» Freshman **DJ Steward** is averaging 14.7 points and shooting .427 from the field in conference play to lead all ACC freshmen.

### » THE OPENING TIP

- » Long-standing rivals Duke and Clemson square off Saturday afternoon at Cameron Indoor Stadium at 12 p.m. ET, each looking to find a groove in the heart of ACC season.
- » Saturday marks the 144th meeting in the series that dates back to the 1925-26 season, with the Blue Devils leading 111-32. Duke has won 18 straight in Durham and leads the series at home 63-4.
- » Sophomore **Matthew Hurt** -- the ACC's second-leading scorer overall (19.2) and leader in conference play (19.3) -- is the nation's only player to have scored 12+ points, shot better than .400 from the field on 5+ made field goals and have 6+ rebounds in each of his team's games this season.
- » Hurt is also third in the ACC in rebounding (8.2), sixth in field goal percentage (.536) and third in most made three-pointers per game (2.5) -- the only player ranked in the ACC's top six in each.
- » In ACC play, freshman **DJ Steward** is 12th in scoring (14.7), 15th in field goal percentage (.427), fourth in free throw percentage (.870) and 15th in minutes (33.8). He leads all ACC freshmen in each category.
- » Senior **Jordan Goldwire**, who is coming off a career-high-tying seven assists versus Georgia Tech, leads the ACC in assist/turnover ratio (+2.80), while ranking second in steals (2.5) and eighth in assists (3.8). He has 25 assists and five turnovers over the last six games.
- » Only three times in at least the last decade has a power conference player had 15+ points, 15+ rebounds, 5+ assists and 4+ blocked shots in a game -- freshman **Jalen Johnson** has two of those three performances (vs. Coppin State; at Pitt).
- » Johnson is averaging 13.3 points and shooting .571 (20-of-35) over the last four games since returning from a foot injury.
- » Sophomore **Wendell Moore Jr.**, is averaging 10.2 points, 4.8 rebounds and shooting .412 from the field over the last six games after respective averages of 3.8, 2.8 and .219 over the first five.
- » Following Monday's game at Miami (7 p.m., ESPN), Duke's final five home games of the regular season come in the next seven contests.

**116TH SEASON OF BASKETBALL**

- » The 2020-21 campaign marks the 116th season of Duke Basketball.
- » The Blue Devils have compiled a 2,207-898 all-time record to rank fourth all-time in victories.
- » Only Kentucky (2,325), Kansas (2,312) and North Carolina (2,286) have more all-time wins than Duke.
- » Duke's all-time .711 winning percentage is also the fourth-best in NCAA history, behind only Kentucky (.763), North Carolina (.735) and Kansas (.727).

**DUKE VS. CLEMSON**

- » Duke and Clemson are meeting for the 144th time in a series that dates to the 1925-26 season, with the Blue Devils leading 111-32.
- » In Durham, the Blue Devils lead the series 63-4 (60-4 at Cameron Indoor) and have won 18 consecutive home games in the series.
- » Duke's four-game winning streak in the series was snapped last season at Littlejohn Coliseum when Aamir Sims scored 25 points with nine rebounds in Clemson's 79-72 win on January 14.
- » Coach K achieved a pair of his milestone victories over Clemson -- No. 100 overall came February 24, 1982 in triple overtime, 73-72, and No. 600 at Duke came January 3, 2004, 73-54.

**SCOUTING THE TIGERS**

- » Clemson is 10-4 overall and 4-4 in the ACC. The Tigers snapped a three-game skid with a 54-50 win over Louisville on Wednesday.
- » Preseason All-ACC pick Amir Simms leads the Tigers in scoring (12.0) and rebounding (5.9).
- » Clemson owns the ACC's second-best scoring defense, yielding just 62.4 points per contest.
- » The Tigers have marquee non-conference wins this season over Purdue and Alabama, and handed Florida State its only ACC loss on December 29.

**ON THIS DATE**

- » Duke is 24-8 all-time when playing on January 30, including a 14-2 record in home games (10-2 at Cameron Indoor Stadium).
- » Duke is 14-2 in ACC games on this date.
- » Duke last played on this date in 2017, an 84-74 win at Notre Dame.

**THREE-POINT STREAK**

- » Duke has connected on at least one three-pointer in 1,101 straight games, the second-longest streak nationally.
- » It has been more than 30 years since Duke was held without a three-point field goal -- Dec. 30, 1989, versus Hawai'i.
- » Vanderbilt had owned the second-longest streak before its January 18, 2020 game versus Tennessee (0-of-25).

