SETTING THE SCENE BETWEEN THE TIGERS AND BULLDOGS

- The Clemson Tigers open their season against Mississippi State in the 2020 Space Coast Challenge. Previously the Cancun Challenge, the Space Coast Challenge is hosted by Eastern Florida State College in Titan Field House.
- The contest will be televised on CBS Sports Network with Dave Ryan and Bob Wenzel calling the action, while Don Munson and Tim Bourret will call the action on the radio waves. The radio call will be available on the Clemson Tigers Network and Tunein.com.
- Live stats will be provided on ClemsonTigers.com and Twitter updates will be available on Clemson's official account (@ClemsonMBB).

CLEMSON BASKETBALL HEADLINES

- Clemson is 3-1 all-time against Mississippi State. The Tigers fell to the Bulldogs in their last meeting during the 2018 Never Forget Tribute Classic, 82-71.
- Aamir Simms was named to the All-ACC Preseason First-Team, becoming Clemson's first since 2016 and second since 2018 to earn preseason league honors.
- Simms was previously named to the Karl Malone Watch List (Top 20 PF in the country) and became the first Tiger to earn recognition from the Basketball Hall of Fame's preseason award watch lists.
- Simms was named Third-Team All-ACC on March 9. It's Simms' first career ACC postseason accolade.
- Clemson boasted a Top-20 recruiting class in the country for 2020 with the additions of PJ Hall, Olivier-Maxence Prosper and Lynn Kidd. It marked the program's highest recruiting ranking since 2009, according to 247Sports.
- Clemson was been bitten by the injury bug in 2019-20, having many key players miss time due to injuries, which included three starting players. For much of the season, Clemson had as few as eight scholarship players active. Clemson had players miss 75 games last season.
- Jonathan Baehre and Clyde Trapp are both healthy after overcoming torn ACL's last year. Baehre re-tore his ACL in December 2019. Chase Hunter has overcome a foot injury that held him to just nine contests his freshman season.
- Nick Honor is eligible for the Tigers' in the backcourt after previously sitting out the 2019-20 season due to NCAA transfer rules. Honor has three seasons of eligibility left after playing his freshman year at Fordham. Honor spent last season on Clemson's scout team.
- Head Coach Brownell passed Cliff Ellis as the program's all-time winningest coach. Coach Brownell was two wins shy of passing Ellis and the Tigers earned back-to-back victories at North Carolina and at home over No. 3 Duke. The win over North Carolina was the program's first-ever in Chapel Hill.

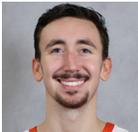

CLEMSON WINS OVER TOP-6 TEAMS LAST SEASON

- Clemson defeated Florida State, 70-69 for its third top-six win (time of the game) over teams in the AP poll on Feb. 29, and now leads the nation in top six wins. • The Tigers have defeated a third-ranked Duke, fifth-ranked Louisville and sixth-ranked Florida State this season.
- It is the first time since 1979-80 that Clemson has beaten three top-6 teams (top six by one of the two polls) in the same year.
- It is the first time in program history that Clemson has recorded three Top-6 AP ranked wins in the same season.
- Thirty-two different teams have recorded 36 top-6 wins this year. Louisville and Kentucky are the only other teams with two wins over top-6 teams. There have been 11 top-6 wins by ACC teams this year and Clemson has three of them.

CLEMSON OVERCAME HALFTIME DEFICIT FIVE TIMES LAST SEASON

- Clemson overcame a 39-32 halftime deficit to defeat Florida State on Feb. 29. It was Clemson's fifth victory after trailing at the half this season. That is the most halftime deficits overcome to gain victory since 2015-16.
- The record for halftime deficits overcome for victory is six, set in 1989-90 and 2013-14.
- Three times this year Clemson has overcome a deficit of six or more to win. Clemson overcame a 10-point deficit at North Carolina, a six-point deficit at home against Wake Forest and the aforementioned Florida State game when the Tigers trailed by seven. This is the most halftime deficits of six or more points overcome to gain victory since 2008-09 when the Tigers also did it three times.
- It is interesting to note that Clemson has five wins by five points or less this year and in all five, Clemson trailed at the half.

