Need to Know

ROAD WARRIORS

- The Tigers have just one loss on the road, outscoring opponents by a combined 11-3 across seven matches.
- Most recently, Clemson went on the road and knocked off previously undefeated No. 3 Duke, 2-0 in the ACC quarterfinals and then took it to Wake Forest 2-0 in the semifinals. The Demon Deacons did not record a shot on goal.

TOUGH TO BEAT

- Clemson has been tough to beat at home under Mike Noonan. Since Noonan took over, the Tigers are 100-34-15 in home games. Clemson leads the nation in cumulative home attendance (29,855). There was a recorded crowd of 6,359 at the Aug. 26th win against Indiana. Clemson is 42-11-2 at home in the NCAA Tournament all time.
- Clemson is 92-5-5 under Noonan when leading at the half and was unbeaten (12-0-1) last season when scoring the game's first goal. Noonan is 131-9-9 at Clemson when his team scores first, including 11-1-1 this season.
- During his time at Clemson, Noonan is 122-8-5 when the Tigers score at least twice. Clemson won all its games this season when scoring at least two goals (11-0-0). Noonan has never lost at Clemson when the team scores at least three goals.

SENSATIONAL SYLLA

- Ousmane Sylla has been extraordinary in the 2022 season, leading the team with five goals and 17 points. He is tied for seventh in the ACC in points per game (1.00). He is tied for third in the ACC in assists (7).
- He's scored four points in two separate games this season, and has tallied at least one point in nine of the 16 games he's played. This season, he was named to the All-ACC first team for the first time in his career.

INSANE SEYE

- Mohamed Seye has been brilliant as Clemson's #9, scoring four goals and assisting on three of Sylla's five goals this season. He is the only Tiger to have started every game this season, and has six total assists.
- His 14 points are second-most on the team, and he has twice tallied four points in a single match this season (Indiana, UNC Asheville). He was named to the All-ACC third team. It was his first all-conference recognition.
- Seye is tied for fifth in the ACC in assists with six. He was named to the All-ACC third team. It was his first all-conference recognition.

PEAKING AT THE RIGHT TIME

- The Tigers have won five of their last six games, outscoring their opponents 13-4 over that stretch.
- Clemson defeated Notre Dame 3-1 at home in the first round to advance to the ACC Quarterfinal match for the 12th time in Mike Noonan's 13 season tenure. The 2-0 upset victory on the road against top-seeded Duke earned Noonan his 10th appearance in the ACC semifinal match, and the 2-0 result at Wake sent him to his third ACC final in four seasons and fifth overall.

NOONAN IN TOURNAMENT TIME

- This is the Tigers' seventh appearance in the NCAA Tournament under Mike Noonan, and fourth consecutive appearance. Last season, Clemson won its third NCAA Championship.
- Clemson has advanced to the round of 16 in each of the last three seasons in the NCAA Tournament, and is 15-1-1 overall in the round of 32.
- Mike Noonan appeared in his fifth ACC Championship in just 13 seasons. His teams have reached at least the semifinal in 10 of the last 11 seasons. This was Clemson's third ACC final appearance in four seasons.

NINE STRAIGHT IN THE PALMETTO STATE

- The Tigers' 1-0 win in Columbia on September 2 marked their ninth consecutive victory over their rival, tied for the longest streak in matchup history.
- Alvaro Gomez's second half goal proved decisive while Trevor Manion earned his first career shutout and Clemson moved to 3-0-0 on the season with a 6-2 goal differential.

GARCIA'S GOALS

- Marco Garcia became the first Clemson freshman to record a hat trick since Eric Quill in 1996 when he accomplished the feat in a span of just under six minutes. He played 32 total minutes in the match against Presbyterian. He earned his first career start at North Carolina.

DOMINATING THE DRAFT

- A program-record six Tigers were selected in the 2021 MLS SuperDraft, tied for most from any one school in a single draft. It marked the third consecutive year in which at least three Tigers were selected.
- Clemson has had 34 players drafted since 2000, and 22 in the last seven, most of any program in that span. Every starter on Clemson's 2019 team was drafted or signed to a professional contract.

FRESH FACES

- Clemson added a whopping 14 newcomers to the 2022 roster, including grad transfer and former Brown captain Derek Waleffe, as well as UNCG transfer Joey Skinner.
- Clemson has relied on its true freshmen this season for 3,109 total minutes. The freshman class has contributed eight goals and 22 points this season. Joseph Andema has cemented himself as the starting goalkeeper, and he's earned eight shutouts in 15 starts. That figure is tied for ninth-most in NCAA and is second-best amongst freshmen.

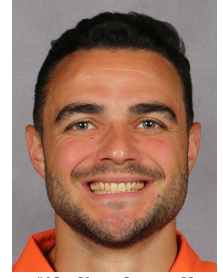

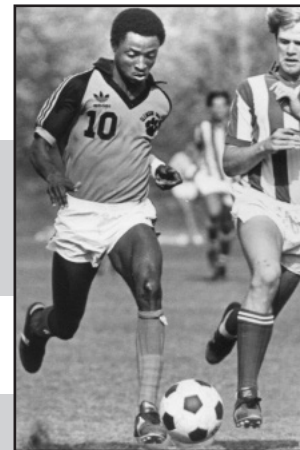

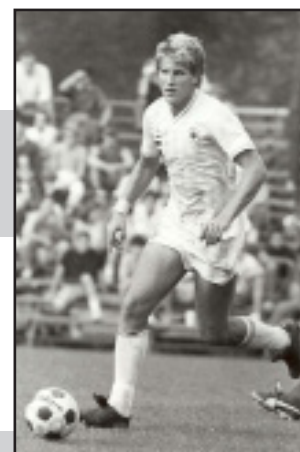

Clemson Wins over #1 Ranked Teams

When Clemson defeated Pittsburgh in men's soccer on April 17, 2021, it marked the eleventh time in history that Clemson had upset the nation's top ranked team in men's soccer. It was the 38th time Clemson has done it in all sports combined. The soccer team's 11 upsets of number-one is second in Clemson sports history to the baseball program's 17 wins over number-one. Clemson has also defeated number-one in men's basketball, men's tennis, women's basketball and women's soccer. Men's soccer has defeated the nation's No. 1 team in nine different seasons.

Clemson defeated number-one Wake Forest 2-1 in overtime in the NCAA Tournament on November 30, 2002 in Winston-Salem, NC.

The Tigers also defeated a #1 Virginia team, 2-1 at Virginia on a goal with just one second left by Jimmy Glenn. That is the latest game-winning regulation goal in Clemson history in any match.

The 2002 win over Wake Forest was the third time Clemson has beaten the number-one team in the NCAA soccer Tournament. It also took place in 1984 when Clemson beat a number-one Alabama A&M team 3-1 in the second round in a game played at Clemson. Clemson also defeated a number-one Indiana team in the second round of the 1987 tournament.

Clemson's 2-1 win over Pittsburgh on Nov. 22, 2020, secured the program its 15th ACC Championship. It also meant that the 2020-21 season was the first in program history with multiple wins against No. 1.
