Wake Forest handed Clemson its largest home loss of the Mike Noonan era earlier this season in a 6-1 result.

The 6-1 loss marked the most goals ever allowed by a Mike Noonan coached Clemson team.

Clemson has never defeated Wake Forest in the ACC Tournament (0-4-2). They last met in the 2017 ACC semifinal, where Wake won 2-1.

Need to Know

ROAD WARRIORS

- The Tigers have just one loss on the road, outscoring opponents by a combined 9-3 across seven matches.
- Most recently, Clemson went on the road and knocked off previously undefeated No. 3 Duke, 2-0 in the ACC quarterfinals. Goalkeeper Joseph Andema earned his seventh shutout in the match.

TOUGH TO BEAT

- Clemson has been tough to beat at home under Mike Noonan. Since Noonan took over, the Tigers are 100-34-15 in home games. Clemson leads the nation in cumulative home attendance (29,855). There was a recorded crowd of 6,359 at the Aug. 26th win against Indiana.
- Clemson is 91-5-5 under Noonan when leading at the half and was unbeaten (12-0-1) last season when scoring the game's first goal. Noonan is 130-9-9 at Clemson when his team scores first, including 10-1-1 this season.
- During his time at Clemson, Noonan is 121-8-5 when the Tigers score at least twice. Clemson won all its games this season when scoring at least two goals (10-0-0). Noonan has never lost at Clemson when the team scores at least three goals.

SENSATIONAL SYLLA

- Ousmane Sylla has been extraordinary in the 2022 season, leading the team with five goals and 16 points. He is sixth in the ACC in points per game (1.07).
- He's scored four points in two separate games this season, and has tallied at least one point in eight of the 14 games he's played.

INSANE SEYE

- Mohamed Seye has been brilliant as Clemson's #9, scoring four goals and assisting on three of Sylla's five goals this season. He is the only Tiger to have started every game this season, and has six total assists.
- His 14 points are second-most on the team, and he has twice tallied four points in a single match this season (Indiana, UNC Asheville).
- Seye and Sylla are each tied for fourth in the ACC in assists with six.

PEAKING AT THE RIGHT TIME

- The Tigers have won each of their last four games, outscoring their opponents 11-2 over that stretch.
- Clemson defeated Notre Dame 3-1 at home on Wednesday to advance to the ACC Quarterfinal match for the 12th time in Mike Noonan's 13 season tenure. The 2-0 upset victory on the road against top-seeded Duke earned Noonan his 10th appearance in the ACC semifinal match.

FRESH FACES

- Clemson added a whopping 14 newcomers to the 2022 roster, including grad transfer and former Brown captain Derek Waleffe, as well as UNCG transfer Joey Skinner.
- Clemson has relied on its true freshmen this season for 2,739 total minutes. The freshman class has contributed eight goals and 22 points this season. Joseph Andema has cemented himself as the starting goalkeeper, and he's earned six shutouts in 12 starts. He had a career high six saves in the 3-1 win over Notre Dame.
