Saint Francis Quick Hits

- Lindsay Ward earned NEC Player of the Week after she hit .364 with nine runs scored, two home runs, six RBIs. She hit a two-run home run in the seventh inning to guide Saint Francis to a 6-5 win over South Dakota on Feb. 20.
- Rachel Marsden earned NEC Pitcher of the Week with her 4-1 record, 2.65 ERA and 32 strikeouts through 39.2 innings. Her four wins are tied for 13th in the NCAA Division I.
- Jordan Pietrzykoski leads the team with a .394 batting average, .487 on-base percentage, 10 runs scored and four steals. She was named an NEC Prime Performer for the first time in her career.
- Mekenzie Saban hit .389 with eight runs scored, two doubles, one home run and seven RBIs through the first 10 games. She is now six doubles shy of setting a new program record.
- As a team, the Red Flash are 52nd in the NCAA Division I with a .395 team on-base percentage and 55th with a .308 team batting average.

Scouting Opponents

Akron

The Zips enter the Clemson Classic with an 0-5 record after they went winless at the Northern Lights/Southern Lights Tournament. They were outscored 34-6 in the tournament and shutout twice. Molly McChesney and Kalli Macintosh-Houder lead Akron with a .286 batting average each. McChesney also leads the team with two runs scored. In 6.2 innings pitched, Alexa DiFeo leads the team with a 2.10 ERA, which is seventh in the MAC, and is second in the conference with a .136 batting average against.

Clemson

The Tigers enter the weekend ranked No. 14 in the USA Today/NCFCA Division I Coaches Poll with a 7-3 record. They are 1-2 against current ranked teams, with their only victory a 2-0 defeat of No. 5 Washington on Feb. 20. Valerie Cagle leads Clemson with a .394 batting average, six runs scored, three home runs and 10 RBIs. Cagle has the most innings pitched with 31 and carries a 1.81 ERA with 42 strikeouts, which ranks 24th in the NCA Division I. Cammy Pereira is tied with Cagle for the team-lead with six runs scored and is second with a .357 batting average. Millie Thompson and Brooke McCubbin have 14.2 innings pitched each and carry a 0.95 and 1.43 ERA, respectively. The Tigers' pitching staff is 20th in the NCAA Division I with a 1.40 ERA.

Boston University

The Terriers enter the weekend with a 3-6 record after they went 0-4 to start the season at the Green & Gold Classic, followed by a 3-2 weekend at the Red & Black Showcase. They had a notable 6-1 defeat of then-No. 13 Georgia on Feb. 18. Kayla Roncin leads qualified Terriers' hitters with a .310 batting average, four doubles and two triples. Nicole Amodio had a team-leading three home runs, seven RBIs and .433 on-base percentage. Lizzy Avery leads the team with 31.2 innings pitched and carries a 3.54 ERA with 26 strikeouts and 20 walks. Allison Boaz leads the Terriers with a 2.25 ERA and two wins in 18.2 innings pitched.

All-Time vs. Akron

The Zips hold a 12-8 all-time advantage over the Red Flash since the first meeting in 1996 – a 7-0 win for Akron. Since 2015, Saint Francis is on a five-game winning streak, where they outscored Akron 32-10. Two of the games were played in 2021, while the other three were played in 2015. In the last matchup on March 24, Lexi Hernandez led the Red Flash with three hits and three RBIs.

All-Time vs. Clemson

Friday's matchup will be the first between the programs. Clemson is one of two ACC opponents Saint Francis plays this season, as they have a matchup with Pitt on April 6. The Tigers previously defeated NEC opponent LIU 8-0 on Feb 11.

All-Time vs. Boston University

Saturday's matchup will mark the first between the programs. Boston University is one of three Patriot League opponents the Red Flash face this season, as they face Holy Cross on March 5 and have a doubleheader at Bucknell on April 12. Saint Francis is one of two NEC matchup the Terriers have this season, as they face Merrimack in a March 22 doubleheader.

