STORYLINES

- The Maryland men's basketball team hits the road for its first away game of the season as it faces Clemson in the annual ACC/Big Ten Challenge. It will mark the first meeting between the schools since Maryland left the ACC following the 2013-14 season. The Terps hold a formidable 90-50 advantage in the series, winning 90-of-140 contests dating back to the inaugural meeting in 1938.
- Maryland advanced to 4-0 on the season with a decisive 90-57 victory over Saint Peter's last Friday, led by **Hakim Hart's** breakout 32-point effort. It was one of the more unlikely shooting performances in Maryland history, as Hart had totaled just 45 career points in 21 games entering the contest. He became the first Terp with at least 30 points and four steals in a game since John Gilchrist had 30 points and four steals against NC State in the 2004 ACC Tournament.
- Maryland is 11-10 all-time in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge, having competed for both conferences. The Terps' 11 victories are tied for third-most in the series, trailing only Duke and Virginia. Maryland was victorious in last season's challenge, handily defeating Notre Dame, 72-51.
- Maryland has opened the season as one of the best shooting teams in the country, ranking ninth nationally and first in the Big Ten shooting at a 56.0% clip. Junior **Eric Ayala** has led the way, ranking fifth in the Big Ten in field goal percentage (.618).
- The Terps have featured a diverse array of scoring options, with six players averaging better than 9.0 points-per-game and at least four players reaching double-figures in all four games. Overall, seven players have scored double-figures at least once this season (**Eric Ayala, Aaron Wiggins, Donta Scott, Darryl Morsell, Jairus Hamilton, Galin Smith and Hakim Hart**).
- Maryland legend Len Bias was announced as a member of the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Class of 2021 on Nov. 29. The late Bias was a two-time All-American and two-time ACC Player of the Year, before being selected with the No. 2 overall pick by the Boston Celtics.
- Maryland head coach **Mark Turgeon** is in his 10th season at the helm for the Terrapins, having led the program to more than 20 wins in five of the last six seasons. Turgeon's .652 winning percentage in Big Ten Conference play ranks sixth all-time among coaches with at least 50 wins, trailing only Bob Ryan, Bob Knight, Tom Izzo and Thad Matta.

QUICK HITTERS

- Maryland has won its first four games by an average margin of 24.8 points.
- Maryland has yet to trail at halftime this season.
- Junior guard **Eric Ayala** has reached double-figures in every game.
- Maryland has shot better than 47-percent from the field in all four games to open the season.
- Maryland has six players currently averaging more than 9.0 points/g, including four players averaging double-figures.

HAKIM HART'S MAGICAL NIGHT

- Sophomore **Hakim Hart** exploded for a career-high 32 points on 11-of-13 shooting against Saint Peter's on Dec. 4. Check out some of the facts & figures from the unlikely night:

- The first Maryland player to score 30 points on 80-percent shooting since March 2004 when John Gilchrist had 32 points on 11-13 FG.
- The first Maryland player with 30+ points and four steals in a game since John Gilchrist had 30 points and four steals vs. NC State in the 2004 ACC Tournament.
- The most points for a Terp at home since Diamond Stone (39) vs. Penn State in 2015.
- The most points for at Terp since Melo Trimble (32) at Northwestern in 2017.
- Prior to the game, Hart had just 45 career points to his name in 21 appearances.
- He became only the seventh Terp to post a 30-point game with less than 600 career points, joining Barry Yates (342), Rudy Archer (393), Diamond Stone (436), Matt Roe (497), Seth Allen (548) and Steve Francis (579).

WHO TO KNOW: THE RETURNERS

- Maryland returns three starters from a season ago (**Darryl Morsell**, **Eric Ayala**, **Donta Scott**), in addition to the Big Ten Sixth Man of the Year **Aaron Wiggins**.
- Despite coming off the bench most of the season last year, **Aaron Wiggins** actually averaged the most minutes-per-game of any returner with 28.6. Wiggins, who averaged 10.4 points and 4.9 rebounds as a sophomore, was selected to the Erving Award Preseason Watch List for the nation's top small forward.
- Baltimore native **Darryl Morsell** enters his senior season as the Terps' undisputed leader. Long known as the program's lockdown defender, the 2020 Honorable Mention All-Big Ten honoree looks to take another step forward for Maryland. Morsell has appeared in 96 career games (81 starts), averaging 8.1 points, 4.2 rebounds and 1.9 assists.
- Junior **Eric Ayala** has appeared in all 65 games of his Maryland career, making 53 total starts. The Wilmington, Del., native is no stranger to running the point position to the Terps, but steps into the role of the true leader of the back court with the departure of Anthony Cowan Jr. Ayala has averaged 8.6 points and 2.3 assists across his two seasons.
- Sophomore **Donta Scott** looks to build off an impressive freshman season in which he started 21 games and averaged 5.9 points and 3.8 rebounds in 21.7 minutes of action. Scott was particularly strong down the stretch, scoring at least nine points in six of the final eight games.

