

KEY STORYLINES

LADY VOL NOTABLES

- **SMOTHERING DEFENSE:** Using a high-pressure defense, Tennessee is holding foes to 42.0 ppg., 28% on FGs and 27% on 3FGs while forcing 30.3 turnovers per game.
- **COUNT OF 10:** UT forced four backcourt violations all last season. They already have prevented foes from crossing the timeline six times in 2018-19 (4 vs. Presbyterian).
- **RATTLING THE RATTLERS:** UT limited Florida A&M to 18.9% on FGs (11-59), 6th lowest % ever by a UT opp., five 4Q pts. (t3rd fewest in qtr.) and 31 points (6th fewest allowed).
- **ABOUT LAST WEEK:** Tennessee outscored its two foes 84.5 to 38.5 last week, grabbed 30 steals and forced 52 turnovers. Opponents shot 26% on FGs, 20% on 3FGs and 44% on FTs. UT also had a 52.5-30.0 edge on the boards. UT outscored its foes 55-18 in the first quarter and 40-17 in the fourth.
- **HOT SHOTS:** UT had six of 10 active players shoot better than 50 percent on FGs last week.

BIG ORANGE NUGGETS

- **HOCKEY-LIKE SUBS:** In the first three games, Holly Warlick has followed a hockey-like pattern of substitutions, sending in an entire new line of players. Versus FAMU, all 10 players played exactly 10 minutes at the half. The final stats showed the starters with 21 minutes each and the subs with 19.
- **DOUBLE-DOUBLE DAVIS:** Rennia Davis (12.0 ppg., 9.5 rpg.) had her first double-double of the season vs. FAMU and 10th of her career, which ranks No. 6 among active SEC players despite her only being a sophomore.
- **MY-OH-MY, MEME:** Meme Jackson is off to a hot start, averaging 14.3 ppg., 4.0 spg., 3.0 apg. and shooting 53% on FGs and 47% on 3FGs.
- **EVINA ON POINT:** Point guard Evina Westbrook is averaging 12.7 ppg. and 5.7 apg. (17/6 asst./TO) while shooting 54% on FGs and 67% on 3FGs.
- **HOO-RAE!:** Rookie Rae Burrell is off to a great start (12.7 ppg./6.3 rpg.).

DID YOU KNOW?

- **WINNINGEST PROGRAM:** The Lady Vols have the most wins in NCAA history, standing at 1,347-320 through the Florida A&M game.
- **WARLICK TOPS SEC IN PCT.:** In her seventh season, Holly Warlick tops SEC coaches in winning percentage in league games (71-25, .740).
- **IN ELITE COMPANY:** Only three schools have reached the Elite Eight more than UT (three times) the past six seasons (UConn 6, Notre Dame 5, Baylor 4).
- **100 PERCENT GRAD. RATE:** Every Lady Vol who has completed her eligibility at UT (136) has gotten a degree and earned the right to sign her name on the "Graduation Pole" in the locker room.
- **TWELVE IN THE HALL:** Lady Vol legend Chamique Holdsclaw and former assistant coach Mickie DeMoss ran UT's total in the Women's BB Hall of Fame to 12 with their induction this summer.

PHOTOGRAPHER CREDENTIALS

Special arrangements for strobes or catwalk access must be made through the UT Media Relations and Arena Management Offices no later than one week in advance of the game. UT's arena security policy requires that all photographers placing strobes will go through a screening process and must be accompanied by a UT police officer or representative when placing strobes.

TEAM NOTES

UT VS. CLEMSON IN JUNKANOO JAM

- After three straight home games to open the 2018-19 season, No. 11/12 Tennessee plays its first contest outside the friendly confines of Thompson-Boling Arena.
- The Lady Vols (3-0) meet Clemson (2-2) at 3 p.m. on Thursday (Thanksgiving day) in the opening game of the 2018 Women's Junkanoo Jam at Resorts World Bimini in Bailey Town, Bimini, Bahamas.
- The tournament will be played at the Gateway Christian Academy gymnasium.
- Tennessee is coming off a 96-31 home victory over Florida A&M on Sunday afternoon in Knoxville.
- UT has produced a +46.7 scoring margin (88.7-42.0) and +18.7 rebounding margin (51.0-32.3) in its first three games after also defeating Presbyterian (97-49) and UNC Asheville (73-46) in its initial two contests of the year.
- Clemson, meanwhile, enters on the heels of a 76-56 loss to Alabama on Monday night in Tuscaloosa.
- The Tigers previously beat Wofford (85-77) and Lipscomb (68-26) and lost at No. 10/11 South Carolina, 69-57. UT is their third SEC foe of the season.
- UT is making its second appearance in the Junkanoo Jam, winning the 2013 Lucaya Division crown in Freeport, while Clemson is making its debut.

JUNKANOO JAM FORMAT

- The Women's Junkanoo Jam, hosted annually over Thanksgiving, will feature Clemson, Eastern Kentucky, Florida State, Iowa, Oklahoma, Tennessee, UAB and West Virginia.
- This year's field is split into two divisions of four teams, the Junkanoo and Bimini Divisions, and each division will crown a champion.
- The Lady Vols are in the Junkanoo Division with Clemson, Oklahoma and UAB.
- The victor of the Tennessee-Clemson game will meet the winner of the Oklahoma-UAB contest on Saturday at 2 p.m. for the Junkanoo Division championship.
- The losers of the two first-round games will play on Friday at 7:45 p.m. for third place.
- OU (NCAA First Rd.) and UAB (WNIT Second Rd.) are coming off 2018 postseason appearances.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

- Tom James (play-by-play) and Ray Giacoletti (analyst) will describe the action for the Junkanoo Jam online broadcasts on FloHoops.
- Mickey Dearstone is handling the call for IMG College/Lady Vol Network radio/online broadcasts for the 20th season. A link to the live audio stream can be found on each game's Hoops Central page or the Lady Vol schedule on UTSports.com.
- Air time for games on the Lady Vol Radio Network generally occurs 30 minutes prior to tip-off.
- **PLEASE NOTE:** If Tennessee advances to Saturday's winner's bracket game, the contest will feature an online broadcast only, due to the football radio broadcast of the Vols vs. Vanderbilt. If UT drops its opener in the Junkanoo Jame, the Lady Vols will be on the radio for Friday's game as usual.

ANOTHER TROPICAL THANKSGIVING

- Just as they did a year ago and have done several times in the past, the Lady Vols are visiting somewhere tropical for Thanksgiving to play several games in a short period of time.

