



Clemson used a last-minute drive, a two-point conversion, and two overtimes to defeat Wake Forest 37-30 in the season opener. Charlie Whitehurst found Kyle Browning for an 11-yard touchdown pass in the second overtime and the Tiger defense held Wake Forest on four downs to win a conference game on opening day for the first time since 1969.

Clemson got off to a quick start after a Whitehurst to Airese Currie 31-yard touchdown pass combined with a Justin Miller 69-yard punt return gave the Tigers a 14-3 after the opening quarter. Chansi Stuckey blocked a Ryan Plackemeier punt through the endzone for a safety and Stephen Furr booted a 42-yard field goal (his first career made field goal) off the left upright for a 19-3 Clemson lead.

Wake Forest came storming back, as backup quarterback Ben Mauk found Jason Anderson for an 85-yard touchdown pass, which tied for the longest pass in the history of Death Valley by an opponent. Wake Forest scored later in the quarter when Cornelius Birgs scored from two yards out.

The Wake Forest defense forced Clemson into a three-and-out on its next possession and needed only three plays to find the endzone. Chris Barclay, who rushed for 179 yards on 29 carries, broke free

from the pile on a third-and-two play and dashed 50 yards for a touchdown. After trailing 19-3, the Demon Deacons reeled off 24 unanswered points.

Whitehurst hit Stuckey on each of the first two plays of the game's most important drive to move the ball into Demon Deacon territory. The Tigers would end up taking eight snaps inside the Wake Forest 10-yard line before Yusef Kelly plunged over from a yard out to cut the Demon Deacon lead to 27-25 with 1:48 remaining. On the two-point conversion play, Whitehurst lofted a pass to Kelvin Grant in the corner of the endzone, and the sophomore receiver out-jumped the Wake Forest defender to pull down the two-pointer.

Clemson won the overtime coin toss and elected to play defense first. Wake Forest could not pick up a first down, and Wisnosky booted his third field goal of the day, this time a 38-yarder. Furr connected from 23 yards out to send the game to a second overtime period, a first in Clemson history.

The Tigers got the ball first in the second overtime. After picking up a first down, Whitehurst dropped back and lofted a screen pass to Browning, and he raced untouched into the endzone. One Barclay run and three incomplete Cory Randolph passes gave Clemson its fourth overtime win in its history.

Currie and Stuckey became just the third tandem in Tiger history to amass at least 100 receiving yards in the same game. Anthony Waters and Miller led the Tigers with nine tackles apiece. Miller also was named ACC Defensive Back-of-the-Week for his performance.

Clemson scored on touchdown runs of 62 and 54 yards in the fourth quarter to take a 10 point lead, but could not hold on, as Georgia Tech struck twice in the final 1:50 to gain a wild 28-24 victory over Clemson in Death Valley. It was the eighth time in the last nine meetings between the two schools that the game was decided by five points or less.

Reggie Ball hit Calvin Johnson for an 11-yard touchdown pass with 11 seconds left to give the Yellow Jackets their first lead since the second quarter. Airese Currie returned the ensuing kickoff back to the Georgia Tech 31-yard line, giving the Tigers one last desperation heave into the endzone. Charlie Whitehurst's pass intended for Kelvin Grant was incomplete, which brought an end to the Tigers' seven-game home winning streak.

Georgia Tech struck first when Ball connected with a diving Johnson in the corner of the endzone from 37 yards out late in the first quarter.

Clemson went on a nine-play, 80-yard drive that culminated in a Whitehurst 22-yard touchdown pass to Curtis Baham. The teams went to the locker rooms deadlocked in a 7-7 tie.

Georgia Tech opened the second half with a 13-play drive that ended when Clemson stopped P.J.

Daniels short of the endzone on fourth-and-goal. The drive chewed up 5:48 off the clock.

In the fourth quarter, Reggie Merriweather found a hole off right tackle and dashed 62 yards untouched for his first career rushing touchdown.

The two teams again exchanged punts before the Yellow Jackets went on a five-play, 49-yard drive that ended with a Ball to Levon Thomas 19-yard touchdown pass to cut the Tiger lead to 17-14.

Clemson again answered with a long run on its third play of the ensuing drive. This time Kyle Browning ran up the middle for 54 yards, and the Tigers led by 10 with 3:18 remaining.

Georgia Tech moved the ball quickly down field and scored with 1:50 remaining, as Ball again hit Johnson on an eight-yard "jump ball." The Yellow Jackets' onside kick attempt was unsuccessful, and Clemson took over on its own 33-yard line.

