ANNIVERSARIES: The 2022 season marks anniversaries of two special seasons in program history.

1982 - Forty years since IU men's soccer won its first national championship.

2012 - Ten years since IU's most recent national title and the first NCAA championship of the Todd Yeagley era.



FAMILY MATTERS: So many families have made Bloomington their second home while joining the greater Indiana men's soccer family, creating a special environment in and around the program.

The Yeagley family has set this pattern - Jerry Yeagley lobbied for men's soccer to become a varsity sport at IU in 1973 and, as head coach, went on to win six national championships. Yeagley family involvement in the program now spans three generations, as Todd Yeagley, an IU player from 1991-94, has coached the team since 2010 and now coaches his sons, Ben and Grant, two current IU players.

Five current IU student-athletes have family legacies in the program:

Luka Bezerra: Brother, Victor, was an All-America forward from 2019-2021 before signing an MLS Homegrown Contract with Chicago Fire.

Trey Kapsalis: Father, Paul, played at IU between 1984-87; Uncles Dan (1982-84) and Dean (1989-90; 1992-93) also played at IU.

Joey Maher: Brother, Jack Maher, was an All-America defender from 2018-19 and now plays for MLS club Nashville SC.

Ben & Grant Yeagley: Brothers; Father, Todd, is current head coach and played from 1991-94; Grandfather, Jerry, was head coach from 1973-2003.

#PROIU: Combining Major League Soccer Draft picks (45), MLS Supplemental Draft picks (4) and MLS Homegrown selections (8), the Indiana men's soccer program has seen 57 Hoosiers selected into the top flight of American soccer. Additionally, 18 Hoosiers have earned United States Men's National Team caps.

BIG TEN DOMINANCE: With 32 total conference trophies, Indiana has consistently been the biggest program in Big Ten men's soccer history. Owing a 137-32-24 (.772) record in league play all-time, IU is the only Big Ten program with over 100 wins in conference play coming into the 2022 season.

Indiana has totaled 115 All-Big Ten first team selections all-time, 55 more than the next-best program (Penn State, 60). IU boasts four of the last five Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year awards and three of the last four Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year awards.

Additionally, Jerry Yeagley and Todd Yeagley are the winningest coaches in Big Ten history, by percentage.

THREADED WITH HISTORY: In Season 50, the Hoosiers will debut uniforms that express the program's Tradition of Excellence. In July, the program released its cream and crimson jerseys for the 2022 campaign, a refreshing take on some of the old styles of the team's storied past.

Indiana's new crimson kit features stripes, a popular choice across IU athletics and in the program's 2010s designs. The stripes are alternating shades of crimson with the eight-star logo sitting on the left chest like a crest, the player number centered on the torso and an adidas logo aligned high on the right.

On the back, like many modern IU shirts, an "INDIANA" nameplate floats above the player number. On a cream collar, "Never Daunted" lies in reference to the school fight song, "Indiana, Our Indiana."

The updated cream kit is a distinct reference to the styles of the 1970s and early '80s, the first decade of varsity soccer at IU. One decoration graces a white front; the left chest has the Indiana script mark on top of the player number. Indiana's first national championship teams in 1982 and 1983 wore kits with similar designs.

Indiana's eight-star mark is prominent atop the back of the cream jersey. "Tradition of Excellence" graces the hem of the shirt, a reminder of the program's proud history and drive to continue it for many years to come.

PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

The MAC Hermann Trophy is annually presented to the nation's top collegiate soccer player. Indiana men's soccer has a rich tradition of producing the most excellent players in the country, with eight player of the year selections all-time.

EIGHT STARS

1982: After being denied in the NCAA College Cup final three times (1976, 1978 and 1980), the Hoosiers won the program's first NCAA National Championship via a 2-1, eight-overtime marathon victory over Duke.

1983: Following an overtime loss in the season opener the Hoosiers went undefeated the rest of the way (21-1-4 overall) including a 1-0, overtime win in the national championship match. IU won back-to-back titles for the first time in program history.

1988: Ken Snow tallied 22 goals and seven assists to lead IU back to the mountaintop in 1988. In a matches played at IU's home, Bill Armstrong Stadium, the Hoosiers won 1-0 decisions versus Portland and Howard to win their third title.

1998: Indiana captured its first of three championship trebles in program history, winning the Big Ten regular season and tournament titles in the same year. IU outscored its two NCAA College Cup opponents 7-1 to win its first title in a decade.

1999: IU won the treble for a second straight season, capping the century with its fifth national title. After surviving a four-overtime victory over UCLA the day before, Indiana bested Santa Clara, 1-0, in the title match.

