THE MATCH

- No. 1 Pitt's historic season continues with the biggest game in program history Sunday, Nov. 22 in the ACC Championship Final.
- The Panthers face No. 2 Clemson in a winner take all final at WakeMed Soccer Park in Cary, N.C.
- The game is slated to kick-off at 12 PM and will be broadcast on ESPNU.

WHAT'S AT STAKE?

- A victory in the ACC Championship Final would be the first ACC tournament championship captured in program history. Volleyball is the last Pitt team to be named ACC Champion (2019), while Gymnastics was the last team to win their respective conference tournament in 2016.
- Head Coach **Jay Vidovich**, who has won one national championship in his career, (Wake Forest - 2007) is seeking his first ACC Tournament trophy.

A MILESTONE SEASON

- This year has been a milestone season for Pitt, setting new program highs and making school history.
- The Panthers earned a ranking of number one in the country on Oct. 20 for the first time in program history. Men's soccer joins football and men's basketball as the only Pitt athletics teams to earn the No. 1 spot in their respective polls.
- Pitt's 7-0 overall start is the best start to a season in program history. No other team has started the season undefeated through its first seven games of the season.
- The 4-0 record in the ACC is now tied for most ACC wins in a season. Pitt went 4-3-1 in league play last year.
- Six of the seven victories have been on the road or at neutral site fields. Pitt won its first four road games of the season for the first time since 2000.

EARLY OFFENSE POWERS PITT TO ACC FINAL

- Three first half goals and three key first half saves set the tempo for the No. 1 ranked Panthers Wednesday night in the ACC Championship Semifinal, as Pitt defeated Notre Dame 3-1.
- Sophomore **Veljko Petkovic** scored two goals, including one from a free kick 25-yards out, to lead the Panther offense. The multi-goal game was the second of Petkovic's career.
- Sophomore **Valentin Noel** scored his seventh goal of the season and kept his goal streak alive at five games.
- Sophomore **Raphaël Crivello** and graduate student **Jasper Löeffelsend** each registered an assist, while graduate student goalkeeper **Nico Campuzano** tied a career-high six saves.

THE FIRST NOEL

- One of the top goal scorers in the country, sophomore **Valentin Noel** has led the Panther offense in 2020 at a record breaking pace.
- The Niort, France, native goes into the ACC Championship Final second in the country in total goals (7), second in total points (16), second in shots on goal per game (2.83) and first in goals per game (1.17).
- On Nov. 15 vs. Duke, Noel set a school record for consecutive games played with a goal at four. The streak went to five games after his first half score against Notre Dame in the ACC Championship Semifinal on Nov. 18.

ACTION JACK-KAY-SON

- Freshman **Bertin Jacquesson** has made an immediate impact for the Panthers since game one, totaling nine points including two goals and five assists.
- The Frenchman totaled three points in each of his first three games, with highlighted moments including a goal at

both Notre Dame and Syracuse and three assists at home vs. Virginia Tech.

- Jacquesson ranks third in the country in assists per game (0.83), second in game-winning goals (2) and third in total assists (5).

#1 SCORING OFFENSE

- The Panthers enter the ACC Championship Final with the number one scoring offense in the country, averaging 3.14 goals per game.
- Pitt has scored three or more goals in six of its seven games and has scored four goals in two.
- The Panthers are also the number one ranked team in points per game with a 9.86 mark, 2.69 points higher than second-place Kentucky and 4.46 points higher than fourth-place Clemson.
- Pitt enters the game third in the nation in shot accuracy at .530, a number that is also best in the ACC.
- In just seven games, Pitt has totaled 25 assists as a team. In 2019, the Panthers registered 29 assists in 20 games played.

MAKING THE STOPS

- Graduate student goalkeeper **Nico Campuzano** came up big Wednesday night against Notre Dame, tying a career-high six saves and seeing a career-high 18 shots.
- Campuzano (Comp-ew-thawn-oh) has not allowed the opposition to score more than two goals a game all season.
- The Cantabria, Spain, native has recorded four or more saves four times this season and sits sixth in the country with 24 total saves.

DEXTER SECOND ALL-TIME IN ASSISTS

- Senior **Alexander Dexter** moved into second place all-time in school history in assists Sunday, Nov. 15, with his 15th career assist against Duke.
- The Bronx, N.Y., native is tied for third on the team with three assists this season,

and sits 11 back from Eric Prex's record of 26 career assists (1991-1994).

THE SERIES

- The Tigers lead the all-time series 4-1, with the latest contest a 1-0 Clemson victory in the ACC Championship Semifinals November 13, 2019.
- Pitt's only victory over Clemson came at home Oct. 5, 2018 in 2-1, double overtime fashion.
- Head coach **Jay Vidovich's** career record against the Tigers is 14-9-6.