VETERAN TRANSFERS ADD FRONT COURT DEPTH

- Head coach Mark Turgeon added a pair of transfer big men in the offseason in **Jairus Hamilton** (Boston College) and **Galín Smith** (Alabama). Smith was a graduate transfer and Hamilton received a waiver to play immediately in the fall.
- **Jairus Hamilton** was familiar with the Terrapin program prior to his transfer, having seriously considered Maryland as a destination before settling on Boston College. The 6-8 forward had a breakout season as a sophomore, starting 20 games and averaging 9.5 points and 4.3 rebounds.
- A native of Clinton, Miss., **Galín Smith** appeared in 94 career games for Alabama and brings a veteran presence down low for the Terrapins. Smith averaged 3.2 points and 2.3 rebounds across his three seasons in Tuscaloosa.

A LOOK AT THE FRESHMEN

- **Aquan Smart** is a 6-3 point guard from Evanston, Ill., who was a unanimous Illinois Basketball Coaches Association First Team 4A All-State selection at Niles North HS. Smart averaged more than 20 points a senior as Niles North won the conference and regional titles.
- **Marcus Dockery** is a 6-2 guard from Washington, D.C., who attended Brewster Academy as a senior and won the 2020 National Prep Championship. A three-star recruit, Dockery played his junior season at Bishop O'Connell HS, the alma mater of former Maryland star Melo Trimble.
- **Arnaud Revaz** is a 6-10 forward from Switzerland who most recently attended Bourg-en-Brasse Academie in France. Revaz had a unique journey to basketball, having first played the game at 15 years old when he was 6-7 and spotted by a former Swiss professional basketball player.
- **James Graham III** signed in early Nov. 2020 to the class of 2021, but announced in late November he will graduate high school early and join the team this season. A four-star recruit from Milwaukee, Graham will be on full scholarship and will be eligible to play upon arrival (expected after the holidays).

HOME DOMINANCE

- Maryland has been dominant at home during the Mark Turgeon era, winning 84-percent of its games (140-26) since 2011-12. Turgeon's 84-percent winning mark is the best in Maryland coaching history, edging Lefty Driesell's .829 mark.
- The Terps have compiled a 50-7 record since the start of 2017-18 in College Park. It is the most wins at home in the Big Ten Conference during that span.
- Last season, Maryland was 16-1 overall at home and 7-0 in non-conference play. The lone loss was to Michigan State, who had the Terps had beaten two weeks prior in East Lansing.

TERPS IN THE PROS

- Jalen Smith became the most recent former Maryland player to be selected into the NBA, as he was taken 10th overall by the Phoenix Suns in the 2020 NBA Draft. He was the 61st pick in Maryland history and first top-10 pick since Alex Len (5th - Phoenix) in 2013.
- Smith continues an impressive span of draft picks for the Terrapins, which have had six players drafted in the last five seasons. The mark is tied for the most in the Big Ten during that span with Michigan State.
- The Terrapins have four other players currently in the NBA: Bruno Fernando (Atlanta Hawks), Kevin Huerter (Atlanta Hawks), Jake Layman (Minnesota Timberwolves) and Alex Len (Toronto Raptors).

TURGEON BY THE NUMBERS

- **Mark Turgeon** has posted 18 consecutive winning seasons, and has led his teams to a winning season in 19 of his 22 seasons as a head coach.
- Turgeon's teams have been the model of consistency since joining the Big Ten Conference, securing top-5 finishes in five out of six seasons in the league.
- Turgeon has won an average of 12.2 conference games-per-season over six years in the Big Ten, marking the highest average win total among all active coaches in the league. Tom Izzo is second with 12.1, while Greg Gard is third with 11.8.
- Turgeon's .652 win percentage (73-39) in Big Ten Conference play ranks fifth in league history among coaches with at least 50 wins, trailing only Bo Ryan, Bob Knight, Tom Izzo and Thad Matta.
- Turgeon won his 200th game at Maryland against Nebraska (2/11/20), becoming the second-fastest in program history to reach the milestone behind Lefty Driesell. He also secured his fifth 20-win season in the past six years in the same game.
- Turgeon has a 140-26 (.843) home record at Maryland, the highest win percentage for a coach in program history.
- Turgeon led the Terrapins to a 30-11 record through their first 41 Big Ten games, becoming the fastest Big Ten coach to reach 30 conference wins since former Illinois mentor Bruce Weber guided the Illini to 30 victories in his first 35 conference games at the helm during the 2003-04 and 2004-05 campaigns and the first three conference games of the 2005-06 season.

INSIDE THE BIG TEN

- The Big Ten is once again shaping up to be the best conference in the country, with a nation's-best seven teams ranked in the AP Preseason Top-25. In week two of the preseason poll, four Big Ten teams were ranked in the top-8 (Iowa, Illinois, Wisconsin and Michigan State).
- Maryland's Jalen Smith was the only Big Ten player selected in the first round of the 2020 NBA Draft, serving as a reminder that most of the Big Ten's top players decided to return in 2020-21.
- Among the player's returning this season are the reigning Big Ten Player of the Year Luka Garza (Iowa), and All-Big Ten honorees Ayo Dosunmu (Illinois), Trayce Jackson-Davis (Indiana), Joe Wieskamp (Iowa), Geo Baker (Rutgers), Nate Reuvers (Wisconsin), D'Mitrick Trice (Wisconsin), Kofi Cockburn (Illinois), Marcus Carr (Minnesota), Trevion Williams (Purdue) and Ron Harper Jr. (Rutgers).