2003: Jerry Yeagley retired following the 2003 season after once again leading IU to a championship treble. On a snowy day in Columbus, Ohio, the Hoosiers scored two-first-half goals to bury St. John's, 2-1, in the championship match.

2004: Indiana won back-to-back NCAA Championships for the third time in program history as former Hoosier All-American Mike Freitag led IU in his first season as head coach. After a 1-1 full-time result, the Hoosiers won, 3-2, on penalties.

2012: It took Todd Yeagley just three seasons to continue the family legacy and win his first national title as head coach. The No. 16 national seed in the NCAA Tournament, IU beat four national seeds and allowed just one goal in its title run.

NOTES: Two historic programs, Indiana and Clemson have combined for 11 NCAA National Championships (IU 8, Clemson 3), 30 NCAA College Cup appearances (IU 21, Clemson 9) and 80 NCAA Tournament berths (IU 46, Clemson 34).

Including this season's opener, the programs' last three matchups have each been 10 years apart. The two teams last met almost exactly a decade ago on August 31, 2012, in a 3-0 win for eventual national champion IU. Before that, the Hoosiers and Tigers met another 10 years prior, to the tune of a 1-1 draw. Friday's contest will be the third match of the series played on Riggs Field and first since 1998, a 2-1 win for IU. The series is tied, 1-1, at Clemson's home facility.

Four of the eleven matchups in the all-time series have been played in the NCAA Tournament, with the winner advancing in or to the NCAA College Cup each time. On eight occasions, the winner of the match would go on to appear in the NCAA College Cup - this has been the case in all six of IU's victories.

IU had won back-to-back NCAA titles in 1982 and 1983 when it was defeated by Clemson, 2-1, in the 1984 national championship match, decided by a goal in the final two minutes of play. After a 1987 regional final defeat to the Tigers, the Hoosiers would get revenge in 1998 and 2001 NCAA Tournament quarterfinal matches, both victories eventually leading an appearance in the national championship match.

Indiana is undefeated in the last six matches of the series, with a 5-0-1 record in that span. IU's last defeat to Clemson came in that 1987 match, when the Tigers won their second national title.

TEAM NOTES

OPENING DAY: Indiana men's soccer owns a 30-12-7 (.684) all-time record in season openers. The Hoosiers have won six of their last seven opening day contest.

Friday evening's matchup at Clemson will be IU second straight season opener on the road. Indiana has a 9-2-2 (.769) mark all-time in such matches and beat Notre Dame, 3-2, away to open the 2021 season after **Ben Yeagley's** golden goal.

Since his first season as head coach of the Hoosiers in 2010, **Todd Yeagley** has an 8-2-2 (.750) mark in season openers.

STARTING SLATE: Each of Indiana's first five opponents made the NCAA Tournament last season. The schedule kicks off August 26 at reigning national champion and No. 1-ranked Clemson.

Then, the Hoosiers host four straight home matches against 2021 tournament teams beginning August 30 versus Portland. September starts with fixtures against Notre Dame, St. John's and Akron.

BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH: Three Hoosier veterans were named Big Ten Players to Watch as announced by the conference office.

Herbert Endeley

Led team with six assists in 2021 and was named second-team All-Big Ten for a second straight season.

Daniel Munie

2021 All-American and Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year after leading IU defense to 13 clean sheets.

Ryan Wittenbrink

Totaled eight goals and seven assists in the 2021 calendar year (two seasons), including three goals and five assists (11 points) last campaign.

The top-ranked Big Ten program in all three preseason polls, IU was picked No. 2 in the Big Ten's preliminary ranking as voted on by the league's coaches.

MISTER MUNIE: **Daniel Munie**, an All-American and the reigning Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, is back for his redshirt junior season. Munie was named team captain and will wear the armband this season.

Preseason awards have come in for Munie, as he's been named to the Top Drawer Soccer Preseason Best XI first team as well as the Big Ten watch list and United Soccer Coaches defensive watch list.

Munie led the IU defense to an NCAA DI-best 13 clean sheets last season, including a span of seven straight in October. Munie also bagged three goals and three assists to contribute to the scoresheet.

Among his awards, Munie was a Top Drawer Soccer Best XI second team selection, ranked No. 13 on Top Drawer Soccer's Postseason Top 100 list and, on three occasions, was named the Big Ten Player of the Week.

SOPHOMORE SCORERS: Sophomore forwards **Tommy Mihalic** and **Samuel Sarver** are key returners for Indiana in 2021. The attacking duo combined for 12 goals last season as freshmen as well as five assists. Both were named to the All-Big Ten Freshman Team and were featured in Top Drawer Soccer's Postseason Top 100 Freshmen list, with Mihalic ranked No. 14 and Sarver rated No. 60.