**SO GOOD IT HURTS**

- » Matthew Hurt added 25 pounds to his frame in the offseason, and the bulked-up Hurt is second in the ACC in scoring (49th nationally) at 19.2 points per game.
- » Hurt leads the ACC in conference-only scoring at 19.3 points.
- » Already named ACC Player of the Week and Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week once this season, Hurt has nearly doubled his per-game scoring average from last season (9.74 to 19.20), which is the ACC's third-largest scoring improvement from last year.
- » The Rochester, Minn., native is also third in the ACC in rebounding (8.2), sixth in field goal percentage (.536) and third in most made three-pointers per game (2.5) -- the only player ranked in the ACC's top six in each category.
- » He is the nation's only player to have scored 12+ points, shot better than .400 from the field on 5+ made field goal and have 6+ rebounds in each of his team's games this season.
- » Three of his four career double-doubles have come in this season's first 10 games, including 21 and 13 vs. Michigan State, 17 and 11 vs. Boston College and 20 and 11 at Virginia Tech.
- » He is one of the final 10 candidates for the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award.

**HURT IN SELECT COMPANY**

- » Of the 18 players nationally (six power conference players) this season to have 10 or more games with 12+ points, six+ rebounds, five+ made field goals and shoot .400+ from the field, Hurt is the only one to have done so in each of his team's games.
- » Hurt opened the season with 12 points and seven boards on 5-of-11 (.455) shooting versus Coppin State, and has registered no less than 13 points, six boards, five field goals, while shooting no worse than .417 in a game since.

**STEWART LEADS ALL FROSH IN ACC SCORING**

- » Freshman DJ Steward, already twice named ACC Freshman of the Week this season, is Duke's second leading scorer at 13.6 points, while averaging 4.6 rebounds and shooting .423 from the field and leading the team in free throw percentage (.867).
- » In ACC play, Steward ranks 12th in the conference in scoring (14.7), 15th in field goal percentage (.427), fourth in free throw percentage (.870) and 15th in minutes (33.8). He leads all ACC freshmen in each category.
- » The Chicago native is coming off a 19-point, five-rebound, three-assist effort against Georgia Tech, and is five games removed from his ACC-career-high 21 points versus Wake Forest.
- » Steward has hit at least one three-pointer in eight consecutive games and carries a streak of 12 straight made free throws into the Clemson game.

## EMILY K CENTER RAISES \$18.85 MILLION FOR GAME CHANGER CAMPAIGN

- » The Emily Krzyzewski Center announced the completion of its three-year Game Changer fundraising campaign.
- » Goaled at \$15 million, the campaign surpassed that by more than \$3 million, raising \$18.85 million by the campaign's completion on December 31, 2020. The campaign was kick-started by a \$3 million gift from Emily K Center founders **Mike** and **Mickie Krzyzewski**.
- » The Game Changer Campaign provided funding to help support Center operations, enhance educational programs, ensure the Center's long-term sustainability, and expand the facility. Due to the success of the campaign: Construction is underway on a 7,500 sq. ft. building expansion ... The Center's endowment more than doubled ... Seven new, named scholarships were created, including the 'Brotherhood Endowment', a scholarship created and supported by former Duke Men's Basketball players and managers.
- » Founded in 2006 by Coach K in honor of his late mother, the Emily Krzyzewski Center is a non-profit organization that serves as a college access hub in Durham, propelling academically-focused, K-12 students and graduates toward success in college through its K to College programs.

## CAMERON INDOOR STADIUM

- » Duke has posted an all-time record of 912-165 (.847) at Cameron Indoor, including 554-70 (.888) under Coach K.
- » Duke is 255-59 (.812) in ACC regular-season games at Cameron Indoor in the Coach K era.
- » Duke has won more games at its current home venue than any team in college basketball.
- » Now in its 82nd season as the home of the Blue Devils, Duke has averaged 31.1 wins since the venue opened January 6, 1940 -- a 36-27 win over Princeton.
- » The Blue Devils have 18 undefeated home seasons, including 11 under Coach K.

## CHARITY STRIPE DISPARITY

- » For the season, Duke opponents have attempted 43 more free throws than the Blue Devils (212-169), and Duke has been out-scored at the line by 32 (149-117)
- » Eight times this season, Duke's opponents have attempted more free throws, including in four of the last five games where the disparity has been 31.
- » In the six-point loss at Pitt, Duke was out-scored at the free throw by 13 points (24-11).
- » In a five-point loss at Louisville the Cardinals scored 11 more points at the line (18-7).
- » In both the Pitt and Louisville games, 70 percent of the possessions by each opponent ended with a free throw attempt.

## JOHNSON MAKES STATEMENT IN RETURN

- » **Jalen Johnson** logged 33 productive minutes at Pitt, scoring a career-high 24 points with 16 rebounds, seven assists, no turnovers, four blocked shots and two steals.
- » It marked his second career double-double, after posting 19 points and 19 rebounds in the season-opener versus Coppin State.
- » Johnson is the first Duke player all-time to score at least 20 points, have at least 15 rebounds, at least seven assists and no turnovers in a single game.
- » He is one of eight players nationally to post a 20-15-5 statline with no turnovers since at least the 2010-11 season, and is the only one to do so with at least four blocked shots.
- » He was 8-of-14 from the field, 7-of-10 at the free throw line and of his 15 rebounds 10 came on the defensive glass.
- » The freshman had missed three consecutive games with a foot injury before returning to play limited minutes at Virginia Tech on Jan. 12.