TERPS TACKLE SOCIAL INJUSTICE

- The Maryland men's basketball team will be wearing phrases on the backs of their shooting shirts this season in an effort to bring awareness to social injustice and help spark change. Each student-athlete selected a particular phrase that resonated with them personally.
- Following the tragic death of George Floyd over the summer, head coach Mark Turgeon and the entire program held zoom calls specifically to discuss social injustices in the world. The entire team read Martin Luther King Jr.'s *Why We Can't Wait* and discussed the book chapter-by-chapter.
- Maryland's student-athletes also took pride in becoming the very first team on campus to become 100-percent registered to vote. The entire team also voted in the 2020 Presidential Election.

- Maryland Sports Radio Network play-by-play announcer Johnny Holliday enters his 42nd season of broadcasting Maryland basketball this season. Holliday has broadcast over 1,500 University of Maryland games during his Hall of Fame career, including 14 bowl games, 10 Sweet 16s, two Final Fours and Maryland's 2002 National Championship.
- Holliday's partner on the call, Chris Knoche, is gearing up for his 22nd season as Maryland's color analyst. Knoche played basketball at American University under HOF coach Gary Williams from 1979-81, and he later coached there from 1990-97 before joining the crew.

CLEMSON, S.C. (AP) — Sophomore Seth Allen scored 20 points and Evan Smotrycz added 19 as Clemson took down Maryland 77-73 in double overtime at Littlejohn Coliseum Sunday.

K.J. McDaniels notched his seventh game this season with double-figure points and rebounds for Clemson.

Allen's final basket gave the Terrapins a 71-70 lead with 1:27 to go. That's when McDaniels drove the lane and found Harrison open in the right corner for his only long-range basket of the game. Smotrycz had 19 points off four 3-pointers for Maryland.

The Tigers seemed to wrap it up on Hall's 3-pointer with 19.2 seconds left in the first overtime for a 63-59 lead. But officials reviewed the shot, found his feet were on the line and changed it to a two-point goal and a 62-59 lead. That's when Smotrycz hit his fourth 3-pointer with 7.6 seconds to go and tied things once more.

McDaniels got the ball to the rim on Clemson's last possession, but it fell away and brought a second extra period.

Maryland appeared in good shape after a 14-5 run early in the second half to move in front 48-44.

The Terps were still up 54-50 on Allen's bucket with 5:02 go, but they did not score after that and missed their final eight shots of the half.

Clemson didn't do much better, but tied the game on Jaron Blossomgame's three-point play with 3:24 left and McDaniels' foul shot a minute later. Clemson got the final chance with 7.3 seconds left, but Adonis Filer's running shot bounced away at the horn.

Maryland seemed to find its stride after that with an 11-1 run — Allen had seven points and Charles Mitchell four — to grab a 27-18 lead with 4:46 left.



MARK TURGEON

458-258 (23RD SEASON) / 208-99 (10TH SEASON AT MARYLAND)

Mark Turgeon is fresh off his ninth season at the helm of the University of Maryland men's basketball team, most recently leading the Terrapins to the 2020 Big Ten Championship. Turgeon has recorded winning seasons in all nine years and four NCAA Tournaments appearances in

the last five applicable seasons, while all 33 student-athletes who have exhausted their eligibility have earned their undergraduate degrees.

In an unfortunate set of circumstances due to the coronavirus pandemic in 2020, Turgeon's Big Ten Championship-winning Terrapins were unable to compete in the postseason as the NCAA season was canceled. Having claimed just the program's seventh regular season title in its history, Maryland was 24-7 and a lock for at least a top-4 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

Turgeon has led three different programs to 13 applicable postseason appearances, which includes the Terps advancing to their first Sweet 16 in 13 years in the 2015-2016 season. Turgeon signed a four-year contract extension through the 2022-23 season on Oct. 27, 2016.

In his first nine seasons at Maryland, Turgeon has compiled a 204-99 (.673) record. He claimed his 200th victory at Maryland in the 2019-20 season, becoming the second-fastest coach in program history to reach the milestone behind Lefty Driesell. Turgeon's .591 win percentage in conference action overall (ACC & B1G) is the best in program history, with Hall of Famers Gary Williams (.553) and Driesell trailing just behind (.550).

Under Turgeon, Maryland has thrived in its six seasons as members of the Big Ten Conference, earning five top-5 finishes and compiling a 72-39 (.658) conference record while claiming the 2020 Big Ten Title. Turgeon's teams boast a 44-10 (.815) home record in conference play. He was named the 2015 Big Ten Coach of the Year.