RETURNERS: Of IU's 25 players that saw minutes in 2021, 20 have returned for the 2022 season.

Statistically, the Hoosiers return 71 percent of its goals scored (27 of 38) and 75 percent of its assists (27 of 36) from last campaign, which saw IU make a tournament run to the round of 16.

Center backs **Joey Maher** and **Daniel Munie**, who started all 22 matches for IU in 2021 and led the team to 13 clean sheets, are both back to anchor the back line again. **Brett Bebej**, **Lawson Redmon** and **Nyk Sessock** all saw significant time in defense last season.

XAVIER TRANSFER DUO: Two former Xavier student-athletes made the short move from Cincinnati, Ohio, to Bloomington during the offseason.

6-foot-3 senior forward **Karsen Henderlong**, a Crown Point, Indiana, native, returned to his home state and trained with the Hoosiers during spring. Henderlong is a gifted scorer and playmaker, totaling 22 goals and seven assists over three seasons at Xavier. Henderlong was a first-team All-BIG EAST selection in 2021 (eight goals, four assists) and ranked No. 87 on Top Drawer Soccer's Postseason Top 100 list.

6-foot-2 junior defender **Jansen Miller** adds depth to the IU back line after two seasons at Xavier where he played in 27 matches with 26 starts. Last season, Miller helped the Musketeers to five clean sheets, including shutouts of Northwestern and Seton Hall.

JT HELPS: Junior goalkeeper **JT Harms** is another newcomer via transfer after two seasons at Duke, where he earned clean sheets in both matches he started last season. Like Henderlong, Harms joined the program in spring and saw significant minutes in spring and fall exhibition matches.

2022 SIGNING CLASS: Including transfer student-athletes, Indiana signed the No. 9-ranked recruiting class according to Top Drawer Soccer. Along with the three transfers, IU also welcomes six freshmen to its squad in 2022.

Luka Bezerra: Forward that played 11 seasons for Chicago Fire FC Academy, helping club to U19 MLS NEXT Cup in 2021. Younger brother of former Hoosier Victor Bezerra (2019-21).

Cooper Johnsen: Goalkeeper that captained Silicon Valley Soccer Academy during multiple MLS NEXT seasons. Also spent part of youth career in San Jose Earthquakes academy.

Noah Joseph: Pacey winger that trained at Portland Timbers Academy, helping club reach its first MLS NEXT Playoffs. Father, Miles, is a former MLS and USMNT player and currently serves as an assistant coach for Portland Timbers.

2022 SIGNING CLASS, cont:

Breckin Minzey: Midfielder and Indiana native that played for Indiana Fire and Indy Eleven Academy. Led both clubs to significant postseason finishes in 2021.

Seth Stewart: Midfielder that scored 11 goals and had 10 assists during time with Chicago FC United Academy since 2019. Also spent eight years in the Chicago Fire FC Academy.

Jack Wagoner: A midfielder who spent spring playing for St. Louis City SC as an amateur prior to its inaugural year in MLS. Played club at St. Louis Scott Gallagher.

BACK TO WORK IN BLOOMINGTON: Two former Indiana men's soccer players returned to Bloomington in March as additions to head coach Todd Yeagley's coaching staff. With the hires, every position on IU's staff is filled by a former Hoosier men's soccer player.

Tanner Thompson joined the staff as an assistant coach, while **Jeremiah Gutjahr** serves as the program's director of operations.

Thompson was a three-time All-American at IU between 2013-16, totaling 18 goals and 19 assists. He was a 2017 MLS SuperDraft selection and went on to play for USL side Indy Eleven. His brother, Tommy Thompson, now plays in MLS for the San Jose Earthquakes, and his father, Gregg Thompson, helped the Hoosiers to their first national title in 1982, scoring both goals in the final match, and is a member of the IU Athletics Hall of Fame.

Gutjahr, born and raised in Bloomington, was a four-year midfielder at IU from 2015-18 while also competing for the U20 U.S. Men's National Team. In 2019, Gutjahr signed a Homegrown contract with Chicago Fire FC in Major League Soccer. Gutjahr competed two seasons with Chicago and most recently played for Indy Eleven in 2021.

STREAKING: Indiana carries several notable active streaks into the 2022 season:

- The Hoosiers have reached the NCAA Tournament in 35 straight seasons.
- Indiana has earned a national seed in eight consecutive seasons, the longest active streak.
- IUMS is one of two programs (Wake Forest) to advance to the third round of the tournament in each of the last seven seasons.

COACH YEAGLEY CONTINUES WINNING

CULTURE: IU head men's soccer coach **Todd Yeagley** is carrying on the Tradition of Excellence and winning culture of IUMS into his 13th season as leader of the program.