Saint Francis Dominates First NEC Weekly Awards

Lindsay Ward was named NEC Player of the Week and Rachel Marsden was named NEC Pitcher of the Week on Feb. 22. Jordan Pietrzykoski and Mekenzie Saban added Prime Performer selections. Ward was clutch with a two-run home run in the seventh inning of an eventual 6-5 win over South Dakota on Feb. 20. Marsden had four wins in her first seven appearances and a 2.65 ERA. Pietrzykoski led the team with a .394 batting average, .487 on-base percentage, 10 runs scored and four steals through the first 10 games. Saban hit .389 with two doubles and inched closer to the program record for career doubles, only five shy of tying.

Saban: Record Setter

Infielder Mekenzie Saban set a program record for highest batting average in a single season with her .452 mark in 2021. She had the second-most hits, 76, and doubles, 20, in a single season, falling just short of her own standard set in 2019 with 80 hits and 23 doubles. Saban also ranks third in single-season runs scored with 63 in 2019 and fifth with 19 stolen bases in 2021. She enters the 2022 season with 45-career doubles, fourth in program history, and 133 runs scored, fifth in program history.

Vesco No. 81 in Extra Inning Softball Elite 100 Rankings

Pitcher Grace Vesco was placed 81st in the first-ever Extra Innings Softball Elite 100 College Player Rankings. In 2021, Vesco set a new program record with 196 strikeouts and had the second-lowest ERA at 1.00. In her career, Vesco has just 239-career strikeouts in just 227.1 innings pitched.

1-2 Punch Returns

Grace Vesco and Rachel Marsden, both juniors, return after a historic 2021 season. The duo guided Saint Francis to a 1.47 staff ERA that ranked fourth in the NCAA Division I last season. Vesco's 1.00 ERA finished fifth in the nation and Marsden's 1.62 ERA finished 45th, the only two NEC pitchers in the top-125. Vesco's ERA was the second-lowest in program history and Marsden's was third. The Saint Francis staffed tied for sixth-most shutouts in the nation last season with 19 and was 23rd with a 3.45 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

Four-Straight NEC Titles

The Red Flash have won four-straight Northeast Conference titles dating back to 2017. The only season during the stretch without a title was in the canceled 2020 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Two current players, Mekenzie Saban and Jordan Frank, were part of three of the titles. During the four championship seasons, Saint Francis has a combined 64-8 conference and 157-71 overall record.

Softball Picked First in NEC Preseason Poll

Saint Francis was picked to repeat as Northeast Conference Champions in this season's NEC Preseason Poll. The Red Flash earned six first-place votes and were selected to finish first for the first time since 2018. LIU was selected second in the conference and earned the remaining three first-place votes. Central Connecticut, Sacred Heart and Mount St. Mary's rounded out the top-five in that order.

Petrie Joins Staff as Assistant Coach

Elysse Petrie joined head coach Jessica O'Donnell's staff in August 2021 as an assistant coach, working primarily with the pitching staff. She previously worked as a graduate assistant at Division II University of Indianapolis, where she

guided one Midwest Pitcher of the Year and was part of the NFCA Midwest Coaching Staff of the Year. As a player, Petrie had the fewest earned runs allowed (178), second-lowest ERA (3.26) and second-fewest walks (76) in Centre College program history.

Frank Joins Staff as Graduate Assistant

Jackson Frank joined the softball program as a graduate assistant in January 2022. He is a former volunteer student manager on the Penn State baseball team, where he kept stats and opposing team scouting reports. As a player at Pennsylvania State University DuBois from 2017-19, he earned two United States Collegiate Athletic Association National Championships. He is the brother of current Saint Francis outfielder Jordan Frank.

Softball Adds Six Players in 2022 Signing Class

The Red Flash added Annabelle Farmer, Lauryn Kane, Savannah Nash, Brianna Sawyers, Tessa Thompson and Madelyn Wilson in the 2022 signing class. "This class is filled with incredible talent and experience," said head coach Jessica O'Donnell. "They have been competing nationally against the top competition for years and they are no stranger to winning the big games. We are looking forward to getting them on the field with us next year."

Jessica O'Donnell - Fourth Season



O'Donnell became the 12th head coach in Saint Francis Softball history in July of 2018 after serving the previous five seasons as the Associate Head Coach at Villanova University.