## EXCLUSIVE COMPANY

- » Only three times in at least the last 10 seasons has a power conference player logged a game with 15+ points, 15+ rebounds, 5+ assists and 4+ blocked shots -- freshman **Jalen Johnson** has two of those three occurrences.
- » Johnson had 19 points, 19 rebounds, five assists and four blocks versus Coppin State (Nov. 28), and 24 points, 16 rebounds, seven assists and four blocks at Pitt.
- » The only other power conference player with at least 15-15-5-4 in the last decade was Wisconsin's **Ethan Happ** versus Virginia (Nov. 23, 2018) -- 22 points, 15 rebounds, six assists and four blocks.

## MORE ON JOHNSON...

- » Freshman **Jalen Johnson** stamped his name on the 2020-21 season with a record-setting performance in Duke's opener.
- » The Milwaukee, Wis., native scored 19 points, grabbed 19 rebounds, had five assists and four blocked shots in 35 minutes becoming the first Duke player in history to post a statline of 19+ points, 19+ rebounds, 5+ assists and 4+ blocks.
- » Only Johnson and **Danny Ferry** have posted a game of 19-19-5 in Duke history. Ferry scored 20 points, had 19 rebounds and seven assists at Maryland on Jan. 14, 1987.
- » His 19 rebounds marked the third most by a Duke freshman, while his 15 defensive rebounds set a Duke freshman record.
- » He finished the game without missing a shot (8/8 FG, 1/1 3FG, 2/2 FT), also setting a Duke freshman record for most points in a game with 100% shooting.
- » He became just the third Duke freshman to post a double-double in a debut game, joining **Jason Williams** (13 points, 10 rebounds) vs. Stanford on Nov. 11, 1999 and **Marvin Bagley III** (25-10) vs. Elon on Nov. 10, 2017.

## DUKE AWAY FROM CAMERON

- » In the Coach K era, Duke is 261-149 (.637) in true road games and 275-77 (.781) in neutral site games, for a combined mark of 536-226 (.704) in all games outside of Cameron Indoor Stadium.
- » In ACC regular season play, Duke is 190-124 (.605) away from home under Coach K. The Blue Devils are 134-71 (.656) in ACC road games since the 1996-97 season.
- » In ACC Tournament play, Duke's .696 winning percentage and 103 wins each lead the conference.
- » Coach K's 190 ACC road wins are a conference record.
- » Coach K has also won 16 road games against AP top five teams, the most in the history of the AP poll.

## ACC WEEKLY HONORS

- » Duke swept the ACC weekly awards on Jan. 11 when sophomore **Matthew Hurt** was named the Player of the Week and **DJ Steward** was the Freshman of the Week.
- » Hurt also won the Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week that same week.
- » It was the second honor for Steward, and first Player of the Week award for Hurt, who was the Freshman of the Week once last year.
- » Duke has already had two named ACC Freshman of the Week this season with **Jalen Johnson** earning the honor on Nov. 30 and **DJ Steward** on Dec. 21 and Jan. 11.
- » It was the first sweep for a school since Duke's **Vernon Carey Jr.**, was both the Player of Freshman of the Week on Feb. 3, 2020.
- » Duke now leads the ACC in all-time selections for both weekly honors -- 143 Player of the Week awards and 138 Freshman.
- » The Blue Devils have had a stranglehold on the Freshman of the Week award over the last seven-plus season as Johnson and Steward become the 17th and 18th different Duke freshmen to win it in that span.
- » Duke has had an ACC Rookie of the Week nearly 50 percent of the time over the last seven-plus seasons (63 times in 127 weeks).

## YOUTH AND INEXPERIENCE

- » Duke's 2020-21 roster features seven newcomers -- six freshmen that comprised the nation's No. 2 class and graduate transfer **Patrick Tapé** from Columbia University -- the program's first grad transfer.
- » Duke's roster is ranked as the fifth most inexperienced in the nation of the 287 ranked by KenPom, behind only Kentucky, Presbyterian, Auburn and Stetson.
- » Of Duke's new faces, Tapé missed all of last season at Columbia University with a foot injury.
- » Freshman center **Mark Williams** missed time during his senior season at IMG Academy with an injury.
- » Freshman guard **Jeremy Roach** missed the entirety of his junior season at St. Paul VI with a knee injury.