Since 2011, Yeagley is the NCAA co-leader in wins with 164. In that span, IU has reached the NCAA College Cup four times, tied for the most appearances of any program in Division I men's soccer.

Yeagley is the only DI men's coach with at least 150 wins AND four NCAA College Cup appearance since 2011.

OVERTIME RULES: The NCAA made changes to its overtime rules for men's and women's soccer competition, effective for the 2022 season.

For the regular season, overtime has been eliminated, meaning if a game is tied after the regulation 90 minutes, it will end in a tie. Previously, teams played two 10-minute overtime periods in a sudden-victory (golden goal) format, and if neither team scored, the game ended in a tie.

In conference tournaments and NCAA postseason games, the sudden-victory component has been eliminated, and teams will play two 10-minute overtime periods instead. Also, when a substitution is made by the winning team in the last five minutes of the second overtime, the game clock will stop.

If the game remains tied, a penalty-kick shootout will be held to determine the winner.

After a standout playing career for the Hoosiers, Todd Yeagley was named Indiana head men's soccer coach on December 18, 2009. Yeagley is in his 13th season at the helm of the Hoosier program in 2022.

Yeagley is a four-time Big Ten Coach of the Year, has led the region staff of the year three times and in 2012 was named Soccer America Coach of the Year.

2012 NCAA National Championship

• In just his third season as head coach, Yeagley led Indiana to the 2012 NCAA title, the eighth championship in IU men's soccer history. The Hoosiers became the first No. 16 seed to win the championship, compiling victories over Xavier, at No. 1 Notre Dame, at No. 9 North Carolina, versus No. 12 Creighton and against No. 3 Georgetown during their tournament run.

• Yeagley was named 2012 Soccer America Coach of the Year as he and his father Jerry become the first father-son duo to have won Division I men's soccer championships.

2021 Season

• Indiana earned a national seed (No. 15) for the eighth straight season in 2021, the only program in NCAA Division I men's soccer to do so in that span. A late season run helped IU to a 15-6-1 record on the year, boosted by a seven-match shutout streak in October, the second-longest clean sheet streak in program history. Tying the league-high, eighth Hoosiers combined for 10 conference postseason awards. Goalkeeper Roman Celentano became the first-ever repeat Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year, while Daniel Munie was the fourth Hoosier in five years to be named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year. Celentano and Munie each picked up All-America accolades. Celentano was also picked No. 2 overall in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft by FC Cincinnati and Victor Bezerra signed an MLS Homegrown contract with Chicago Fire FC.

Playing Career

• As a player, Yeagley was a four-time All-American at Indiana (1991-94) and in 1994 was named the Missouri Athletic Club National Player of the Year. During his stint as a student-athlete in Bloomington, Yeagley was a two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree. He led the Hoosiers to three Big Ten titles (1991, 1992, 1994) and a 79-9-5 overall record.

• He remains third on IU's career assists list with 40 and shares the Big Ten single-season assists record with the 14 he recorded in 1993.

• After his playing days at Indiana, Yeagley also enjoyed a successful seven-year professional career in Major League Soccer with the Columbus Crew. Columbus advanced to the MLS Playoffs in five of Yeagley's seven seasons with the team and won the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup in 2002 – the first trophy in club history.

Honors

• Since returning to his alma mater, Yeagley has coached 17 Major League Soccer Draft picks, seven MLS Homegrown signees, 32 first team All-Big Ten honorees, 12 Big Ten Player of the Year selections and six Big Ten Freshman of the Year picks.

• In 2015, Jack Griffith was given the prestigious Jack D. Tichenor Award, which is given annually to IU's top male and female student-athletes that hold the highest individual cumulative GPA among the entire Department of Athletics. Griffith is the fourth men's soccer student-athlete to earn the Tichenor Award, joining Barry T. Margolin (1987), Christopher Munroe (2005) and three-time winner Tyler McCarroll (2010-12).

• In 2016, Femi Hollinger-Janzen was presented the Spirit of Indiana Director's Award, given by Vice President and Director of Athletics Fred Glass to two student-athletes that best represent The Spirit of Indiana: 24 Sports, 1 Team.

Personal

• Yeagley is a member of the Indiana Soccer Hall of Fame and in 2013 was inducted into the Monroe County Hall of Fame and the IU Athletics Hall of Fame.

• Yeagley earned a Bachelor of Science degree in sociology from Indiana in 2002. He and his wife, Suzy, have three children: Ben, Grant and Jay.

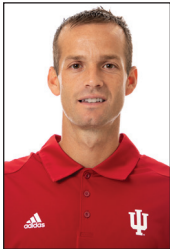
