TUESDAY'S GAME: After a 10-day layoff, the RedHawks resume action by rounding out a two-game road stretch at Clemson on Tuesday, Dec. 14. Game time is set for 7 p.m.

ABOUT CLEMSON: The Tigers enter Tuesday's game with a 6-4 record and are coming off a 90-80 overtime win against Drake on Saturday. Clemson has used the same starting line up in all 10 games and all five starters are averaging double figures in scoring. PJ Hall averages a team-leading 14.7 ppg and also averages 6.2 rpg, while David Collins paces the Tigers with 6.7 rpg and also averages 11.4 ppg.

THE SERIES WITH THE TIGERS: Tuesday marks the second meeting with Clemson. The last meeting between the teams was in Kansas City, Mo., on March 14, 1997 in the first round of the NCAA Midwest Regional. Clemson notched a 68-56 win.

UP NEXT: Miami returns home for a two-game stretch, beginning with a 2 p.m. game against Bellarmine on Saturday, Dec. 18. The RedHawks then host Spalding at 2 p.m. on Tuesday, Dec. 21.

TELEVISION: Saturday's game will be aired on ESPN+ and ACCNX.

BROWN POISED TO OWN BOTH GAMES STARTED AND PLAYED RECORDS: Breaking Ron Harper's record of 118 for career starts with a start at Indiana State on Dec. 4 and tying Geovonie McKnight's record for career games played (126) during that outing, senior forward **Dalonte Brown** is set to be the record holder in both categories in his next game. Brown's 119 career starts are the new Miami record, and his next appearance will be the 127th of his career to also break that record.

CENTURY CLUB: Senior forward **Precious Ayah** and senior guard **Isaiah Coleman-Lands** became the latest members of Miami's Century Club, playing in their 100th career games against Cincinnati on Dec. 1. Each has now played in 101 career games. Senior forward **Dalonte Brown** is already a member of Miami's Century Club for games played (126). One other RedHawk also is closing in on joining them: senior guard **Mekhi Lairy** (95).

MIAMI RECORD BOOK LINK

CHART CLIMBER: Senior forward **Dalonte Brown** is climbing several Miami career top-10 lists and continues to climb the points scored list. Here is where he stands entering Miami's next game:

- Starts: 119 (1st, owns record)
- Games Played: 126 (t-1st, 1 from breaking record)
- 3-Point FG: 163 (7th, 14 away from No. 6)
- Rebounds: 726 (10th, 56 from No. 9)
- Scoring: 1,329 (15th, 60 from No. 14)

1,000 POINT WATCH: Entering the RedHawks' next game with 872 career points, senior guard **Mekhi Lairy** could become the 38th member of the 1,000 Point Club. Lairy is averaging 14.5 ppg to start the season and would reach the milestone in January at his current pace.

EASY AS ONE, TWO, THREE: A big reason the RedHawks lead the MAC and rank ninth nationally in assist/turnover ratio (1.66) is junior guard **Dae Dae Grant**, senior guard **Isaiah Coleman-Lands** and senior guard **Mekhi Lairy**, who rank first, second and third, respectively, in the MAC in the category. Grant ranks 15th nationally (3.44), while Coleman-Lands ranks 23rd (3.22) and Lairy ranks 52nd (2.50) nationally in assist/turnover ratio.

20/20 VISION: With a 20-point effort against Cincinnati on December 1, senior guard **Mekhi Lairy** notched his second 20-point scoring performance of the season. Lairy recorded 23 points in the season-opener at Georgia Tech, the most points by a RedHawk this season thus far.

Senior forward **Dalonte Brown** earned his undergraduate degree in Family Studies during Miami's commencement ceremonies on Friday, December 10. He joins senior guard **Isaiah Coleman-Lands**, who earned his bachelor's degree in Spring 2021, and senior forward **Precious Ayah**, who earned his bachelor's degree in Spring 2020 and a master's degree in Spring 2021, as the RedHawks who currently own Miami University degrees.

Miami ranks among the top three in the MAC in 14 statistical categories, leading the league in six categories: assist/turnover ratio, fewest fouls, fewest turnovers, field goal percentage defense, scoring margin, turnovers per game.

The RedHawks rank among the top 30 nationally in six different statistical categories, including ranking third in fewest turnovers and ninth in both turnovers per game and assist/turnover ratio.

Senior forward **Precious Ayah** leads the MAC in field goal percentage, shooting a scorching 75.6 percent from the floor, while junior **Myja White** leads the MAC in 3-point field goal percentage, hitting a sizzling 52.2 percent from beyond the arc.

Miami has been in single digits for turnovers in five of its eight games this season and has committed fewer turnovers than its opponents in all but one game this season.

Miami returners accounted for 97.1 percent of Miami's scoring and 94.7 percent of its rebound from a season ago.

Entering 2021-22, the dozen combined to play in 640 Miami games, making 181 combined career starts and playing a monstrous 11,795 minutes during their time as RedHawks. Leading the way are seniors **Dalonte Brown** (118 games, 111 starts, 2,835 minutes), **Isaiah Coleman-Lands** (93 games, 7 starts, 2,094 minutes), **Mekhi Lairy** (87 games, 37 starts, 1,910 minutes), **Precious Ayah** (93 games, 12 starts, 930 minutes) and **Elijah McNamara** (84 games, 21 starts, 991 minutes), and juniors **Dae Dae Grant** (55 games, 52 starts, 1,405 minutes) and **Myja White** (51 games, 33 starts, 941 minutes). *Numbers all prior to start of 2021-22 season.