- Tennessee is making its third in-season trip outside the U.S. during the Holly Warlick era and fourth international excursion during the past seven years, holding an 8-0 mark on foreign soil under Holly Warlick, including 5-0 in games that count toward season records.
- Last year, Tennessee went 3-0 at the Cancun Challenge, defeating #20/20 Marquette (101-99, OT), Oklahoma State (79-69) and South Dakota (69-49) to take the Riviera Division crown at the Hard Rock Hotel Riviera Maya Convention Center in Puerto Aventuras, Mexico.
- UT was 2-0 at the 2013 Junkanoo Jam in Freeport, Bahamas, defeating Virginia (76-67) and SMU (87-47) to win the Lucaya Division title.
- UT also went 3-0 during a tour of Italy during the summer of 2015.
- This will mark the program's eighth all-time international excursion, and UT is 19-7 on foreign soil.
- During the Pat Summitt era, the Lady Vols had previous summer trips to Brazil in 1987, Belgium/France/Switzerland in 1999 and Italy/Greece in 2003. They also went to Great Britain in January of 1992.

FAMILIAR FACES

- Tennessee's Holly Warlick and Amanda Butler are quite familiar with one another from their days of coaching against each other in the SEC.
- Warlick is in her seventh season as head coach at UT and spent five years battling Butler's Gator teams in league play.
- UT's Warlick has a 6-1 head-to-head record vs. Butler's troops, but many of those games were tight contests.
- Florida's only win over UT under Butler was a 74-66 triumph in Knoxville on Jan. 7, 2016.
- In other tight games, UT won 74-70 at home on Feb. 23, 2017, in the last meeting between these coaches, and the Lady Vols needed overtime (78-75) to defeat UF in the first meeting between these skippers on Jan. 13, 2013.

LADY VOLS IN THE NAT'L RANKINGS

- After ending the 2017-18 campaign at No. 12 in the AP Poll and No. 17 in the USA Today Coaches Poll, Tennessee opened the 2018-19 season ranked No. 11 (tied) by AP and No. 12 in the USA Today poll.
- In the Nov. 12 AP Poll, the Lady Vols fell out of a tie with Texas, but they moved back up to No. 11 in the Nov. 19 poll. The next USA Today Coaches Poll will be released on Nov. 20.
- This Nov. 19 AP Poll has Tennessee ranked for the 101st time during the seventh season of the Holly Warlick era. UT's Pat Summitt is the all-time leader at 618.
- The Lady Vols were ranked in the top 10 in several preseason polls, including Athlon (No. 5), College Sports Madness (No. 7), Lindy's (No. 8), Sports Illustrated (No. 9) and espnW (No. 10).
- Street and Smith magazine was the outlier, leaving the Lady Vols entirely out of the top 20.

UT TOP FOUR IN BOTH SEC POLLS

- Members of the media picked Tennessee to finish third in the SEC this season, ranking behind Mississippi State and South Carolina.
- The league's coaches predicted the Lady Vols to wind up fourth, finishing behind Mississippi State, South Carolina and Georgia.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- Sophomore guard/forward Renna Davis is on the Cheryl Miller Award and John R. Wooden Award Preseason Watch Lists and was an All-SEC First Team pick by the coaches and media.
- Sophomore point guard Evina Westbrook is on the Nancy Lieberman Award Preseason Watch List and was an All-SEC Second Team choice by the coaches.
- Both players are on the Women's Citizen Naismith Trophy Preseason Watch List.

LADY VOLS AT A GLANCE

- Tennessee returns three starters and six letterwinners from last season's 25-8 squad that advanced to the NCAA Second Round.
- After effectively deploying the nation's No. 1 recruiting class as freshmen in 2017-18, the Lady Vols follow that by welcoming a No. 4-rated 2018-19 rookie collection.
- With four players in the freshman class and three in the sophomore group, Tennessee will feature seven members of its 10-player active roster (70 percent) playing their first or second year of college hoops.

- With five newcomers to the program (four freshmen, one graduate transfer), 45 percent of the Big Orange's roster are first-year members of the UT program.
- Among the 25 wins accumulated by the 2017-18 Lady Vols were triumphs over national powers South Carolina (twice), Texas and Stanford.
- The Big Orange women were 11-5 in league play a year ago and finished tied for fourth, just one game out of sole possession of second in the SEC standings (Mississippi State went undefeated and made it to the NCAA title game).

THE RETURNEES

- Tennessee returns three starters in 6-2 sophomore forward Renna Davis (12.0 ppg., 7.6 rpg.), 6-0 sophomore point guard Evina Westbrook (8.4 ppg., 2.8 rpg., 4.3 app.) and 5-11 senior wing Meme Jackson (8.2 ppg., 4.2 rpg.).
- Davis is the Lady Vols' top returnee in scoring (12.0), rebounds (7.6) and steals (1.1).
- Top returning reserves include 6-3 redshirt senior forward Cheridene Green (4.1 ppg., 3.7 rpg.) and 6-4 sophomore center Kasiyahna Kushkituah (1.8 ppg., 1.4 rpg.).
- Davis and Westbrook started from day one a year ago and made the 2018 SEC All-Freshman Team.
- Jackson has started 52 games the past two seasons, leading UT in three-pointers (50) in 2017-18, while Kushkituah and Green played back-up roles and showed promising flashes as reserves a year ago.
- Also back is 6-3 junior center Kamera Harris, who is trying to earn minutes in the paint as well.

NO. 4-RANKED FRESHMAN CLASS

- Tennessee's 2018 signing class was ranked No. 4 by espnW HoopGurlz and ProspectsNation.com.
- Zaay Green (6-0 guard from Duncanville, Texas) is

- ranked No. 10 by ESPN and No. 26 by ProspectsNation. She is a McDonald's and Naismith All-American and was picked to play in the Jordan Brand Classic.
- Green hails from Duncanville (Texas) High School, the same prep alma mater as Lady Vol, WNBA and USA Basketball legend Tamika Catchings.
- Jazmine Massengill (6-0 point guard from Chattanooga) is ranked No. 11 by ProspectsNation and No. 25 by ESPN. She is a McDonald's All-American and was picked to play in the Jordan Brand Classic.
- Massengill is the first Lady Vol basketball player from Chattanooga.
- Mimi Collins (6-3 forward from Waldorf, Md.) is ranked No. 9 by ProspectsNation and No. 49 by ESPN. She is a McDonald's and Naismith All-American, a top-five finalist for the Naismith Girls' High School Player of the Year and was picked to play in the Jordan Brand Classic.
- Rae Burrell (6-1 wing from Las Vegas, Nev.) is rated No. 43 by ESPN and No. 119 by ProspectsNation. She was a two-time member of the American Family Insurance ALL-USA Nevada Girls Basketball Team and the 2018 Las Vegas Review-Journal Best of Nevada Preps Female Athlete of the Year.