SCOUTING THE TIGERS

- Clemson enters the contest 7-2-1 overall and finished ACC regular season competition 3-2-1. It's two losses came against North Carolina and Wake Forest, with its tie also happening against UNC.
- The Tigers enter the game ranked top-five in multiple offensive categories, including assists per game (4th - 1.60), points per game (4th - 5.40), shots per game (3rd - 14.10) and total goals (3rd - 19).
- Senior forward Kirmani Smith leads the country in total goals with eight and became the second player in ACC Championship history to tally a hat trick. He also heads into the final tied for first in the ACC Championship record books for goals in a tournament with four.
- Smith has eight goals, three assists, 28 shots, 16 shots on goal and a .571 shot on goal percentage. His .80 goals per game is fifth in the nation.
- Junior forward Grayson Barber leads the team in assists with six, a mark that is tied for first in the country with Pitt defender **Jasper Loeffelsend**.
- Barber has two goals, six assists, 27 shots, 11 shots on goal and a .407 shot percentage.

KEY RETURNERS

- Senior **Alexander Dexter** returns after leading the Panthers in assists with six last season. Dexter tallied three goals and 15 shots on goal and finished second on the team in game-winning goals with two.
- Sophomore **Veljko Petkovic** looks to build on an impressive freshman campaign, where he finished second on the squad in goals (6) and assists (5) while recording 16 shots on goal. The Nis, Serbia, native earned All-ACC Third Team and All-ACC Freshman team recognition.
- Also among the returning players is senior **Sito Sena**, junior **Jackson Walti**, and sophomores **Valentin Noel** and **Arturo Ordoñez**.
- Despite playing only 10 games last year, Sena was an impact on the pitch by scoring three goals and adding three assists, earning Third Team All-ACC honors.
- Walti, a 2019 captain and one of three players to earn All-ACC Academic Team recognition, returns to help lead the midfield. Walti scored one goal on nine shots a year ago.
- Noel and Ordoñez each were tabbed to the All-ACC Freshman squad, as Noel finished with three goals and three assists while Ordoñez, a core piece to the defense, tallied one assist and finished third on the team in minutes played (1,681).

THIS YEAR'S NEWCOMERS

- The Panthers bring in 15 newcomers, including 12 for the fall season.
- Redshirt freshman **Louis Spicer**, freshmen **Lucas Matuszewski** along with **Dominic Reiter** joined the squad during the spring, but were unable to compete due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Matuszewski and Reiter both hail from Pennsylvania, with Matuszewski from

- York (Dallastown) and Reiter from Sewickley (Quaker Valley). Reiter was named Men's Soccer Gatorade Player of the Year for the state of Pennsylvania back in June.
- Spicer, a native of Cambridge, England, is a transfer from Maryland.
- Of the 12 newcomers, two are graduate students in **Nico Campuzano** (Cantabria, Spain) and **Jasper Löeffelsend** (Cologne, Germany), while **Raphaël Crivello** (Bordeaux, France) and **Anas Amrani** (Rabat, Morocco) are both sophomores.
- The remaining freshmen include **Vinicius Belon** (Curitiba, Brazil), **Brandon Clagette** (Atlanta, Ga.), **Bertin Jacquesson** (Lorrez-Le-Bocage, France), **Luis Lara** (Mexico City, Mexico), **Filip Mirkovic** (Belgrade, Serbia), **Luke Peperak** (Pittsburgh, Pa.), **Soshun Shigaki** (Tokyo, Japan) and **Nathan Stricker** (Sinking Spring, Pa.).

PITT RANKED NO. 1 FOR FIRST TIME

- The Panthers earned the top spot in the most recent United Soccer Coaches Poll on Oct. 20, the first number one ranking



in program history.

- The No. 1 spot is the third time in Pitt Athletics history a team has been number one in the land, joining football and men's basketball.
- It is the first time a Pitt program has been number one since men's basketball owned the number one spot in the AP and USA Today poll on February 23, 2009.
- Pitt retained the number one ranking on Nov. 17, marking four consecutive weeks with the number one ranking.

PREVIOUS POLL PLACEMENTS

- Since the inaugural United Coaches Poll in 1996, Pitt has been ranked 20 times.
- The Panthers have been ranked in the top-10 nine times and six times in the top-5.

GAME RECAPS

PITT HOLDS OFF DUKE IN ACC QUARTERS

- Pitt scored its lowest amount of goals on the season in a physical, defensive battle against Duke Sunday, Nov. 15, but came away with the 2-1 victory to advance to the ACC Championship Semifinals.
- Junior **Jackson Walti** scored the games' first goal in the 34th minute, the third of his career and first score since the Panthers defeated Duke at home on Oct. 25, 2019.
- Sophomore **Valentin Noel** broke the 1-1 tie in the 62nd minute, his sixth of the season. Noel's goal proved to be the deciding factor for the Panthers, as Pitt held off Duke's late minute attack.
- Noel, senior **Alexander Dexter** and freshman **Filip Mirkovic** all tallied assists.