In 2021, O'Donnell led the Red Flash to its fourth-consecutive NEC Tournament Championship and NCAA Regionals appearance as well as the third NEC Regular Season Championship in program history with a 22-2 record in NEC play. Saint Francis claimed the tournament championship with a 12-4 win in

five innings against LIU. The Red Flash concluded the season with a trip to Austin, Texas for NCAA Regionals, facing No. 11 Texas and No. 10 Oregon.

At the conclusion of the Red Flash's season, Saint Francis was nationally ranked in seven categories. The SFU pitching staff had the fourth-best ERA (1.47), was tied for fifth in shutouts (19) and ranked 24th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.45). The SFU offense ranked 29th in on-base percentage (.390), 33rd in scoring (5.64) and 34th in batting average (.304). The Saint Francis squad was 14th in the nation in win-loss percentage (.800).

In addition to team rankings, three individuals were nationally ranked as well. Senior McKenzie Saban finished the season tied for fourth in doubles (20), sixth in hits (76), tied 11th in doubles per game (.40), 15th in batting average (.452), 26th in runs per game (1.04) and 47th in on-base percentage (.508). Sophomore Grace Vesco was tied for third in shutouts (13), fifth in hits allowed per seven innings (3.26), sixth in ERA (1.00), tied for 13th in wins (22) and tied for 28th in strikeouts (196). Sophomore Rachel Marsden ranked 27th in walks allowed per seven innings (1.15), tied for 39th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.00) and 49th in ERA (1.62).

The Red Flash set four single-season program records and ranked in the top five in program history in four other categories. Saint Francis broke the program records for shutouts (19), strikeouts (321), ERA (1.47) and batting average (.305). SFU also ranked second in single-season program history in wins (40), third in stolen bases (69), fifth in RBI (258) and fifth in runs (282). The Red Flash had the best start in program history, winning nine of its first 10 games. Four single-season individual records were broken as well, with Saban having the highest batting average (.452) and on-base percentage (.508) and Vesco having the most shutouts (13) and strikeouts (196).

Saban and Vesco were among those honored with postseason accolades. Vesco was named All-Region First Team while Saban earned All-Region Second Team honors. Vesco was the unanimous choice for NEC Pitcher of the Year and was named to the NFCA Division I National Freshman of the Year Top 15 list. She was among four All-NEC First Team selections, joined by Saban, Marsden and senior Jordan Frank. Freshman Lexi Hernandez was named All-NEC Second Team and All-Rookie Team. Vesco was named the NEC Tournament MVP and was joined on the All-Tournament Team by Hernandez, Saban and junior Allyn Bezjak.

O'Donnell's hire paid immediate dividends as she and her staff, in 2019, led the Red Flash to their third-straight Northeast Conference title and competed in the Ann Arbor regional hosted by the University of Michigan. The accomplishment becomes even more impressive when taken in consideration

O'Donnell inherited a team racked by graduation and transfers including the loss of the incumbent pitching staff. Despite the reduced squad, Saint Francis finished with a NEC record of 10-6 to continue a streak of winning records in NEC play. The Red Flash impressed in non-conference play. One notable result was a narrow 3-1 defeat at No.5 Alabama in which the Red Flash silenced the home crowd by tying with the Crimson Tide for the majority of the game. When NEC conference play began, Saint Francis kicked it up a notch to clinch the third seed. Mixed among the conference games were victories over in-state rivals Penn State and Pitt and a doubleheader sweep of local Bucknell.

Entering the conference tournament as the number-three seed, the Red Flash knocked off Sacred Heart in the opening round and host LIU Brooklyn twice to capture the 2019 crown. The two victories against LIU Brooklyn were the only home losses for the Blackbirds in 2019. The 29 wins amassed by the Red Flash in 2019 are the most for a coach in their first season in school history.

