STARTING FIVE

- The Gophers take part in the annual Big Ten/ACC Challenge presented by Continental Tire, hosting Clemson for their third meeting in the event and the second time in the last five years.
- Monday's game concludes Minnesota's longest homestand of the season. Following the stretch which concludes with the Big Ten/ACC Challenge game against Clemson on Dec. 2, Minnesota will have back-to-back home games just twice more during the regular season. The Gophers have just one more nonconference home game remaining after Monday, coming on Dec. 28 against FIU.
- Already twice this year, the Gophers have taken aim at the record books with hot shooting from beyond the 3-point arc. Against Central Michigan, Minnesota drained 14 treys, which ties for the second-most in school history (last: 12/13/02 vs. Fairleigh Dickinson). Minnesota sank 13 3-pointers in the season opener vs. Cleveland State.
- Sophomore Jarvis Omersa had his best game of his career to date on Sunday against the Fighting Hawks of North Dakota. The Orono, Minn., native recorded career-highs with 11 points, a game-high nine rebounds and three assists in 22 minutes. Omersa made 5-of-9 field goals and also came up with a pair of steals in the Gophers' victory.
- The Gophers already rank highly among the nation's college basketball teams in several categories. As of Dec. 1, Minnesota is 25th in 3-pointers made per game (BIG: 2nd), and 25th in blocked shots per game (BIG: 3rd). Daniel Oturu is 13th in double doubles (BIG: 2nd) and ninth in the country in blocks (BIG: 2nd) while eighth in rebounds per game (BIG: 2nd) and 45th in field goal percentage (BIG: 2nd). Marcus Carr is 23rd in the country in assists per game (BIG: 2nd). Payton Willis leads the Big Ten and ranks 36th in the nation in 3-pointers made per game.

SCOUTING THE TIGERS

- Clemson is 5-2 on the season, including a 0-1 mark in conference play after dropping their ACC opener to Virginia Tech, 67-60. A loss to Colorado in Las Vegas last Tuesday ended a five-game winning streak.
- Monday's game is Clemson's first true road test of the year, opening with five home games before a pair in Sin City.
- Tevin Mack has scored in double figures every game this season and leads the team averaging 15.4 points per contest, one of four double-digit scorers for the Tigers.

GOPHERS VS. THE ACC

- The Gophers have amassed a record of 35-42 against the current membership of the Atlantic Coast Conference, excluding vacated games.
- Series records vs. ACC teams are as follows: 0-1 vs. Boston College; 2-1 vs. Clemson, 1-2 vs. Duke, 6-5 vs. Florida State, 2-1 vs. Georgia Tech, 4-2 vs. Louisville, 1-2 vs. Miami, 2-2 vs. UNC, 0-2 vs. N.C. State, 8-14 vs. Notre Dame, 1-2 vs. Pittsburgh, 1-1 vs. Syracuse, 2-4 vs. Virginia, 1-0 vs. Virginia Tech, 4-3 vs. Wake Forest.

GOPHERS IN THE ACC/BIG CHALLENGE

- The Gophers are 9-11 all-time in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.
- This is the third meeting between the Gophers and Tigers in the event, with all coming at Williams Arena.
- The Gophers have a 3-3 mark under head coach Richard Pitino in the Challenge. Minnesota has dropped three in a row after winning five straight Challenge games.

ET TU, OTURU?

- Sophomore center Daniel Oturu is off to one of the best starts in the country. He has already set new or matched career highs in eight different categories.
- Oturu had one of the best nights of his career at Butler, setting new career-bests in scoring (24 points), field goals (9) and 3-pointers made (2) and minutes played (38) while adding 10 rebounds for his 10th career double-double.
- Three days later at Utah, his 18 rebounds, two 3-pointers and two steals set or matched career highs for the Woodbury native in those categories - the first again matched on Friday against DePaul.

RAINING IN THE BARN

- The season opener versus Cleveland State saw the Gophers connect on 13 3-pointers, tying for the fourth-highest single game total in program history.
- Payton Willis led the Gophers and tied a career-high by making 5-of-8 from beyond the arc, while Marcus Carr and Gabe Kalscheur each had three trifectas.
- When the team returned to Williams Arena next, 16 days later, the Gophers connected on 14 3-pointers which tied for the second most in school history.
- It matched the totals at Michigan (Feb. 17, 2001) and, most recently, at home against Fairleigh Dickinson (December 13, 2002).
- Last season, the Gophers (who ranked among the nation's

least productive teams behind the arc) sank double-digit treys just four times including a season-high of 12 in a win over Indiana on Feb. 16.

