PRESEASON ALL-BIG SOUTH

- Sophomore guard Rayshon Harrison was named preseason First Team All-Big South. Last season, Harrison was Big South Conference Freshman of the Year, Second Team All-Big South and to the Big South All-Freshman team. Harrison averaged 17.3 points and 5.6 rebounds per game.

COACH FERRELL - Head coach Quinton is in his third season as head coach. Ferrell has a longtime association with Presbyterian as a former standout player for Presbyterian from 2003-07 and assistant coach from 2007-12.

Coach Ferrell's first game as the Presbyterian coach came on the road at Clemson, November 7, 2019.

RETURNERS - The Blue Hose return five starters and 11 letterwinners off last season's team. Returning starters: Rayshon Harrison, Owen McCormack, seniors guard Brandon Younger (6.9 ppg, 4.9 rpg) and forward Winston Hill (12.1 ppg, 6.1 rpg) and junior guard Trevon Reddish-Rhone (10.2 ppg, 3.9 rpg).

- Presbyterian plays VMI in their home opener on Friday, November 12. The Blue Hose will play 14 home games in the Templeton Center.

Head Coach Quinton Ferrell Third Season

Quinton Ferrell is in his third season as head coach, and eighth overall as a member of the PC coaching staff, having served as an assistant coach from 2007-2012.

Ferrell, who helped Presbyterian College to a NCAA Division II Tournament appearance in 2005 and two 20-win seasons in his four years as a student-athlete, returned to his alma mater as the 19th head coach in men's basketball program history April 11, 2019.

COACHING CAREER AT PRESBYTERIAN

In his first season, the Blue Hose finished the 2019-20 season 10-22 overall and 7-11 in the league. The 10 overall wins tied for seventh in the PC DI record book for total victories, the seven conference wins, tied for fourth. PC experienced a five-game winning streak last season, which tied for the longest winning streak since the 2017 season when the team picked up five straight.

In his second season during the COVID-19 pandemic, the Blue Hose finished the 2020-21 season 7-15 overall and 5-12 in the Big South Conference with six losses coming by six points or less. Rayshon Harrison was named Big South Conference Freshman of the Year, Second Team All-Big South Conference as well as being named a CollegeInsider.com Freshman All-American. Owen McCormack earned Big South Conference All-Academic team honors.

PREVIOUS COACHING EXPERIENCE

Ferrell came to PC after five seasons as an assistant coach at College of Charleston, where he had major responsibility in recruiting, scouting and developing perimeter players. Promoted to lead assistant in 2018-19, he worked with several standout players, including 2019 Colonial Athletic Association First Team All-Conference selections Jarrell Brantley and Grant Riller, as well as one of the best players in school history Joe Chealey, who garnered several awards during his time at CofC, including multiple CAA and NABC All-Conference honors, the Lou Henson All-American team, and became the third Cougar to play in the NBA.

The Cougars finished 2018-19 with a 24-9 overall record, its third straight 20+ win season, including non-conference victories over Rhode Island, VCU and Memphis.

In 2017-18, the Cougars made a memorable run that included the program's second-straight 25-win campaign, an impressive 26-8 overall record and 14-4 mark in CAA play. The co-regular-season champions won the CAA Men's Basketball Championship and earned their first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 1999. Brantley was named to the All-CAA Second Team and Cameron Johnson to the CAA All-Defensive Team for the third year in a row.

Of the 13 scholarship players CofC had in 2019-20, Ferrell was responsible for signing 11 of them, and helped Head Coach Earl Grant resurrect a team that won nine games in 2014-15, to three straight 20+ winning seasons.

In 2016-17, the Cougars posted a 25-10 overall record, marking the program's first 20-win campaign since 2013. Charleston advanced to the championship game of the CAA Tournament for the first time since CofC joined the Colonial in 2013. The Cougars were also selected and made their fifth all-time appearance in the Postseason NIT. It was their first postseason berth (NCAA or NIT) since 2011.

In 2015-16 Ferrell helped develop four all-conference players including CAA All-Freshman team selection Marquis Pointer, as well as Rookie of the Year and All-CAA Third Team selection Brantley, the first freshman to receive such honors since 2006. CofC went 9-4 in non-conference action, including an upset of LSU and projected No. 1 NBA Draft pick Ben Simmons.