## AP POLL STREAK SNAPPED

- » With Duke falling from the AP Top 25 this week, it snaps a streak of 91 consecutive polls that the Blue Devils had been ranked, which was the nation's second-longest active streak and the fourth-longest streak in program history.
- » The last time Duke was not ranked was February 8, 2016.
- » Just 10.5 percent of Duke's games in the Coach K era have been as an unranked team (145) and the Blue Devils are 82-63 (.566) in those games.
- » Duke has been ranked in 461 of the last 466 polls.
- » Duke was ranked No. 9 in the *Associated Press* preseason poll on Nov. 9, and the Blue Devils have now been ranked in the top 10 at least once in 25 consecutive seasons -- the longest active streak nationally by a decade (Kansas, 15).
- » This marked the 13th consecutive season that the Blue Devils have debuted in the top 10.

## SCHEDULE MANEUVERING

- » Due to schedule changes as a result of COVID-19 protocols, Duke has already had five games canceled or postponed a total of six times.
- » The Blue Devils' season-opener versus Gardner-Webb was initially postponed due to COVID issues at GWU. The game was later rescheduled for Dec. 19 and eventually canceled by Duke.
- » Duke's games versus Elon (Dec. 6) and Charleston Southern (Dec. 12) were each postponed due to virus issues with those programs and won't be rescheduled.
- » The latest impacts came since Christmas when two of Duke's ACC contests were postponed -- Dec. 29 due to virus issues with Pitt and Jan. 2 due to virus issues at Florida State.
- » Rescheduled dates have not yet been announced.

## DUKE'S 2020-21 FRESHMAN CLASS

- » Duke was ranked No. 2 in ESPN's 2020-21 class rankings, boasting a class that includes Jaemyn Brakefield, Henry Coleman III, Jalen Johnson, Jeremy Roach, DJ Steward and Mark Williams.
- » Roach, Steward and Williams were McDonald's All-Americans, while Brakefield, Johnson, Roach, Steward and Williams were set to compete in the 2020 Jordan Brand Classic.
- » Roach was a multiple gold medalist with USA Basketball - at the 2017 FIBA Americas U-16 and the 2018 FIBA U-17 World Cup. He was teammates on both teams with sophomore Wendell Moore Jr.

## MOORE TAPPED TO NABC COALITION

- » The National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) announced in August the formation of the NABC Player Development Coalition, a diverse collection of Division I men's basketball student-athletes that will provide valuable perspective and feedback on college basketball issues. Sophomore Wendell Moore Jr., is one of 11 selected to form the initial coalition.
- » In addition to creating a vehicle for student-athletes to address current issues, the coalition will also provide members with numerous professional and personal development experiences. The coalition will meet quarterly and have regular opportunities to address the NABC Board of Directors and NCAA committees.

- » The Blue Devils most recent selections are Jeremy Roach, D.J. Steward and Mark Williams, as Duke joined Kentucky and North Carolina as the only programs with multiple selections to the 2020 team.
- » Mike Krzyzewski has now signed 80 McDonald's All-Americans -- the most all-time by a coach -- and has added at least one to his roster in 36 consecutive years.

## TWO TOP-10 PLAYERS SIGN FOR 2021-22 CLASS

- » The Blue Devils announced the first two members of next season's freshman class with the signing of ESPN top-10 players Paolo Banchero and AJ Griffin.
- » Banchero, a 6-9 power forward from O'Dea HS in Seattle, Wash., is ranked as the No. 3 overall prospect in the class of 2021 by ESPN.
- » Griffin, a 6-7 small forward from Archbishop Stepinac in White Plains, N.Y., is ranked as the No. 9 overall prospect in the class by ESPN.
- » Duke is currently the nation's only program with multiple top-10 players in the 2021 class.
- » The Blue Devils, who have finished first or second in each of ESPN's class rankings since 2014, are looking to extend that streak to eight consecutive seasons.

## COACH K'S NBA PLAYERS SURPASS \$2,000,000,000 IN CONTRACTS

- » Through the 2019-20 season, Coach K's former Duke players have accumulated more than \$2 billion in NBA contracts.
- » Lottery selections who played for Krzyzewski at Duke have combined to earn more than \$1.6 billion in contracts, an average of nearly \$60 million per individual.
- » These figures don't include the recent five-year, \$195 million max contract extension signed by Jayson Tatum, nor the five-year \$158 million max contract extension inked by Brandon Ingram.

## THREE DRAFTED, TWO SIGN OVERSEAS

- » Three Blue Devils - Vernon Carey Jr., Tre Jones and Cassius Stanley -- were selected during the 2020 NBA Draft in November, marking the fourth consecutive year with three or more Blue Devils drafted.
- » The selections of ACC Freshman of the Year Carey Jr., by the Charlotte Hornets (32nd pick), ACC Player of the Year Jones by the San Antonio Spurs (41st) and ACC All-Freshman Stanley by the Indiana Pacers (54th), Duke now boasts 100 all-time NBA draft picks, including 67 coming under head coach Mike Krzyzewski.
- » The Blue Devils joined Kentucky and Arizona as the only college programs with three players selected during the 2020 NBA Draft.
- » Duke has had at least one player selected in 33 of the 40 drafts under Krzyzewski, including at least one in 10 consecutive drafts. In that span since 2011, 27 Blue Devils have been drafted. Coach K's 41 first-round selections remain a Draft record.
- » The Melbourne United of Australia's National Basketball League (NBL) announced in July the signing of former captain Jack White to a three-year deal.
- » The 22-year-old from Traralgon, Australia graduated from Duke this past season after playing four years for the Blue Devils and serving as team captain his final two campaigns.
- » KK Mornar Bar of the Adriatic First League Division (ABA) announced in September the signing of former captain Justin Robinson.
- » The 23-year-old son of NBA Hall of Famer David Robinson completed his master's degree at Duke's Fuqua School of Business after spending the past five seasons with the Blue Devils.