Turgeon's consistency in Big Ten Conference action is stark, leading all active Big Ten coaches with an average 12.2 conference wins per season in his six-year career in the conference. Additionally, Turgeon's .652 win percentage in Big Ten play ranks fifth among coaches with at least 50 wins in the last 40 years, trailing only Bo Ryan (.717), Bob Knight (.700), Tom Izzo (.696) and Thad Matta (.658).

Over the last six seasons dating back to 2014-15, Maryland has been ranked in 74 of 116 Associated Press Top-25 polls. The Terps have spent 30 of those weeks in the top-10, after previously not reaching the top-10 since 2003.

Since taking over the program in 2011-12, Turgeon's Terrapins have amassed a 136-26 (.840) home record overall. Maryland's 47 wins at home since the start of 2017-18 are the most of any Big Ten Conference team. The Terps recorded the most consecutive wins at home in program history (27) from Dec. 6, 2015 - Feb. 13, 2016.

Turgeon led the Terrapins to a 30-11 record through their first 41 Big Ten games, becoming the fastest Big Ten coach to reach 30 conference wins since former Illinois mentor Bruce Weber guided the Illini to 30 victories in his first 35 conference games.

Turgeon has led his teams to a winning season in 19 of his 22 seasons, including a current streak of 18 consecutive winning seasons. The Terps won 27 or more games in back-to-back seasons for the first time in program history during the 2014-15 and 2015-16 campaigns.

Cut short due to the coronavirus pandemic, Turgeon's 2019-20 team, which was ranked 12th in the final AP poll, will never know what would have transpired in the postseason. Instead, it is remembered for its final game of the season when the Terrapins cut down the nets after defeating Michigan to claim the 2020 Big Ten Championship. The Terps finished 24-7 (14-6) and were a lock for a top-4 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Sophomore Jalen Smith was a unanimous Third Team All-American and a finalist for the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award, while senior Anthony Cowan Jr. earned his third All-Big Ten Conference nod while being named a Wooden Award candidate.

The 2018-19 team flourished despite boasting the fourth-youngest team in the nation and playing the eighth-toughest schedule, advancing to the NCAA Tournament Second Round. The Terps won 13 games in the Big Ten Conference, and featured sophomore Bruno Fernando, who was the only player in the Big Ten to earn All-Big Ten First Team and All-Defense honors. Fernando was also a top-5 finalist for the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award for the nation's top center.

In 2016-17 Turgeon led Maryland to a 24-9 record, with an impressive 11-2 mark away from XFINITY Center and its aforementioned third consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. With a 20-2 record through 22 games in 2016-17, Turgeon topped the 1998-99 squad for the best regular season start in program history. Additionally, Turgeon was instrumental in the development of three-time All-Big Ten guard Melo Trimble, who became one of just four players to post 1,600 points, 400 assists and 150 steals at Maryland. Trimble was also just one of two players (Joe Smith) in school history to record 500 or more points in each of his first two seasons at Maryland.

Under Turgeon's direction the 2015-16 team finished with 27 victories and opened the regular season with a 15-1 record – the best start in program history. Maryland featured five All-Big Ten performers, including guard Melo Trimble (Second Team All-Big Ten) who was also named to the Associated Press Honorable Mention All-America Team. Center Diamond Stone was a Third Team All-Big Ten selection and was named Associated Press Big Ten Newcomer of the Year. Forwards Jake Layman and Robert Carter, Jr., as well as guard Rasheed Sulaimon each earned Honorable Mention All-Big Ten honors.

Maryland, ranked No. 18 in the Associated Press and No. 12 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll, finished 27-9, marking the first time in program history the Terps have put together back-to-back 27-plus win seasons. The Terrapins also led the Big Ten and ranked fifth nationally in attendance in 2015-16, averaging 17,863 fans per game.

Maryland posted a school-record 26 wins during the regular season in 2014-15 and notched 28 total, an eight-game improvement from its 17 victories during the 2013-14 season. The 11-game win total was the second-highest improvement among all Power Five schools. Maryland also advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament. Turgeon posted 25 or more wins in a season for the fourth time in his career.

The Terps finished their inaugural season in the Big Ten with a 9-0 home record, which included victories against then-No. 5 Wisconsin, Michigan State and Indiana. Overall, Maryland concluded with an 18-1 home mark at XFINITY Center. Maryland's 14-1 record in 2014-15 marked its best start in 18 years (1996-97).

In 2013, he captured his 300th career victory with an 85-74 defeat of Tulsa on Dec. 29, before leading the Terps to a thrilling overtime win against No. 5 Virginia in Maryland's final ACC regular season game.

After bringing in a top-15 recruiting class in 2012, Turgeon led the Terrapins to a 25-13 record (most wins in six seasons) and appearances in the ACC Tournament semifinals and the NIT semifinals in 2012-13.

