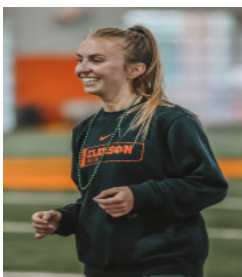

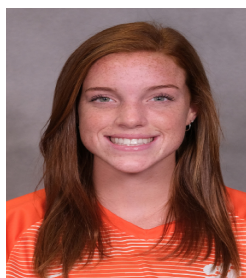

GAME 1 - MIAMI

RECAP

Jacksonville, Fla. - The Clemson women's soccer team put on an offensive showing in its season opener as they downed the Miami Hurricanes 4-0 in a neutral-site, non-conference match to move to 1-0 on the season.

"We are just really grateful for the opportunity to be able to play," said Head Coach Eddie Radwanski. "Our group has spent a lot of time playing each other in scrimmages and practices so they were just ready to face an opponent. It's always nice to get the win, get the shutout, and create scoring opportunities, so it is nice for the kids to see their hard work pay off."

After leading the Hurricanes in shots by an 8-0 margin midway through the first half, senior Mariana Speckmaier picked up her 24th career goal off a header in the box sent in by Caroline Conti. It was just a minute later that Megan Bornkamp added her name to the scorebook with her first collegiate goal as Courtney Jones and Lauren Bruns picked up their first points of the fall.

The Tigers were able to carry the momentum into the second half as Renee Guion found the back of the net for her second career goal off a feed from Speckmaier. Another Clemson newcomer would close out the scoring for the night as Sami Meredith connected for a volley from Harper White's touch.

"We feel like we are going to be a lot more balanced," Radwanski spoke on the attack. "We have more attacking options than we have ever had - I'm pleased with our depth and know that everyone who steps on the field

has the ability to contribute."

GAME 2 - VIRGINIA TECH

RECAP

Clemson, S.C. - The Clemson women's soccer team (2-0, 1-0) earned a 3-0 victory over Virginia Tech (0-2, 0-1) on Thursday night at Historic Riggs Field to open ACC play. Caroline Conti led the team in scoring with two goals on the night. Following tonight's win, Clemson has outscored its first two opponents by a 7-0 margin.

"Grateful and excited to play at Historic Riggs Field again," said Head Coach Eddie Radwanski. "It was a good match for us - we needed to have a game where we got pushed, challenged and had some adversity to deal with. I think both teams enjoyed being back out and competing."

The first half saw Clemson outshoot Virginia Tech by an 8-2 margin, with five of the shots put on net. The Tigers' best opportunity of the half came when Maliah Morris took a penalty kick after being fouled at the top of the box moments after beating her defender with a skillful touch. Morris' attempt was saved by Virginia Tech's Alia Skinner.

The second half saw the Tigers' scoring erupt, with Conti netting the first and third goals for the Tigers. This was the first multi-goal game of Conti's career. A Virginia Tech own-goal in the 67th minute rounded out the scoring summary on the night. In total, the Tigers logged 16 shots during the 90-minute match.

In net, Hensley Hancuff recorded her second shutout of the season and made three saves.

"It was wonderful to see Hensley [Hancuff] come and throw her body around and make some great saves and earn back-to-back shutouts," said Radwanski.

Clemson won the possession battle between the two sides, holding 55% of the ball with the majority being spent in the Tigers' own attacking third. Clemson played a total of 16 players Thursday evening.

GAME 3 - VIRGINIA

RECAP

Clemson, S.C. - The Clemson women's soccer team (3-0-0, 2-0-0 ACC) defeated the Virginia Cavaliers (1-1-1, 0-1-1 ACC) by a final score of 3-0 at Historic Riggs Field on Sunday afternoon. The Tigers had three different players contribute to the scoresheet, while Hensley Hancuff extended her shutout streak to three consecutive matches. This is the Tigers' largest margin of victory against the Cavaliers since a 4-0 victory at Historic Riggs Field in 2001.

"Today's game was a collective decision by the team to come out to compete and to win," said Head Coach Eddie Radwanski. "You want to beat a good team and they were a No. 1 team last year - I have great respect for Steve [Swanson] and his program. We say the best is yet to come for Clemson and this is what we're doing."