Whitehurst ran for nine yards on first down, but the next two rushing attempts did not result in a first down. On fourth down with less than 25 seconds remaining, Geoff Rigsby snapped the ball low to Cole Chason. Rigsby had made 136 straight punt snaps without error. The Tiger punter could not scoop the ball, and when he fell on the ball at his own 11-yard line, Georgia Tech gained possession on downs with 16 seconds remaining.

On the next play, Ball found Johnson again in the endzone, giving Georgia Tech a bizarre victory.

The Tigers were led defensively by Leroy Hill, who had 14 tackles, including three tackles for loss and two sacks. Hill was also named ACC Defensive Lineman-of-the-Week for his efforts.

Clemson's first trip to play a football game in the state of Texas since 1974 was not a successful one, as Texas A&M defeated the Tigers 27-6. The Aggies benefited from four Tiger turnovers and got over 125 yards rushing from both Courtney Lewis and Reggie McNeal.

After receiving a punt, the Aggies drove 68 yards to the Tiger one-yard line. The big play of the drive was a 44-yard run by Lewis. After stopping Texas A&M twice, the Tigers could not keep Lewis out of the endzone on third and goal.

The Aggies needed only four plays to go 71 yards to produce another score. McNeal hit Jesse Woods for a 27-yard completion to the Clemson 29-yard line on the drive's third play. On the following snap, Lewis ran 29 yards for his second touchdown.

Clemson responded with a touchdown drive of its own on the following series. Justin Miller ran the kickoff back 41 yards. After Merriweather ran for two yards, Whitehurst found Ben Hall in the middle of the endzone, and the Clemson tight end made a nice catch between Texas A&M defenders for a 15-yard touchdown grab.

To open the second half, the Tigers could only go 13 yards in five plays, resulting in another punt.

Chason hit a career-long punt, this time a 52-yarder that was downed on the Texas A&M one-yard line.

It looked as though the Tigers had gained a little momentum, but it was short-lived. On the first snap from the one-yard line, McNeal hit DeQawn Mobley for 31 yards to get the Aggies out of the shadow of their own endzone. Texas A&M would end up going 99 yards on nine plays, with the drive culminating in a Jason Carter three-yard run. After Pegram's extra point was successful, the Aggies held a 24-6 lead.

The two teams exchanged punts twice and the Tigers got the ball back early in the fourth quarter, but again could not produce anything offensively. Texas A&M then went on a 10-play, 60-yard drive that took 5:32 off the clock. Pegram again came on to make a 36-yard field goal, and the Aggies had their biggest lead of the night (27-6).

Clemson moved the ball deep into Texas A&M territory with the help of two Kelvin Grant first down receptions. However, Whitehurst was picked off for the third time on the night when Mayes snatched a deflected ball at the Aggie 10-yard line. The Tigers would not see the ball again, as Texas A&M ran off the remaining 5:49, giving the Aggies a 9:32 advantage in time of possession for the game.

Lewis led the Aggies with 165 rushing yards while McNeal followed with 129 yards of his own. It was the first time two opposing running backs gained over 100 yards in the same game in eight years. For the Tigers, Whitehurst completed 20 of 36 passes for 192 yards. It was the first time in nine games he did not throw for at least 200 yards.

yards for a touchdown. The quick turn of events gave Florida State 14 points in just 18 seconds.

The Tigers answered the Seminole scores on their next drive, as Whitehurst opened the series with a 23-yard run to the Florida State 27. On a third down play from the 12, Whitehurst found Curtis Baham wide open for a touchdown.

Florida State took the second-half kickoff and scored on a Sexton to Chauncey Stovall 47-yard touchdown pass.

The Clemson defense forced Florida State to a three-and-out, and C.J. Gaddis blocked Chris Hall's punt out of the endzone for a safety.

On the following free kick, Miller caught the ball on his own 14-yard line and again raced 86 yards untouched for his second kickoff return for a touchdown of the day. Whitehurst was stopped just shy of the endzone on the two-point conversion attempt, and the Seminoles held on to a 24-22 lead.

Late in the third quarter, Leon Washington broke through the Tiger defense and raced down the sideline for a 35-yard touchdown run.

The Clemson offense could never get on track in the second half, and after another Chason punt, the Seminoles took over at their own 49. Florida State needed only one passing play on a scoring drive that covered 51 yards on 10 plays and chewed 4:42 off the clock. The drive culminated in a James Coleman one-yard run on fourth and goal.

Miller had 282 yards on his six kickoff returns, 34 more than any other player in NCAA history. Leroy Hill led the defense with 13 tackles and three tackles for loss.

