### CLEMSON OVERVIEW

- Clemson returns 17 letterwinners from the 2022 roster, including five players that were All-ACC selections, and added three graduate transfer to bolster the roster.
- The Tigers held a .271 batting average last season led by McKenzie Clark (.328), maintained a .467 slugging percentage and .365 on-base percentage.
- Clemson's pitching staff returned every pitcher from 2022 and the group held a 1.78 ERA through 385.1 IP with 345 strikeouts.

### FIU OVERVIEW

- FIU is led by second year head coach Mike Larabee.
- The Panthers batted .224 with 270 hits and 138 runs scored in 2022. The pitching staff held a 4.83 ERA through 324.1 IP and 202 strikeouts.
- Madison Lewis leads returners at the plate after batting .273 in 2022 off 33 hits, 20 RBI and 16 runs scored. The Panthers don't return any pitchers from last season.

### GEORGIA STATE OVERVIEW

- Georgia State is led by second year head coach Angie Nicholson.
- The Panthers batted .237 with 317 hits and 192 runs scored in 2022. The pitching staff held a 4.40 ERA through 346.2 IP and 226 strikeouts.
- Bailey Richardson leads returners at the plate after batting .315 in 2022 with 53 hits, 38 RBI and 29 runs scored. Emily Hodnett leads players in the circle with a 4.02 ERA through 55.2 IP and 39 strikeouts.

### KANSAS CITY OVERVIEW

- Kansas City is led by first year head coach Kiki Stokes O'Connor.
- The Roos batted .228 with 272 hits and 145 runs scored in 2022. The pitching staff held a 1.70 ERA through 301.1 IP and 181 strikeouts.
- Ally Vonfeldt leads returners at the plate after batting .270 in 2022 off 38 hits, 16 RBI and 26 runs scored. Camryn Stichel pitched 81.2 innings with 39 strikeouts and leads returners with a 6.28 ERA.

### QUICK HITS

- Clemson outscored opponents last season 282-138.
- The Tigers run-ruled 13 opponents: FGCU, Kent State, LIU, Texas Tech, Boston U, Winthrop, Furman, four ACC opponents (Duke, Louisville, North Carolina and Pitt twice) and posted two run-rules in the 2022 Clemson

Regional (UNCW and Louisiana).

- Clemson had 405 hits through 59 games, including posting 67 doubles and 68 home runs.
- The Tigers finished with 260 RBIs last season with Alia Logoleo (46), Valerie Cagle (44) and McKenzie Clark (44) leading returners.
- When Clemson scored in the first inning, the Tigers were 20-4. The Tigers have outscored opponents 51-21 in the first inning.
- The Tigers are 33-7 when scoring first this season, no matter what inning.

### SINGLE-GAME TICKETS

- During the off-season, Clemson expanded the berm seating along the outfield fence to allow more fans into McWhorter Stadium.
- Single-game tickets went on sale on Feb. 19 to the general public. Fans are encouraged to purchase tickets at <https://am.ticketmaster.com/clemson/>.
- New in 2023, the Clemson Athletic Ticket Office will hold a limited number of seats on the berm for walk-up sales on the day of each game. Fans can purchase these tickets on gameday at the gate of McWhorter.

### THE NATIONALLY RANKED TIGERS

- Clemson clocked in at No. 9 on D1 Softball's preseason rankings - the highest preseason ranking in the program's short infancy.
- Clemson is clocking in at No. 10 on all remaining national polls (USA Today/NFCA, ESPN/USA Softball and Softball America).
- Clemson received its first single-digit ranking in program history clocking in at No. 9 on the ESPN/USA Softball poll during the third week of 2022.

### IN THE SHORT INFANCY...

- The Clemson softball team has accomplished multiple feats for being a program with only 138 games.
- The 100th game in program history was played on March 13, 2022 against Illinois. The Tigers 4-0 victory was due to Millie Thompson pitching her first career shutout with a career-high 11 strikeouts. The game was played almost five years to the date of the program's announcement (March 14, 2017).
- Through the first 100 games, the softball team paced itself to tie the best start by a program at Clemson. Softball tied women's tennis with 78 wins. Other sports at Clemson can be found below:

- Clemson hit its 100th win in program history in 130 games - this marked the second-fastest program to reach 100 wins after women's tennis accomplished this in 128 matches. A full list can be found below:

- Coach Rittman became the fifth-fastest head coach to reach 100 wins at Clemson. Among active coaches, Coach Swinney is the only coach to reach 100 wins faster (129).
- Other impressive feats in the program's short infancy on the field include: 2021 ACC Regular Season title, two appearances in the ACC Softball Championship final (2021, 1-0 loss to Duke & 2022 8-6 loss to Florida State), two Regional Appearances (2021, Tuscaloosa Regional & 2022, hosted the Clemson Regional as the No. 10 National Seed) and a Super Regional Appearance in only the third year.