OVERCOMING DOUBLE-DIGIT DEFICITS

- Clemson has overcome four double-digit deficits this season and comeback to win overtime games against TCU (Nov. 24) and North Carolina (Jan. 11), as well as, games in regulation against Wake Forest (Jan. 21) and Syracuse (Jan. 28).
- The Tigers trailed by as many as 15 points against the Horned Frogs in their first game of the MGM Main Event in Las Vegas.
- Clemson defeated TCU 62-60 at T-Mobile Arena in their opening contest of the tournament on Sunday. • After putting together a 15-0 run to close out the second half, Clemson prevailed in overtime.
- Marking the largest comeback for the Tigers since 2011.
- Down 52-37 with 7:39 remaining, the Tigers remained poised, however, and outscored the Horned Frogs 15-0 over the course of the final 7:39 of the second half. A steal by Curran Scott helped facilitate a game-tying basket by Mack in the final minute, thus forcing overtime.
- Clemson would prevail 62-60 in the extra period.
- Clemson overcame a 13-point deficit toward the end of the first half against the Tar Heels, and also a 10-point deficit with just 2:08 remaining in regulation to force overtime and claim victory in the extra period.
- Aamir Simms scored the last 10 points of regulation to help force overtime and then scored or assisted on six-of-nine overtime points to help the Tigers prevail for their first-ever win in Chapel Hill.
- Clemson trailed Wake Forest early in the first half, but overcame a 10-point deficit and a six-point halftime deficit to oust the Demon Deacons by three in regulation.
- The Tigers used a big second-half from Tevin Mack to overcome a 10-point deficit to the Orange.
- Clemson trailed by 10 with 16:26 left in the second half to edge Syracuse by one in regulation.
- The Tigers' fifth double-digit comeback of the season was realized with a one-point victory over No. 6/6 Florida State.
- Al-Amir Dawes went coast-to-coast for a game-winning layup with one second left to seal the comeback.

CLEMSON'S SECOND TOP-5 WIN

- With Clemson's dominating win over fifth-ranked Louisville (Feb. 15), the Tigers now claim two top five wins this year. Clemson defeated third-ranked Duke on January 14, at Littlejohn Coliseum by a 79-72 score.
- The Tigers were led by John Newman III who poured in a career-high 23 points on 7-for-9 shooting from the floor, including 7-for-7 at the foul line.
- Clemson held Louisville to a season-low 14 first-half points. It was its lowest total since Jan. 30, 2016 (14 vs. Virginia) and tied for its second-lowest since Feb. 7, 2015 (13 vs. Virginia).
- The Tigers have now recorded a second top five win in the same season for the first time since 1979-80, and just the fourth time overall. Clemson recorded at least two top five wins three times between 1975 and 1980.
- The Tigers defeated No. 3 Maryland and No. 4 NC State in 1974-75 in Tates Locke's last year.
- Then, in 1975-76 the Tigers defeated No. 5 Wake Forest and No. 2 Maryland in consecutive ACC road games.
- The win at No. 2 Maryland is the highest ranked team Clemson has beaten on the road in history. Those were the first two ACC road games of Bill Foster's Clemson coaching career.
- The last time Clemson beat at least two top five teams in the same season was 1979-80, when the Tigers beat three top five teams in the UPI Coaches Poll.
- The Tigers defeated No. 4 North Carolina and No. 1 Duke on consecutive Wednesday nights in January of 1980. Then in February of that season the Tigers downed fifth ranked Maryland.

CLEMSON RECORDED FOURTH-STRAIGHT WIN AT PITTSBURGH AND BOSTON COLLEGE

- Clemson defeated Pittsburgh on Feb. 12 by a 72-52 score. The 20-point win was just the eighth ACC road win by 20 points or more in Clemson history.
- It was also the fourth straight win for the Tigers at Pittsburgh. That is tied for the second longest road ACC winning streak in school history. Clemson won five straight at Virginia from 1959-60 through 1963-64 and four in a row at Georgia Tech from 2010-11 through 2013-14.
- The list below is for ACC road win streaks at the same venue of three or more. Clemson has won two in a row at Georgia Tech and will have a chance for a third in a row when the Tigers travel to Georgia Tech on Feb. 25.
- Clemson also just won its fourth-straight on the road at Boston College (Feb. 22).
- The Tigers shot a program record for an ACC road game (68.9 percent) from the floor en route to an 18-point victory.