LADY VOLS SPORTING TALL ROSTER

- UT has only one player standing shorter than six-foot tall, and that is 5-11 senior wing Meme Jackson.
- This marks the third time in school history that the Lady Vols have sported 10 players standing six-foot tall or higher on a roster. The other occasions were in 2009-10 and 2014-15, when UT also had 10.
- The Lady Vols feature five players 6-3 or taller, marking the first time that has occurred during the Holly Warlick era and for the initial occasion since 2009-10.
- The only other times UT had five on the roster standing 6-3 or taller occurred in 2004-05 (6), 2005-06 (6), 2007-08 (5), 2008-09 (5) and 2009-10 (5).

A LOOK AT THE TIGERS

ABOUT CLEMSON

- Former Florida head coach Amanda Butler has taken the reins of the Clemson program. She spent 10 seasons in Gainesville and two previous years at Charlotte.
- The Tigers return seven letterwinners and two starters while welcoming five newcomers.
- Three of the top leading scorers from 2017-18 return: Kobi Thornton, 11.1 ppg., Danielle Edwards, 9.2 ppg. and Aliyah Collier, 8.1 ppg.
- Clemson played No. 10/11 South Carolina to within 12 points, 69-57, in Columbia on Nov. 15.
- Florida transfer Simone Westbrook has provided a boost to the team, averaging 11.8 ppg.

LAST YEAR

- Clemson was 11-19 overall and 1-15 in ACC play a year ago, losing its final 11 games.
- The Tigers averaged only 50.5 points per game

and shot .341 from the field, .214 from three-point land and .658 at the charity stripe.

THE TIGERS' LAST GAME

- Alabama drained 10 of 19 three-pointers, including 6-of-11 marksmanship in the first half, en route to a 76-56 home victory over Clemson on Monday night.
- The Crimson Tide took a 17-12 lead after the opening 10 minutes before outscoring the Tigers 24-12 in each of the next two quarters to put the game away.
- Clemson struggled to get in a flow offensively, shooting only 33.3 percent from the field, 12.5 percent on threes and 50 percent at the free throw line.
- Tylar Bennett (15) and Kobi Thornton (14) hit double figures in points, while Aliyah Collier pulled down 10 rebounds for the Tigers.

UT-CLEMSON SERIES NOTES

- Thursday's match-up between Tennessee and Clemson will be the 13th meeting between these schools.
- The last time UT and CU met, back on Nov. 24, 2000, a No. 2/2 Lady Vols squad rolled to an 86-58 victory in UT's opening round game at the Maui Invitational.
- Gwen Jackson (17), Semeka Randall (16) and Tamika Catchings (14) paced UT in scoring in that Maui Invitational contest, UT's second game of the year.
- UT has won the last four games in the series and is 4-0 in neutral site tilts vs. the Tigers.
- Holly Warlick was 7-0 vs. Clemson as a player and 3-0 as an assistant at Tennessee, but she is facing the Tigers for the first time as a head coach.

UT has scored 80+ points in nine of 12 previous meetings with the Tigers.

Clemson is a member of the ACC, and UT is 109-28 all-time vs. the current members of the league.

A LOOK AT THE LADY VOLS' LAST GAME

UT 96, FLORIDA A&M 31 (11/18/18)

- No. 12/12-ranked Tennessee came out hot and never let up in a 96-31 win over Florida A&M on Sunday afternoon at Thompson-Boling Arena.
- The Lady Vols began a season 3-0 for the sixth year in a row. The Rattlers fell to 0-3 with the loss.
- Sophomore guard/forward Rennie Davis notched her 10th career double-double, scoring 14 points and pulling down a team-high of 11 rebounds on the day. Three other Lady Vols also finished with double-digit scoring, led by senior guard/forward Meme Jackson with 19 points. Jackson also had a career-high six steals with her previous-best being four against Central Arkansas on Nov. 30, 2017.
- Freshman guard/forward Rae Burrell had another double-figure performance for UT with 14, while sophomore center Kasiyahna Kushkituah scored 13.

The Lady Vols came out on fire, opening up the first quarter with a 20-0 scoring run led by Meme Jackson, who scored nine during that spree. UT led 34-10 after the first 10 minutes.

WARLICK IN SEVENTH SEASON

- Head coach Holly Warlick is in her seventh season at the helm of the Lady Vols.
- Warlick's career SEC winning percentage (.740, 71-25) ranks her first among all SEC women's head coaches.
- She accumulated an overall record of 153-54 during her first six years at the helm (2012-18).
- That win total ranked No. 11 among all Power 5 women's coaches, and every other coach on that list has 11 or more seasons of experience as a head coach.
- Only three coaches (Geno Auriemma, Muffet McGraw, Kim Mulkey - four each) have led their schools to more Elite Eights over the past six seasons than Warlick (three).
- Warlick's program is one of only 12 that has appeared in every NCAA Tournament the past six years.
- UT ranks eighth among Power Five schools with a 13-6 NCAA tourney record during the past six years.
- Tennessee claimed three SEC trophies in Warlick's first six seasons, winning regular-season crowns in 2013 and 2015 and claiming the tournament title in 2014.
- Warlick and her staff have had 11 Lady Vols taken in the WNBA Draft.
- The program also continues its 100 percent graduation rate for players who completed their undergraduate eligibility here.

GREAT G.A. ADDITION TO THE STAFF

- After the position was vacant last season, Holly Warlick filled her graduate assistant role with a former Lady Vol standout and team leader for 2018-19.
- Returning to Rocky Top is Nicky Anosike, a 6-4 center who was a four-year starter at UT from 2004-08 and helped the Lady Vols claim NCAA titles in 2007 and 2008.
- She was noted as a player who held, and insisted others hold, teammates accountable for their commitment and performance in practice and games.
- Anosike played in the WNBA (Minnesota/Washington/Los Angeles) from 2008-12 before embarking on a teaching career.
- Before returning to Knoxville, Anosike was teaching sixth grade world history and eighth grade U.S. history at Azalea Middle School in St. Petersburg, Fla.
- Head coach Holly Warlick, assistant Bridgette Gordon and Anosike all played at Tennessee, and all were part of NCAA title teams as players and/or coaches.