The Cavaliers answered Clemson's score with another field goal. This time, Hughes connected from 43 yards. The key play of the drive was a Hagans completion to running back Wali Lundy for 15 yards on a third-down play.

Virginia needed only nine plays to go 58 yards in the second quarter, and capped the drive with a Hagans three-yard touchdown pass to Heath Miller.

To open the second half, Virginia ran 7:35 off the clock and moved the ball 69 yards in 14 plays, but did not score, as Lundy fumbled at the Tiger six. Travis Pugh came up with Clemson's first turnover on defense during the three-game roadstand.

The Tiger defense played tough, as it bent but did not break, stopping the Cavaliers at the Clemson

33. Hughes came on for his third field goal of the night and again was true on a 50-yard attempt. Hughes finished 3-3 after entering the game 3-6.

The third quarter ended with Virginia leading 16-10, but the Cavaliers had the ball deep in Tiger territory. On the first play of the final quarter, Pearman scored on a two-yard run to put Virginia up 23-10 with 14:55 left to play.

Clemson picked up three first downs on its next drive, and looked ready to score and get back into the game. However, the turnover bug again bit the Tigers, as Whitehurst was intercepted by Tony Franklin at the Virginia 39.

Virginia again went on a scoring drive, this time chewing up 6:52 off the clock. The drive culminated with another Pearman two-yard touchdown run.

The Tigers got one more offensive possession, but could only move 21 yards in six plays. Virginia got the ball back with 2:53 and drained the clock for a 30-10 victory. Clemson's average start on its last six possessions was its own 15.

The win was only the eighth in the series for Virginia, all of which have come since 1990. Clemson dropped its fourth game in a row, the first time it has suffered such a streak since 1998.

Hagans, led the Cavaliers by completing 14 of 26 passes for 225 yards and a touchdown. Pearman also amassed 104 rushing yards on 18 carries, as Virginia outgained Clemson 464-211 thanks to an 80-49 advantage in offensive plays. It was the fewest offensive plays for the Tigers since 1966.

Leroy Hill and Travis Pugh led the Tigers in tackles with 10 apiece.

Gaines Adams blocked the rugby-style punt of Leon Jackson III in the fourth quarter. Bobby Williamson fell on the ball in the endzone, and Clemson had its fourth special teams score of 2004.

The Tigers covered 32 yards in eight plays on their way to another second-half touchdown drive. Again, Clemson did not throw a pass, and the drive ended with Coleman scoring on a seven-yard touchdown run. Dean's extra point gave Clemson its largest lead of the season at 35-0.

Utah State scored on the game's final play when E.J. Reid recovered a fumble and stumbled in from one yard out. With the clock expired, no point after touchdown was attempted.

Michael Collins, who had only four career receptions and none in 2004 entering the game, led the team with six catches for 64 yards. Merriweather and Coleman combined for 166 rushing yards and three touchdowns, as Clemson rushed for 200 yards for the first time in 2004.

Coming into the game, no Tiger starting defensive lineman had a sack. The foursome of Charles Bennett, Eric Coleman, Maurice Fountain, and Trey Tate combined for six sacks, and the 11 total by the Tigers was one off the school record set against Furman in 1996.

The Tiger defense limited the Aggies to just two conversions in 13 attempts on third down. Clemson also held Utah State to just 139 yards of total offense, 73 of which came on the final drive with the Tigers' second and third-string defense on the field. It was the best total defense by a Tiger team against a Division I opponent since 1996.

Clemson used 11 sacks and a defense that yielded -20 net rushing yards in cruising to a 35-6 victory over Utah State on Homecoming. The -20 rushing yards were the fewest Clemson has ever allowed against a Division I-A opponent.

To open the second quarter, the Tigers went 78 yards in 10 plays, with three of the 10 plays going for 15 yards or more. Charlie Whitehurst hit Michael Collins for a 17-yard pass, Reggie Merriweather had a 20-yard run, and Duane Coleman caught a pass for 20 yards. The drive ended when Merriweather scored from two yards out on third-and-goal.

Clemson forced Utah State to a three-and-out to open the second half and quickly went to work. Whitehurst scrambled for 26 yards for the longest run of his career, and Merriweather scored his second touchdown of the day from four yards out.

The Aggies again had trouble moving the ball and punted back to the Tigers. Clemson again went on a scoring drive, this time needing only four plays to go 46 yards. The big play on the drive was a Whitehurst to Airese Currie pass for 39 yards. Whitehurst ended the drive when he ran around right end for a one-yard touchdown run.