TIGERS DOWNED PITTSBURGH BY 20

- The Tigers shot 59.1 (13-22) percent from 3-point range in the game. The best mark of the season.
- Clemson also shot 57.9 percent (11-19) from the floor in the second half, including 77.8 percent (7-9) from three.
- The 20-point victory was Clemson's 26th ACC road win by double digits in history – the eighth under head coach Brad Brownell.
- Brownell holds the record for ACC road wins by double-digits.
- Prior to the Pitt game last season, he was tied with Bobby Roberts, who had six between 1963-64 and 1967-68.
- The win over Pittsburgh was the second ACC road win this season, the first by double digits.
- Head Coach Brad Brownell has now also coached three of Clemson's eight all-time wins that have come by 20+ points on the road against ACC opponents.
- It was just the ninth loss for Pitt at the Petersen Events Center by at least 20 points in the Panthers' 18 years in the facility.
- Pitt entered the game with 262 wins at home since the 2002-03 season, the eighth most home wins by a Division I program since the building opened.

- Clemson posted a 5-2 record for the month of January, tied for third best record among the 15 ACC teams and tied for the third best winning percentage in January by a Clemson team over the last 30 years.
- Only Louisville (7-1) and Florida State (5-1) had better marks than Clemson among ACC schools for January.
- The Tigers were tied with Duke at 5-2. The Tigers defeated the Blue Devils so Clemson would be the third seed if there was a ranking for the month.
- Syracuse (5-3) was the only other ACC team with a winning record for the month.
- The .714 winning percentage for the month was tied for the third best in the last 30 years for the program.
- The 2015-16 Clemson team and the 1996-97 Tiger team were 6-2 in January and those are the best records for that month since 1990. Clemson was also 5-2 in January in 2008-09 and 2010-11.
- In addition to the two January accomplishments above the Tigers also...

CLEMSON VS. STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

- With a win over Wake Forest on Jan. 21, it gave Clemson at least a break even record in the season series against all four ACC schools from the Tar Heel state for the first time since 1989-90 when the Tigers were 1-1 vs. Duke, 1-1 vs. UNC, 1-1 vs. NC State and 3-0 vs. Wake Forest.
- The only other years Clemson has been at least break even against all four ACC schools from North Carolina are 1979-80 (when Clemson was 1-1 against all four) and 1976-77. That year, Tree Rollins senior season, Clemson was 3-0 vs. Duke, 1-1 vs. North Carolina, 2-0 vs. NC State and 1-1 vs. Wake Forest.
- This is just the third time in the last 24 years Clemson has at least four wins over ACC schools from the state of North Carolina.
- Other years are 2007-08 (4-4) and 2016-17 (4-2).
- Clemson finishes 4-2 against ACC schools from the state of North Carolina, most wins in a season against the "Big Four" since 2016-17 when the Tigers were 4-2 against North Carolina, Duke, NC State and Wake Forest combined. But it would be just the second time Clemson has had four wins against the Big Four since 2007-08.

TIGERS TOPPLED NO. 3 BLUE DEVILS

- Clemson finished a historic back-to-back with a 79-72 win over No. 3/3 Duke on Jan. 14.
- Duke had held its previous seven opponents under 65 points until Clemson nearly put up an 80-spot in the seven-point victory.
- The win marked just the fourth time in the last 20 years that a team had defeated North Carolina and Duke back-to-back during the regular season.

- The last time that Clemson had defeated North Carolina and Duke in consecutive games was during the 1989-90 season.
- That year the Tigers earned a 69-61 home win over North Carolina on Feb. 24 and then turned around and took down No. 5 Duke by four, 97-93.
- The win over Duke helped Clemson clinch at least a share of the 1990 ACC Regular Season championship. (Duke would lose to UNC the very next weekend to give the Tigers sole possession of the regular season championship).
- The win over No. 3/3 Duke was also the highest-ranked team that Clemson has beaten under Head Coach Brad Brownell.
- It was the first time since Feb. 4, 2009 that the Tigers have defeated a top-5 Duke team. Clemson beat Duke 74-47 that year.
- The Tigers knocked off an AP Top 3 ranked opponent for the first time since Feb. 18, 2001 when Clemson topped No. 1 North Carolina 75-65.

