#### LAST TIME OUT

- A backline of Chrisitan Curti, Buster Sjoberg, and Olu Oyegunle led the way in a 1-0 win over Niagara.
- Senior forward Levonte Johnson scored the game winner in the 13th minute. Nathan Opoku was in on the assist
- Syracuse did not concede a corner. The feat was last achieved in 2019.
- The Orange outshot Niagara 19-5.

### SETTING THE SCENE

- Syracuse is 5-0-1 to open the 2022 season. The record matches the best start to a season since 2016.
- 'Cuse comes in at No. 16 in the latest United Soccer Coaches' poll.
- The Orange have a goal difference of +10, which ranks second in the ACC.
- Noah Singelmann was named to College Soccer News' Team of the Week after his performances against UConn and Notre Dame.

### THE SERIES

- Tuesday's match will be the 14th meeting between Syracuse and Clemson.
- Clemson holds a narrow lead in the series, 5-4-4.
- The last meeting came in 2021, as the Orange took down the eventual national champion #6 Tigers on Senior Night. Graduate striker Manel Busquets grabbed the lead in the 32nd minute. The win was secured when Deandre Kerr scored the second in the 86th minute.

### SCOUTING THE TIGERS

- Clemson enters Friday's match as the No. 1 team in the nation with a perfect record of 6-0-0
- Head coach Mike Noonan is in his 13th season as head coach. He has a record of 146-72-34 and led the Tigers to the 2021 NCAA National Championship.
- Clemson won its midweek nonconference match against UAB. After a scoreless first half, Ousmane Sylla snatched the lead with a 63rd minute goal, while Tyler Trimmnal scored his first goal of the season in the 81st minute to ensure the three points.
- Sylla leads Clemson in goals and assists with four and five respectively.
- The Tigers are third in the ACC in goal difference with a margin of +9.

### IMMEDIATE IMPACT

- New additions Levonte Johnson, Nathan Opoku, and Lorenzo Boselli have provided immediate results on the attacking end.
- Opoku has recorded a point in the first six matches. He scored against Iona and UConn, and assisted against Penn State, Vermont, Notre Dame and Niagara.
- Johnson scored his first career Syracuse goal against Vermont, and added another against Niagara. He also has two assists on the season.
- Boselli scored his first career Syracuse goal against UConn.

## STRENGTH IN DEFENSE

- Syracuse started the 2022 season with consecutive shutouts against Iona and Penn State.
- The last time the Orange opened the season with consecutive clean sheets was in 2014.
- The Orange have only allowed one goal in six matches. That's the lowest total to start a season since 2014.
- Syracuse is tied with Duke in the ACC for fewest goals conceded (1).

## ORANGE SELECT TEAM CAPTAINS

- Seniors Amferny Sinclair and Noah Singelmann and graduate student Julio Fulcar are the 2022 captains.
- Singelmann appeared in every match during the 2021 season. He also led the team in points for the 2020-21 season.
- Sinclair has 44 starts in 47 appearances during his Orange career.

## PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- Senior midfielder Amferny Sinclair was named to the 2022 Atlantic Coast Conference Preseason Watchlist.
- Senior forward Levonte Johnson was named to the Hermann Trophy Watch List. The transfer from Seattle U scored nine goals and tallied eight assists in 2021.

## ORANGE EARN ACADEMIC HONORS

- The Orange were recognized as a 2021-22 College Team Academic winner by the United Soccer Coaches. The squad earned the honor after maintaining a GPA above a 3.0 for the 2021 season.
- Noah Singelmann and Buster Sjoberg were named to the All-ACC Academic Men's Soccer team in January.

## 500 AND COUNTING

- The Orange's 1-0 victory at Colgate on Sept. 24, 2019 was the 500th win in program history.
- Syracuse has an all-time record of 520-536-130
- The first Syracuse team took to the pitch in 1920. No games were played in 1922, 1943-45 and 1951. The program was briefly discontinued between 1961-1970 before being reinstated in 1970.

## ORANGE IN THE PROS

- Last season's leading goal scorer DeAndre Kerr joined the long list of Syracuse alumni in the pros.
- In January, Kerr signed with Toronto FC. He's played 24 MLS matches with 10 starts so far in his MLS career.
- 'Cuse alum Tajon Buchanan and Miles Robinson were also named to the 2021 MLS Best XI in December 2021. Syracuse is the only ACC squad with representatives in the 2021 MLS Best XI.
- Kamal Miller played and started in the 2022 MLS All-Star Game. Syracuse is the only ACC school to have a former student-athlete in the 2022 MLS All-Star game.
- In August 2021, Tajon Buchanan signed a three-year deal with 2021 Belgian First Division A champions Club Brugge.
- Ryan Raposo won 2022 Best Young Canadian Player honors at the Canadian Championship as he led the Vancouver Whitecaps to a Canadian Championship.
- In a seven-year span, Syracuse has had 12 former student-athletes taken in the first two rounds of the MLS Draft.

One of the brightest head coaches on the college circuit, Ian McIntyre has led Syracuse to unprecedented heights in his first eight years at the helm of the program.

A 1996 Hartwick graduate, McIntyre owns a 186-120-53 (.592) record in 19 seasons as a college head coach. He's been honored with multiple coaching awards, including the ACC Coach of the Year Award in 2014.

## DONNING ORANGE

McIntyre became the 15th coach in Syracuse soccer history on Jan. 6, 2010. During his time in the Emerald City, McIntyre has gone about the task of building the Orange into a national contender. That effort began paying dividends in 2012 as Syracuse won 14 games, more than twice the number of victories in McIntyre's first two years with the Orange, and the most victories for the program since 1986.