Under O'Donnell's tutelage, the Red Flash hammered opponents' pitching and launched themselves into the single-season annuals of the Red Flash record book. Saint Francis set team records for hits in a season (480), and doubles (97), a mark which was 15th in the NCAA. The 2019 team placed third in the record books for RBI (329), batting average (.287), runs scored (348), and home runs (66). The squad finished fourth in triples (15), and walks (187). Defensively, the squad finished second in putouts (1,175) and fifth in assists (461).

Beyond the SFU record book, the squad dotted the 2019 NCAA leader board finishing 15th in doubles per game, 24th in scoring, 32nd in home runs per game, 32nd in slugging percentage, and 42nd in triples per game.

Individual players shined under O'Donnell's hitting approach. Sophomore McKenzie Saban's 23 doubles were a NEC and SFU record and third-most in the NCAA. More than just doubles, Saban blossomed under O'Donnell's style, and turned into one of the most dangerous hitters in the nation. The sophomore displayed massive improvement across all hitting categories: her average rose from .105 to .367, she collected 80 hits to set the team mark for hits in a season, smashed her first collegiate home runs, became a prototypical leadoff hitter to set a program record for at-bats in a season (218), scored 63 runs (third all-time for single season play), and knocked in 29 RBIs.

Underclassmen were not the only players to progress under O'Donnell. Seasoned veterans also chronicled career years under the inaugural head coach. Catcher/Outfielder Sierra McKee set career marks in home runs (14), RBI (59), slugging percentage (.656), and OBP (.447). Twin sister Cheyenne McKee saw similar results: career highs in home runs (11), RBI (44), doubles (15), at-bats (190), and walks (22). Senior slugger Hayley Norton devastated opposing hurlers setting career highs in home runs (16) fourth best in the single season category, RBI (65) second best for a single season, hits (72) second best for a single season, slugging percentage (.680), OBP (.441), at-bats (197) and runs (50). Her 65 RBIs placed 11th in the nation.

The squad's assault on the record books didn't just include the shattering of team and single season records. Career records were also demolished. Norton and the McKee twins all passed Madison Cabell's previous mark of career hits (202) in a climatic race for top position. Norton won the title setting a new mark of 243 hits. Cheyenne McKee edged her twin sister Sierra McKee 237-236. Cheyenne McKee eclipsed Jordan Seneca's run scored record of 181 with 209 runs of her own. Cheyenne McKee broke into the top-5 for career batting average (.343) and placed third in triples (10). Norton set a NEC and SFU record for home runs with 57 bombs. The McKee sisters moved into the top-five as well. Sierra McKee hit 34 homers and Cheyenne McKee finished with 32. Norton smashed another Cabell record with 218 RBIs surpassing the old mark of 188.

Jessica O'Donnell - Fourth Season

She guided three seniors Hayley Norton (second team), Sierra McKee and Cheyenne McKee (third team) to Great Lakes All-Region honors. Five Red Flash players were named All-NEC led by Hayley Norton's first team selection. Mikayla Bower, Christina Clark, Sierra McKee and MeKenzie Saban all took home second team honors. Clark was also named to the All-Rookie team, and backed up a strong NEC season by being named NEC Tournament MVP. Norton earned first-team All-ECAC honors. Six times SFU players won NEC Player of the Week, one NEC Pitcher of the Week, and three NEC Rookie of the Week awards in 2019.

In addition to the success on the field, the Red Flash excelled in the classroom in O'Donnell's first season. The team recorded a collective GPA of 3.54 during the spring, in-season semester. Three players: Mikayla Bower, Hayley Norton and MeKenzie Saban all earned Academic All-District honors in 2019. Over half the team (eight players) earned NFCA Academic Recognition: Mikayla Bower, Brittney Crawford, Jordan Frank, Halle Marion, Cheyenne McKee, Hayley Norton, MeKenzie Saban, and Cassidy Troxell. The softball team also won the SFU athletics 2018-2019 Frankie's Cup. The Frankie Cup is given to the SFU athletics team that earned the most points based off the criteria of academics, athletic performance, community service, involvement in Student-Athlete Development groups (SAAC and SAMs), and attendance at home athletic sporting events. The squad also won the Bob Hahn Team of Excellence Award.