Prior to CofC, Ferrell served as an assistant coach at Army for one season under head coach Zach Spiker. The Black Knights recorded a program-best 10 conference wins in the Patriot League in 2013-14 and also turned in back-to-back winning seasons in league play for the first time in school history. He mentored unanimous First Team All-Patriot League selection Kyle Wilson and Patriot League All-Rookie Team member Tanner Omlid.

During the 2012-13 season, Ferrell served as an assistant coach at The Citadel under head coach Chuck Driesell. He worked with the Bulldogs' perimeter players, while holding major responsibility in recruiting, opponent scouting and the monitoring of players' academic progress. Ferrell worked with developing Citadel point guard Marshall Harris III, who handed out the second-most single-season assists (155) in program history, and recruited Southern Conference All-Freshman Team member Brian White.

Prior to his tenure at The Citadel, Ferrell spent five years as an assistant coach at PC. In addition to working with both perimeter and post players, he was responsible for a wide variety of tasks including recruiting, scouting, team travel, equipment and academics.

In 2007-08, Ferrell helped the Blue Hose transition from NCAA Division II status into the NCAA Division I ranks, and was part of a staff which engineered victories over Auburn, Wake Forest and 20th-ranked Cincinnati during his time in Clinton, S.C.. He recruited the top two scorers in school history in Khalid Mutakabbir (1,576 points) and Al'Lonzo Coleman (1,501 points), who went on to earn All-Big South Conference honors twice.

COLLEGIATE PLAYING CAREER

Ferrell joined the Blue Hose coaching staff the first time around after a productive four years on the PC men's basketball team. A three-year starter at point guard for PC, Ferrell is regarded as one of the best defenders to ever play at PC under former head coach Gregg Nibert.

Ferrell was on the 2005-06 Blue Hose basketball team that advanced to the NCAA Division II South Atlantic Regional Semifinals. He was also a senior captain on the 2006-07 Blue Hose squad that finished with 20 wins for the second consecutive season and led the Blue Hose in assists and steals in each of his final two seasons and was twice named the program's Most Valuable Defensive Player.

EDUCATION

Ferrell graduated from Presbyterian with a degree in accounting in 2007.

PREP PLAYING CAREER

Ferrell attended North Augusta High School and graduated in 2003. He was named South Carolina All-State after a senior season where he averaged 17 points, eight rebounds, and eight assists. After the completion of his senior year, he participated in the North Carolina/South Carolina All-Star Game.

FAMILY

Ferrell is married to the former Kimberly Turner, of Augusta, Ga., and the couple has a son, Qaiden Mauricio (5) and a daughter, Keziah Renata (3).

NICK LAGROONE ASSISTANT COACH

Nick Lagroone is in his fourth season as an assistant coach at Presbyterian.

Before joining the coaching staff at Presbyterian, Lagroone spent the previous three seasons as an assistant coach at Southeast Missouri State following a year as the Director of Basketball Operations for the Redhawks. At SEMO, he helped recruit multiple high school players of the year from various states.

Lagroone helped develop perimeter players, including OVC Freshman of the Year Denzel Mahoney and two-time All-OVC honoree Antonius Cleveland, who has played with the Dallas Mavericks and Atlanta Hawks in the NBA and is currently on the Texas Legends, the G-League affiliate of the Dallas Mavericks.

As Director of Basketball Operations, Lagroone handled all the day-to-day operations of the team, assisted with scheduling practice and skill workouts, on-campus recruiting, team travel, academics, camps, video, and other duties.

Prior to Southeast, he coached one season at Greenforest-McCaleb Christian Academy in Atlanta, Georgia. The team tied a school record with 27 wins during the season and set a school record with 22 wins in a row. Greenforest won the regular season and region title, as well as the Chick-Fil-A Classic in Columbia, S.C., and was Class A State Runner-up with Lagroone at the helm. Eight players from that team are now playing in Division I.

Prior to being the head coach at Greenforest, Lagroone was a graduate assistant at Mississippi State, where he earned a Master's degree in Educational Leadership in 2014.

Lagroone played four years (2007-11) as a guard at Southern Wesleyan University in Central, South Carolina. He was a two-time NAIA All-American and three-time Southern States Athletic Conference honoree. Lagroone finished his college career with 1,645 points and ranked among the top 10 in the NAIA in scoring his final two seasons. He earned his Bachelor's degree in Physical Education in 2011.

Lagroone and his wife, Brittany, have a son, Braylen.



TOM TANKELEWICZ ASSISTANT COACH

Tom Tankelewicz is in his first season at PC as assistant coach after spending five seasons as a member of the coaching staff at UNCG including the last two seasons as Director of Basketball Operations. Tankelewicz served his first two seasons as a graduate assistant manager working across various areas of the program including operations, video exchange and team/player video scouting before serving as Video Coordinator for the 2018-19 season.