FIFTH-ANNUAL COACHES VS. CANCER TIPOFF DINNER

- Before the season tipped off, the Gophers and head coach Richard Pitino continued their annual tradition of raising money for the fight against Cancer.
- On Sunday night at Interlachen Country Club in Edina, more than \$117,000 was grossed in the fifth annual Coaches vs. Cancer Tipoff Dinner.
- All proceeds from the event benefit the Richard M. Schulze Family American Cancer Society Hope Lodge in Minneapolis, which provides accommodations and support to families and patients during their time fighting the disease.

DRESS REHEARSALS

- The Gophers played a pair of preseason games as they readied for the 2019-20 season.
- On October 19, Minnesota edged Iowa State in a closed scrimmage in Ames, 77-68 in overtime.
- Four Gophers reached double figures in the contest, led by 17 points from sophomores Marcus Carr and Gabe Kalscheur. Classmate Daniel Oturu posted a double-double with 13 points and a game-high 13 rebounds, adding two blocks. Joining the group was junior Payton Willis, who added 12, including a pair of 3-pointers in overtime.
- Nine days later, the Gophers handled Southwest Minnesota State, 73-48, in an exhibition game at Williams Arena.
- Willis finished the game with a team-high 14 points to go with six assists and four rebounds, while Oturu recorded a double-double with 12 points, a game-high 16 rebounds and three steals. Carr wound up with 12 points and six assists, and Kalscheur had 11 points for the Gophers.

DINKYTOWN TO THE LEAGUE

- Three members of last season's NCAA Second Round team have found their way into roster spots with NBA organizations.
- Amir Coffey signed a two-way contract with the Los Angeles Clippers and began the season on the team's roster.
- Jordan Murphy signed a contract with the Minnesota Timberwolves and is currently among the Iowa Wolves G League roster, while Dupree McBrayer was on the Long Island Nets roster before being waived in early November.
- All three, along with 2018 graduate Nate Mason (G League/Texas Legends) are looking to become the first Gopher to play in the NBA since Kris Humphries, who last appeared in the league in 2017.

NEW TEAM, WHO DIS?

- Minnesota welcomes seven newcomers to the court this season, the most since the 2004-05 campaign.
- Among the group is three transfers: guards Payton Willis (Vanderbilt) and Marcus Carr (Pittsburgh) who sat out last year due to NCAA transfer rules, along with graduate transfer Alihan Demir (Drexel).
- Four freshmen in guards Bryan Greenlee and Tre' Williams, along with big men Sam Freeman and Isaiah Ihnen round out the corps of fresh faces.

WILLIE BURTON TO BE HONORED IN JANUARY

- One of the greatest players in Minnesota men's basketball history will soon find his name among the legends of Williams Arena, as Willie Burton (1986-90) will be honored during halftime of the Gophers' nationally-televised home game against Michigan State on Sunday, January 26.
- Burton, the third-leading scorer in program history, led the team in scoring both his junior (18.6) and senior (19.3) seasons, both NCAA Tournament years. His senior squad advanced to the Elite Eight, earning March Madness victories over UTEP, Northern Iowa and Syracuse before falling to Georgia Tech at the Superdome in New Orleans.
- The Detroit native finished his career behind Mychal Thompson (1,992) atop the career scoring records with 1,800 points - a mark that was eclipsed just last season by Jordan Murphy (1,802).

CURRY TO MISS 2019-20 SEASON WITH KNEE INJURY

- Redshirt junior forward Eric Curry (Memphis, Tenn./Southwest

Christian Academy) suffered a season-ending knee injury in practice in early October.

- "We are obviously disappointed in Eric's recent setback," Pitino said at the time. "He has worked so hard and stayed positive throughout this whole process. He is still a valuable member and leader on this team. I can't wait to get him back, better than ever next year."
- Curry will undergo successful surgery in late October to repair the torn ACL and will miss the 2019-20 season.