The Tigers' opening goal came off of a beautifully orchestrated counterattack in the 4th minute of play, as Mariana Speckmaier dribbled the ball down the touchline and handed it off to Maliah Morris who crossed the ball right on to Caroline Conti's head. Conti's goal was her third of the season and made her the Tigers' leading scorer.

In the second half, Clemson displayed their dominance on the ball by adding two goals and controlling the pace

of play for the entirety of the half. In the 58th minute, Courtney Jones put away her first goal of the season to extend the Tigers' lead. In the closing minutes of the match, Megan Bornkamp converted from the penalty spot for the Tigers' final goal of the match and her second of the season.

Hancuff logged another shutout in net, making a season-high five saves against the Cavaliers. Hancuff's save of the match came in the 54th minute, as the junior was forced to lay out to stop a close-range header from Virginia's Diana Ordonez.

"We feel like we have great goalkeepers overall," said Radwanski. "Hensley is playing like a pro - she has her head down and is working at getting better and she's of the growth mindset. Having a presence like her back there is comforting."

Following today's match, Clemson has scored seven of their 10 goals this season in the second half of their matches. Morris' service to Conti for the Tigers' opening goal was her second assist of the season, a category which she now leads the team in.

In his 10 seasons at Clemson, Radwanski is now 22-0 when his team scores three or four goals in a match and improved to 90-6-4 when his Tigers score first.

ACC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

RELEASE

Greensboro, N.C. - After starting the season 3-0 (2-0 ACC), the Tigers racked up their first individual accolades of the 2020 season as sophomore midfielder Caroline Conti and junior goalkeeper Hensley Hancuff were named as ACC Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week, respectively. With Conti and Hancuff claiming positional honors, it marks the first time in program history that the Tigers have swept the ACC Players of the Week since the conference began naming both in 2015 and the first time a team has swept the awards outright since North Carolina grabbed both honors on Sept. 18, 2018.

Conti, who tallied two goals and two assists in 2019, kicked off her sophomore campaign with three goals and an assist across the first three games of the season. In the opening weekend of 2020, she recorded an assist on Mariana Speckmaier's season-opening goal. By just the second game, she opened up her lethal attack, netting two goals against Virginia Tech for her first multi-goal game of her career. The Greenville, S.C. native solidified her ACC Offensive Player of the Week nod by finding the back of the net on a perfectly placed header in the 4th minute against the Cavaliers, marking back-to-back game-winning goals.

Hancuff, a Villanova transfer and former BIG EAST All-Freshman team member, has started her Clemson career with 256 scoreless minutes across her three starts between the posts. The Edmond, Okla. native has recorded nine saves to start the season with a season-high five coming against Virginia. With two solo shutouts and a combined shutout under her belt, Hancuff sits just one shutout away from tying her career-high mark for a single-season.

Collectively, the match against Virginia was the Tigers' largest margin of victory against the Cavaliers since a 4-0 victory in 2001. Hancuff was the first goalkeeper to shut out the high-powered Virginia offense since Oct. 21, 2018.

GAME 4 - #1 NORTH CAROLINA

RECAP

Chapel Hill, N.C. - The #3 Clemson women's soccer team (3-1-0, 2-1-0) was handed its first loss of the 2020 season, falling 0-2 to the #1 North Carolina Tar Heels (4-0-0, 4-0-0) in Chapel Hill, N.C.

"It was a learning game for us - being a young team," said Head Coach Eddie Radwanski. "Our quality wasn't quite where it needed to be, especially for playing a good team."

With both sides splitting chances in the opening minutes of the nationally-ranked match up, North Carolina would find themselves on the board first in the 6th minute of play. A rushing Isabel Cox sent a centering ball from the goalline as freshman Sam Meza finished the play, just out of the reach of Clemson's Hensley Hancuff.

Prior to Meza's goal, the Tigers had accumulated 270 scoreless minutes across their opening three games while outscoring opponents 10-0.

In the 27th minute, a penalty kick was awarded to North Carolina following a handball in the box. Rachel Jones successfully converted the attempt to put the Tar Heels up by two, but neither side would find any additional scoring opportunities for the remainder of the half. Clemson showed a strong response in the second half of play, but the final 45 minutes would see no change to the scoreline, handing Clemson its first loss of the 2020 season.

Statistically, the Tar Heels held the advantage in shots (13-6), shots on goal (5-2), and corners (6-1). Megan Bornkamp led the Tigers' attack with three shots while Hensley Hancuff played all 90 minutes and tallied three saves.

