## ACC NOTABLES

• The ACC is the only conference to win national championships in football, men's basketball, women's basketball and baseball over the last four years.

• Led by ACC Champion Louisville, eight league teams were selected to the 64-team 2018 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship field. The eight teams matched a league record (2014 and 2015), and were the most of any conference last year. It was also the fourth time in the last five years that at least seven ACC teams have earned berths in the Big Dance, and the 11th time in the last 14 years that at least six teams were selected.

• Notre Dame won the 2018 NCAA Championship following wins over No. 1 seed Connecticut (91-89 in OT) in the semifinals and No. 1 seed Mississippi State (61-58) in the championship game. Junior guard Arike Ogunbowale hit the game-winning shot in both the semifinal and championship games and was named the Women's Final Four's Most Outstanding Player.

• Since the 2015 NCAA Tournament, the ACC owns the most tournament wins (55) of any conference. The ACC's .671 winning percentage in the tournament during that time is the best among the Power 5 conferences.

• Since 2006 current ACC membership combines for nine NCAA title game appearances, the most of a single conference.

• ACC member institutions have won three NCAA Championships and made 23 trips to the Final Four.

• Seven different institutions have represented the ACC in the Women's Final Four (current membership).

• The ACC welcomes four new head coaches to the league – Boston College's Joanna Bernabei-McNamee, Clemson's Amanda Butler, Pitt's Lance White and Virginia's Tina Thompson, who was recently enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

• Louisville senior guard Asia Durr and Notre Dame senior guard Arike Ogunbowale have been named to the five-member Associated Press Preseason All-America Team.

• Six ACC teams are ranked in both the AP and USA Today/Coaches polls - tied for the most of any league - led by No. 1 Notre Dame.

• The ACC combines for 17 players on the preseason award watch lists - Nancy Lieberman (4), Ann Meyers Drysdale (2), Cheryl Miller (6), Katrina McClain (1) and Lisa Leslie (4).

• Eight All-ACC performers return from a season ago – Louisville's Asia Durr (first team, ACC Player of the Year), North Carolina's Paris Kea (first team), Notre Dame's Arike Ogunbowale (first team), Jessica Shepard (first team) and Marina Mabrey (second team), Syracuse's Tiana Mangakahia (first team), Virginia Tech's Taylor Emery (second team) and Wake Forest's Elisa Penna (second team). All eight players who were All-Freshman Team selections also return: Boston College's Milan Bolden-Morris, Duke's Jade Williams, Georgia Tech's Kierra Fletcher, Louisville's Dana Evans, Miami's Mykea Gray and Kelsey Marshall, North Carolina's Janelle Bailey (ACC Freshman of the Year) and Syracuse's Digna Strautmene.

• The ACC has five of the top 20 freshman classes as ranked by ESPN Hoopgurlz this season – No. 6 Florida State, No. 7 Notre Dame, No. 8 Syracuse, No. 9 Georgia Tech and No. 15 Louisville. The ACC's five ranked classes are tied for the most from any conference.

• Seven McDonalds All-Americans join the league for the 2018-19 season: Valencia Myers (Florida State), Izabela Nicoletti (Florida State), Elizabeth Balogun (Georgia Tech), Elizabeth Dixon (Georgia Tech), Jordan Nixon (Notre Dame), Katlyn Gilbert (Notre Dame) and Emily Engstler (Syracuse).

• The ACC boasts five coaches, who rank in the top 20 of winningest active coaches by percentage, the most of any league in the country – 6. Muffet McGraw (.766), 9. Jeff Walz (.757), 10. Wes Moore (.752), 14. Joanne P. McCallie (.729) and 18. Sylvia Hatchell (.720).

• ACC teams will play at least 40 games against teams that are either ranked in preseason AP Top 25 or earned a berth in the 2018 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship.

Defending NCAA champion and four-time Atlantic Coast Conference champion Notre Dame is again the ACC Women's Basketball preseason favorite, according to separate polls of the league's Blue Ribbon Panel and its 15 head coaches.

## WEEKLY/SEASON AWARDS

The Atlantic Coast Conference's "Blue Ribbon Panel," consisting of national and local media members, as well as school representatives, will vote for the league's preseason poll, weekly honors and postseason All-Conference teams for the 2018-19 season.

The ACC, with nominations from its 15 member institutions, will designate approximately 35 media members who cover ACC Women's Basketball regularly to the panel. In addition to the 35 members, the league's communications office will invite additional national and selected persons to the panel, including ACC television broadcasters.

Finally, all 15 league head coaches will receive one ballot to vote on preseason and postseason accolades; however, they will not be permitted to vote on a weekly basis or for their own student-athletes.

Following the conclusion of the regular season, the Blue Ribbon Panel will select a 10-member All-ACC First Team, a five-member All-ACC Second Team, an eight-member All-Freshman Team as well as Player of the Year, Rookie of the Year and Coach of the Year. The league head coaches will also select their own 10-member All-ACC First Team, an eight-member All-ACC Second Team, an All-Freshman Team, Player of the Year, Rookie of the Year and Coach of the Year, as well as, the All-Defensive Team, Defensive Player, Sixth Player and Most Improved Player of the Year.

## 2019 ACC WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT AND NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP REGIONAL



Greensboro, North Carolina and the Greensboro Coliseum will be the epicenter for women's basketball during the month of March as the ACC and the city of Greensboro will host the 2019 ACC Women's Basketball Tournament and a 2019 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship Regional.

The ACC Tournament will be held at the Greensboro Coliseum, for the 19th time in 20 years, on March 6-10, 2019. The Coliseum, with assistance from the Tournament Hosts of Greensboro, Greensboro Sports Commission and Convention and Visitors Bureau, is now set to play host to the tournament through 2023. Every attendance record for the 40-year-old tournament has been set at the Greensboro Coliseum, including the overall attendance mark of 73,187 in 2009. Overall attendance at the Greensboro Coliseum has exceeded 60,000 eight times since 2006.

The winner of the ACC Women's Basketball Tournament receives the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship. The tournament seeding and Conference Champion are determined by the 16-game regular-season ACC schedule.

The ACC and the Greensboro Coliseum will also host the 2019 NCAA women's regional on March 30-April 1. The Regional Semifinals are set for Saturday, March 30 at 11:30 and 2 p.m., and the Regional Final for 7 p.m. on Monday, April 1. The ACC was also awarded a NCAA Regional in 2022.

# 2018-19 ATLANTIC COAST CONFERENCE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

## 2018 ACC/BIG TEN CHALLENGE

The Atlantic Coast Conference and the Big Ten Conference announced the matchups for the 2018 ACC/Big Ten Women's Basketball Challenge. This year's Challenge will mark the 12th straight year of the event that pits the two perennially strong conferences against each other.

The ACC and Big Ten conference offices determine the schedule each season, and the official title of the Challenge rotates each year. The 2018 event will be referred to as the ACC/Big Ten Women's Basketball Challenge and will continue to mirror the official title of the conferences' Challenge agreement for men's basketball.

All 14 Big Ten teams and 14 of the 15 ACC teams will participate in the 2018 Challenge.

This year's event will be played in a two-day format beginning on Wednesday, Nov. 28. A year ago, ACC women's basketball teams combined for a record 10 wins over the Big Ten to win the 2017 Big Ten/ACC Challenge, 10-4. The outright title was the eighth overall for the ACC. The ACC owns an 81-55 record against the Big Ten in Challenge games.

After a closely contested first day of games in which the ACC held a slim 3-2 edge, the ACC claimed seven wins last Nov. 30, to clinch the title.