SUPPORT STAFF CHANGES

- Head coach Richard Pitino announced in early November the addition of Patrick Reilingh to the newly created position of recruiting coordinator, along with the promotion of Josh Adel to video coordinator.
- Reilingh, a 2014 graduate of Louisville, joins the Gophers after spending time at his alma mater and most recently one season as the video coordinator at La Salle.
- Adel has served in a variety of roles since joining Pitino's original staff at Minnesota in 2013.
- Additionally, former Gopher student-athlete Jarvis Johnson joined the team as a graduate manager prior to the season, after earning his undergraduate degree from the 'U' this past spring.

UP NEXT

- The Gophers take the annual December foray into conference play, traveling to Big Ten rival Iowa on Monday, Dec. 9.
- Tip off is set for 7 p.m., on BTN while KFAN 100.3 FM will carry the Gopher Radio Network broadcast in the Twin Cities.

SIGNING DAY

University of Minnesota head men's basketball coach Richard Pitino announced Wednesday the addition of future Gophers Jamal Mashburn, Jr. (Miami, Fla./Brewster Academy) and Martice Mitchell (Chicago, Ill./Bloom). Each signed their National Letter of Intent to join the men's basketball program for the 2020-21 season. The Gophers have now signed at least one four-star prospect in each of the last six years.

JAMAL MASHBURN, JR. 6-2 • MIAMI, FLA. • BREWSTER ACADEMY

Mashburn is a consensus four-star and top-100 prospect in the nation as well as one of the top 2020 recruits from the Sunshine State. He is in his second season at Brewster, where he helped lead the New Hampshire prep school to a National Prep Championship. Last season, Mashburn scored nine points per game while shooting 38 percent from behind the 3-point arc and 77 percent from the free throw line. In the Bobcats' National Prep Championship game, Mashburn contributed 22 points to the winning effort.

PITINO ON MASHBURN:

"Jamal is one of the top scorers in his class. He has unlimited range and competes every second he gets on the court. Jamal is one of the hardest workers in the country. He will be a tremendous addition to our basketball program on and off the court."

MARTICE MITCHELL 6-10 • CHICAGO, ILL. • BLOOM H.S.

Mitchell also ranks among the top five prospects in his home state of Illinois as well as a four-star prospect. Last season at Bloom, he averaged 11 points, nine rebounds and three blocks per game. His team was ranked throughout the season among Illinois state high school programs, falling in the sectional semifinals.

PITINO ON MITCHELL:

"Martice has phenomenal potential. He can score inside and out. He's versatile and has tremendous length. Every time I saw him he got better and better. He will be a terrific student athlete and will fit in right away into our locker room."

MINNESOTA MEDIA POLICIES

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Requests for working media credentials (newspaper, radio, TV, photo) for Minnesota home games must be made on-line at gophersports.com/media. Requests for credentials should be made as early as possible due to severe seat limitations in the press areas at Williams Arena. Please contact the Athletic Communications office for more information regarding the on-line credentialing system. Delivery of credentials will be handled according to individual situations, but in most cases will not be mailed. Credentials can be picked up starting two and a half hours before game time at the Williams Arena media will call gate at the west end of the south lobby of the building.

MEDIA CREDENTIAL CRITERIA

Due to severe space limitations for media seating in Williams Arena, media requesting credentials for Golden Gopher basketball will have to meet certain criteria to gain access to press seating. **Media seating is located in section 203 (SE corner of the arena).**

- The originating television entity of the game will be seated courtside at center court.
- Flagship radio for the visiting team will be seated in the first row of section 203. Any non-originating radio stations doing game updates will be seated in the upper press row. Student radio stations will be subject to space restrictions and will only be granted credentials if space allows.
- Any national publication will be granted a minimum of

one credential for working press and one photography credential if needed courtside.

- The Associated Press and the primary daily newspapers of the Minneapolis/St. Paul market that provide daily coverage for Golden Gopher basketball will be granted three seats. (1-photo, 2-working press). Any other requested credentials will be seated as space dictates.
- Any visiting team's primary newspapers from its largest media market that provide daily coverage of the visiting team will be granted credentials. The location of other credentialed media of the visiting team will be determined by circulation size or the visiting SID.
- Minneapolis/St. Paul local television stations with network affiliation will be granted one seat in the press seating area. additional seats will be granted if space allows.
- Only on-line entities that are affiliated with an accredited news agency can qualify for credentials. No additional credentials will be given to any print, radio or television agency for their on-line websites that are already credentialed for Gopher Basketball.
- If there is no space available within the arena, media can request credentials and have access during the game to the media work room located on the second level of the east addition and postgame interview areas.