Turgeon directed Maryland to three wins over a ranked team in 2012-13 after Maryland had gone two seasons without one. The Terps were the only team in the nation to beat Duke twice, while also knocking off then-14th ranked NC State at home in January. Maryland's win over Duke at home on Feb. 16 was its first over a No. 1 ranked opponent in five years.

Turgeon, who came to College Park after directing Texas A&M to four consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament, led Maryland to a 17-15 record in 2011-12. At A&M, he posted a 97-40 record in four seasons and was named the Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year in both 2010 and 2011. He is the only coach in Big 12 history with at least 24 victories in each of his four seasons.

In seven years at Wichita State, he built the Shockers into a power in the Missouri Valley Conference, earning the league title and an NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance in 2006.

Turgeon has coached and developed nine future NBA players: Gal Mekel, Donald Sloan, Khris Middleton (Milwaukee Bucks), DeAndre Jordan (Brooklyn Nets), Alex Len (Sacramento Kings), Jake Layman

(Minnesota Timberwolves), Diamond Stone, Kevin Huerter (Atlanta Hawks) and Bruno Fernando (Atlanta Hawks). Len was selected in the first round (fifth overall) by the Suns in the 2013 NBA Draft and Huerter was selected 19th overall in the first round by the Atlanta Hawks in 2018. In addition, multiple former players are playing in the NBA's G-League and overseas.

Turgeon amassed a 128-89 record at Wichita State (2000-07), posting the third-most wins in school history. The Shockers advanced to three straight NITs from 2003 to 2005 in addition to the 2006 NAAs, the first time WSU had four straight postseason appearances in 40 years.

He began his head-coaching career at Jacksonville State, going 17-11 in his final season there (1999-2000) after going 8-18 in his first year.

Turgeon was an assistant at Kansas for five seasons, first under Larry Brown (1987-88) and then under Roy Williams (1988-92). The Jayhawks made the NCAA Tournament in four of those seasons, winning the national championship in 1988 and finishing second in 1991. KU also won Big Eight titles in 1991 and 1992 with Turgeon on staff.

He was the top assistant under Jerry Green at Oregon from 1992-97 and was an assistant coach under Brown with the Philadelphia 76ers in 1997-98 before taking the head coaching position at Jacksonville State.

A point guard at Kansas from 1984-87, Turgeon was the first player in Jayhawks history to play in four straight NCAA Tournaments. KU went 108-33 under Brown in that stretch. Turgeon served as team captain in his junior and senior seasons, leading the Jayhawks to the 1986 NCAA Final Four.

A native of Topeka, Kan., Turgeon led Hayden High School to back-to-back Class 4A state titles in 1982 and 1983, earning all-tournament honors each year. A first team all-state pick as a senior, Hayden went 47-3 in his high-school career.

Additionally, Turgeon was selected as a court coach for the USA Basketball Pan-American Team in preparation for the Pan-Am Games in the summer of 2015. The following year, Turgeon served as an assistant coach for USA Basketball's Under-18 Team, working with head coach Shaka Smart and assistant coach Kevin Ollie, in helping guide the squad to a gold medal. On June 13, 2016, he was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Ad Hoc committee on NCAA men's basketball tournament selection, seeding and bracketing.

Turgeon increased his activity in social justice reform in the summer of 2020 following the death of George Floyd. He and his team had open conversations about the history of America and its current state, and committed themselves to becoming further educated on the topic. As part of that education, Turgeon and the team read and discussed Martin Luther King Jr.'s book *Why We Can't Wait* chapter-by-chapter. Turgeon also pledged his support to the John McLendon Minority Leadership Initiative to jump-start the careers of minorities in collegiate athletics administration.

Turgeon is active in the College Park community and has hosted the Coaches vs. Cancer Season Tip-Off Breakfast in conjunction with the American Cancer Society and the National Association of Basketball Coaches for five years. Over the past four seasons, Turgeon worked with the Infiniti Coaches Charity Challenge to raise money and awareness for the Alzheimer's Association. In addition, Turgeon and his team worked with the Special Olympics of Maryland and hosted a basketball clinic for athletes in the organization along with inviting them to home games the past five seasons. Turgeon also participated in the Special Olympics Relay Across America carrying the Flame for Hope through the College Park campus in 2016.

Turgeon ("TURGE-in") is married to the former Ann Fowler of Chicago, Ill, and they have two sons - William (Will) and Leo - and a daughter, Ella. Will currently plays basketball at nearby Catholic University.

MATT BRADY
ASSISTANT COACH
4TH YEAR AT MARYLAND

Head coach Mark Turgeon announced Matt Brady was elevated to the role of assistant coach in June of 2018 and has spent the last two seasons in the role. He was previously hired by Turgeon as the director of player personnel on July 10, 2017.

Brady, who has over 30 years of experience as a coach at the Division I level, including 12 as a head coach, came to Maryland after serving as an assistant coach at La Salle the previous season. Brady reunited with Maryland assistant coach Bino Ranson, who was an assistant under Brady while at Marist.