"This is part of our journey and we have to learn from it," said Radwanski. "We will learn from it and get ready for our game against Duke on Sunday."

GAME 5 - #11 DUKE

RECAP

Durham, N.C. - The No. 3 Clemson (3-2-0, 2-2-0) women's soccer team fought until the final whistle but could not even the scoreline as No. 11 Duke (2-1-2, 1-1-2) downed the Tigers in Durham, N.C. by a 0-1 score.

"Disappointed in the result, but not disappointed in the effort displayed by the team," said Head Coach Eddie Radwanski on the performance. "We had our chances, but just needed to put one of those away to solve it."

Entering the match, forward Sami Meredith and goalkeeper Halle Mackiewicz received their first career starts. Meredith, who averaged 45 minutes off the bench in the first four matches, recorded 86 minutes in Sunday's game while Mackiewicz saw her first bout of action in any form against the Blue Devils while playing a full 90 between the posts.

In the 30th minute the Blue Devils would find the eventual game winner as a sliding Olivia Migli was able to connect and find the far side of the net.

Trying to find the equalizer, Clemson came into the final half with speed as they outshot Duke 8-3. The final 45 minutes of play also gave the Tigers a slew of opportunities from the corner, managing to force six in the second half alone.

"I was proud of the performance particularly in the second

half," said Radwanski. "I thought we played with a lot of energy and decisiveness. You're banging on the door and don't get anything from it, but we will learn from this experience."

Overall, the Tigers outshot the Blue Devils by a 10-5 margin while also edging the Durham squad 8-4 in corners. Clemson will return home for their next opponent as they face Wake Forest on Oct. 11 for a 3:30 p.m. match on ACCN. The match against the Demon Deacons will also honor Clemson's four seniors Kimber Haley, Abigail Mitchell, Mariana Speckmaier, and Audrey Viso.

SENIOR DAY RECOGNITION

Sunday's match against the Wake Forest Demon Deacons at Historic Riggs Field will honor Clemson's four seniors: #9 Audrey Viso, #11 Kimber Haley, #14 Abigail Mitchell, and #17 Mariana Speckmaier.

Throughout their collective time at Clemson, the honored seniors have competed in three consecutive NCAA Tournaments, earned notable wins against #4 Virginia and #7 South Carolina, and been selected as All-ACC recipients both on the field and in the classroom. Most importantly, they have embodied what it means to be a Clemson Tiger.

GAME 6 - WAKE FOREST (SENIOR DAY)

RECAP

Clemson, S.C. - The Clemson women's soccer team got back in the win column on Sunday afternoon with a 2-0 win over Wake Forest at Historic Riggs Field. With the win, the Tigers move to 4-2-0 overall with a 3-2-0 mark within conference play.

With the Tigers pressuring the Wake Forest defense, a service was placed into the middle of the box which deflected off a defender, putting Clemson up 1-0 in the 14th minute. Taking the early lead, Clemson brought on a series of substitutions in the 30th minute which included senior Mariana Speckmaier. Forcing a corner just four minutes later, Renee Guion sent a ball to the far side of the box which found the head of Speckmaier to extend Clemson's lead to two heading into halftime. The goal would be the 25th of the Miami native's career, bringing her to 56 career points.

"It was poetic," said Head Coach Eddie Radwanski. "She showed why she's an All-ACC type of player. When you're in games like this and to have a player like that step on the field and contribute I was really happy for her, especially it being Senior Day."

Despite leading the Demon Deacons by a two-goal margin at halftime, Wake Forest outshot the Tigers 12-8 in the match. Hancuff, who tied her career-high mark with 8 saves in the game, recorded five in the first half alone.

"It gives the team an awful lot of confidence knowing that you have someone like Hensley back there," said Radwanski. "When you have a quality goalkeeper like that, they can keep you in games like this and other big games that are coming down the line."

GAME 7 - #14 NOTRE DAME

RECAP

Notre Dame, Ind. - The No. 4 Clemson women's soccer team extended its win streak to two with a 2-1 win over No. 14 Notre Dame on the road. The Tigers improve their overall record to 5-2-0 with a 4-2-0 mark within

conference play.