PHOTO AND FILM CREDENTIALS

All photo and game film credentials should be requested as early as possible because of severe space limitations. Photographers and film crews may work only in the designated areas. Photographers are not allowed on

the court during play, but can photograph pregame and postgame activities, if they have requested such access from the media relations staff. Failure to comply will result in expulsion from the arena.

MEDIA PASS GATE

You must have proper identification to receive your credentials. The media pass gate opens two and a half hours before game time.

Coach Pitino and select Golden Gopher players will be made available for interviews the day before each game prior to practice. Requests for individual players should be submitted to Dan Reisig no less than 24 hours before scheduled availability, but are not guaranteed for availability.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Minnesota complies with an equal-access policy. Following a 10-minute cooling-off period, postgame coaches' interviews are conducted in the Media Room, located on the second level of the east addition. Selected Minnesota student-athletes will be made available for post-game interviews in the Media Room. The Minnesota locker room is not open to the media. Generally, visiting team player interviews are conducted in the lower level hallway outside the visitor locker room.



Richard Pitino is in his seventh season as the 17th head coach of the University of Minnesota's Golden Gopher men's basketball team.

Last year, Pitino guided the Gophers to their second NCAA Tournament bid in three seasons, along with just the second tournament victory in nearly 30 years. The Gophers won 22 games, finished seventh in the Big Ten and upset the No. 7-seed Louisville Cardinals in the NCAA first round. Two Gophers in Jordan Murphy and Amir Coffey earned All-Big Ten nods, the former also earning NABC All-District honors.

In his fifth season, Pitino saw the Gophers achieve several notable achievements. The Gophers were ranked nationally to begin the season and as high as 12th, while two individuals picked up All-Big Ten honors. Jordan Murphy earned his third straight All-Big Ten nod after a year in which he led the conference in rebounding and tied for the nation's lead in double-doubles (24). Nate Mason received All-Big Ten honorable mention after capping a career in which he ranked among the all-time Gophers.

The 2017 Big Ten Coach of the Year as voted by the league's media and head coaches, Pitino led the Gophers to a school-record 23 regular season wins and an NCAA appearance for the first time since 2013. Earning a No. 5 seed in the tournament - the Gophers' highest since 1982 - Pitino guided the Gophers to an 11-win Big Ten season, the most since the 1990 campaign. Four Gophers received All-Big Ten honors, including First Team selection Nate Mason and Defensive Player of the Year Reggie Lynch along with third teamer Jordan Murphy and All-Freshman selection Amir Coffey.

The 2016-17 season saw several accomplishments, including the selection of freshman Jordan Murphy to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. He was the Gophers' first honoree since 2005 and only the third ever. The Gophers also picked up signature victories over No. 6 Maryland at home, along with improving to 3-0 under Pitino in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge after a home victory over Clemson in November.

In 2015-16, the Gophers set a new school single-season record with 313 steals, passing the previous mark of 297 set in 2007-08. The team averaged 74.2 points per game, the highest since the 2001-02 season and the second straight season under head coach Richard Pitino that the Gophers have averaged more than 71 points per game. Two of his players garnered All-Big Ten honorable mentions in guard Andre Hollins (coaches & media) and Maurice Walker (media). In February, the Gophers defeated then-#25 and eventual Final Four team Michigan State in East Lansing for the first time since 1997 (later vacated) - the team's first road win over a top-25 team since 2012.

Pitino came to Gold Country after spending one season at the helm of the Florida International University (FIU) basketball program.

Prior to leading FIU, Pitino served as the Associate Head Coach for one season and an assistant for two other seasons under his father, Rick, at Louisville. In three years overall with the Cardinals, he helped the program to a combined 88-25 record, a pair of NCAA Elite Eight berths (2008 and 2009) and one NCAA Final Four appearance (2012). His efforts also helped the Cards land two of top 15 recruiting classes in his three years (2007-08 and 2008-09). Pitino also spent time as an assistant for two seasons under Billy Donovan at Florida. In his time with the Gators, the club was a combined 50-20 with back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances, including reaching the 2011 NCAA Southeast Regional finals before falling to NCAA runner-up Butler.