While at Villanova, O'Donnell worked with the infielders and catchers as well as day-to-day operations. During O'Donnell's time at Villanova, the Wildcats increased their win total in each of her first four seasons on campus and achieved winning records in each of the last three seasons. Villanova earned 17 All-Big East selections and three NFCA All-Region selections during O'Donnell's tenure.

O'Donnell helped the Wildcats to a 27-24-1 record in 2018, including a 10-8 mark in the Big East. Under O'Donnell's leadership, Wildcats senior shortstop Brittany Husk earned NFCA Mideast Region Second Team honors as well as First Team All-Big East accolades. Freshman second baseman Angela Giampolo was a First Team All-Big East selection, while senior first baseman Nikki Alden was a Second Team All-Big East pick.

Prior to her time at Villanova, O'Donnell spent two seasons as an assistant at Francis Marion University, where she coached the infielders and handled operations duties.

O'Donnell began her coaching career at the Community College of Baltimore in Catonsville and worked with the Florida Pride professional softball team in 2011.

The Pasadena, Md. native began her playing career at CCBC, earning All-Conference, All-Region and NFCA All-American Scholar Athlete honors before transferring to UMBC. She served as a three-year starter at short-stop. O'Donnell was a three-time member of the America East Honor Roll and was a team captain in 2009. She graduated in 2010 with a Bachelor's Degree in American Studies.

Elysse Petrie - First Season (Centre College '17)



Elysse Petrie joined the Red Flash softball program in August 2021 as an assistant coach, where she will work primarily with the pitching staff.

Petrie arrived in Loretto after a stint as a graduate assistant at the University of Indianapolis, where she earned her Master of Science in Sports Management. She assisted in scouting, recruiting, daily practices, and team travel arrangements and working with the pitching staff.

She helped guide a 46-8 Greyhounds' team in 2021 that clinched the GLVC Championship and qualified for the NCAA DII Midwest Regional. The team's 25-game winning streak was the longest in Division II that season. She assisted one pitcher to a 23-3 record and 1.21 ERA and another to a 21-4 record with a 1.89 ERA. She coached one Midwest Pitcher of

the Year, NFCA Division II Freshman of the Year and NFCA Division II Pitcher of the Year award finalist. Indianapolis was selected as the NFCA Midwest Region Coaching Staff of the Year.

Petrie is a 2017 graduate of Centre College with a Bachelor of Science in Psychology. As a player, she was a two-time SAA All-Conference Honorable Mention and SAA All-Tournament Team selection.

In her playing career, Petrie had the fewest earned runs allowed (178), second-lowest ERA (3.26) and second-fewest walks (76) in school history. She also ranked top-10 in innings pitched (272.2), appearances (60), games started (41), complete games (26), wins (15), shutouts (three), strikeouts (140), hits allowed (350).

Jackson Frank - First Season



Jackson Frank joined the Red Flash softball program in January 2022 as the team's graduate assistant.

He is a 2021 graduate of The Pennsylvania State University, Smeal College of Business with a Bachelor of Arts in Business Management, with a focus in leadership. In addition, he minored in Spanish and was part of the sabermetrics and business clubs.

Frank worked as a volunteer student manager on the Penn State Nittany Lions' baseball team, working with other student managers to keep stats and opposing team scouting reports. During the season, Penn State went 18-24, but ended the season with a 10-6 record over the final month.

He worked as an assistant general manager for the DuBois Bucks Collegiate baseball team in two separate stints. He had responsibility in creating player profiles, keeping stats, announcing and operating the videoboard. He also had internship experience with DuBois Sports Properties, where he collaborated with Prep Baseball Report Pennsylvania to organize baseball showcases.

In 2019, Frank spent time at the Sports Management Worldwide General Manager and Scouting Course, where he was mentored by MLB scout Larry D'Amato and former Dodgers general manager Dan Evans. As a player at Pennsylvania State University DuBois from 2017-19, Frank earned two United States Collegiate Athletic Association National Championships. He was also named PSUAC All-Conference Academic and USCAA National All-Academic Team in 2019.

He is the brother of current Saint Francis outfielder Jordan Frank.