"If you get three points in a win on the road in the ACC it's well deserved and never easy," said Head Coach Eddie Radwanski. "This was our first win at Notre Dame and we had to pull out a little Clemson grit to get it but it was a great win, collectively."

Just 12 minutes into the match, Hal Hershfelt took a feed from Lauren Bruns before firing a shot from inside the box to the far-side of the net past the Notre Dame keeper. The goal marked Hershfelt's first of the 2020 season. Despite the early goal, the remainder of the first half would remain quiet from both sides on the scoresheet as the Tigers entered the locker room with a 1-0 advantage.

Coming into the second half, Notre Dame's Ospeck was able to net the equalizer in the 46th minute after securing the ball after an initial play was slowed by the foot of Hensley Hancuff. Her tying goal would stand until the 83rd minute.

With under 10 minutes to play, the Tigers strung together a play which sent Lauren Bruns up the side of the field who fed a ball to Megan Bornkamp inside the Notre Dame box. After an initial attempt was blocked, the freshman regained possession and sent a ball past the backline.

"Lauren helped keep the ball alive and Megan got a nice finish there," stated Radwanski. "We also got some really great play from Hensley again in goal — she is really someone that can manage the game back there."

GAME 8 - PITT

RECAP

Clemson, S.C. -- The No. 3 Clemson Tigers (6-2, 5-2 ACC) defeated the Pittsburgh Panthers (9-4, 3-4 ACC) at Historic Riggs Field on Thursday night in overtime by a score of 2-1 thanks to a spectacular brace from freshman Megan Bornkamp. Despite starting at center back for the Tigers, Bornkamp recorded her first career multi-goal game and her fifth goal of the season.

"Everything we do is to try and get better and it is safe to say we got better from this game," said Head Coach Eddie Radwanski.

The opening 45 minutes of the match passed quickly as sharp passing and precise runs from Clemson's pace-filled forwards allowed the Tigers to dictate the speed of play. Courtney Jones and Hal Hershfelt were dynamic in the Tigers' midfield, with the two helping to control the match from the onset while holding the majority of possession. Clemson registered 10 shots in the opening half and forced Pittsburgh's Caitlyn Lazzarini into making three saves. As a result of the Tigers' potent attack, the team earned seven corners as opposed to the Panthers' one.

The nil-nil deadlock was broken by Pittsburgh in the 49th minute via an Amanda West goal on a counter-attack opportunity.

The Panthers' lead was short-lived however, as Bornkamp guided the ball into the back of the net with her head amongst a congested six-yard box. The initial opportunity was created via a Makenna Morris corner kick, and after having her initial header saved by Lazzarini, Bornkamp left no doubt while meeting the rebound, drawing the Tigers level at 1-1.

The two sides battled hard through the remaining time in regulation, as both teams created quality opportunities in their respective attacking thirds.

Just 67 seconds into their first overtime match of the season, the Tigers went back to what worked earlier in the match in search of a game winner. Another Guion corner kick found the head of a soaring Bornkamp on the back post as the freshman fired the ball into the back of the net to end the match. Bornkamp has now scored three of her five goals this season in the Tigers' last two matches.

This is the second-consecutive match against Pittsburgh that Clemson has scored the game-winning goal in the 92nd minute. Hershfelt was responsible for the deciding score when the two teams met in 2019.

Clemson saw a total of 15 players earn time in the match with eight logging a full 92 minutes of action. Hensley Hancuff made five saves in net during tonight's contest. The result secured the Tigers a perfect record at home during the 2020 fall season, improving to 4-0 at Historic Riggs Field.

"Riggs is a special place," stated Radwanski. "It isn't called Historic Riggs Field for nothing. Even though we have a limited number of fans, you can feel the energy in this place - a lot of credit goes to Central Spirit."

GAME 9 - #2 FLORIDA STATE

RECAP

Tallahassee, Fla. - The Clemson women's soccer team dropped its regular season finale by a 0-2 scoreline to the No. 2 Florida State Seminoles. The match was Clemson's fourth, ranked opponent in the 2020 fall season as they move to 6-3-0 overall with a 5-3-0 record within conference play.

"Playing Florida State on their home field is always a difficult affair," said 10th-year head coach Eddie Radwanski. "This was a good game for us. I was pleased with our attitude and commitment from the team and couldn't ask for anything more from them in terms of that."