## » DUKE IN THE NBA

- » Including Duke's most recent three draftees in the 2020 Draft, a total of 86 former Duke players have appeared on NBA rosters.
- » Overall, 41 Duke players have been selected in the first round of the NBA Draft in the Coach K era, including 23 in the past 10 years.
- » There are 27 Duke players on current NBA rosters (including inactive and two-way players) -- the most by any ACC school in a single season in the history of the league.
- » The previous ACC record of 25 was set by Duke last season.
- » Four Duke players have been selected No. 1 in the NBA Draft -- Art Heyman (1963), Elton Brand (1999), Kyrie Irving (2011) and Zion Williamson (2019).
- » Duke now boasts 67 players drafted under head coach Mike Krzyzewski.
- » Duke has had at least one player selected in 33 of the 40 drafts under Coach K, including at least one in 10 consecutive drafts. In that span since 2011, 27 Blue Devils have been drafted.
- » Coach K's 41 first-round selections remain a Draft record
- » Duke has had 28 players selected in the NBA Draft Lottery, the most in the nation since the system was put into place in 1985.
- » Overall, between Duke and USA Basketball, Coach K has coached 112 NBA players.
- » In 1999, Duke became the first program in the history of the NBA Draft to have four players from the same school selected in the first round. Three of the four -- Elton Brand (Chicago), Trajan Langdon (Cleveland) and Corey Maggette (Seattle) -- were lottery picks.
- » In 2002, Jason Williams (2nd overall) and Mike Dunleavy (3rd) became the first college teammates in the history of the NBA Draft to be the first two collegians selected.
- » Six former Duke players -- Jeff Mullins (Golden State, 1975), Danny Ferry (San Antonio, 2003), Shane Battier (Miami, 2012 and 2013), Kyrie Irving (Cleveland, 2016), Dahntay Jones (Cleveland, 2016) and Quinn Cook (Golden State, 2018; L.A. Lakers 2020) -- have been part of NBA championship teams.
- » Through the 2019-20 season, Coach K's former Duke players have accumulated more than \$2 billion in NBA contracts.
- » Lottery selections who played for Krzyzewski at Duke have combined to earn more than \$1.6 billion in contracts, an average of nearly \$60 million per individual.

## ACC DOMINANCE

- » Duke has won 314 league games and eight regular season ACC championships since 1997. Duke is the only league team to win at least 70 percent of its conference games in that span.
- » The Blue Devils have also been outstanding in ACC Tournament play with 12 crowns in the past 23 seasons in what is considered the nation's toughest conference.
- » Duke's 12 ACC crowns since 1997 are seven more than the next closest program and more than all of the other league schools combined (11 by six programs).

## BLUE DEVILS EARN MAKE-A-WISH HONOR

- » Make-A-Wish America presented the 2020 Chris Greicius Award to head coach **Mike Krzyzewski** and the men's basketball program. This award recognizes the exceptional wish-granting support exemplified by Coach K and the team in helping create life-changing wish experiences for children fighting critical illness.
- » The Blue Devils are the first collegiate program nationally to earn the honor that has been presented since 1990 to organizations and individuals such as the Green Bay Packers, the New York Yankees, Katy Perry, Dave Matthews Band, Stephen Curry, and many others.
- » Coach K and the team have been granting wishes for over a decade -- nine wishes since 2012 alone -- the most recent being an incredible wish experience for Make-A-Wish New Jersey wish kid Antonio Sellers, whose wish to attend a Duke vs. North Carolina basketball game at Cameron Indoor Stadium was granted this past March.