## IN THE ACC

- The Tigers were predicted to finish third among Atlantic Coast Conference schools trailing Florida State and Virginia Tech.
- Redshirt junior Valerie Cagle was once again selected to the Preseason All-ACC Softball Team. This marks her third Preseason All-ACC selection (2021 & 2022).
- Junior McKenzie Clark back-to-back Preseason All-ACC honors after garnering it before the 2022 season as well.
- Redshirt junior Alia Logoleo earns her first Preseason All-ACC selection.

## THE FIRST FIVE, THE NEXT FIVE

- Clemson softball was announced in March 2017 with the hiring of head coach John Rittman on Nov. 7, 2017.
- On June 21, 2022, Coach Rittman and Clemson reached a new five-year contract agreement keeping him at Clemson through the 2027 season.
- On Nov. 3, 2022, Coach Rittman celebrated five years at the helm of the softball program and looks ahead at what the next five years has in store for it.

## FALL ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- The Tigers continue to make history on and off the field.
- In the fall of 2022, the softball team posted a 3.68

GPA to set not only a program record, but the highest team semester GPA in school history for any team at Clemson.

- As a department, Clemson tallied a 3.23 GPA to mark the ninth consecutive semester with a combined average GPA greater than 3.0.

## VALERIE CAGLE

- Redshirt junior Valerie Cagle has been a crucial piece to Clemson's early success.
- The Yorktown, Va., native is a two-time NFCA All-American (First Team in 2022, Second Team in 2021).
- She was the first softball player in the ACC to be crowned both the ACC Freshman of the Year and Player of the Year earning the honor in 2021.
- In 2021 she was a USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Top 10 Finalist, and was a Top 25 Finalist in 2022.
- On her career, Cagle is batting .357 with 155 hits, 125 RBI and 103 runs while maintaining a .705 slugging percentage.
- Being a dual threat, she also holds a 2.08 ERA through 91 appearances, 467.0 IP and 530 strikeouts. She leads the program with 53 wins under her belt and has limited opponents to a .206 average.

## MILLIE THOMPSON

- Junior Millie Thompson has added the perfect 1-2 punch dynamic with Cagle to Clemson's pitching staff.
- The lefty was a Third Team All-ACC selection in 2022 after making the All-Freshman team in 2021.
- She threw two no-hitters in 2022, her first coming against Furman (April 6) in five-innings and her second against UNCW (May 20) in the Clemson Regional.
- The Bedford, Va., native finished the Clemson Regional with a five-inning shutout against Louisiana (May 22) with five strikeouts, one hit and one walk.
- She led the ACC in 2022 in strikeout-to-walk ration with 6.11, also ranked 18th in the NCAA. She also led the ACC in fewest walks allowed per seven innings with 1.06.
- On her career, she holds a 2.27 ERA through 46 appearances and 198.0 IP. She has struck out 180 batters and clocked 24 victories while limiting opponents to a .227 average.

## MCKENZIE CLARK

- Junior McKenzie Clark has taken ownership of center field since becoming a Tiger in 2021.
- She is a two-time All-ACC selection being named to the Second Team in 2022 and First Team in 2021. She was also a 2021 NFCA All-Region Southeast selection.
- The Myakka City, Fla., native became the first Tiger to hit an inside the park home run doing so against Akron in 2022.
- She led the Tigers in 2022 with a .328 average off 59 hits, 42 runs and 13 doubles.
- On her career, Clark is hitting .341 with 119 hits, 63 RBI and 89 runs scored. She has stolen 29 bases while holding a .630 slugging percentage and .424 on-base percentage.

## ALIA LOGOLEO

- Redshirt junior Alia Logoleo has a dynamic presence in the Tiger lineup.
- She is a two-time All-ACC selection being named to the Third Team in 2022 and Second Team in 2021. She was also an ACC All-Tournament selection in 2022.
- The Nashville, Tenn., native led the Tigers last season with 15 home runs, including seven in ACC games, while bringing in a team-high 46 RBI.
- Defensively, she turned 10 double plays at shortstop in 2022.

# NOTES

- On her career, Logoleo is batting .290 with 93 hits, 83 RBI and 60 runs scored. She has 23 home runs and a .561 slugging percentage and .361 on-base percentage.

## GRADUATE TRANSFERS

- The Clemson coaching staff has taken advantage of the transfer portal the past two seasons to bolster the Tiger lineup.
- For the 2022 season, Clemson picked up NC State grad transfer, Sam Russ, to add some speed to the lineup. Russ holds Clemson's single-season record for stolen bases with 29.
- Prior to the 2023 season, Clemson once again picked up some crucial grad transfers adding Caroline Jacobsen (Duke), Ally Miklesh (Wisconsin) and Reedy Davenport (FGCU).

# HEAD COACH JOHN RITTMAN



**John Rittman**, a longtime head coach and member of the USA Softball Women's National Team coaching pool, was named the first Head Coach of Clemson Softball on Nov. 3, 2017. Rittman came to Clemson after serving as the Associate Head Coach at the University of Kansas from 2015-17. Rittman joined the Jayhawks after 18 seasons as the Head Coach at Stanford University and 10 years on the United States National Team coaching staff (2001-08, 2016-18).