CLEMSON'S BEST BACK-TO-BACK WINS

- There have been many noteworthy back-to-back victories in Clemson's history, but Jan. 11-14, 2020 is right up there or at the top.
 - Head Coach Brad Brownell has been the leader for two of the moments below.
 - **March 3-4, 1939:** Clemson beat Davidson 49-33 and Maryland 39-27 to win the Southern Conference Tournament in Raleigh.
 - **March 1-2, 1962:** Clemson beats host NC State, 67-46 and No. 8 Duke, 77-72 in first two rounds of ACC Tournament in Raleigh.
 - **Feb. 17-18, 1967:** Clemson downs NC State 62-50 and No. 4 North Carolina, 92-88 to win the North-South Doubleheader in Charlotte.
 - **Jan. 17-21, 1976:** Clemson wins consecutive games over top 5 teams on the road, 86-81 at No. 5 Wake Forest and 82-77 over No. 2 Maryland.
 - **March 6-8, 1980:** Defeated Utah State 76-73 and No. 12 BYU and Danny Ainge, 71-66 in NCAA Tournament in Ogden, Utah.
 - **March 1-4, 1989:** Beat No. 9 Duke, 79-74 and No. 25 Georgia Tech, 81-79 (OT) to clinch NCAA tournament birth.
 - **Feb. 24-28, 1990:** Beat North Carolina 69-61 and No. 5 Duke 97-93 to clinch ACC regular season title.
 - **March 16-18, 2018:** Beat New Mexico State, 79-68 and No. 16 Auburn, 84-53 in NCAA Regional in San Diego, Calif.
 - **Jan. 11-14, 2020:** Beat North Carolina in Chapel Hill for first time, 79-76 (OT) and No. 3 Duke at home, 79-72.

HISTORIC WIN IN CHAPEL HILL

- Clemson overcame a 13-point deficit toward the end of the first half, and also a 10-point deficit with just 2:08 remaining in regulation to force overtime and claim victory in the extra period.
- The comeback win marked the second time this season that the Tigers won a game without leading once during regulation.
- It also marked the second double-digit deficit overcome for victory this season.
- It marked the Tigers' first-ever win in Chapel Hill in 60 tries and over 95 years dating back to the 1925-26 season.
- Aamir Simms led the Tigers with a "Quintuple Leadership" - leading Clemson with 20 points, eight rebounds, six assists, four blocks and three steals.
- Simms scored the last 10 points of regulation for the Tigers and scored or assisted on six-of-the-nine overtime points to help lead the Tigers to an historic victory.

- Simms nailed his third 3-pointer of the contest with 3.5 seconds remaining from the nearside wing to knot the score at 70-70.
- Then in overtime, with Clemson leading 77-76, Simms caught a pass at the key from Clyde Trapp and drove left side to finish a layup and give Clemson a 3-point advantage.
- The Tar Heels came back down and flailed up two three-point attempts, to no avail.
- Both John Newman III and Tevin Mack both showed out and scored 17 points each in the victory.
- Mack fouled out of the game with 2:08 remaining and the Tigers trailing by 10 points, but Clemson finished regulation on a 17-4 run and the game on a 21-8 run to capture the victory.

CLEMSON AGAINST TOBACCO ROAD

- Clemson is in the middle of a five-game streak of playing games against ACC teams from the state of North Carolina. This is the first time in history Clemson has played five-straight games against North Carolina "Tobacco Road" schools in the same season.
- It is the first time Clemson has played five-straight games against ACC teams from North Carolina since the final three games of 1961-62 and the first two games of 1962-63.
- The last three games of 1961-62 were all in the 1962 ACC Tournament in Raleigh, wins over NC State and Duke and a championship game loss to Wake Forest.
- Clemson is off to a great start in this stretch with two wins, a victory over NC State at home and the epic win at North Carolina.
- The win in Chapel Hill was Clemson's first victory over the Tar Heels on their home court and the first win by Clemson against the Tar Heels in the state of North Carolina since the 1996 ACC Tournament in Greensboro.

FEWEST 2ND HALF POINTS ALLOWED UNDER BROWNELL

- Clemson allowed just 11 points in the second half against Jacksonville. It marked the fewest points allowed in a second half under head coach Brad Brownell.
- The previous marked was 14 by Delaware State on Nov. 13, 2013.
- The Tigers allowed just two points in the last 14:40 of regulation, including holding the Dolphins scoreless for the last 7:55 of the second half.
- During the last 14:40, Clemson held Jacksonville to just 1-for-19 from the floor, including forcing five turnovers.