## DUKE'S SOCIAL JUSTICE INITIATIVES AND NOTABLES

*In efforts to promote positive dialogue around racial and social justice issues and to raise awareness of voter participation...*

- » This season, the Blue Devils will wear jerseys with the word "EQUALITY" on the back of the jersey below the number.
- » The team will collectively kneel during the reading of a "Unity" statement from the ACC before each home game.
- » The team had 100% voter registration and participation.
- » The program created working groups among its vast network of former players -- the voting group, which addressed voter awareness and education, was led by former Blue Devils **Reggie Love**, **Todd Singleton** and **Nate James**, while **Nolan Smith** led the Duke/Durham group along with **Grant Hill**, which addressed issues in the Duke and Durham communities.
- » The ongoing group discussions over the last few months, including an initial Zoom call led by head coach **Mike Krzyzewski** that included more than 100 current and former members of the Duke Basketball Brotherhood, led to the creation of the working groups.
- » The program created a website, TheBrotherhoodVotes.us, and a video that included a number of current and former players to promote the need for voter registration and education.
- » Nolan Smith was named the *Raleigh News & Observer's* citizen of the month for October. The award bestowed upon Smith honors those who have made significant contributions to North Carolina and the region.
- » Smith was also recently named a George H.W. Bush Points of Light Inspiration honoree for "his activism and community outreach efforts during the recent social justice movement."
- » In August, Smith organized a rally on campus, has spearheaded voter-registration efforts and led multiple peaceful protests around the city. He was invited by Durham Mayor Steve Schewel to serve as a community leader.
- » Duke University student-athletes held a peaceful protest and conversation on campus bringing together hundreds of Blue Devil staff, student-athletes and coaches in support of the Black Lives Matter movement.
- » Smith addressed the crowd assembled on Krzyzewskiville, along with head coach **Mike Krzyzewski**, women's basketball head coach **Kara Lawson**, men's basketball student-athletes **Mike Buckmire** and **Henry Coleman III**, and **Mark Anthony Neal**, a Duke professor of African and African American Studies.
- » Sophomore **Wendell Moore Jr.** and his girlfriend, **Marissa Moyer**, organized a community march this summer in Concord, N.C.

Now in his 41st season at Duke, Mike Krzyzewski - a Naismith Hall of Fame coach, five-time national champion and 12-time Final Four participant - has built a dynasty that few programs in the history of the game can match.

The numbers that illustrate Coach K's career are simply staggering:

- Five national championships (1991, 1992, 2001, 2010, 2015)
- Six gold medals as head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team
- Nine National Players of the Year (11 honors)
- Six National Defensive Players of the Year (nine honors)
- 10 consecutive top-10 AP poll finishes (1997-06)
- 12 National Coach of the Year honors (eight seasons)
- 12 Final Four appearances (tied for most in NCAA history)

- 12 ACC regular season championships
- 15 ACC Tournament championships (most in league history)
- 28 NBA Lottery picks (most in Draft history)
- 35 NCAA Tournament bids (most by one coach)
- 37 All-America selections (51 honors)
- 67 NBA Draft selections, including 41 first-round picks
- 65 ACC Tournament wins (most in league history)
- 97 NCAA Tournament wins (most in NCAA history)
- 126 weeks ranked No. 1 in the AP poll (most by a coach in poll history)
- 508 ACC wins (most in league history)
- 556 weeks ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll (most by a coach in poll history)
- 649 weeks ranked in the AP poll (most by a coach in poll history)
- 1,090 victories at Duke (most in NCAA history at one school)

Coach K became the Division I men's career wins leader on Nov. 15, 2011, at Madison Square Garden, moving past his former coach Bob Knight with his 903rd victory. His historic 1,000th career victory came against St. John's at The World's Most Famous Arena on Jan. 25, 2015, as he became the first Division I men's basketball coach to achieve a four-figure win total.

Krzyzewski's 1,090 victories at Duke are an NCAA record by a coach at one school. With 1,090 of the Blue Devils' 2,207 all-time victories, Coach K has presided over nearly half (49 percent) of the men's basketball wins in Duke history.

Krzyzewski has won a league-record 510 ACC games (regular season and tournament), passing former North Carolina head coach Dean Smith (422) on Feb. 4, 2015. He has also won an ACC-record 190 conference road games.

Coach K's five national championships are the second-most in NCAA history. Krzyzewski and former Connecticut coach Jim Calhoun are the only coaches in NCAA history to win national championships in three different decades.

Coach K has led the Blue Devils into the NCAA Tournament 35 times - more than any other coach in history. He has taken Duke to the NCAA Tournament in each of the last 24 seasons that the tournament has been played -- the longest streak in NCAA history, surpassing Dean Smith's 23 consecutive appearances from 1975 to 1997.

Krzyzewski holds NCAA Tournament records for games coached (127) and wins (97) while ranking second all-time and leading active coaches with a .764 NCAA Tournament winning percentage (min. 20 games). He has reached the Sweet 16 on 25 occasions, six more than any other coach in NCAA history, and has advanced to the Elite Eight 16 times.

Of the 1,386 games Krzyzewski has coached at Duke, 1,238 - 89.5 percent - have been as a ranked team. The Blue Devils are 1,007-231 (.813) as a ranked team under Coach K.

Coach K has taken top-ranked Duke teams into games on 254 occasions and compiled a 219-35 (.864) record as the AP's No. 1 team, ranking first in poll history in both number of games and wins as coach of a top-ranked squad.

Krzyzewski has tutored 67 NBA Draft picks during his time at Duke, including a total of 41 first-round selections that leads all active coaches. Duke has had at least one player taken in 33 of the 40 NBA Drafts during the Krzyzewski Era.