HOME SWEET HOME

- This is the 32nd season that the Tennessee women's and men's basketball teams have called Thompson-Boling Arena home, and the Lady Vols own an incredible 445-38 mark (.921) in the venue.
- The Lady Vols have a 598-62 (.906) home record in contests played at Thompson-Boling Arena, Stokely Athletics Center and Alumni Gym.
- UT is 3-0 there this season and 92-15 during the Holly Warlick.
- Capacity at Thompson-Boling Arena is 21,678.
- UT has led the nation in attendance 19 times in the past 27 years, finishing second in 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2015-16, and fourth in 2016-17 after an 11-season run at No. 1.
- Tennessee ranked fourth in the nation in home attendance last season with an average of 8,778.

ALWAYS A CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

- Tennessee's schedule features 17 of 29 contests against schools earning NCAA (13), WNIT (3) or WBI (1) berths last season.
- Among the marquee out-of-conference match-ups, the itinerary includes home games vs. Stanford (Dec. 18) and Notre Dame (Jan. 24) and a Dec. 9 contest at Texas.
- Combined with SEC showdowns at home vs. South Carolina and on the road at Mississippi State, the schedule provides Tennessee games against each of last year's NCAA finalists (Notre Dame and Mississippi State) and four of the nation's preseason top 10, according to Charlie Creme's ESPN.com Way-Too-Early Top 25.
- Among UT's opponents this season, Notre Dame (1st), Stanford (6th), Mississippi State (8th), Texas (10th), Missouri (11th), Georgia (13th), South Carolina (15th) and Texas A&M (22nd) are in Creme's Top 25.
- Tennessee has selected dates for a pair of games that bring attention to great causes.
- The Lady Vols will play host to the annual "We Back Pat" game on Jan. 21 vs. Arkansas.
- The contest, which is held in conjunction with the Southeastern Conference's We Back Pat Week observance, creates awareness and raises money for the fight against Alzheimer's disease.
- Women's basketball and Lady Vol coaching legend Pat Summitt saw her career and life cut short by the disease.

- UT also will host its "Live Pink, Bleed Orange" game on Jan. 27 when LSU comes to town, generating publicity and funds for the fight against breast cancer.
- Coaches Holly Warlick (UT) and Nikki Caldwell (LSU), who both played and coached at Tennessee, started an organization called Champions For A Cause that is involved in fund-raising, support and education projects.

HISTORIC UT-UCONN SERIES RENEWED

- The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced on Aug. 14 the renewal of the Tennessee-UConn series, starting with the 2019-20 season.
- The teams consistently met from 1995-2007 but haven't played each other since. UConn leads the series, 13-9, but UT has won the last three meetings.
- Tennessee and UConn account for 19 National Championships, dozens of impact players in the WNBA and many of the sport's all-time greats.
- As part of the two-year series, UConn will host UT during the 2019-20 season (Jan. 23, 2020), with a portion of the proceeds benefitting the Pat Summitt Foundation and the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. In the 2020-21 season, the Lady Vols will host the Huskies in Knoxville (date to be determined), with a portion of the proceeds again benefitting the Pat Summitt Foundation and the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, as well as the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame.

REMEMBERING DAEDRA CHARLES-FURLOW

- Daedra Charles-Furlow, one of only six Lady Vols to have her jersey hung in the rafters of Thompson-Boling Arena, passed away in Detroit, Mich., on April 14, 2018, at the age of 49. Each player will wear a "DC" patch on their shooting shirt this year to honor her legacy.
- Charles was a 1992 Olympian, a two-time All-American and All-SEC performer (1990 & 1991), 1991 Wade Trophy winner, 1991 SEC Female Athlete of the Year and Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductee (2007).

LADY VOLS INK NO. 8/6 SIGNING CLASS

- Tennessee women's basketball head coach Holly Warlick announced Nov. 14 that three student-athletes, including the No. 2-ranked player in the country, had inked National Letters of Intent during the early signing period to join the Lady Vol program for the 2019-20 season.
- Returning paperwork on the first day of the early signing period was the nation's consensus No. 1 guard and No. 2 overall player, 6-foot-1 Jordan Horston (Columbus, Ohio / Columbus Africentric Early College), as well as 6-5 center Tamari Key (Cary, N.C. / Cary H.S.) and 6-5 F/C Emily Saunders (Mullens, W.Va./Wyoming East H.S.). Like Horston, Key is a five-star recruit, according to espnW HoopGurlz, while Saunders is a four-star prospect, as rated by ProspectsNation.com.
- The Lady Vols' three-player class currently is ranked at No. 8 overall and No. 2 in the SEC by espnW HoopGurlz and No. 6 by ProspectsNation.com. It follows Tennessee's No. 1-ranked class in 2017 and a No. 4-rated group in 2018.

JORDAN HORSTON/6-1/G/COLUMBUS, OH

- No. 2 overall player, No. 1 guard, five-star recruit by espnW HoopGurlz
- Member of USA U17 National Team and MVP of FIBA U17 World Cup in 2018
- As a junior in 2017-18, she averaged 18.1 points, 5.8 rebounds, 4.5 assists, 5.1 steals and 1.7 blocks.



TAMARI KEY/6-5/C/CARY, NC

- No. 46 overall player, No. 9 post player, five-star recruit by espnW HoopGurlz
- Averaged 13.9 points, 11.2 rebounds, 5.5 blocks as a junior
- Averaged 15.0 points, 12.3 and 5.8 blocks as a sophomore

EMILY SAUNDERS/6-5/F-C/MULLENS, WV

- No. 88 overall player, No. 18 post player, four-star recruit by ProspectsNation.com
- WVSWA 1st-team AA All-State in 2017, 2018
- Averaged 11.6 points, 7.8 rebounds and 6.1 blocks per game as a junior

UT ONE OF ONLY THREE SEC UNBEATENS

- Tennessee is one of only three remaining unbeaten SEC teams at this point in the season. Kentucky is 4-0, while the Lady Vols and Mississippi State are 3-0 as of Nov. 20.

