After several pastorates, including in North Texas and Tucson, she and her husband are enjoying retirement either in the mountains or on the ocean.



Dr. Nicholas Wolterstorff was Noah Porter Professor of Philosophical Theology at Yale University from 1989 to 2002. Previously, he taught at Calvin College, the Free University of Amsterdam, and the University of Notre Dame and has been visiting professor at several institutions. He has received many fellowships, including ones from the NEH and the Danforth Endowment. He is past President of the American Philosophical Association (Central Division) and serves on its publication and executive committees. He is on the editorial boards of *Faith and Philosophy*; *Topics in Philosophy*; and is also General Editor of the Supplementary Textbook Project of the Christian College Coalition and a member of the evaluation panels for the NEH. He is a featured Wilde Lecturer at Oxford University and a Gifford Lecturer at St. Andrew's University. A prolific author, he has published numerous scholarly articles and several books, including most recently *Hearing the Call: Liturgy, Justice, Church, and World* (2011), *The Mighty and the Almighty: An Essay in Political Theology* (2012), and *The God We Worship: An Exploration of Liturgical Theology* (2015).