Since the inception of the NBA Draft Lottery in 1985, Coach K and Duke have produced 28 lottery picks - a draft-record total for both a school and a coach.

Through the 2019-20 season, Coach K's former Duke players have accumulated more than \$2 billion in NBA contracts. Lottery selections who played for Krzyzewski at Duke have combined to earn more than \$1.6 billion in contracts, an average of nearly \$60 million per individual.

Under Coach K's watch, Duke has produced multiple All-ACC Academic selections in 12 of the last 13 years. The 2015 NCAA championship team featured a program-high five All-ACC Academic honorees. Quin Snyder, Amile Jefferson and Grayson Allen are the only players in Duke history to earn All-ACC Academic honors four times. Jefferson, a three-time captain, departed the university in 2017 with both bachelor's and master's degrees.

Krzyzewski has had six players collect a total of nine CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, headlined by two-time first-team honorees Battier (2000, 2001) and Mason Plumlee (2012, 2013). Allen became the sixth in 2016 when he garnered second-team accolades.

Fittingly, Coach K has earned nearly every award imaginable. The crown jewel of that haul, however, came in 2001 when he was inducted into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.

Since his enshrinement in Springfield, Mass., Krzyzewski has also been inducted into the Army Sports Hall of Fame (2009), the Chicagoland Sports Hall of Fame (2010) and the Duke Athletics Hall of Fame (2011).

While establishing Duke as one of college basketball's dynastic programs, Krzyzewski simultaneously spent more than a decade as one of the architects of the revitalization of USA Basketball. During his tenure at the helm of the program, the U.S. National Team amassed an extraordinary 88-1 record and claimed gold medals at the 2007 FIBA Americas Championship, 2008 Beijing Olympics, 2010 FIBA World Championship, 2012 London Olympics, 2014 FIBA World Cup and 2016 Rio Olympics, as well as a bronze medal at the 2006 FIBA World Championship.

Coach K was 24-0 in the Olympics as head coach of the USMNT and his time at the helm ended with the team in the midst of a National Team-record 76-game winning streak that began in 2006.

Sustained success under Coach K has resulted in coaching opportunities for several of his former players, as well as his former assistant coaches from both Duke and Army. More than 25 of Coach K's former players or assistants are currently either coaching or working in front office roles across professional and college basketball.

**The Coaching Tree**

Ten of Coach K's former players or staff are currently Division I head coaches: Tommy Amaker (Harvard), Kenny Blakeney (Howard), Mike Brey (Notre Dame), Jeff Capel (Pittsburgh), Chris Collins (Northwestern), Johnny Dawkins (Central Florida), Bobby Hurley (Arizona State), Greg Paulus (Niagara), Mike Schrage (Elon) and Steve Wojciechowski (Marquette).

Quin Snyder is currently the head coach of the NBA's Utah Jazz, headlining a long list of former players, staff and managers that are connected to the NBA. That list also includes Grant Hill as part-owner of the Atlanta Hawks, Elton Brand as general manager of the Philadelphia 76ers, Trajan Langdon as general manager of the New Orleans Pelicans and Shane Battier as vice president of analytics and development for the Miami Heat.

Krzyzewski has shown a firm commitment to taking care of his own, having at least three former Duke captains on his staff every season since 1996-97. The Blue Devils have won three NCAA titles, 12 ACC Tournament championships and eight ACC regular season crowns during that time.

The 2019-20 staff of Nate James, Jon Scheyer, Chris Carrawell and Nolan Smith all held the captain role during their playing careers at Duke.

**Giving Back**

Krzyzewski has been diligently committed to public service, both locally and nationally, throughout his coaching career. He is currently serving on boards for, while also assuming vital roles with, the Duke Children's Hospital, the Jimmy V Foundation for Cancer Research, the NABC Foundation, the CEO Roundtable on Cancer and the Emily Krzyzewski Center.

Coach K's philanthropic activities also include the establishment and funding of the Emily Krzyzewski Center, a community center in Durham named in honor of his late mother. The Center's mission is to inspire economically disadvantaged students to dream big, act with character and purpose, strive for academic excellence and reach their highest potential as future citizen leaders.

In May 2018, Coach K and his wife Mickie announced their single-largest philanthropic gift, a \$3 million donation to the Emily K Center to kick start a \$15 million fundraising campaign for the Durham-based Center. That campaign concluded on December 31, 2020 and raised \$18.85 million to exceed the goal.

## Duke showed its capabilities in beating GT, now comes the tough job.

In a game tied late against Georgia Tech Tuesday night, Duke made play after play after play to post a 75-68 win.

Considering Duke hasn't lost to the Yellow Jackets at home since 2004, what's the news here?

Plenty.

This isn't a Blue Devil team playing like all those teams over the last 17 years that have whipped Georgia Tech and plenty of other ACC teams.