In the third year of the Clemson program, Rittman continued to guide Clemson to new heights by making the program's first Super Regional appearance after earning the program's first national seed and hosting a Regional. Early in the season, the Tigers upset then-No. 6 Washington, 2-0, at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational for the program's first top-10 win. Clemson followed that by playing its 100th game in program history against Illinois on March 13. The Tigers won with a 4-0 victory to tie Clemson women's tennis for the most wins through a program's first 100 games with a 78-22 record. With that record, Rittman solidified himself as the winningest coach among active head coaches at Clemson surpassing Dabo Swinney (football), who held a 74-26 record. The Tigers continued to reach new levels by winning their 100th game in only 130 games on May 1 with a 3-2 win against Georgia Tech on Senior Day to become the second-fastest program at Clemson to reach 100 wins trailing only women's tennis (128). The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups. The upset win over Virginia Tech marks Clemson softball's highest victory over a ranked opponent in program history. The hot streak continued for Clemson entering postseason as the Tigers earned the No. 10 national seed for the NCAA softball tournament. The No. 10 Tigers welcomed No. 17 Auburn, Louisiana and UNCW for the Clemson Regional and made a clean sweep in three games by shutting out all three programs and run-ruling UNCW and Louisiana to advance to the Stillwater Super Regional. Clemson finished the year with five All-ACC team selections, and Valerie Cagle was named an NFCA First Team All-American, the second NFCA All-America honor of her career. Behind Rittman's efforts, Clemson climbed as high as No. 14 in the NFCA national rankings and earned its first single digit ranking from ESPN/USA Softball rankings coming in at No. 9 for two weeks. Off the field, graduate Sam Russ was named to CoSIDA's Academic All-America Third Team to become softball's first Academic All-American.

During the second season and first complete year, Rittman propelled Clemson to even higher heights by becoming the ACC Regular Season Champions after posting a 29-5 ACC record and winning seven ACC series, including six series sweeps. The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups. The Tigers finished the season with a 44-8 record and the sixth-best WL Percentage in the NCAA (.846). Rittman was named ACC Coach of the Year and guided Cagle to being the first softball player in league history to be named both the ACC Freshman and Player of the Year in the same season. Clemson finished with six individuals earning nine All-ACC team selections following the regular season, including three on the first team. Cagle and freshman McKenzie Clark were

named to the NFCA All-Region team. The honors continued to roll in for Cagle as she became the first Clemson softball All-American garnering second team honors from the NFCA, was a JWOS First Team All-American, a Top-Three Finalist for the NFCA's National Freshman of the Year and a Top-10 Finalist for USA Softball's Collegiate Player of the Year. Behind Rittman's efforts, Clemson climbed as high as No. 13 in the NFCA national rankings and No. 10 in the ESPN/USA Softball rankings before finishing the season at No. 18 in the NFCA poll. Rittman led the Tigers to their first postseason appearance traveling to the Tuscaloosa Regional to defeat Troy twice, including a five-inning run-rule victory in the opening game that capped off a historic second season.

In its inaugural season, Rittman transcended Clemson into a nationally-respected program. Rittman guided Clemson, which was predicted to finish in 10th in the conference, according to the 2020 ACC preseason poll, to a 19-8 overall record, including 5-1 in ACC play. The Tigers, who won both of their ACC series against Virginia and Pitt, won 11 of their final 12 games before the 2020 season was cut short due to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19). Additionally, Clemson went 14-2 at Clemson Softball Stadium (now McWhorter Stadium), which included a 13-game home win streak that spanned 25 days. Rittman and the Tigers generated plenty of enthusiasm among the Clemson faithful as the first-year program ranked fourth nationally in attendance (24,860) and fifth in average attendance (1,544/game) in 2020.

At Stanford, Rittman and the Cardinals recorded 18-consecutive winning seasons, made 16-straight NCAA appearances, notched 13 40-win seasons and produced at least one All-American in 15 of his last 17 seasons. As head coach, Rittman accumulated a 750-351-3 overall mark, coached a national player of the year, 16 All-Americans, earned five Super Regional appearances, two Women's College World Series appearances and maintained a spot in every regular-season NFCA top-25 poll for more than a decade.

Rittman served on the staff of the USA Softball team which won gold at both the 2016 Women's Softball World Championship and the 2017 Pan Am Qualifier. He also worked with Team USA from 2001-08, coaching the 2004 Olympic gold medal winners in Athens and the 2008 silver medalists in Beijing. Team USA also won gold medals at the 2002 and 2006 World Championship and the 2003 and 2007 Pan Am Games.

Rittman graduated from New Mexico State with a degree in journalism in 1986. He was a three-year letterwinner in baseball as an outfielder at NMSU after transferring from Yavapai Junior College in Prescott, Arizona.

Rittman and his wife, Lorie, a former softball player at the University of Oklahoma, are the parents of Justin, a UCLA graduate and former fullback for the Bruins, and Jake, a Notre Dame graduate and former punter for the Fighting Irish.