In 2019-20, Brady helped lead the Terrapins to the 2020 Big Ten Championship and a 24-7 overall record, before the season was cut short (no postseason) due to the coronavirus pandemic. Brady helped develop All-Big Ten First Teamers Anthony Cowan Jr. and Jalen Smith. Smith was also a unanimous All-American. The Terps finished the season ranked No. 12 in the Associated Press poll.

In Brady's first season as an assistant (2018-19), he helped lead the Terps to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament and a 23-11 overall record despite being the fourth-youngest team in the country according to KenPom.

Prior to La Salle, Brady was the head coach at James Madison for eight seasons, racking up 139 wins, including four seasons with 20 or more victories. In 2013, he led the Dukes to a CAA Championship and an NCAA Tournament bid. He also guided the Dukes to three additional postseason appearances and the 2015 CAA regular season title.

Brady was recognized as State Coach of the Year by the Virginia Sports Information Directors in 2013 following his NCAA Tournament campaign and was also tabbed District 10 Co-Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

Brady inherited a JMU program that finished last in the conference in scoring, field goal and three-point percentage in 2007. The following season, Brady had the Dukes atop the conference in all three statistical categories. While at JMU, Brady coached 10 all-CAA players and four all-district honorees. Brady mentored three of the top 10 scorers in program history as well as three of the top 10 three-point shooters.

Prior to leading the program at James Madison, Brady was the head coach at Marist for four seasons from 2004-08 where compiled a 73-50 record with the Red Foxes and improved their win total during each of his first three seasons with the team. Marist set a program record for wins during its 25-9 season in 2006-07 when Brady was the MAAC and New York City-area coach of the year. Marist had dramatic statistical improvements under his direction, ranking in the top three in the 10-team MAAC in overall field goal percentage, three-point percentage and three-pointers per game during each of his four seasons. While at Marist, Brady mentored MAAC Player of the Year Jared Jordan, who was a two-time NCAA Division I assists champion and the 45th overall choice in the NBA draft by the Los Angeles Clippers.

A 1987 Siena graduate and a native of Haddon Heights, N.J., Brady was a Division I assistant coach for 17 seasons at Rhode Island (1987-89), Wagner (1989-93) and Saint Joseph's (1993-04).

While Brady was at Saint Joseph's, the Hawks appeared in the NCAA Tournament four times, the NIT three times and won four Big 5 championships and three Atlantic 10 titles.

Saint Joseph's was 27-0 during the regular season in 2003-04, earned a No. 1 national ranking and a No. 1 seed for the NCAA Tournament, ultimately reaching the Elite Eight. Brady was involved in recruiting several of the top players in Saint Joseph's history, including 2004 National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson and Delonte West, an honorable mention Associated Press All-America selection. Nelson, who was selected in the first round of the 2004 NBA Draft and has gone on to play 12 seasons in the NBA, continues to be mentored and trained by Brady during his offseason.

As a player at Siena, Brady appeared in 114 career games, including 92 as a starter. He completed his career as the program's all-time assists leader (593), and he was inducted into the school's hall of fame in 1993. For his career he accumulated 1,106 points (9.7 points per game) and was a 45.9 percent shooter from the field.

Brady was a standout at Paul VI High School in Haddon (N.J.) Township and was named to the 1980s South Jersey All-Decade Team. He was enshrined in the Camden County Sports Hall of Fame in 2012. Brady and his wife Mary have three sons, Logan - who is a student at Maryland - and twins Cole and Griffin.

Widely regarded as one of the fastest rising coaches in the country, DeAndre Haynes was officially announced as assistant coach by Maryland head coach Mark Turgeon on June 10, 2019.

"Throughout the hiring process I was very deliberate about finding the right fit for our coaching staff and we hit a home run with DeAndre," Turgeon said. "DeAndre is one of the brightest up and coming coaches in the business and has gained experience working for some of the most well-respected coaches in the country. He was an exceptional point guard during his playing days and he possesses a contagious personality that will fit well with our staff and players. We are excited to welcome DeAndre and his family to College Park."

Over the last three seasons at Maryland and Michigan, Haynes' teams have recorded an 87-22 (.798) overall record, including an NCAA Final Four appearance, a Big Ten Championship and a Big Ten Tournament Championship.

In his first season on the Maryland staff, Haynes helped lead the Terps to the 2020 Big Ten Championship and a 24-7 overall record before the season was cut short (no postseason) due to the coronavirus pandemic. He was instrumental in developing senior Anthony Cowan Jr., who was named First Team All-Big Ten and set personal-bests in scoring and turnovers.

Washington Post: "In job defined by change, Haynes builds bonds that last"

Prior to Maryland, Haynes spent two seasons as an assistant coach with the University of Michigan men's basketball program, where he was worked with the Wolverine backcourt and offensive strategies.

The Wolverines set a program record with 33 wins in 2017-18 en route to winning the Big Ten Tournament and advancing to the Final Four. The following season, U-M recorded its second straight 30 win season to give them 63 wins in two seasons.

Haynes assisted in the development of Zavier Simpson, who was named to the All-Big Ten and All-Big Ten Defensive teams, and All-Big Ten guard Jordan Poole in 2018-19.