Entering the game on a three-game losing streak with a break-even overall record in late January, Duke is a long way from earning consideration for the NCAA tournament.

Playing the way they did against Georgia Tech, particularly late, the Blue Devils took a big step toward showing the kind of team they could become.

"We've had a lot of tough games, a lot of games that we could've won that came down to the wire," Duke senior guard Jordan Goldwire said. "For us to come out and beat a very good Georgia Tech team, an older team, just shows that we're trying to keep improving every day."

Duke (6-5, 4-3 ACC) played really well in multiple stretches Tuesday night. The Blue Devils had done the same in losses at Virginia Tech, Pittsburgh and Louisville leading into the game with Georgia Tech.

But in all three of those games, Duke faltered down the stretch and took losses.

Georgia Tech pushed Duke hard. The Blue Devils led 33-25 at halftime and 45-34 with 15:41 to play.

Led by senior guard Jose Alvarado, the Yellow Jackets chipped away and chipped away and finally tied the game at 52 with 9:30 to play on Jordan Usher's basket.

In the last four minutes, Alvarado gave Georgia Tech a pair of one-point leads on the way to his 26-point night. His 3-pointer with 3:21 to play left Duke down 64-63.

"They took the lead by one," Duke coach Mike Krzyzewski said, "and based on losing three in a row, a team can start thinking negative and our guys didn't. I'm proud of our players."

This time the Blue Devils didn't look and play young at key times.

"You expend so much energy trying to stop them and you can let up a little and not be poised," Krzyzewski said. "I thought we had good poise at the end. Not that we were rattled or anything at Louisville, but we worked better as a unit tonight. Again, it's a young team. Hopefully, we can continue to do that."

That is the next question Duke must answer. The Blue Devils have not turned in consistent performances this season, so all the good work on display Tuesday can be undone by a rough game on Saturday against Clemson.

### JALEN JOHNSON'S MID-GAME TURNAROUND

As it is, Duke showed it has the pieces needed to string together wins.

Freshman guard DJ Steward scored 19 points, continuing to show he can be a reliable scorer on the perimeter.

Sophomore Matthew Hurt, Duke's leading scorer and one of the ACC's top scorers with a 19.4 average, produced only four points in the first half. He finished with 17 points.

Freshman forward Jalen Johnson, after scoring only two points in the first half, finished with 18.

Johnson's mid-game turn-around is notable because he'd been unable to overcome poor early stretches in games and produce this season. Even during Tuesday's game, Johnson twice allowed Alvarado to knock the ball out of his hands for turnovers.

Yet Johnson scored seven points in the game's final four minutes, including conventional three-point plays with a basket and free throw on consecutive possessions after Alvarado had given the Yellow Jackets those one-point leads.

"For him to be advancing like he is is really encouraging," Krzyzewski said. "And to learn about the physicality of the game and to play through contact. He made those two plays in the last few minutes through contact and he made one of them after letting Alvarado take the ball from him. That's a big sign. You can get down about that and not be strong in the next play, but he was."

Then there's Goldwire, who came off the bench to replace struggling freshman Jeremy Roach to produce 11 points, seven assists and two steals while committing just one turnover in 35 minutes.

The senior guard played well and gave Duke experienced leadership when it was needed. Now, he knows the team's strong play needs to be replicated over and over again.

"We lost three tough games and we've just got to get back on the horse," Goldwire said. "This win for us was huge, but we're not satisfied - we've got to come back Saturday (against Clemson) ready to play."

- » Moore came off the bench at Pitt, giving Duke 31 minutes and hitting 5-of-10 from the field, including a career-high three made three-pointers, for 15 points.
- » He also logged four rebounds, three assists and a steal.

- Johnson has produced three of Duke's four highest-scoring halves this season, including 18 of his career-high 24 points in the second half at Pitt.
- He poured in 16 of his 18 after halftime in the Georgia Tech win and 15 of his 19 in the first half against Coppin State.
- Matthew Hurt had 15 points in the first half at Louisville.

### JOHNSON MAKES STATEMENT IN RETURN

- Johnson logged 33 productive minutes at Pitt, scoring a career-high 24 points with 16 rebounds, seven assists, no turnovers, four blocked shots and two steals.
- It marked his second career double-double, after posting 19 points and 19 rebounds in the season-opener versus Coppin State.

### CLUTCH LATE AGAINST JACKETS

- » Goldwire scored 11 points with seven assists and one turnover in Tuesday's win over Georgia Tech.
- » The senior stepped up late with a key steal of Jose Alvarado with Duke up 69-68 with 1:01 left, then hit a pair of clutch free throws to give Duke a 71-68 lead with 47 seconds remaining.

- Matthew Hurt added 25 pounds to his frame in the off-season, and the bulked-up Hurt is second in the ACC in scoring (49th nationally) at 19.2 points per game.
- Hurt leads the ACC in conference-only scoring at 19.3 points.