GOING ON RUNS/ALLOWING RUNS

- UT has put together six runs of 10 or more points this season.
- The Lady Vols have recorded runs of 20 (FAMU, 1Q, 20-0 game-opening run) 16 (PC, 1Q/FAMU, 4Q), 13 (PC, 3Q), 13 (UNCA, 2Q) and 11 (UNCA, 1Q) thus far.
- Tennessee has not allowed any double-digit runs.

COMEBACKS/LEADS/DEFICITS

- UT has trailed in one of three games thus far, including -3 (7:51, 1Q) vs. Presbyterian.
- UT has no fourth-quarter comebacks at this point.
- The biggest deficit (23) and halftime deficit (20) ever overcome for a victory by UT were vs. Rutgers (55-51) on Jan. 3, 2009.
- The largest deficit overcome for a win with Warlick as coach was vs. Gonzaga in Spokane, Wash., on March 28, 2015, with UT trailing by 17, 57-40, with 6:34 remaining in the NCAA Sweet 16.
- UT also rallied from 17-down for a 52-46 win over Virginia in the 1996 Elite Eight to reach the Final Four and win the Lady Vols' fourth NCAA title.
- The biggest first-half deficits overcome for wins in the Warlick era were 15 in the first half at Alabama (Feb. 2, 2014) and vs. LSU (March 7, 2014) in the SEC Tournament.
- The largest home halftime deficit overcome (13) during Warlick era was vs. Notre Dame on Jan. 16, 2017, while the biggest road halftime deficit overcome (12) was at Middle Tenn. on Nov. 8, 2013.
- The largest positive turnaround (25 points) of the Warlick era occurred when Alabama led Tennessee by 15 in the first half and then trailed UT by as many as 16 in the second half (31) en route to a 10-point UT win (25-point final overall turnaround).
- The largest negative turnaround game under Warlick came on Jan. 18, 2018, when #6/7 UT led #5/5 Notre Dame by 23 with 7:03 left in the second quarter, trailed by 16 with 15 seconds left (39) and wound up losing by 14 for a final 37-point reversal.
- In SEC play, the largest negative turnaround came on Jan. 19, 2017, when UT led by 17 in the first quarter and trailed by 23 in the fourth (40) before losing by 16 at Auburn for a 33-point turnaround.
- Other negative turnaround games under Warlick occurred vs. #2/2 Notre Dame on Jan. 20, 2014 (28), when UT led by 12 in the first half and trailed by as many as 17 in the second half on its way to a 16-point loss. On Jan. 18, 2016, UT led N.D. by four and trailed by 25 (29) before losing by 13 (17). On Jan. 28, UT led LSU by 10 in the second quarter, trailed by 14 in the fourth and lost by 11.
- UT's largest margin of victory under Holly Warlick was 68 (110-42) vs. Lipscomb on Dec. 29, 2013.
- Tennessee's highest point total scored under Warlick was 131 vs. Troy on Dec. 6, 2017 (131-69).
- The largest margin of defeat during the Warlick era was 23 at #3/3 Baylor (53-76) on Dec. 18, 2012. That game also produced the worst halftime deficit in school history (25).
- The largest margin of defeat at home was 22 vs. Baylor (88-66, Dec. 4, 2016).
- The lowest point total in UT's modern day history came at home vs. Virginia Tech (43) on Dec. 6, 2015.
- The lowest point total by a foe during the Holly Warlick era was 34 by Central Arkansas on Nov. 30, 2017.

SOME GREAT DEFENSE EARLY ON

- UT held Florida A&M to 18.6 percent shooting, the lowest since Arkansas shot 18.2 percent on Jan. 8, 2012, and the sixth lowest ever by a Lady Vols foe.
- The 31 points scored by FAMU was the sixth fewest ever allowed by Tennessee and the five fourth-period points by FAMU were third fewest in a quarter.

- UT has forced 20+ steals in two of three games this season. UT last posted two 20+ steals efforts in a season in 2014-15 (21-Oral Roberts, 21-Tenn. St.). The Lady Vols haven't had three 20+ steals games since 1997-98, when the 39-0 team had five.
- The Lady Vols have caused two opponents (Presbyterian, Florida A&M) to commit 30+ turnovers. The last time UT forced two or more 30+ turnover games by foes in a season was in 2014-15, when UT forced 30+ in games 2-4 (Oral Roberts, Winthrop, Tennessee State).

BRAND NEW LOCKER ROOM

- On Sept. 7, UT celebrated the dedication of the Larry Pratt Locker Room Complex at Thompson-Boling Arena.
- Pratt is the same person for whom the Tennessee practice facility, Pratt Pavilion, is named.
- Pratt's lead commitment of \$2 million—coupled with other leadership gifts—enabled UT to finance the top-notch locker room facility entirely through private funds.
- The complex provides UT's basketball student-athletes very impressive headquarters during practices and games as well as for medical treatment, film sessions and other team-oriented functions.
- The project, which involved demolition of the old infrastructure and a complete rebuild of that space, resulted in brand-new dressing, meeting and film rooms for both teams and a state-of-the-art sports medicine area. The upgrades certainly enhance the experiences of current Vols and Lady Vols, but they also provide an impressive showpiece during the recruiting process.

BACK-TO-BACK TOP-FOUR SIGNING CLASSES

- Tennessee welcomed back to back top-four signing classes in 2017 (No. 1) and 2018 (No. 4), according to the espnW HoopGurlz rankings.
- These are the best back-to-back recruiting classes of the Holly Warlick era.
- The 2017 group included Evina Westbrook, Anastasia Hayes, Renna Davis and Kasiyahna Kushkituah, while the 2018 collection included Zaay Green, Jazmine Massengill, Rae Burrell and Mimi Collins.
- They are UT's first back-to-back top-five groups since the No. 5 2012 unit (Bashaara Graves, Andraya Carter and Jasmine Jones) signed in Pat Summitt's final season and a No. 3 2013 group (Mercedes Russell, Jannah Tucker, Jordan Reynolds).
- Tennessee is restocking its roster after its 2015 (No. 13) and 2016 (no ranking) classes weren't up to typical program standards.

SIX McDONALD'S A-AS ON ROSTER

- Tennessee has six McDonald's All-Americans on its 2018-19 roster, which is the same number as it had a year ago.
- Those players are sophomores Renna Davis, Kasiyahna Kushkituah and Evina Westbrook, and freshmen Mimi Collins, Rae Burrell and Zaay Green.
- 2017 was the first time an entire Lady Vol signing class consisted only of McDonald's All-Americans.
- Tennessee now has had 34 McDonald's All-Americans on its rosters through the years.
- Holly Warlick has signed 12 McDonald's All-Americans as head coach and added another via transfer for 13 total in her seventh season as head coach.