CLEMSON TOUGH TO BEAT WHEN ALLOWING 50 OR LESS POINTS

- In Brad Brownell's tenure as head coach at Clemson, the Tigers are a combined 45-2 when they allow 50 or less points to its opponent.
- The Tigers have won their last 24 contests in which they have allowed 50 or less points (24-0).
- Most recently, the Tigers held Jacksonville to just 39 total points (only 11 in the second half) en route to a 68-39 victory.
- In just the Tigers' second game of the 2019-20 season, they held Presbyterian to just 45 points, marking the first time this season they have held an opponent under the 50-point threshold.
- Clemson went 4-0 during 2018-19 in such games.
- The Tigers topped Pittsburgh with a 62-48 victory on the road on Feb. 27.
- Clemson rolled Georgia Tech on the road on Feb. 6, 65-42, and clinching the fewest points allowed in consecutive ACC games in Clemson history.
- The Tigers dominated Wake Forest on Feb. 3, 64-37, holding the Demon Deacons to the lowest point total allowed in an ACC game under Brownell.
- The 37 points ties Georgia Tech from a Feb. 21, 2012, 56-37, Tiger victory.

- The 40th win came on Nov. 20 in the Cayman Islands Classic semifinals with a 64-49 win over Georgia.
- The only losses on the record are losses to Virginia (49-47, Feb. 2, 2011) and Miami (45-43, Feb. 17, 2013).

CLEMSON WHEN ALLOWING 40 OR LESS POINTS

- Taking it one step further, Clemson has allowed 40 points or less on nine occasions during Brownell's tenure as head coach.
- The Tigers have accomplished this feat twice during ACC play, while the other seven contests have been out-of-conference games.
- Clemson notched its first of the 2019-20 season with a 68-39 beating of Jacksonville on Dec. 20.
- Clemson allowed just 11 second half points against the Dolphins - the least amount allowed under Brownell at Clemson in a second half.

COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

- Putting on a show in the "Entertainment Capital of the World," the Clemson University men's basketball team stepped up under pressure and pulled off a gritty victory in the 2019 MGM Resorts Main Event.
- Clemson defeated TCU 62-60 at T-Mobile Arena in their opening contest of the tournament on Sunday.
- After putting together a 15-0 run to close out the second half, Clemson prevailed in overtime.
- The Tigers knocked down 10 3-pointers, including several pivotal treys, in their first action away from Littlejohn Coliseum.
- Marking the largest comeback for the Tigers since 2011.
- Tevin Mack led the charge for the Tigers with a season-high 22 points and nine rebounds.
- Mack went 5-of-10 from deep, with three of his 3-point shots coming in the first half.
- Aamir Simms sparked the comeback in the second half. Simms manufactured a double-double with 13 points and 12 boards, and all 13 of his points were tallied after halftime.
- Down 52-37 with 7:39 remaining, the Tigers remained poised, however, and outscored the Horned Frogs 15-0 over the course of the final 7:39 of the second half. A steal by Curran Scott helped facilitate a game-tying basket by Mack in the final minute, thus forcing overtime.
- In the bonus period, the Tigers came back from a four-point deficit, with a 3-pointer by Al-Amir Dawes giving Clemson a lead that it did not relinquish. Dawes' shot was

netted with 1:33 remaining, and it put the Tigers ahead 61-60. The Horned Frogs missed a couple of shots near the basket on their final possession, and Mack then iced the game with a free throw.

HIGH SCORING TIGERS

- Clemson scored 80+ points in three-straight games earlier this season (Nov. 10-21, 2019).
- The Tigers scored 87 points in consecutive games against Detroit Mercy and Alabama A&M en route to blowouts. They also scored 81 against Colgate, the Patriot League preseason favorites.
- It marked just the third time that Clemson has scored 80+ points in three-straight games under head coach Brad Brownell.
- The Tigers also accomplished this from Dec. 4-10, 2016 and Nov. 10-16, 2017.