The first half of play remained silent as both sides were unable to find the back of the net. Florida State tallied three shots in the first half which led to two diving saves made by freshman netminder Halle Mackiewicz who received her second career start in a Clemson uniform. In her first season representing the Tigers, both of Mackiewicz's starts have come in ranked matches as her first appearance came against No. 11 Duke back in October.

The second half kept the same defensive style of play as the sides went back and forth on possession and chances generated. It took until the 78th minute for the silence to be broken as Florida State notched the first goal of the game off the foot of Jody Brown. The Seminoles added on in the final minute of action as Brown tallied her second goal of the match.

Mackiewicz closed out the evening with a season-high eight saves, the second-highest mark recorded by a Clemson goalkeeper in 2020.

GAME 10 - ACC QUARTERFINALS (DUKE)

RECAP

Cary, N.C. - The 4-seeded Clemson squad came up just short in the ACC Quarterfinals as they fell by a score of 1-0 to 5-seeded Duke. The quarterfinal match was the third time in history that the Tigers and Blue Devils have met up in the ACC Championship, both of those matches came in the semifinals in 2000 and 2002, respectively.

"You have two good teams that are going after it," said 10th-year head coach Eddie Radwanski who currently sits at 99 career wins at Clemson. "You can't fault our kids for their commitment and effort on the field — everybody left it out there."

Despite sharing chances in the first half, none were enough to put either team on top before entering the locker room. Clemson's first-half offensive charge came from the connection of Maliah and Makenna Morris who set the pace for the match quickly with key rushes in the final third.

"I thought we got off to a very good start to the game — we were dictating the pace and tempo," said Radwanski. "We got into the 18-yard box on a number of occasions to create opportunities, but our final product wasn't quite what we needed to be. That is something we are just going to have to get better at but it was encouraging to see."

It took until the 51st minute for either side to contribute on the goal log as Duke broke through after a near-side deflected ball from Karlie Paschall was able to sneak by Hensley Hancuff. Beginning to build the momentum, Makenna Morris produced a rush in the attacking third which in turn forced a corner kick in the Tigers' favor. A curling shot sent in by Renee Guion hit the hand of Duke's goalkeeper Ruthie Jones and aided into the net. The should've been equalizing goal and game-changing play of the match was waved off. Unable to level the match after the play, the 1-0 decision marked the 16th time that a match between the two sides has been decided by one goal.

Maliah Morris led the Tigers in offense, contributing four shots and one shot on goal across her 59 minutes of play. 15 players earned minutes as five of those players played the entirety of the match.

With the ACC Championship run coming to an end, the Tigers have closed out the fall slate with a 6-4-0 overall record. The focus will shift ahead as the NCAA Championship will be played in the spring of 2021 in lieu of the fall season

GAME 11 - COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON

RECAP

Mt. Pleasant, S.C. - The Clemson women's soccer team started the spring season with a dominant 4-1 win over College of Charleston (0-2-0, 0-0-0) to move their overall record to 7-4-0. The win marked the 100th victory at Clemson for the coaching staff of Eddie Radwanski, Jeff Robbins, and Siri Mullinix who have led the program for the last decade.

"A lot of credit to the players and teams I have had the pleasure of coaching," said Radwanski on the milestone. "A big thanks goes to Jeff and Siri for coming along for this journey. You're not going to be successful without the right people, but really the teams are the ones that make these things happen. To do it at a place like Clemson is really special."

Maliah Morris started the offensive chances for the Tigers, firing the first three Clemson shots within the opening ten minutes of the match. It was with her fourth shot attempt of the evening and in the 12th minute of the match that the sophomore connected a ball to put the Tigers up 1-0.

Holding the 7-2 shot advantage entering the second half, Clemson flexed its offensive arm as Morris knocked in her second goal of the night with a feed from Jackson Moehler, marking Moehler's first point of the season. The 58th minute goal to double the Tigers lead also gave Morris the first multi-goal game of her career.

With under 20 minutes remaining in the match, Caroline Conti secured a brace of her own, scoring in the 71st and 73d minute. It was the second, multi-goal game of the season for the Greenville, S.C. native and the second of her career after scoring twice in the 3-0 win over Virginia Tech in the fall. With five goals and an assist on the year, Conti propelled herself into a tie for the team lead for goals and points with freshman Megan Bornkamp.

