## Preparation

When I have a new text, I think through a series of exegetical steps. (I) I master the text itself (ideally in Greek). (2) I reach for the best commentaries (Matthew: Keener, Wilkins, Hagner, Bruner; Mark: Lane, Guelich, LePeau; Luke: Bock, Marshall, Green). (3) I employ specialized works that focus on the cultural and rhetorical keys to the parable. These books are the least used by preachers and teachers. A brief bibliography of useful volumes:

Bailey, Kenneth E., Finding the Lost: Cultural Keys to Luke 15 (Concordia 1989) Bailey's scholarly treatment of Luke 15.

Bailey, Kenneth E., Jesus Through Middle Eastern Eyes: Cultural Studies in the Gospels (IVP, 2008)

A collection of studies on the culture of first century Judea and how this changes gospel stories.

Bailey, Kenneth E., Poet and Peasant and Through Peasant Eyes. A Literary Cultural Approach to the Parables in Luke (Eerdmans, 1976)

This is a combined printing of two books in one. Undoubtedly Bailey's most influential books.

Bailey, Kenneth E., The Cross and the Prodigal: Luke 15 Through the Eyes of Middle Eastern Peasants, Revised and Expanded (IVP, 2005)

A popular treatment of Luke 15. The book that changed how most of us preach the prodigal son. No doubt Bailey's most popular book.

Blomberg, Craig, Interpreting the Parables (IVP, 1990)

A scholarly evangelical treatment of the parables with application ideas and interpretative guidance.

Burge, Gary M., Jesus the Middle Eastern Story Teller (Zondervan, 2009)

Written chiefly for laity to show cultural insights to the parables.

Jeremias, Joachim, The Parables of Jesus: Revised Edition (SCM, 1972)

Perhaps the classic treatment of the 20th century. Enormous influence on Bailey's work.

Snodgrass, Klyne R., Stories with Intent: A Comprehensive Guide to the Parables of Jesus, Revised (Eerdmans, 2018) This is a scholar's volume giving the research and bibliography on each parable.

Young, Brad, Jesus and His Jewish Parables (Paulist, 1989)

A thorough treatment of the parables emphasizing early lewish cultural reflexes.