PITT REMAINS UNDEFEATED

- The Panthers kept their undefeated season in check with a 4-1 road victory at Louisville on Friday, Oct. 23.
- Pitt saw four different goal scorers in a game that included an hour and 15 minute weather delay.
- Senior **Bryce Washington** scored the first goal in the ninth minute, his first of the year. Freshman **Filip Mirkovic** netted his first career goal in the 42nd minute. Sophomore **Veljko Petkovic** assisted on both of Washington's and Mirkovic's goals.
- Sophomore **Valentin Noel** recorded his fifth goal of the year in the 64th minute, putting Pitt back up by two (3-1). Freshman and Greensburg, Pa., native **Luke Mort** sealed the deal with his first career goal in the 70th minute.

PANTHERS OUTLAST VIRGINIA IN OT

- Sophomore **Arturo Ordoñez** headed in the game-winning goal in the 93rd minute against No. 5 Virginia, giving Pitt the 3-2 victory and its second top-five victory of the season.
- Sophomore **Valentin Noel** scored twice, both in the first half against the Cavaliers. Ordoñez, along with classmate **Raphaël Crivello** and graduate student **Jasper Löeffelsend**, each tallied an assist.
- The victory was the third straight at Klockner Stadium, dating back to 2018. It was also the third-straight victory over a ranked Cavaliers team.

PANTHERS UPEND HOKIES, 4-2

- Pitt defeated Virginia Tech, 4-2, in its home opener on Saturday, Oct. 10 to improve to 3-0 overall and 2-0 in the ACC.
- Sophomore **Valentin Noel** scored twice,

including a goal in the 87th minute to seal the deal for the second-ranked Panthers.

- Both graduate student **Jasper Löeffelsend** and freshman **Bertin Jacquesson** tallied three assists, which individually tied for second in a single game in program history.
- Graduate student goalkeeper **Nico Campuzano** recorded a career-high six saves. Campuzano has 11 on the season, good for sixth in country and second in the ACC.

JACQUESSON PLAYS HERO AT CUSE

- Freshman **Bertin Jacquesson** lifted the Panthers over Syracuse, 3-2, in double OT Tuesday, Oct. 6 with a golden goal in the 103rd minute. The score was the Frenchman's first game-winner of his career.
- Sophomore **Veljko Petkovic** recorded two goals, his first multi-score game of his career, while Jacquesson, sophomore **Arturo Ordoñez** and senior **Alexander Dexter** each tallied an assist.

PANTHERS OPEN SEASON WITH TOP-FIVE WIN

- Pitt opened the regular season with a top-five, 3-1 victory at No. 5 Notre Dame on Sept. 26.
- The fourth-ranked Panthers held the Irish to five shots and used forwards Alexander Dexter and Bertin Jacquesson to pace the offense, as each scored a goal and tallied an assist.
- The victory was the second in as many years over a top-five team on the road. Pitt upset No. 1 Virginia in Charlottesville, Va., 2-0, on Oct. 18, 2019.
- The victory over Notre Dame was the first regular season opening win for Pitt since 2014.

RECAPPING EXHIBITIONS

- Pitt played in two exhibitions prior to to Notre Dame, first facing Wake Forest on



the road Saturday, Sept. 13 followed by a home contest against Louisville this past Saturday.

- The Panthers dropped a 3-2 decision to the Demon Deacons, before bouncing back with a 5-0 shutout of the Cardinals.
- Senior **Alexander Dexter** netted three goals and added an assist between the two exhibitions, scoring twice against the Cardinals.
- Sophomore **Veljko Petkovic** tallied a goal and two assists in total, including a one goal and one assist performance against the Cardinals.

UP NEXT

- The Panthers conclude the fall season, but will return for their second leg starting spring of 2021.
- The NCAA announced teams may start spring action February 3. Pitt has yet to announce its spring schedule.

Jay Vidovich, one of America's most respected and accomplished soccer coaches, was named the third Pitt men's soccer head coach at the University of Pittsburgh in December of 2015.

In his fourth year at the helm of Pitt men's soccer, Vidovich led the Panthers to one of its most successful seasons in program history. Finishing the 2019 campaign 10-8-2, Vidovich saw Pitt upset No. 1 Virginia on the road on Oct. 18, host an ACC Tournament game against NC State for the first time in school history on Nov. 10, earn a trip to the ACC Semifinals for the first time in program history and stamp its name into the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship for the first time since 1965.