Freshman Devi Dudley picked up her first collegiate point on Conti's brace, sending in an assist on her first goal. Courtney Jones was credited with the assist on Conti's second of the match, Jones's second assist in the 2020-21 season.

"One of the things we are trying to be conscious of is to feed our attacking players and get them opportunities to score," said Radwanski on the Tigers' explosive second half. "Today was a day you could see the rewards of that with two very good players. For both of them to get two goals tonight, that was the thing I was most happy about."

Facing four shots in the match, goalkeeper Halle Mackiewicz tallied the first win of her collegiate career to move her record to 1-2-0. Through the match, the Tigers outshot the opposition 14-4, landing six on target while both teams added two corners.

GAME 12 - COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON

RECAP

Mt. Pleasant, S.C. - The Clemson women's soccer team (8-4-0, 5-4-0) returned to the pitch on Sunday morning, defeating College of Charleston (0-3-0, 0-0-0) 4-1 to claim the sweep of the spring opening series.

"Coming out the weekend scoring eight goals is what you want to see from your team," said Head Coach Eddie Radwanski. "Overall, it was a great weekend with solid consistency and we are going to take these games to continue to get better."

College of Charleston struck first, taking a 1-0 lead in the sixth minute of the match. However, the high-scoring Clemson attack quickly found the equalizer as Caroline Conti knocked home a goalkeeper deflection inside the box in the 13th minute. Conti's goal was her third in two games and sixth of the season.

Just four minutes later, Charleston, S.C. native, Sami Meredith found her second of the season as she was able to connect on a cross sent in by Conti. Conti's assist, giving her a game total of three points, moved her career points total to 19, ranking second among active players behind Renee Guion's 20-point mark.

Holding the statistical advantage at half, the Tigers poured on the offense, netting two second half goals. Hal Hershfelt found her second of the season off a shot

from the top of the box, giving enough movement in the ball to sneak under the crossbar and past the College of Charleston keeper. Maliah Morris joined Conti with three goals across two games, scoring the Tigers' final goal of the day off a close-range strike after taking the ball in from the top of the box.

"Playing these games is a test for us because there are things we are working on while trying to grow and get better – not just attacking-wise, but overall as a team," said Radwanski. "Obviously there has been an emphasis on the attacking end, so to get this opportunity to play Furman in an exhibition and two games against College of Charleston is critical to our development."

NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Kansas City, MO. - Sophomore Caroline Conti was named as the Division I Women's National Player of the Week, announced by United Soccer Coaches on Tuesday. It is the first national recognition for the Greenville, S.C. native.

"I'm honored for this recognition, but I wouldn't be here without the work and support of all of my teammates and coaches," said Conti. "I am excited for what's coming for us this season and ready for much more work to do – humble and hungry."

Netting a brace in the spring opener, Conti added another goal and an assist on Sunday's match against the Cougars, pushing her two-game total to seven points. Her brace marked the second multi-goal game of her young career after notching her first in the fall portion of the season against Virginia Tech.

The forward, who played her high school days with J.L. Mann Academy, while earning back-to-back South Carolina Gatorade Player of the Year nods, took over the team lead for goals and points with her performance over the weekend.

Throughout her two years on campus, Conti has recorded 20 career points, 14 of which have come in the 2020-21 season thus far.

United Soccer Coaches Players of the Week are a weekly recognition of the on-field accomplishments of players competing at the intercollegiate level. United Soccer Coaches names one male and one female recipient at all three NCAA levels and the two Junior College levels, selected from nominations submitted by sports information directors.

ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

RELEASE

Greensboro, N.C. - Sophomore forward Caroline Conti was named as the ACC Offensive Player of the Week on Wednesday, picking up the second ACC weekly honor of her career and the second of the 2020-21 season after being named in the fall portion of the season alongside teammate Hensley Hancuff.

The conference recognition comes after being named the United Soccer Coaches Division I Women's National Player of the Week on Tuesday.

Conti picked up where she left off in the spring season, recording seven points across the Tigers' opening two games against College of Charleston. The Greenville, S.C. native tallied a brace in Thursday's opening match before extending her point streak with a goal and an assist in the Tigers' sweep of the Cougars on Sunday.

As the team's current leader in goals and points, Conti has

played and started all 12 matches for the Clemson squad, totaling 802 minutes on the year.