THREE MAJOR SCORERS

- In Clemson's win over Detroit Mercy on Nov. 17, the Tigers boasted three scorers with at least 18 points.
- Hunter Tyson (20), Aamir Simms (19) and Tevin Mack (18) all helped lead the Tigers to a season-high 87 points and a decisive 22-point victory.
- As a collective group, they finished 24-for-36 from the floor (66.7 percent).
- It also marked the first time in nearly 12 seasons that the Tigers have accomplished that feat.
- You'd have to go back to March 8, 2009 when the Tigers' Demontez Stitt (21), K.C. Rivers (21) and Trevor Booker (18) paced Clemson in a 96-88 loss to Wake Forest.

TIGERS SWIPE 13 STEALS

- Clemson came away with 13 steals in its 81-68 win over Colgate on Nov. 10.
- The 13 steals were the most in a game for Clemson since swiping 15 in an 84-67 win over Lipscomb last season (Dec. 30, 2018).
- The year prior in 2017-18, the Tigers stole 15 passes in a 74-69 overtime win over Louisville (Jan. 6, 2018).
- Besides those two instances, it is the third-most steals in a game for Clemson under head coach Brad Brownell since they notched 16 (the most under coach Brownell) against The Citadel on Jan. 1, 2013.
- Tevin Mack came up with five steals against Colgate (Nov. 10) - his career-best to date.
- Mack is the first Tiger to garner five steals in a game since Marcquise Reed stole five in a 67-55 win over Syracuse last season (March 9, 2019).
- Reed achieved five steals on three separate occasions last season.
- Mack is just the second Clemson player since the 2015-16 season to garner at least five steals in a game.
- Avry Holmes stole six against Georgia Tech that season (Feb. 13, 2016).

THREES FOR DAYS

- Clemson knocked down an impressive barrage of 3-pointers in a 79-45 victory over Presbyterian (Nov. 7).
- The Tigers made 14 threes for just the sixth time in program history.
- Clemson has made 14 threes or more on four occasions during the Brownell Era.
- The Tigers made 14 last season in a home victory over Pittsburgh (Jan. 29, 2019).
- The year prior, Clemson made 15 in a home win against North Carolina (Jan. 30, 2018).
- In 2015, the Tigers knocked down 14 on the road at Minnesota in a loss.

FRESHMEN EMPHASIS

- Head coach Brad Brownell has started an all-freshmen backcourt this season with Al-Amir Dawes and Chase Hunter.
- This marks the first time that Brownell has started a freshman since 2014-15 when Donte Grantham started his first career game as a Tiger.
- The year prior to Grantham, Brownell started Jaron Blossomgame as a rookie in 2013-14.
- Other recent instances of one freshman starting their rookie year: Demontez Stitt (2007-08), Trevor Booker (2006-07), K.C. Rivers (2005-06).
- The last time that Clemson had two freshmen primarily in the starting lineup was 2004-05 when guard Cliff Hammonds and forward Cheyenne Moore shared that privilege.
- The 1995-96 season was unique in Clemson history in that, then-head coach Rick Barnes started four freshmen and one sophomore. Among the freshmen starting that season, current director of player development and second all-time leading scorer Terrell McIntyre.
- You'd have to go all the way back to the 1943-44 season for the last time the Tigers primarily started freshmen in the backcourt.
- Eddis Freeman and Leonard Riddle started most of that season in the backcourt and combined for 18.4 points per game.
- Dawes and Hunter combined for 18 points in their debut as Tigers.

FIRST FRESHMEN TIGERS SINCE...

- As noted above, the last time freshmen primarily started in the backcourt was the 1943-44 season.
- However, Clemson has started freshmen in the backcourt since then, but just not on a regular basis.
- The last time the Tigers started both freshmen in the backcourt was Feb. 27, 1991. A 79-62 loss at Duke.
- Jimmy Mason and Andrew Bovain started for the Tigers at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

BROWNELL'S 20-WIN SEASONS

- Head coach Brad Brownell clinched his fourth 20-win campaign at Clemson with a 75-69 victory over Wright State in the first round of the NIT on March 19, 2019.
- It marks Brownell's second consecutive 20-win season at Clemson.
- Brownell won 25 games in 2017-18 en route to leading the Tigers to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament.
- Brownell was a Naismith National Coach of the Year semifinalist in 2017-18 and won Sports Illustrated College Coach of the Year.
- The 25 wins tied the Clemson record for wins in a season and the 11 ACC victories was the most by a Clemson coach in history.
- Brownell also accomplished 20 wins in 2013-14 and in his first season as a Tiger in 2010-11.
- The Tigers reached the semifinals of the NIT in 2014, while making an appearance in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2011.
- Brownell came to Clemson with six 20-win campaigns under his belt, including one at UNC Wilmington and one for each year he spent at Wright State.
- Of those six seasons, Brownell's teams made it to the

NCAA Tournament on three occasions.