Vidovich and the Panthers earned a monumental victory on Nov. 21, as they defeated Lehigh at Ambrose Urbanic Field, 2-0, winning the first NCAA Men's Soccer Championship game in school history. The season ended Nov. 24 against No. 2 Georgetown in the second round of the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship, but only after a record setting season that saw six All-ACC honorees, two ACC All-Tournament Team winners and one United Soccer Coaches All-South Region Team recipient.

During his third year at Pitt in the 2018 season, Vidovich led the Panthers to wins over two ranked opponents in No. 12 NC State and No. 7 Virginia in the ACC Men's Soccer Tournament. The victory over the Cavaliers marked the Panthers' first ACC Tournament win in program history. Pitt collected its first conference win on the season against the Wolfpack and picked up another ACC victory over Clemson on Oct. 5.

Vidovich played a crucial role in the development of Javi Perez, who was drafted by LAFC in the third round of 2019 MLS Superdraft. With the selection, Perez became only the second player in program history to be drafted to an MLS club team. Three Panthers were also named to All-ACC teams under Vidovich's guidance as Edward Kizza was given First Team honors, Javi Perez earned Second Team recognition and Chandler Vaughn was named to the All-Freshman Team. Both Kizza and Perez earned All-Region Honors as well, with Kizza voted to the Second Team and Perez named to the Third Team.

Following his first year at the helm, Vidovich led the Panthers to wins over No. 7 Notre Dame, No. 13 Columbia and No. 21 Syracuse in the 2017 season. The win against Syracuse would be the Panthers' first win over a ranked opponent since the 2008 season. The victory over the Orange was also the first conference win for Pitt since moving into the ACC at the start of the 2013 season, and they would add their second conference win against the Fighting Irish on Oct. 13. The Panthers would also capture victories against rivals Penn State and West Virginia throughout the season.

Vidovich also guided four players to All-ACC recognition, with Javi Perez earning Second Team honors, Pol Planellas receiving Third Team recognition and both Alexander Dexter and Edward Kizza being named to the All-Freshman Team. The postseason accolades were the team's first in program history since joining the ACC.

Planellas would go on to become the first Pitt men's soccer player in program history to be drafted by an MLS Club team after being selected by the Los Angeles Football Club in the second round of the 2018 MLS SuperDraft, becoming the 36th professional player under Vidovich's tutelage.

Prior to making the move to Pittsburgh, Vidovich oversaw the men's soccer program at Wake Forest for 21 seasons (1994-2014), building the Demon Deacons into a national power and winning the 2007 NCAA championship. He spent 2015 in professional soccer, coaching the Portland Timbers 2 (T2) in the United Soccer League (USL).

During his Wake Forest tenure, Vidovich compiled a 272-121-50 record and led the Demon Deacons to the NCAA Tournament in 13 of his final 14 seasons. Wake Forest won five Atlantic Coast Conference titles under his watch, compiling a 76-52-22 mark in one of the nation's most challenging leagues.

In 2007, Wake Forest went 22-2-2—the winningest season in school history—and defeated Ohio State, 2-1, in the national final to claim the program's first NCAA title. The Demon Deacons made four consecutive appearances in the College Cup from 2006-09.

Vidovich, a two-time National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) National Coach of the Year (2007 and 2008) and five-time ACC Coach of the Year (2002, 2004, 2006, 2008 and 2009), ranks among the most decorated coaches in collegiate soccer.

Vidovich was the 2008 recipient of the prestigious Walt Chyzowych Award for lifetime contributions to the sport of soccer. Vidovich was an assistant under the legendary Chyzowych for eight seasons at Wake Forest from 1986-93.

Widely regarded as one of the game's top evaluators and developers of talent, Vidovich has produced 21 All-Americans and five ACC Player of the Year honorees (three offensive and two defensive). He also coached Marcus Tracy, the first player in Wake history to win the Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy, which honors the top individual player in college soccer.

Thirty-five players under Vidovich went on to play in the professional ranks from 2002-14. His Wake Forest teams also achieved academically, evidenced by two ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year honorees, two Academic All-Americans, one adidas National Scholar-Athlete of the Year and one Senior CLASS Award recipient.

Born in Detroit, Mich., Vidovich was an all-state player for New Canaan High School in Connecticut. He played for Indiana University in 1978 before transferring to Ohio Wesleyan, where he was a three-year starter. As a senior, Vidovich was team captain and helped lead OWU to the semifinals of the NCAA Tournament.

A 1982 graduate of Ohio Wesleyan with a bachelor's degree in physical education, he went on to earn a master's degree in sports sciences from the University of Denver in 1983.

It was at Denver where Vidovich's coaching career was launched as an assistant in 1982. He served in additional assistant posts at Regis College (1983) and his alma mater Ohio Wesleyan (1984-85) before joining Wake Forest's staff in 1986.