In just her second year donning the Clemson Orange and Regalia, Conti has tallied 20 career points, 14 of which came throughout the current season.

GAME 13 - AUBURN

RECAP

Clemson, S.C. - The Clemson women's soccer team (9-4-0) picked up its fifth home win of the season in 1-0 fashion over the visiting Auburn Tigers (5-5-3). It was the 10th all-time matchup between the two sides and the ninth victory for the Clemson squad against Auburn in the series.

"Auburn is always a competitive team so we knew we were going to be in for a dog fight," said Head Coach Eddie Radwanski. "This was a gritty game, and we won the gritty game so this was a great win for our DNA as a team."

Sami Meredith nearly put the home side ahead late in the opening half, sending a tipped ball just over the crossbar, but play remained scoreless after the first 45 minutes of action after swapping attempts in the final third. With neither goalkeeper being forced to make a first half save, the teams entered the locker room with Clemson holding the edge in shots and corner kicks.

Mimicking the play of the first half, the two sides came out each sharing attempts within the box. Clemson added on the pressure with multiple through balls nearly connected but it took until the final 10 minutes of action for the deadlock to be broken.

With Clemson putting together a series of passes centralized outside of the 18-yard box, Hal Hershfelt sent a ball to Megan Bornkamp who took a touch and sent a shot to the lower corner of the net, beating the diving Auburn keeper. The 84th minute goal was Bornkamp's sixth of the season and team-leading third game-winning goal of the year.

GAME 14 - GEORGIA

RECAP

Clemson, S.C. - The No. 8 Clemson women's soccer team (10-4-0) picked up their 10th win of the season against the Georgia Bulldogs (3-7-2) by a 3-1 score led by a five-point night from Maliah Morris. Win No. 10 on the season gave Head Coach Eddie Radwanski his seventh consecutive year at the 10-win threshold and his 16th total across 20 years of collegiate coaching.

"We knew Georgia would come in and give us a great battle," said Radwanski. "It was a great response to a slow start on our part and really thought we managed the game quite well."

Just two minutes into the match, Georgia got on the board after a close-range shot from the right side of the box was able to slip by Hensley Hancuff who stepped out to challenge the play. Two minutes later, a goal kick opportunity by Hancuff reached past midfield where Sami Meredith met the ball with a header aimed towards the attacking third. A one-touch feed from Maliah Morris was greeted by the right foot of Caroline Conti who slotted home her team-leading seventh goal of the year. The primary assist by Morris was her fourth of the year, taking over the team lead in that category.

Not letting off the gas, Morris picked up a goal of her own in the 16th minute after a slide into the box coincided with the right-field service from Jackson Moehler. The Bulldogs and Tigers split possession time throughout the remainder of the first half with the home side entering the locker room with the 2-1 lead.

The two sides continued the aggressive battle in the second half, with play remaining silent until the 72nd minute. With the Tigers controlling the pace in the midfield, a series of passes between Meredith and Conti eventually found Morris who slipped past the Georgia defender and fired a well-struck ball to the far side of the net. It was the second, multi-goal game of her career after netting her first in the spring opener against College of Charleston. She moves her season total to five goals and four assists for 14 total points.

"[Maliah] was the 'Player of the Match,'" Radwanski said in response to the sophomore's play. "She was dangerous and the difference-maker in this game. She has put so much work in this season and the dividends are finally starting to payout."

This season the Tigers are 7-0-0 when leading at halftime and 6-0-0 when scoring either three or four goals in the match. Clemson improves their home record to 6-0-0 while only conceding two goals across those six matches.

ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

RELEASE

Greensboro, N.C. - Clemson picked up its fourth ACC Player of the Week honor of the 2020-21 season as Maliah Morris was named Offensive Player of the Week, announced by the conference office on Tuesday. It is the second ACC weekly award of the sophomore's career after earning her first in the 2019 season following her game-winning-goal to knock off No. 7 South Carolina.

In the Tigers' most recent matchup against Georgia, Morris netted a single-game, career-high five points courtesy of two goals and a primary assist. It is the most points recorded in a single game by a Clemson player since Oct. 21, 2018, when Mariana Speckmaier tallied a similar stat line against Virginia Tech. The Germantown, Md. native's five-point effort in the match propelled her into second on the team for total points with 14 while her brace marked the second, multi-goal game of her career after recording her first in the spring opener.

