We praise you today as the God of peace.

We lament that we have been party to wars that have unnecessarily wounded, maimed, and disfigured your children in body and soul.

We are sorry. Be merciful to us, we pray.

We claim the promise of your Word today,

that you do not treat us as our sins deserve or repay us according to our iniquities,

that as high as the heavens are above the earth,

so great is your love for those who fear you.

That as far as the east is from the west.

so far have you removed our transgressions from us.

We praise you today as the one who comes with healing in your wings.

We pray today for the healing of the nations.

You have already created peace by the blood of your cross.

Make peace reign in our world, dear God.

And make us instruments of your peace.

We pray for the day when all nations will beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks,

for the day when there will be no more war, no mourning, no crying anymore. Make us instruments of your peace.

And come, Lord Jesus.

Come quickly. Amen.
