CLEMSON OVERVIEW

- Clemson returns 17 letterwinners from the 2022 roster, including five players that were All-ACC selections, and added three graduate transfer to bolster the roster.
- 24 of the 25 players on the current roster have made an appearance this season
- The Tigers hold a .377 batting average after the USF tournament led by Valerie Cagle (.509) and JoJo Hyatt (.469). The team holds a .632 slugging percentage led by Cagle (1.038) and a .456 on-base percentage led by McKenzie Clark (.569).
- Clemson's pitching staff maintains a 0.96 ERA through 102.0 innings pitched. They have struck out 94 batters and limited opponents to a .182 average.

GARDNER-WEBB OVERVIEW

- Gardner-Webb is led by head coach Bailey Wigness.
- The Runnin' Bulldogs are batting .273 as a team led by Andrew Lyon batting .500 with a .419 team slugging percentage.
- In the circle, the team posts a 5.06 ERA with 51 strikeouts through 99.2 innings.

QUICK HITS

- Clemson has outscored opponents 121-17.
- The Tigers have run-ruled five opponents: FIU, Georgia State, No. 14/11 Northwestern, Ohio State and Michigan State.
- Clemson has 161 hits through 16 games, including posting 30 doubles and 25 home runs.
- The Tigers have 112 RBI this season with Valerie Cagle (20), Caroline Jacobsen (16), JoJo Hyatt (13), McKenzie Clark (12) and Alia Logoleo (12) leading the way. A total of six players have double digit RBI.
- Nine Tigers have combined for 43 multi-hit games this season led by Cagle (10).

SINGLE-GAME TICKETS

- During the off-season, Clemson expanded the berm seating along the outfield fence to allow more fans into McWhorter Stadium.
- Single-game tickets went on sale on Feb. 19 to the general public. Fans are encouraged to purchase tickets at <https://am.ticketmaster.com/clemson/>.
- New in 2023, the Clemson Athletic Ticket Office will hold a limited number of seats on the berm for walk-up sales on the day of each game. Fans can purchase these tickets on gameday at the gate of McWhorter.

McWHORTER MADNESS

- Clemson fans continue to showcase why they are the best fans in the country.
- Through five home games, Clemson has welcomed 9,878 fans into the stadium to average roughly 1,975 fans per game.

- Prior to the 2023 season, Clemson sold out of season tickets for the second consecutive year after previously selling out in 2022 (season tickets were not sold in 2021 due to COVID).
- During the preseason Orange vs. Purple scrimmage, Clemson pulled roughly 950ish fans to the event, the largest gathering for the open practice before

THE NATIONALLY RANKED TIGERS

- The Tigers continue to reach new heights climbing to No. 4 on the USA Today/NFCA and ESPN/USA Softball polls heading into week 4.
- Clemson rounds out the polls coming in at No. 7 on D1Softball and No. 5 on Softball America polls.
- Clemson received its first single-digit ranking in program history clocking in at No. 9 on the ESPN/USA Softball poll during the third week of 2022.
- The Tigers have received single-digit rankings by the NFCA for three consecutive weeks in 2023

VALERIE CAGLE

- Redshirt junior Valerie Cagle has been a crucial piece to Clemson's early success.
- The Yorktown, Va., native is a two-time NFCA All-American (First Team in 2022, Second Team in 2021).
- She was the first softball player in the ACC to be crowned both the ACC Freshman of the Year and Player of the Year earning the honor in 2021.
- In 2021 she was a USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Top 10 Finalist and Top 3 Freshman of the Year and was a Top 25 Finalist in 2022.
- This season, Cagle is batting .509 with a team-high 27 hits, including five doubles and seven home runs with a 1.038 slugging percentage. She has tallied 20 RBI and scored 14 runs.
- Being a dual threat, she also holds a 0.83 ERA through nine appearances with one solo shutout and one combined shutout. She has struck out 51 batters in 42.1 innings of work while limiting opponents to a .188 average.
- She pitched both games against SEC opponents during the third week of action pitching 13 innings with 12 strikeouts without giving up a walk. Against No. 17 Georgia, she only allowed four hits in seven innings, while against No. 12 Tennessee, she allowed six but struck out eight batters and kept the Lady Vols scoreless for 5.2 innings.
- Cagle was named ACC Pitcher and Co-Player of the Week after the second week of action where she batted .529 with one double and four home runs and maintained a 1.65 ERA with three victories and a save while striking out 23 batters. She was also a Top Performance selection by the NFCA
- After opening weekend, Cagle earned her first Top Performances by the NFCA of the season.