WARLICK 41-35 VS. TOP 25 TEAMS

- During the Holly Warlick era, Tennessee is 41-35 vs. ranked teams.
- The Lady Vols were 7-6 in 2017-18 after winning vs. #20/20 Marquette, vs. #2/4 Texas, at #18/24 Stanford, at #9/8 South Carolina, vs. #14/12 Texas A&M, vs. #18/18 Georgia and vs. #7/6 South Carolina, while falling at #17/16 Texas A&M, at #5/5 Notre Dame, vs. #3/3 Mississippi State, at #13/13 Missouri, vs. #8/8 South Carolina in the SEC Tourney and vs.

GRAD. TRANSFER FROM "DOWN UNDER"

- Tennessee's fifth newcomer on the squad is graduate transfer Lou Brown, who came from Washington State and hails from Melbourne, Australia.
- Brown, unfortunately, suffered a torn ACL in her right knee during preseason practice and is out for the year. UT will apply for a sixth season of eligibility.
- She is UT's second-ever international player, following in the footsteps of teammate Cheridene Green, a native of London, England.
- Brown averaged 6.4 points, 6.0 rebounds and knocked down 29 three-pointers while starting 23 of 28 games as a redshirt junior a year ago for the Cougars.
- For her career, she tallied 529 points, 167 rebounds, 106 assists, 88 steals, 80 three-pointers and 66 blocks while drawing 71 starts in 95 contests.

- Before an injury sidelined her after seven games as a junior in 2016-17, Brown was averaging 10.4 points and 6.9 rebounds, posting career bests in points (16 vs. Nebraska) and rebounds (16 vs. Oklahoma State).
- Brown was ranked No. 2 by ProspectsNation.com among international high school recruits in 2014.
- Aussie Basketball USA founder Samantha Tomlinson played college basketball at Troy University alongside UT director of recruiting operations and player personnel Heather Ervin and was coached by (then) Troy assistant Sharrona Reaves, who is now the recruiting coordinator and an assistant coach for the Lady Vols.

LOOKING BACK TO 2017-18...

LADY VOLS WIND UP NO. 12 IN AP POLL

- Tennessee finished the 2017-18 season with a 25-8 overall record.
- UT ended up in four-way tie for fourth place in SEC standings at 11-5, one game out of second.
- If UT had won one more game, it would have owned the tie breaker over both South Carolina and Georgia (who tied for second) and would have been the No. 2 seed in the SEC Tournament.
- The Lady Vols finished ranked No. 12 in the AP Poll and No. 17 in the USA Today Coaches Poll (end of regular season).
- Tennessee did so after returning only two starters from the year before and only four players with significant experience while featuring three freshmen among its top five players.
- It marked Holly Warlick's fourth 25-win season (27 - 2013, 29 - 2014, 30 - 2015, 25 - 2018) after winning 22 in 2016 and 20 in 2017.
- UT finished 7-6 vs. ranked teams and 18-2 vs. unranked teams this season (LSU was later ranked and made the NCAA Tournament).
- Tennessee had quality wins over #2/4 Texas, #7/6 South Carolina, #9/8 South Carolina, 14/12 Texas A&M, #18/24 Stanford, #18/18 Georgia and #20/20 Marquette.
- The Lady Vols had been predicted to finish fourth by the media and fifth by the coaches in the SEC standings.

TENNESSEE EARNS 37TH TOURNEY BID

- As the only program to appear in every NCAA Tournament, the Tennessee women's basketball team was selected to the postseason for the 37th time last season, advancing to the second round.
- The No. 3 seed Lady Vols defeated the 14th-seeded Liberty Flames, 100-60, in the first round of the Lexington Regional at home in Knoxville on March 16, 2018.
- Renna Davis led UT (25-7) with 18 points and 11 rebounds, marking her ninth career double-double and tying her with Tamika Catchings for the fifth most double-doubles ever recorded by a UT freshman. Redshirt junior Cheridene Green also posted a double-double, the second of her career, with 15 points and 12 rebounds.
- Tennessee's season came to an end in the second round, falling to the No. 6 seed #13/12 Oregon State Beavers in Knoxville, 66-59, on March 18.
- It marked UT's first-ever NCAA loss at home.
- Senior Mercedes Russell closed out her UT career with a double-double of 21 points and 14 rebounds in 38 minutes.
- Russell's double-double pushed her past Candace Parker into second place in career double-doubles with 46. She finished as UT's all-time leader for a senior with 16 in 2017-18.

UT POSTS 35TH 25-WIN SEASON

- With its win over Liberty in the NCAA Tournament, Tennessee achieved its 25th victory of the year, marking the 35th season the Lady Vols have

- reached that win total
- It marked the fourth 25-win campaign under Holly Warlick, with the Lady Vols last achieving that total during a 30-6 season in 2014-15.
- The Lady Vols hit the 20-win mark for the 42nd consecutive season on Feb. 8, 2018, winning at Arkansas, 90-85.

LONG DISTANCE THREATS

- Tennessee returns 64.6 percent (102) of its 158 three-pointers made a year ago.
- Meme Jackson led UT in that category, knocking down 50 as a junior.
- Other returning long-range threats include sophomores Evina Westbrook and RENNIA DAVIS, who made 27 and 25, respectively, a year ago.
- Tennessee welcomes graduate transfer Lou Brown, who nailed 29 treys last season at Washington State. Due to injury, however, she will sit out 2018-19.
- UT also could get help from freshmen Zaay Green, Jazmine Massengill, Rae Burrell and Mimi Collins.
- Departed players Jaime Nared (27), Kortney Dunbar (19) and Anastasia Hayes (10) made a collective 56 three-balls in 2017-18.

UT SAYS GOODBYE TO FOUR PLAYERS

- Tennessee lost four players from last year's squad.
- The Lady Vols lost their top two scorers in 6-2 forward Jaime Nared (16.7 ppg.) and 6-6 center Mercedes Russell (15.3 ppg.) to graduation and the WNBA.
- Russell (9.2 rpg.) and Nared (7.4 rpg.) also were the team's top and third-leading rebounders, respectively.
- Russell and Nared were All-SEC First Team Selections and WBCA Honorable Mention All-Americans, and Nared also earned AP H.M. All-America.
- Another graduate was Kortney Dunbar, who played about nine minutes per game and was a three-point shooting specialist, knocking down 19 treys in 2017-18 and 69 for her career.
- Anastasia Hayes, who averaged 9.3 ppg., 3.5 apg. and 2.5 rpg. en route to SEC 6th Woman of the Year accolades as a freshman last season, was dismissed from the program due to a violation of team rules on Aug. 31.