Prior to Michigan, Haynes served as an assistant coach at Toledo on head coach Tod Kowalczyk's staff during the 2016-17 season following four years as an assistant at his alma mater - Kent State - on head coach Rob Senderoff's staff (2012-16).

While at Toledo, Haynes helped the Rockets to 17 wins and a postseason appearance in the 2017 College Basketball Invitational (CBI). With Haynes as an assistant, forward Steve Taylor Jr. earned All-MAC second team honors after leading the nation with 9.9 defensive rebounds per game and ranking third nationally with 12.2 rebounds per contest. Additionally, guard Jonathan Williams received All-MAC third team accolades after ranking third in MAC scoring with 19.6 points per game.

Haynes began his coaching career in 2012 as an assistant at Kent State where he helped the Golden Flashes to the 2014-15 MAC regular-season title and a pair of Collegelinsider.com Tournament appearances, in 2013 and 2015. He was instrumental in the development of guards Kris Brewer, who earned MAC Sixth Man of the Year (2015) and All-MAC honorable mention (2014, '15) accolades, as well as guard Devareaux Manley, who earned All-MAC second team honors in 2015. Additionally, he helped coach forward Jimmy Hall to two All-MAC first team honors (2015, '16) as well as forward Chris Evans to first team honors in 2013.

Before becoming a coach, Haynes played professionally for six years in FIBA Europe with stops in Belgium, Hungary, Germany and Finland. In his final professional season, Haynes averaged 14.2 points, 4.8 assists and 4.8 rebounds per game for Finland's Namika Lappeenranta.

A native of Detroit, Michigan, and a Southwestern High School graduate, Haynes was a four-year starter at point guard for Kent State (2002-06), totaling 89 wins and four postseason appearances. Haynes ranks 12th in program history with 1,259 career points, while his 114 career starts rank second all-time. He also led the MAC in assists in the 2003-04 and 2004-05 campaigns with 5.5 and 5.8 assists per game, respectively.

Haynes is KSU's program leader in career assists (625), steals (229) and minutes (4,070). During his senior season in 2006, Haynes became the first Golden Flash to earn MAC Player of the Year honors. An Associated Press All-America honorable mention selection that year as well, Haynes led Kent State to the 2006 MAC regular season and tournament titles and a berth in the NCAA Tournament.

Haynes and his wife Tierra have three sons, DeAndre Jr., Devon and Dallas.

Orlando "Bino" Ranson was hired as an assistant coach at Maryland in the summer of 2010 and has coached 10 seasons in College Park, including nine on the staff of head coach Mark Turgeon. During his time with Turgeon, Ranson and the Terps have collected 204 wins.

In 2019-20, Ranson helped lead the Terps to the 2020 Big Ten Championship and a 24-7 overall record, before the season was cut short (no postseason) due to the coronavirus pandemic. Maryland finished the season ranked No. 12 in the Associated Press poll, as Baltimore forward Jalen Smith was a unanimous All-American.

Ranson played a major part in helping lead the Terps to four NCAA Tournament appearances, including four in the last five seasons, and a berth in the Sweet Sixteen during the 2015-16 season. It marked the Terps' longest run in the NCAA Tournament since 2003. In the 2015-16 season, Maryland started 15-1 – the best start in program history and finished the campaign with a 27-9 overall record No. 12 ranking in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

The Terps won 79 games between the 2014-15 through 2016-17 seasons, adding up to the second-most wins in school history over a three-year span. Ranson has helped lead the Terps to three 24-plus regular season-win seasons, while the Terrapins were also ranked in the Associated Press top-25 for 36 consecutive weeks, including 20 weeks in the top-10.

In their inaugural season in the Big Ten (2014-15), Ranson and the Terrapins posted a school record 26 regular season wins en route to advancing to the NCAA Tournament.

Ranson played a major role in helping Maryland sign five consecutive top-25 recruiting classes in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016. Ranson was critical in helping Maryland secure a top-10 recruiting class in 2018, leading the recruiting efforts to sign five-star McDonald's All-American Jalen Smith out of Mount Saint Joseph's High School in Baltimore. In addition, Ranson directed the recruiting efforts for Darryl Morsell from the class of 2017, a four-star recruit out of Mount Saint Joseph's.

Ranson has helped develop seven NBA Draft selections while at Maryland: Alex Len, Jordan Williams, Jake Layman, Diamond Stone, Kevin Huerter, Justin Jackson and Bruno Fernando.

In 2016, Ranson led the recruiting efforts for consensus four-star forward Justin Jackson, who was selected in the second round of the 2018 NBA Draft before signing with the Orlando Magic. Jackson played high school basketball at national power Findlay Prep as a junior before finishing his high school career at Hill Academy in Ontario, where he was named a First Team All-Star in the Ontario Scholastics Basketball Association. He was also a member of the Canadian U-19 national team that participated at the 2015 FIBA World Championships in Greece.

Ranson has strong ties to the Baltimore-Washington area, having grown up in the area and coached for two seasons at St. Frances Academy in Baltimore.