PITCHING PROWESS

- Junior Millie Thompson has added the perfect 1-2 punch dynamic with Cagle to Clemson's pitching staff.
- The lefty was a Third Team All-ACC selection in 2022 after making the All-Freshman team in 2021.
- She threw two no-hitters in 2022, her first coming against Furman (April 6) in five-innings and her second against UNCW (May 20) in the Clemson Regional. The

Bedford, Va., native finished the Clemson Regional with a five-inning shutout against Louisiana (May 22) with five strikeouts, one hit and one walk.

- She led the ACC in 2022 in strikeout-to-walk ratio with 6.11, which also ranked 18th in the NCAA. She also led the ACC in fewest walks allowed per seven innings with 1.06.
- On her career, she holds a 1.73 ERA through 52 appearances and 226.2 IP. She has struck out 203 batters and clocked 29 victories.
- Joining Cagle and Thompson have been junior Regan Spencer and sophomore Brooke McCubbin.
- Spencer has made six appearances (14 innings) with one solo shutout and seven strikeouts while maintaining a 0.50 ERA.
- McCubbin has appeared in four games (17 innings) and struck out 13 batters, including a career-high eight in the third week of action against Michigan State. She holds a 0.82 ERA with two victories.

NEED FOR SPEED

- The Tigers have been dynamic on the base paths in 2023 clocking 35 stolen bases through 16 games to average 2.19 per game and sit 22nd in the NCAA and third in the ACC.
- Pinch runner Julia Bomhardt leads the team with six bases this season followed closely by Alia Logoleo, McKenzie Clark and Caroline Jacobsen all clocking five.
- In total, 11 Tigers have stolen at least one base this season (Cagle, Hyatt, Davenport, Moore, Miklesh, Oda and Houston).
- Last weekend against UIC, the Tigers finished with seven stolen bases led by Clark (3), while Miklesh (2), Bomhardt (1) and Moore (1) rounded out the group - this tied a program record set earlier in the season against Ohio State where six Tigers stole a base.
- Against UIC, Clark's three stolen bases tied her personal and the individual record for most stolen bases in a single game that was set by Sam Russ (2022) and Clark (2021).
- The Tigers finished the third week of action going 19-for-22 for stolen bases while only allowing opponents to steal two.

IN THE ACC

- The Tigers were predicted to finish third among Atlantic Coast Conference schools trailing Florida State and Virginia Tech.
- Redshirt junior Valerie Cagle was once again selected to the Preseason All-ACC Softball Team. This marks her third Preseason All-ACC selection (2021 & 2022).
- Junior McKenzie Clark back-to-back Preseason All-ACC honors after garnering it before the 2022 season as well.
- Redshirt junior Alia Logoleo earns her first Preseason All-ACC selection.

- Conference action gets underway for six programs as Clemson vs. Syracuse, Duke vs. Notre Dame and Virginia Tech vs. NC State get set to battle.

ACC & NCAA RANKINGS

- As a team, the Tigers sit towards the top of multiple stat categories in both the ACC and NCAA.
- In the ACC alone, Clemson holds the top spot in seven categories, the second spot in six categories and the third spot in two. The only area Clemson isn't in the top three is triples per game.

- Clemson softball was announced in March 2017 with the hiring of head coach John Rittman on Nov. 3, 2017.
- On June 21, 2022, Coach Rittman and Clemson reached a new five-year contract agreement keeping him at Clemson through the 2027 season.
- On Nov. 3, 2022, Coach Rittman celebrated five years at the helm of the softball program and looks ahead at what the next five years has in store for it.

- The Tigers continue to make history on and off the field.
- In the fall of 2022, the softball team posted a 3.68 GPA to set not only a program record, but the highest team semester GPA in school history for any team at Clemson.
- As a department, Clemson tallied a 3.23 GPA to mark the ninth consecutive semester with a combined average GPA greater than 3.0.

HEAD COACH JOHN RITTMAN



John Rittman, a longtime head coach and member of the USA Softball Women's National Team coaching pool, was named the first Head Coach of Clemson Softball on Nov. 3, 2017. Rittman came to Clemson after serving as the Associate Head Coach at the University of Kansas from 2015-17. Rittman joined the Jayhawks after 18 seasons as the Head Coach at Stanford University and 10 years on the United States National Team coaching staff (2001-08, 2016-18).

