#### Need to Know

##### ROAD WARRIORS

- The Tigers have yet to lose on the road, outscoring opponents by a combined 7-2 across five matches.
- Clemson had back to back road ACC matches and in less than a week and rose to the occasion, earning a 1-0 win at North Carolina and securing a 1-1 draw at Pitt, bringing home four points in total from their road trip.
- Joseph Andema was the starting keeper in both matches. He has allowed just three goals over seven games.

##### TOUGH TO BEAT

- Clemson has been tough to beat at home under Mike Noonan. Since Noonan took over, the Tigers are 97-33-15 in home games. Clemson finished the 2021 season second nationally in cumulative attendance (31,853) and fourth in attendance per game (2,275). Both marks topped the ACC. There was a recorded crowd of 6,359 at the Aug. 26th win against Indiana.
- Clemson is 89-5-5 under Noonan when leading at the half and was unbeaten (12-0-1) last season when scoring the game's first goal. Noonan is 126-9-9 at Clemson when his team scores first.
- During his time at Clemson, Noonan is 117-8-5 when the Tigers score at least twice. Clemson won all its games last season when scoring at least two goals (14-0-0). Noonan has never lost at Clemson when scoring at least three goals.

##### SENSATIONAL SYLLA

- Ousmane Sylla has been extraordinary in the 2022 season, leading the team with five goals and 15 points. He has the most points per game in the ACC (1.50).
- He's scored four points in two separate games this season, and has tallied at least one point in seven of the 10 games he's played.

##### INSANE SEYE

- Mohamed Seye has been brilliant as Clemson's #9, scoring two goals and assisting on three of Sylla's four goals this season. He has six total assists.
- His ten points are second-most on the team, and he has twice tallied four points in a single match this season (Indiana, UNC Asheville).
- Seye is tied for the ACC lead in assists.

##### HOT START

- The Tigers got off to 6-0 start for the second-straight season, outscoring their opponents 14-3 in the first six games.
- Prior to the goal scored by Boston College in the second half, Clemson had a 387 minute streak without allowing a goal.

##### DOMINATING THE DRAFT

- A program-record six Tigers were selected in the 2021 MLS SuperDraft, tied for most from any one school in a single draft. It marked the third consecutive year in which at least three Tigers were selected.
- Clemson has had 34 players drafted since 2000, and 22 in the last seven, most of any program in that span. Every starter on Clemson's 2019 team was drafted or signed to a professional contract.
