COACHES QUOTE'S:

coach Danny Ford of Clemson: We feel very lucky to win the football game and are very proud of our youngsters. Maryland did a great job against us. We had to do something right, but I believe that came in mostly the first and third ~~wa~~ quarters.

When it was 24-7, I thought we were in pretty good shape and I thought our defense would stop them. But we didn't and that shows you what a tremendous team and what tremendous heart Maryland has.

When they scored that two-point play, that made a lot tighter than we wanted it to be and they ~~was~~ had the momentum going at that time. We felt like we might get a fumble a little earlier with them coming across the field on the crossing patterns, but it didn't come until later and we were certainly glad to see us come up ~~with~~ with it. They had some turnovers that hurt them and we didn't and that's about how it happened.

~~But~~ But we're just happy to win the game. Each team got some breaks and were fortunate ~~to~~ to come up with the last one. I'm just happy that we have at least earned a tie for the conference championship and glad that our players have another chance to get a ~~win~~ ring.

Coach Bobby Ross of Maryland: "It can be said in one word - turnovers. The wind was a factor in the game but it was the same for both sides. Defensively, we broke down a couple of times on option assignments. There were some very critical plays that stifled us when we had the opportunity to win. All we ~~was~~ have to do is hold on to the football and we have shot at it. We ~~missed~~ handled the ball on the six and with excellent field position could have scored."

"They are a great football team, no question about that. They are quick and the quarterbacks execute the option game very well. They are defending national champs and have lost only one game in two years. They ran the ball well, better than I thought they would. Clemson is a heck of a team. I can't say we should have won it, but we sure had our chances. I feel we will bounce back. We have some character to our football team. I'm terribly disappointed we didn't get a shot at the field goal. (In answer to the question) John Tice played extremely well. ---Len Lynch has a sprained ankle and John Tice a slight concussion.