In the third year of the Clemson program, Rittman continued to guide Clemson to new heights by making the program's first Super Regional appearance after earning the program's first national seed and hosting a Regional. Early in the season, the Tigers upset then-No. 6 Washington, 2-0, at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational for the program's first top-10 win. Clemson followed that by playing its 100th game in program history against Illinois on March 13. The Tigers won with a 4-0 victory to tie Clemson women's tennis for the most wins through a program's first 100 games with a 78-22 record. With that record, Rittman solidified himself as the winningest coach among active head coaches at Clemson surpassing Dabo Swinney (football), who held a 74-26 record. The Tigers continued to reach new levels by winning their 100th game in only 130 games on May 1 with a 3-2 win against Georgia Tech on Senior Day to become the second-fastest program at Clemson to reach 100 wins trailing only women's tennis (128). The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups. The upset win over Virginia Tech marks Clemson softball's highest victory over a ranked opponent in program history. The hot streak continued for Clemson entering postseason as the Tigers earned the No. 10 national seed for the NCAA softball tournament. The No. 10 Tigers welcomed No. 17 Auburn, Louisiana and UNCW for the Clemson Regional and made a clean sweep in three games by shutting out all three programs and run-ruling UNCW and Louisiana to advance to the Stillwater Super Regional. Clemson finished the year with five All-ACC team selections, and Valerie Cagle was named an NFCA First Team All-American, the second NFCA All-America honor of her career. Behind Rittman's efforts, Clemson climbed as high as No. 14 in the NFCA national rankings and earned its first single digit ranking from ESPN/USA Softball rankings coming in at No. 9 for two weeks. Off the field, graduate Sam Russ was named to CoSIDA's Academic All-America Third Team to become softball's first Academic All-American.

During the second season and first complete year, Rittman propelled Clemson to even higher heights by becoming the ACC Regular Season Champions after posting a 29-5 ACC record and winning seven ACC series, including six series sweeps. The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups. The Tigers finished the season with a 44-8 record and the sixth-best WL Percentage in the NCAA (.846). Rittman was named ACC Coach of the Year and guided Cagle to being the first softball player in league history to be named both the ACC Freshman and Player of the Year in the same season. Clemson finished with six individuals earning nine All-ACC team selections following the regular season, including three on the first team. Cagle and freshman McKenzie Clark were

named to the NFCA All-Region team. The honors continued to roll in for Cagle as she became the first Clemson softball All-American garnering second team honors from the NFCA, was a JWOS First Team All-American, a Top-Three Finalist for the NFCA's National Freshman of the Year and a Top-10 Finalist for USA Softball's Collegiate Player of the Year. Behind Rittman's efforts, Clemson climbed as high as No. 13 in the NFCA national rankings and No. 10 in the ESPN/USA Softball rankings before finishing the season at No. 18 in the NFCA poll. Rittman led the Tigers to their first postseason appearance traveling to the Tuscaloosa Regional to defeat Troy twice, including a five-inning run-rule victory in the opening game that capped off a historic second season.

In its inaugural season, Rittman transcended Clemson into a nationally-respected program. Rittman guided Clemson, which was predicted to finish in 10th in the conference, according to the 2020 ACC preseason poll, to a 19-8 overall record, including 5-1 in ACC play. The Tigers, who won both of their ACC series against Virginia and Pitt, won 11 of their final 12 games before the 2020 season was cut short due to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19). Additionally, Clemson went 14-2 at Clemson Softball Stadium (now McWhorter Stadium), which included a 13-game home win streak that spanned 25 days. Rittman and the Tigers generated plenty of enthusiasm among the Clemson faithful as the first-year program ranked fourth nationally in attendance (24,860) and fifth in average attendance (1,544/game) in 2020.

At Stanford, Rittman and the Cardinals recorded 18-consecutive winning seasons, made 16-straight NCAA appearances, notched 13 40-win seasons and produced at least one All-American in 15 of his last 17 seasons. As head coach, Rittman accumulated a 750-351-3 overall mark, coached a national player of the year, 16 All-Americans, earned five Super Regional appearances, two Women's College World Series appearances and maintained a spot in every regular-season NFCA top-25 poll for more than a decade.

Rittman served on the staff of the USA Softball team which won gold at both the 2016 Women's Softball World Championship and the 2017 Pan Am Qualifier. He also worked with Team USA from 2001-08, coaching the 2004 Olympic gold medal winners in Athens and the 2008 silver medalists in Beijing. Team USA also won gold medals at the 2002 and 2006 World Championship and the 2003 and 2007 Pan Am Games.

Rittman graduated from New Mexico State with a degree in journalism in 1986. He was a three-year letterwinner in baseball as an outfielder at NMSU after transferring from Yavapai Junior College in Prescott, Arizona.

Rittman and his wife, Lorie, a former softball player at the University of Oklahoma, are the parents of Justin, a UCLA graduate and former fullback for the Bruins, and Jake, a Notre Dame graduate and former punter for the Fighting Irish.
