CLEMSON VERSUS APPALACHIAN STATE September 7, 1991

Today opens the 50th year of football in Death Valley. Following today's victory over App. State, Clemson has compiled a record of 165-62-8 in the 50 seasons. Clemson has now won each of its last nine games at home, including six in a row last year by a combined margin of 211-28, the largest such combined margin of victory in the history of Death Valley. Since coach Hatfield took over the Tiger program, Clemson has outscored its opponents in Death Valley by a score of 245-28.

Today's game with App. State marked the third meeting between the two schools. Clemson has outscored the Mountaineers by a 122-7 count. Clemson defeated App. State 34-0 this afternoon in Death Valley.

On the first play from scrimmage for the Tigers, DeChane Cameron connected with Larry Ryans for a gain of 38 yards. That reception was Ryans' second longest catch of his career. His career long came against App. State last year, when he caught a 40-yard touchdown pass in the first half. Ryans finished today's game with two catches for 49 yards.

When Richard Moncrief connected on a nine-yard touchdown pass to Terry Smith at the 1:48 mark in the third quarter, it marked Moncrief's first career TD pass.

App. State picked up its first first down of the game at the 13:50 mark in the third quarter as D. J. Campbell connected with J. K. Reeves for a gain of six yards.

Clemson now has a 71-17-8 record for its 96 season openers.

Clemson compiled 409 yards in total offense, while App. State was held to 84 total net yards.

Sophomore tailback Ronald Williams finished the game 108 yards on 14 carries. Last year Williams broke the 100 yard barrier against App. State (183), Georgia (128), Georgia Tech (108) and South Carolina (124). Combined with his efforts from last season, Williams has gained 291 yards on just 28 attempts against App. State for an average of 10.39 yards per carry average.

In the first half of today's contest with App. State, Clemson held the Mountaineers to just 18 yards in total offense while the Tiger compiled 254 yards. The first half stats looked like this: Clemson 35 rushes for 154 yards while App. State had 12 carries for one yard. Clemson connected on 7-12 passes for 100 yards, while App. State connected on 3-7 for 17 yards.

Today's contest marked the 218th time that Clemson has run down the hill. The Tigers have done it for every game since 1942, except for the seasons of 1970, 1971 and four games of the 1972 season.

When sophomore Ronald Williams scored on a 14-yard touchdown run in the first quarter, it gave him nine TDs for his career, and four TDs against Appalachian State. In last year's contest against App. State, Williams rushed for 183 yards on 14 carries and scored three touchdowns.

This afternoon, the three tailbacks combined for 213 yards on 41 carries. Last year the Clemson tailbacks carried the ball 24 times for 306 yards. Over the course of the last two games against App. State, the Clemson tailbacks have averaged 8.238 yards per carry.

Clemson held Appalachian State to just zero yards in total offense in the first quarter, while the Tigers put together 133 yards in total offense.

App. State crossed into Clemson territory for the first time in the game at the 4:30 mark in the fourth quarter when McClain gained two yards on an off tackle play. The deepest App. State got into Clemson territory was Clemson 22 yard line.

Former walk-on fullback Paul Caputo scored his second career touchdown in the second quarter on a fourth and two. His first career touchdown came against App. State last year. He scored on a one-yard run in the fourth quarter.

According to Tiger equipment manager Doug Gordon, 143 Clemson players dressed out for today's game with App. State.

At the 10:31 mark in the second quarter, red-shirt freshman Nelson Welsh kicked his first field goal of his career. His field goal was good from a distance of 36 yards. He was also good on a field goal from 31 yards out. Welsh also connected on four PATs.

According to assistant athletic director/ticket manager Yan Hilderbrand today's attendance was 72,000.

At the 4:40 mark in the second quarter, sophomore tailback Derrick Witherspoon scored on a one-yard run, marking his second TD run of his career. His first came against App. State last year as he had an 81-yard run, the longest run from scrimmage in the ACC in 1990.

Tiger punter Chuck Lynch had four punts against App. State this afternoon for an averaged of 37 yards per kick. Three of his four kicks pinned App. State inside their own 20-yard line.

Following today's victory, Clemson head coach Ken Hatfield has a 4-0 record over App. State's head coach Jerry Moore. They have been opposing head coaches in the Southwest Conference when Moore was at Texas Tech and Hatfield at Arkansas.

COACHES' QUOTES

COACH KEN HATFIELD, CLEMSON: First, I want to say that I thought Appalachian State played hard at all times. This team is a much improved one over last year, and it will be a contender in its conference.

I was glad that we were able to put press on them at all times. We were out there a long time today, especially the offense. This is the hottest day we have had and it was not like a controlled scrimmage where you can sit down and rest and take a break. The extreme heat got to some of our guys. All of their fluid was gone. We'll work on that and try not to get in that situation again.

We got some awfully good blocks from our linemen today. And I am really please with the second effort the backs put forth. Most of the linemen did a good job holding their blocks and I think you measure a running back on not how many yards he gains, but how many he gets after getting hit. And a good number of yards was gained on second effort today.

One of our goals today was to have 40 minutes of possession time. Although it was just over 35, we came out all right. We didn't want our defense to stay out there too long because of our depletion in our ranks with some guys out. I thought our outside linebackers did a good job rushing and pressuring the quarterback.

Overall, our kicking game needs to improve. I'm please with our deep snapper, but we have two weeks now to get some work in and work on improving where we were slack today. The kicking game will be one phase which will get our attention.

Temple is a solid team. Remember they beat Pittsburgh last year, so we can't sit back and count the score from today. They'll bring a representative team in here.

COACH JERRY MOORE, APPALACHIAN: I think the thing that really sticks out in my mind about the game is Clemson's overall team speed. We can't come close to trying to imitate that in practice and then to come out on the field and try to stop it is impossible. I told Ken (Hatfield) that I think he has an improved team, a better team, and one that can have a national championship type of season.

I thought our defense did a good job and never gave up. A lesser defense might have given 18-20 more points this afternoon. And our defense was on the field a long time today.

We saw some good things this afternoon. We got some younger players in the game and got a good look at them. We showed we are an improved football team. When some things didn't go well for us, especially on offense, it was mostly due to the caliber of players Clemson has and the tremendous speed they possess.

Our players have a lot of pride and Appalachian has been a team to contend for the Southern Conference and the NCAA playoffs and we feel we are that type of team again this year. We have improved and we are looking forward to getting back into Southern Conference play next week against VMI.

A major thing for us this afternoon, also, was the fact we didn't have any injuries.