*LIT*TLEJOHN COLISEUM

- The Tigers are 40-12 (.769) dating back to the beginning of the 2017-18 season on their home floor.
- Since the inception of the newly renovated Littlejohn Coliseum prior to the 2016-17 season, the Tigers are 49-18 overall (.731 percent).

ALL- ACC THIRD TEAM RECOGNITION

- Aamir Simms earned the recognition from media and ACC coaches for his performance on the floor last season and earned third-team honors.
- It marks the first time that Simms has earned postseason accolades from the ACC.

ALL-ACC NOMINEE

- Aamir Simms put together an All-ACC type of season last year and garnered recognition from around the league.

- Simms followed up that performance and weekly accolade with a 25-point, nine-rebound and five-assist game against No. 3/3 Duke in a 79-72 victory.
- It marked the first time in Simms' career that he has posted back-to-back 20 point games and the 25-point outing proved to be a career-best for the junior.

AAMIR SIMMS LAST SEASON

- Aamir Simms has made a tremendous impact on the floor last season for the Tigers.
- Simms posted one of the best performances of his career against North Carolina (Jan. 11).
- He posted a “Quintuple Leadership” - leading the Tigers with 20 points, eight rebounds, six assists, four blocks and three assists.
- Simms notched his fourth career 20-point game against Miami (Dec. 31) with 21 points, while also tallying eight rebounds.
- Simms scored 18 points in a 29-point thrashing of Jacksonville on Dec. 20.
- He finished 7-for-8 from the floor, including a perfect 3-for-3 from downtown and 1-for-1 from the foul line.
- Simms has made a Clemson season-best seven-straight 3-pointers from Dec. 8 at Florida State through the Tigers’ contest against Jacksonville on Dec. 20.
- Simms posted his third career 20-point game against South Carolina (Dec. 15) on 5-for-7 shooting and a perfect 3-for-3 from behind the arc.
- Simms also finished 8-for-11 (career-highs in makes and attempts from the charity stripe).
- Simms posted a season-high with 19 points in a 22-point win against Detroit Mercy (Nov. 17).
- In the Tigers’ first game of the MGM Resorts Main Event against TCU, Simms posted 13 points, 12 rebounds and seven assists to notch his second career double-double and nearly manage his first career triple double.
- Simms followed up his performance against TCU, tying his career-best with 23 points against Colorado.
- Simms also notched a career-high seven made free throws, while finishing 7-for-14 in the contest.
- One of Clemson’s most versatile players captured his first career double-double in the season opener against Virginia Tech.
- Simms posted 12 points and 15 rebounds in a stellar performance to open the season.
- The 15 rebounds for Simms was a new career-best, outdoing his 10-rebound game last season at Duke (Jan. 5, 2019).
- Simms posted yet another double-digit scoring game with 12 points against Colgate (Nov. 10). He narrowly missed a double-double with eight rebounds, however, of the eight boards, four were on the offensive glass - tying a career high.
- Simms is now averaging 13.0 points and 7.1 rebounds per game.
- The last Tiger to average double-digits on the boards was Sharone Wright (1993-94 - 10.6 rebounds per game).
- Wright was a 1994 NBA First Round Draft Pick. The highest in Clemson history at sixth overall - selected by the Philadelphia 76ers.
- Wright is also the last player for Clemson to accomplish a triple double (12 points, 14 rebounds and 10 blocks in an 82-72 win against Maryland on Jan. 26, 1993).

ACCOLADES

- Aamir Simms earned ACC Player of the Week honors following his performance at North Carolina (Jan. 11) and was named on Monday, Jan. 13.
- It’s the Tigers’ first ACC Player of the Week honor since Gabe DeVoe during the 2017-18 season. Marcquise Reed also won the award that season.