During his tenure with UNCG, Tankelewicz helped the Spartans achieve unprecedented levels of success as the Spartans won at least 20 games four-straight years for the first time in school history. The Spartans finished 23-9 (13-5) and reached the Southern Conference tournament quarterfinals during the 2019-20 season.

With Tankelewicz's assistance, UNCG won a program-record 29 games and was the No. 1-overall seed in the National Invitation Tournament (NIT) in the 2018-19 campaign. During the 2017-18 season, UNCG collected team records in overall wins (27), home wins (16) and Southern Conference wins (15) en route to regular season and conference tournament titles. UNCG reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 17 years, narrowly falling to Gonzaga in the first round 68-64.

In the 2016-17 season, Tankelewicz helped the Spartans win the Southern Conference regular season championship. The Spartans won 25 games that season, including a 14-4 mark in league play. UNCG advanced to the postseason for the second-straight year, earning the Southern Conference's automatic bid into the National Invitation Tournament (NIT).

In the summer of 2018, Tankelewicz was selected to serve as an Assistant Coach on the USA College All Stars. The head coach was Larry Brown (the only coach in basketball history to win both an NCAA National Championship with Kansas Jayhawks in 1988 and an NBA title with Detroit Pistons in 2004). Th

Tankelewicz returned to the Southern Conference with UNCG after being a three-year letter winner for Western Carolina (2011-14). Tankelewicz finished his career playing in 93 career games, making 36 starts and averaging 7.2 points per game during time in Cullowhee.

In 2012-13, he led the Southern Conference with 80 made 3-pointers, which ranks seventh in a single-season in Western Carolina history. He holds the single season record for most 3-pointers in a game by going 10-of-18 vs. Charleston Southern. Prior to Western Carolina, he played one season for Charleston Southern where he played in 20 games and averaged 5.5 points per game.

After his playing career ended at WCU, he played one season (2014-15) professionally with the KB Bashkimi Prizren Basketball Club. He was named to the All-Kosovo Super League Team following the year.

Tankelewicz earned his Bachelor's Degree from Western Carolina in criminal justice in 2014 and graduated with his Master's Degree in Liberal Studies from UNCG in 2018.



ERIC WILSON ASSISTANT COACH

Eric Wilson is in his first season as assistant coach at Presbyterian after spending the last two seasons as an assistant coach at the College of Charleston.

Prior to joining the College of Charleston coaching staff, Wilson spent four seasons at North Carolina Central University where he helped head coach LeVelle Moten lead the Eagles to three-consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Championship titles and NCAA Tournament appearances in 2017, 2018 and 2019.

During the 2016-17 season, the Eagles put together one of the best seasons in school history with a 25-9 overall record and a 13-3 mark in conference play. NCCU captured its third MEAC Regular-Season Championship and second MEAC Tournament Championship within a four-year span to make its second-ever NCAA Tournament appearance as a NCAA Division I member school.

The Eagles also made history claiming their first win over an SEC opponent with a wire-to-wire 62-52 win at Missouri. Taking pride in their defense, they also ranked second in the nation in three-point defense allowing just 29.0 percent made attempts.

Prior to NCCU, Wilson spent six years on the coaching staff of his alma mater, Western Carolina. From 2009 to 2010, he was Director of Basketball Operations for the program, before being elevated to Assistant Coach and Recruiting Coordinator in 2010.

A former four-year point guard and defensive specialist for the Catamounts from 2004 to 2008, he played in 109 career games with 56 starts and averaged 4.2 points, 2.6 rebounds and 1.2 assists per game. Wilson graduated in 2008 from Western Carolina University's College of Business.

Following his graduation from WCU, he accepted his first coaching position in August of 2008 as an assistant coach (and later interim head coach) at NAIA-member Truett McConnell University in Cleveland, Ga. There, Wilson helped lead the Bears to a 20-win season and the conference semifinals. Three players from that squad were also named to the Georgia All-State Team.

The Lincolnton, North Carolina native is a 2004 graduate of Lincolnton High School where he closed out his prep career with 1,917 career points. Wilson was also runner-up for the North Carolina 2A Mr. Basketball Award and was a two-time Midwest Athletic Conference Player of the Year.

Wilson and his wife, Kate, are the proud parents of Asher James and Ezekiel "Zeke" Kai.