Head Coach Jack Owens



Entering his fifth season at the helm of the Miami University men's basketball program, head coach Jack Owens boasts a veteran roster that returns 99 percent of its scoring and 98 percent of its rebounding from a season ago and also returns all five starters.

In his four seasons with the RedHawks, Owens has led Miami to 56 wins, most in a four-year span since 2009-12, and a berth in the 2018 CBI.

In 2020-21, the RedHawks recorded their first winning season since 2009. Miami earned a berth in the eight-team Mid-American Conference Tournament as the RedHawks advanced to the quarterfinal round for the fourth time in the last six years, including three of the last four MAC Tournaments. Miami clinched its MAC Tournament berth with three games remaining on its regular-season schedule. It was the second time in the last four years Miami was the No. 7 seed in the tournament, its highest seeding since the 2011 tournament. Dae Dae Grant also earned All-MAC honors as a sophomore.

Under Owens' guidance last season, Miami set a program record for three-pointers in a game with 18 at Central Michigan (Feb. 23, 2021) and set season program records for free-throw percentage (.776) and fewest turnovers (249).

The RedHawks continued the momentum they experienced at the end of the 2019-20 season when Miami upset No. 5 seed Buffalo on the road in the opening round of the 2020 MAC Tournament and was playing some of its best basketball of the season before COVID-19 brought the campaign to an abrupt halt during the MAC Tournament. For the third-straight year, the RedHawks had a player land on the MAC All-Freshman Team as guard Dae Dae Grant earned a spot in 2020. In 2018-19, Owens led Miami to 15 victories and saw several of his players earn awards, including guard Mekhi Lairy who earned a spot on the All-MAC Freshmen Team.

Despite being hired in April 2017, Owens quickly showed his recruiting prowess by bringing in six new players to join the roster and saw immediate results. He led Miami to 16 wins in 2018 and a berth in the College Basketball Invitational. It was the RedHawks' most victories and first postseason appearance since 2011.

The 2018 CBI appearance continued a collective pattern of success for Owens as his teams have advanced to postseason play in 14 of the past 20 seasons and went on to the NCAA Tournament in 11 of the past 15 years, including four trips to the Sweet 16. He has also helped secure several top recruiting classes, produced NBA talent and developed some of the nation's top players.

Prior to joining Miami, Owens spent the past nine seasons on staff at Purdue University, three as an assistant coach and the last six as its associate head coach. During his time the Boilermakers recorded 209 wins (23.2/year), including 27 during his final year (2016-17 season) to help Purdue win a Big Ten Regular Season Championship.

In Owens' nine seasons with Purdue, the Boilermakers made the NCAA Tournament on seven occasions, advancing to the Sweet 16 three different times.

Owens has helped produce five NBA draft picks, including AJ

Hammons and Robbie Hummel and multiple professional basketball players. In 2017, he helped guide Caleb Swanigan to national attention, he was named one of five finalists for the John R. Wooden Award, given to the nation's top player.

Owens arrived at Purdue after a five-season stint as an assistant at Southern Illinois. In 2003-04, Owens was part of a Southern Illinois team that went 25-5 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament. In the next four seasons at SIU, Owens helped guide the Salukis to three more NCAA Tournament berths, a trip to the NCAA Sweet 16, a Missouri Valley Conference title and an appearance in the National Invitation Tournament.

Prior to joining SIU, Owens served as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Eastern Illinois, during the 2002-03 season, and spent the 2001-02 campaign as an assistant at Barton County Community College, which reached as high as No. 2 in the national polls during the season. Owens began his coaching career as an assistant at Howard Community College during the 2000-01 season, serving as the team's interim head coach for a portion of the year.

The Indianapolis native began his collegiate playing career at Murray State, and played a season at Howard Community College before playing two seasons at Eastern Illinois. While at EIU, Owens averaged 11.7 points and 6.5 assists per game as a senior, earning honorable mention All-Ohio Valley Conference honors. He also served as team captain during his final campaign, and garnered team MVP and Outstanding Defensive Player honors. During the 1999-00 season, Owens remained a part of the Eastern Illinois program as a student assistant coach.

Owens and his wife, Kamilah, have three daughters, Alanah, Aniyah and Anyah.

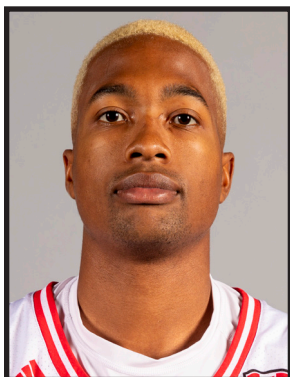

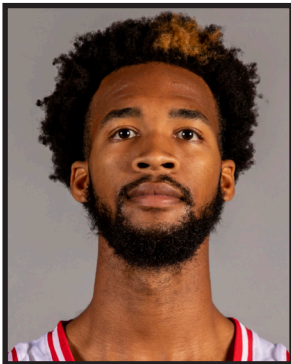