Morris has been a constant force in the Tigers' offense this season, leading the team in both shots (37) and shots on goal (17). In Clemson's four spring matches, Morris has scored five goals while adding two assists.

Kaitlyn Parks of Wake Forest joins Morris in the weekly honor, picking up this week's ACC Defensive Player of the Week award.

GAME 15 - ALABAMA

RECAP

Clemson, S.C. - The Clemson women's soccer team (11-4-0, 5-3 ACC) defeated the Alabama Crimson Tide (7-8-2, 2-5-2 SEC) by a 1-0 score, closing out its home slate for the 2020-21 season at 7-0-0. The perfect home record for this year's squad marks the first time in program history that a team has concluded their home season without suffering a loss or draw.

"This place is special and I think we all know that," 10th year Head Coach Eddie Radwanski spoke on the home season. "It's an honor to play here and represent Clemson

and really speaks volumes to the wins we had here this season. To be able to do it for the first time is a credit to the players and the work they have put in."

Within the opening ten minutes, Clemson added on the pressure, recording two shots on goal and a goalline push by Maliah Morris nearly resulting in a goal for the home side. Despite the strong offensive charge from the Tigers, both squads would enter halftime without finding the back of the net. The Tigers dictated play for a majority of the first half, landing three of their four shots on target.

Entering the final 45 minutes of regulation, the Tigers carried the momentum over as Maliah Morris headed a service from across the field within inches from besting the flailing arm of Alabama's goalkeeper McKinley Crone. With Crone able to get a piece of it, play remained scoreless. Clemson maintained the possession battle across the remainder of regulation and despite a series of chances nearly breaking the silence, the two sides headed into overtime.

In just their second overtime match of the season, and second at home, Clemson dominated play with much of the opening minutes being handled within the attacking third. A foul committed inside the box by Alabama's Reyna Reyes in the 98th minute placed junior Renee Guion on the penalty spot. Able to convert, Guion clinched the match for the Tigers, placing a well-struck ball to the bottom left of the net. The golden goal was Guion's second goal of the year and third of her career.

"We don't take winning for granted – winning is hard," said Radwanski. "Proud of our kids for working hard and being resilient in this match. This was almost like an NCAA Tournament game with how close it was."

14 players recorded minutes in the match as the Tigers led the Crimson Tide 11-8 in shots while freshman goalkeeper Halle Mackiewicz improved her record to 3-2-0 with four saves on the afternoon.

GAME 16 - SOUTH CAROLINA

RECAP

Columbia, S.C. - The No. 8/11 Clemson women's soccer team picked up their 12th win of the season as they downed in-state rival No. 11/9 South Carolina 2-1 at Stone Stadium on Saturday night. It marks the second consecutive year that the Tigers have defeated the Gamecocks after taking the 2019 match by a 1-0 margin and just the third time in the all-time series they have gone consecutive years with wins over South Carolina. Clemson moves to 12-4-0 on the season as South Carolina falls to 10-4-0.

"It's a great result for having two highly-ranked teams play each other," said Head Coach Eddie Radwanski. "What a great response from our kids – they went out there and did it with an incredible second half. To come down here and beat them on their field to cap off an undefeated spring is special."

In the opening half, the Tigers got off to a strong start, dictating play within the offensive third. However, a goal kick from South Carolina was deflected within the midfield and a rushing Corinna Zullo was able to break free and slot a ball to the lower-left corner of the net. Despite South Carolina holding the halftime advantage with its 28th-minute strike, Clemson led the first half with eight shots and forcing the Gamecock goalkeeper to make four saves.

Clemson dominated the second half of action with much of the play residing within the attacking third. It would take until the 72nd minute for the Tigers to find the equalizer after a Maliah Morris shot was saved with the ball being directed into the crossbar before Megan Bornkamp cleaned up the initial attempt for her seventh goal of the year.

Just 10 minutes later and off of a Renee Guion corner, Borkamp connected on a header that was able to beat the cluster of Gamecock defenders. The 82nd-minute goal gave Bornkamp her team-leading eighth goal of the season, moving her points total to 17, sitting in a tie for the team lead with Caroline Conti. The assist was Guion's fourth of the season, a mark that ties Morris for the team lead in that category.

The Tigers landed nine of their 18 total shots on target while holding the Gamecocks to six shots total with only one recorded shot in the second half of action.