Overall, Syracuse finished 14-6-1 in 2012 and was the most improved team in the nation, posting a win-loss improvement of +8.5. The Orange nearly doubled its number of goals (39) from the previous year and the defense posted 12 shutouts, tied for the third-most in the country. As a result, Syracuse finished second in the BIG EAST Red Division and earned a berth in the 2012 NCAA Championship, just the second time in program history the Orange advanced to the national tournament.

Syracuse continued to perform upon reaching the national stage, knocking off Ivy League champion Cornell and VCU in the opening two rounds to notch the first NCAA Tournament victories in team history. In the third round (Sweet 16), the Orange tied eventual national finalist Georgetown, 1-1, before being eliminated on penalty kicks.

McIntyre and his assistants were rewarded with 2012 BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year honors for authoring the breakout campaign.

In 2013, Syracuse's first year in the Atlantic Coast Conference, McIntyre led the Orange to a 10-7-1 record, marking the first time in more than a decade that the team posted double-digit wins in consecutive years. Along the way, the Orange went undefeated in non-conference play (7-0-0), beat two ranked teams (#12 Connecticut and #19 Clemson) and earned its first ACC win, a 2-1 victory at Duke.

The Orange reached unprecedented heights in 2014 when it climbed to No. 1 in the national rankings for the first time in school history. Syracuse won a share of the ACC Atlantic Division and earned a program-best No. 9 seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Orange defeated Penn State on its home field before its season came to an end in the Sweet 16 in a 2-1 overtime loss to Georgetown. Syracuse posted a 16-4-1 record, finishing just one win shy of the single-season school record for victories.

The 2015 squad produced the most successful season in school history. Syracuse, which had to replace seven starters, became the first No. 10 seed to win the ACC Tournament, the first in school history. The Orange earned a program-best sixth seed in the NCAA Tournament. After a first-round bye, they defeated Dartmouth, Seattle and Boston College to advance to the College Cup for the first time in school history. The Orange faced No. 3 Clemson for the third time that season and were tied with the Tigers, 0-0, after 110 minutes of play. Clemson won the penalty kick shootout to advance to the national final. Syracuse ended the season with a 16-5-4 record and was No. 4 in the final NSCAA poll, its highest final ranking in school history.

Syracuse continued its success in 2016, earning the No. 8 seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Orange

earned a first-round bye and defeated Dartmouth to advance to the third round for the third straight year.

Elite-level players have keyed the Orange's success as McIntyre's recruiting classes have consistently been ranked in the top 40 by *College Soccer News*.

## REVIVING A SLEEPING GIANT

Prior to taking over the Orange, McIntyre spent seven seasons (2003-09) as the head coach at his alma mater, Hartwick College. He guided the Hawks to four 10-win seasons and a 2005 NCAA Championship appearance.

McIntyre succeeded the legendary Jim Lennox in 2003 and promptly led the Hawks to 15-2-1 overall record, the most wins for the program since 1993. The next season, McIntyre was named the regional coach of the year after presiding over a 13-3-3 campaign that featured a nine-game winning streak and an Atlantic Soccer Conference runner-up finish.

In 2005, McIntyre guided the team to another 13-win season and the Atlantic Soccer Conference regular-season and tournament titles. For his efforts, McIntyre was rewarded with 2005 Atlantic Soccer Conference Coach of the Year honors, and by virtue of its conference championship, Hartwick earned its first trip to the NCAA Tournament in a decade.

Two years later, McIntyre was the driving force behind Hartwick's successful move from the Atlantic Soccer Conference to the MAC, qualifying for the league's postseason tournament in all three seasons (2007-09) he was at the helm.

## AN ALL-AMERICAN PLAYING CAREER

Before becoming Hartwick's sixth head coach, McIntyre was a standout player for the Hawks, earning NSCAA First Team All-America honors as a senior in 1995. He helped the program to two NCAA Tournament berths and a 52-20-7 record in his four seasons (1992-95).

McIntyre scored 18 goals and had 10 assists in his career and developed a reputation for clutch goal-scoring. He tallied game-winning goals in NCAA Tournament victories against Rutgers and Boston University in 1993, and the Hawks were 16-0-1 in his career when he scored a goal.

McIntyre was named the Hartwick Male Athlete of the Year in 1995-96 and earned the President's Scholar-Athlete Award. In addition, he was enshrined in the Hartwick College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2001, his first year on the ballot.

## CLIMBING THE COACHING LADDER

After his college playing career, McIntyre served as an assistant coach at Fairfield from 1996-98 under former Hartwick assistant coach Carl Rees. He helped Rees lead the Stags to a pair of Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) championship game appearances.

In 1998, Fairfield went 15-4-1 and earned the program's first national ranking, checking in at No. 24 after a 10-0-1 start. In addition, McIntyre coached the Region I amateur team to the gold medal at the 1999 U.S. Soccer Festival in Portland, Ore.

Following his stint at Fairfield, McIntyre returned to Oneonta, N.Y. to become head coach for the former Division I program at Oneonta State. He posted a 36-28-7 record for the Red Dragons from 1999-2002. He led them to three straight double-digit win seasons and was named Independent Coach of the Year in his debut campaign after leading Oneonta to a 10-6-1 record and an upset of Hartwick in the 1999 Mayor's Cup title game.

A native of Basildon, England, McIntyre and his wife, Jenn, have a daughter, Lyla, and a dog, Elmore.