RUSSELL JOINS ELITE COMPANY

- Redshirt senior Mercedes Russell became just the sixth Lady Vol to ever record 1,500 points and 1,000 rebounds in a career, finishing with 1,597 and 1,085 to wind up 16th and third, respectively, on UT's career lists.
- The 6-foot-6 center was UT's top rebounder (9.2) and second-highest scorer (15.3) as a senior and shot .583 from the field to pace the team.
- Russell set the record for most double-doubles in a season by a Lady Vol senior at 16 after setting a junior record with 19 in 2016-17.
- She posted the second-most career double-doubles at UT (46), finishing behind only Chamique Holdsclaw (57).
- Her 8.0 career rebound average is sixth all-time at UT, while her 9.2 season average was fifth among seniors.
- Russell's 15.3 ppg. average as a senior was the sixth highest ever by a true Lady Vol center.
- She finished fifth at UT in career FG pct. (.570) and ninth for a season at UT and 21st nationally (.583).
- She tallied 195 career blocked shots to wind up fifth all-time at Tennessee in that statistical category.
- Russell started her last 69 games at UT and 101 of 136 total contests as a Lady Vol.

NARED LEAVES MARK AT UT

- Senior Jaime Nared led Tennessee in scoring at 16.7 points per game and was third in rebounding at 7.4.
- Her team-leading 16.7 ppg. average ranks eighth all-time for a Lady Vol senior.
- She also led the team in free throw percentage

- (.820) and steals (73) as a senior.
- She finished her career with 1,460 points and 722 rebounds, winding up No. 26 among UT's 45 all-time 1,000-point scorers.
- Nared finished second on all-time UT season lists for free throws made (169) and free throws attempted (206).
- She wound up fifth on Lady Vol career lists for free throws made (429) and free throw pct. (.827, 429-519).
- Her 10 double-doubles last season ranked her No. 7 among all Lady Vol seniors and her 19 over four seasons put her at No. 19.

FIVE LADY VOLS EARN SEC HONORS

- Seniors Jaime Nared and Mercedes Russell were named to the eight-player All-SEC First Team, freshman Anastasia Hayes was chosen as 6th Woman of the Year and her classmates RENNIA DAVIS and Evina Westbrook were selected for the eight-person SEC All-Freshman Team.
- Nared and Russell picked up Coaches All-SEC accolades for the second time in their careers, but they made the first team in 2018 after earning second-team honors a year ago. It marked the fourth time during the Holly Warlick era UT had two on the coaches' first team. Cierra Burdick and Isabelle Harrison had that distinction in 2015, while Meighan Simmons and Harrison made the cut in 2014 and Simmons and Bashaara Graves did so in 2013.
- Hayes is Tennessee's second-ever 6th Woman of the Year, following in the footsteps of Alyssia Brewer in 2010. Davis and Westbrook, meanwhile, are the fourth and fifth members of the SEC All-Freshman Team during the past six seasons. It marked the seventh time in history UT has had two players on that squad in the same year.
- Nared and Russell were AP All-SEC Second Team selections this year.

NAT'L HONORS FOR TWO LADY VOLS

- Seniors Mercedes Russell and Jaime Nared earned recognition from two national organizations for their senior-year efforts.
- Nared was an AP Honorable Mention All-American, a WBCA Honorable Mention All-American and made the WBCA All-Region 2 Team.
- Russell was a WBCA Honorable Mention All-American and made the WBCA All-Region 2 Team.

FRESHMEN MAKE IMMEDIATE IMPACT

- SEC All-Freshman guard/forward RENNIA DAVIS became the 15th Lady Vol (adding redshirt freshman Candace Parker makes her 16th) to score in double figures during her first year as a Lady Vol.
- Davis averaged 12.0 points and 7.6 rebounds as a freshman, starting 32 of 33 games.
- She notched nine double-doubles to tie Tamika Catchings for fifth-most double-doubles recorded by a Lady Vol freshman. Tennessee players ahead of her on the list are Chamique Holdsclaw (16), Sheila Frost (11), Bashaara Graves (10) and Candace Parker (10).
- Davis finished sixth in rebounds per game all-time by any Lady Vol freshman at 7.6.
- She ranked No. 11 in rebounding in the SEC as a rookie, including second among freshmen.
- SEC All-Freshman point guard Evina Westbrook averaged 8.4 points, 4.3 assists and 2.8 rebounds while starting all 33 games as a rookie.
- Her 4.3 assists per game average was the No. 2 all-time mark by a UT freshman.
- Westbrook's 143 assists also were the second-most ever by a Lady Vol rookie.
- SEC 6th Woman of the Year Anastasia Hayes finished with averages of 9.3 ppg. and 3.5 apg.
- She was UT's first player off the bench on 27 occasions and scored in double figures 18 times.
- Her 3.5 assists per game average edged her coach and Lady Vol legend Holly Warlick (3.4 apg) for

THREE LADY VOLS GO IN WNBA DRAFT

- The Tennessee women's basketball program added to its impressive list of players advancing to the professional ranks, as three former Lady Vol standouts were selected in the 2018 WNBA Draft 2018.
- The Chicago Sky took Diamond DeShields (2015-17) with the third overall pick in the first round, UT's highest draftee since Shekinna Stricklen went second to the Seattle Storm in 2012.
- Jaime Nared (2014-18) was the second LVFL chosen, selected by the Las Vegas Aces with the 13th overall pick and first selection of the second round.
- Mercedes Russell (2013-18) was the third Big Orange product to hear her name called, going to the New York Liberty with the 22nd overall pick in the second round.
- All time, 42 Lady Vols have been taken in the WNBA Draft, including 11 during the Holly Warlick era.
- The eight previous Lady Vols taken during Warlick's six years include: the duo of Jordan Reynolds (2nd Rd., 19th pick, Atlanta) and Schaquilla Nunn (3rd Rd., 25th pick, San Antonio) in 2017; Bashaara Graves (2nd Rd., 22nd pick, Minnesota) in 2016; the trio of Isabelle Harrison (1st Rd., 12th pick, Phoenix), Cierra Burdick (2nd Rd., 14th pick, Los Angeles) and Ariel Massengale (3rd Rd., 29th pick, Atlanta) in 2015; Meighan Simmons in 2014 (3rd Rd., 26th pick, New York); and Kamiko Williams in 2013 (2nd Rd. 15th pick, New York).