He came to Maryland after one season as an assistant at Xavier, during which the Musketeers went 26-9 and reached the NCAA Sweet Sixteen. In his lone season on the staff of Maryland head coach Gary Williams in 2010-11, the Terrapins went 19-14. Ranson has had a winning season in each of his 11 seasons as an assistant coach.

He spent two years as an administrative assistant at Loyola University on the staff of long-time Maryland assistant and former Siena head coach Jimmy Patsos.

Prior to Xavier, Ranson was an assistant coach at James Madison for one season, helping the Dukes to a 21-15 mark, the most wins by JMU in a season since 1992-93. The Dukes advanced in the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament for the first time since 2003 and their berth in the College Insiders.com Tournament marked their first postseason appearance since 1994.

Ranson also worked for Matt Brady at Marist University for three seasons. The Red Foxes were 62-33 in those three seasons and won the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference regular season in 2007. That season, Marist won at Oklahoma State in the Postseason NIT. Ranson coached under current Maryland assistant Matt Brady during his stops at Marist and JMU.

Considered an outstanding recruiter, he helped bring in excellent classes at James Madison, Marist and Xavier. Ranson helped land Jay Gavin at Marist, who went on to become the MAAC Rookie of the Year.

Ranson coached at St. Frances Academy for two seasons before joining the Loyola staff. He handled St. Frances' junior-varsity program, directing the 2003-04 team to a 24-5 record, titles in the MIAA and the Baltimore Catholic League. He also founded Team Baltimore, one of the top AAU programs in the Northeast.

Among the players Ranson worked with at the AAU level are Sean Mosley and Juan Dixon of Maryland, Ricky Harris of Massachusetts, Jermaine Dixon of Pittsburgh and Donte Greene of Syracuse.

A 1999 graduate of Southern New Hampshire with a B.S. in sports management, Ranson completed his collegiate career as one of the top players in the history of the school. He ranked seventh in career scoring (1,899 points), fifth in assists (598) and fourth in 3-point field goals (226) after lettering for four seasons. He was inducted into the school's hall of fame in January 2007.

Ranson and his wife, Shannon, have two sons; BJ and Bradshaw.

Mark Bialkoski has completed two seasons as director of operations for the Maryland basketball team after being elevated to the role in June of 2018. He previously served three seasons as the program's video coordinator.

"Mark is very deserving of this promotion, as he's been a great addition to our staff and program over the past three years," said head coach Mark Turgeon. "He's a tireless worker who is very committed to our team, and will continue to play a major role in our day-to-day activities. Mark has a promising future ahead of him in this business, and we're excited to reward him for his dedication and commitment to Maryland basketball."

In four seasons with the program, the Terrapins have advanced to three NCAA Tournaments and finished in the top-5 in the Big Ten four times. In the 2019-20 season, Maryland claimed the 2020 Big Ten Championship and finished the season ranked N. 12 in the AP Poll. In his first season at Maryland in 2015-16, the Terps won 27 games, finished No. 12 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and reached the Sweet 16 for the first time since 2003.

Bialkoski spent three seasons as the Charlotte 49ers director of basketball operations. Prior to serving as the director of operations, he spent three years (2009-12) as a program assistant and a graduate manager with the 49ers men's basketball program.

In his three seasons on the staff, the 49ers captured the Great Alaska Shootout and Puerto Rico Tip-Off titles and reached the Charleston Classic championship game. The 49ers defeated No. 10 Butler on the road as well in 2013. The 49ers won 52 games, including a 21 wins season in 2013 which marked the program's first 20 wins season since 2007-08. With another winning season in 2014, the 49ers posted back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 2007. Charlotte made its first postseason tournament appearance since 2008 with an NIT appearance in 2013.

During the 2012-13 season, Bialkoski played a major role in helping set up the first annual Military Appreciation game (the Georgia Southern game) where the 49ers were able to raise over \$600 for military personnel.

As Director of Operations, Bialkoski helped with team travel, budgeting, scheduling and academic support as well as helping run the Alan Major Basketball Camps. In the fall of 2013, the Niners men's basketball team achieved its highest semester grade point average in program history.

While as a program assistant and graduate manager at Charlotte, Bialkoski did advance opponents scouting, assisted in scheduling, and managed all video related tasks for the coaching staff in addition to designing and developing the first Charlotte 49ers Men's Basketball Newsletter. Bialkoski facilitated all pre- and post-game practice set-up, created recruiting mail-outs and was a key resource to all basketball operational functions.

The Jacksonville, Florida native earned a Bachelor's of Science with a major in Exercise Science from Georgia Southern in 2008. While at Georgia Southern, Bialkoski served as head manager for the men's basketball program under Head Coach Jeff Price. During his time at Georgia Southern, the Eagles captured the 2006 Southern Conference Championship. He also served as assistant director of the Jeff Price Basketball Camp.

Bialkoski and his wife, La Shae Marie, have a daughter Baylee Josephine and a son Finley.