HEAD COACH HOLLY WARLICK



In six complete years at the helm of Tennessee women's basketball, Holly Warlick has built a very impressive résumé in her young head coaching career. Her worksheet contains accomplishments few coaches have achieved in their entire careers, much less as first-time head coaches.

Those successes verify that Warlick was the right choice to take the reins at Tennessee and that she and her staff have the acumen to run a championship program. A disciple of the legendary Pat Summitt, Warlick has maintained the core values of her former coach, co-worker and friend while at the same time employing her own personality, style and competitive energy to coach today's players.

Whether as an All-America player from 1976-80, an assistant and associate head coach for 27 seasons from 1985 to 2012, or head coach from 2012 to present, Warlick has thrived during her more than three decades in the spotlight at Rocky Top. She enters her seventh year as head coach and 38th season of overall affiliation with the program hoping to build upon last season's NCAA Second Round finish.

Warlick was announced as head coach of the Lady Vols on April 18, 2012, as women's hoops legend Pat Summitt stepped into the role of head coach emeritus. In a touching and symbolic gesture the following day at a press conference announcing the changes, Summitt presented her coaching whistle to her long-time aide and former floor general.

Since that day, Warlick and her staff have worked tirelessly to maintain the program's lofty expectations. Despite being picked to finish as low as fifth in the SEC and 20th nationally, her first squad won the 2013 SEC regular season title and made the NCAA Elite Eight, finishing 27-8/14-2 despite injuries that forced players to miss a combined 53 games. Her 2014 edition went 29-6/13-3, winning an SEC Tournament title and making it to the NCAA Sweet 16.

In 2015, her third team reached the 30-win plateau at 30-6/15-1, claiming a share of the regular-season SEC crown and charting the second NCAA Elite Eight appearance in her three seasons. Her last three units have finished 22-14, 20-12 and 25-8, advancing to the NCAA Elite Eight and back-to-back Second Round appearances, respectively. The last two seasons saw the Lady Vols knock off national powers South Carolina, Mississippi State, Stanford, Notre Dame and Texas along the way.

During Warlick's first six seasons, 11 Lady Vols have been taken in the WNBA Draft. Diamond DeShields (1st Rd.), Jaime Nared (2nd Rd.) and Mercedes Russell (2nd Rd.) were picked in 2018; Jordan Reynolds (2nd Rd.) and Schaquilla Nunn (2nd Rd.) were selected in 2017; Bashaara Graves (2nd Rd.) went in 2016; Isabelle Harrison (1st Rd.), Cierra Burdick (2nd Rd.) and Ariel Massengale (3rd Rd.) were chosen in 2015; Meighan Simmons (3rd Rd.) was taken in 2014 and Kamiko Williams (2nd

Rd.) was selected in 2013. Simmons was twice named SEC Player of the Year (2013, 2014) during her UT career.

On the international scene, Warlick is a gold medal coach, and two of her players joined her in earning that hardware. Warlick served as an assistant, while Mercedes Russell and Diamond DeShields played on the undefeated (6-0) 2015 USA World University Games Team in South Korea.

From 2012-18, Tennessee also has produced in the classroom, with 15 players earning a total of 33 spots on the SEC Academic Honor Roll. In 2015, Cierra Burdick became Warlick's first CoSIDA Academic All-American, garnering second-team honors and also being named a UT Torchbearer, the most prestigious accolade a student at Tennessee can receive.

Warlick has been recognized personally for her performance. In 2013, members of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association named her the Spalding Maggie Dixon Division I Rookie Coach of the Year. She was selected by the AP and league coaches as the 2013 SEC Women's Basketball Coach of the Year, and members of the Tennessee Sports Writers Association also chose her as TSWA Women's Basketball Coach of the Year that season.

In May 2017, Warlick was recognized for her years of distinguished leadership, volunteer activities, philanthropic work and professional accomplishments that have contributed to improving the quality of life in Tennessee. She was named the 2017 Tennessee Woman of Distinction at the 32nd annual Chattanooga Women of Distinction Awards luncheon.

Warlick and her staff also continue to build for the future on the recruiting trail. They have welcomed 13 McDonald's All-Americans in six recruiting classes, including seven in the last two years. All four members of the No. 1-ranked 2017 signing class were McDonald's All-Americans, including the No. 2 player in Evina Westbrook, and three of four members of the No. 4-rated 2018 group were McDonald's All-Americans, led by No. 10 ranked Zaay Green.

After Warlick helped shape the direction of Lady Vol basketball as an assistant on Summitt's staff for more than a quarter of a century, the pupil took on greater responsibility and oversaw daily supervision of the basketball office during the 2011-12 season. She also handled a large measure of the media obligations after Summitt's Aug. 23, 2011, announcement regarding the diagnosis of early onset dementia, "Alzheimer's type."

Providing an excellent example of how people rally around each other, the Tennessee staff members pulled together remarkably in the face of that adversity. The end result was a 27-9 overall record, an SEC Tournament Championship and advancement to the NCAA Regional Final.

It's worth noting that Warlick was by Summitt's side, either as a player or an assistant, for 949 of

Warlick has continued the Lady Vols' 100-percent graduation rate for players who have completed their collegiate careers at Tennessee.

Only three schools have reached the NCAA Elite Eight more times in the past six seasons than the Lady Vols, who advanced to that round in 2013, 2015 and 2016.

Warlick and Leon Barmore (formerly of Louisiana Tech) are the only skippers to direct their programs to three NCAA Elite Eight appearances in their first four seasons as head coaches.

Holly Warlick's 153-54 record through the 2017-18 season ranked her 11th among Power Five women's coaches.

She is the only coach in that group who had fewer than 10 seasons as a head coach.

UT ranks eighth among Power Five schools with a 13-6 NCAA Tournament record during the past six seasons.

Warlick's career SEC (.740, 71-25) winning percentage entering 2018-19 ranked her first among all SEC women's head coaches.

Tennessee has claimed three SEC trophies in Warlick's first six seasons, winning regular-season crowns in 2013 and 2015 and claiming the tournament title in 2014.

• Only 13 women's programs in the nation have appeared in every NCAA Tournament the past six years, including three from the SEC (Tennessee, South Carolina, Texas A&M).