Reggie Merriweather scored on a two-yard touchdown run with 23 seconds left after Charlie Whitehurst completed 4-5 passes in the final 2:50 to give Clemson a 10-7 come-from-behind win over Maryland in Death Valley. It was the first time the Tigers defeated the Terrapins since 2000. It was also Maryland's first loss in 31 games under Head Coach Ralph Friedgen when leading at halftime.

In a game that featured two programs known for their offensive prowess, the defenses took over. The teams combined for only 400 yards of offense.

In the first quarter, two Whitehurst to ACC-leading-receiver Airese Currie passes gained 28 yards for the Tigers before the Terrapins forced a punt. David Holloway busted through the protection and blocked Cole Chason's punt at the Clemson 17-yard line. It was Chason's first punt-block of 2004.

Maryland needed six plays to move 17 yards, and ended the drive with a one-yard Josh Allen touchdown run.

Clemson gained one first down on its next drive before the punting contest began. Each of the next four offensive drives in the quarter ended in punts.

Maryland got its offense rolling early in the second quarter, moving the ball from its own 19-

yard line to the Clemson 21. The drive took 15 plays and drained 6:38 off the clock. However, the Terrapins came up empty on the drive, as Novak missed a 38-yard field-goal attempt, the first miss by a Tiger opponent in 11 tries in 2004.

The Tigers took over with 7:30 on the clock and went on their longest drive of the year. Clemson moved 73 yards in 18 plays in a drive that lasted 7:21. The Tigers converted two third downs and one fourth down on the drive. However, Clemson had to settle for a field goal, as Jad Dean drilled a 21-yard field goal to give Clemson its first points.

Whitehurst completed four of five passes on Clemson's final drive of the game, with the big play coming on an 18-yard connection with Currie. On a first-and-goal play from the two, Merriweather was able to get the ball across the goal line, and Clemson led for the first time all day with only 23 seconds left on the clock. The drive was helped on a crucial pass interference call in the endzone on third-and-goal.

After Dean kicked the ball to the back of the endzone, Maryland began the next drive at its own 20. Joel Statham's first pass was intercepted by Miller, and Clemson had its second ACC win of the year.

Whitehurst completed 14 of 31 passes for 170 yards. Merriweather added 60 yards on the ground for the Tigers on 17 attempts including the winning score. The Tiger defense, which yielded under 200 yards for the second straight week, was led by Leroy Hill, who had 11 tackles. Maurice Fountain added two tackles for loss as well.

N.C. State had two touchdowns called back because of illegal procedure penalties, and the drive ended with Justin Miller intercepting Davis in the endzone.

The Tiger defense forced a three-and-out to begin the second half, and after Miller returned a punt 15 yards, Clemson began the drive in Wolfpack territory. After another third-down conversion, Whitehurst hit Currie for 24 yards and a touchdown.

The Clemson defense again made a stand, as Jamaal Fudge intercepted a Davis pass on the next drive and returned it to the Tiger 42. A personal foul penalty against N.C. State moved the ball into Wolfpack territory, and after moving 13 yards, Dean hit his second field goal of the day. The 47-yarder by Dean gave the Tigers a 10-point lead.

Whitehurst led the Tigers on a 12 play, 40-yard drive that again ended with a field goal by Dean. The sophomore's fourth field goal of the day, this time from 42 yards, put Clemson back up by two scores with 8:50 to play.

The Wolfpack again answered a Clemson score with a score of their own. This time it was in the form of a Deraney field goal from 44 yards away.

Davis directed the Wolfpack down to the Clemson 11-yard line with under 30 seconds to play. After three incomplete passes, N.C. State faced a fourth down with eight seconds to play. Charles Bennett intercepted Davis at the four-yard line in what was the Wolfpack's sixth turnover of the day.

Tramaine Billie, Leroy Hill, and Travis Pugh each had 10 tackles apiece, while Anthony Waters had a team-high three tackles for loss. Hill also had a sack for the fifth-straight game, tying a Tiger record.

Clemson scored 21 unanswered points and held Miami (FL) scoreless in the second half to upset the #10 Hurricanes 24-17 in overtime at the Orange Bowl. The win was Clemson's third win over a top-10 team in the past two seasons. The Tigers also improved to 5-0 all time in overtime games.

The game did not start out well for the Tigers, as Frank Gore scored on a 23-yard touchdown run on the game's opening drive. It took the Hurricanes only five plays to move 68 yards in 2:04.

The Tigers were forced to punt on their first drive of the night, and again the Hurricanes wasted little time getting on the scoreboard. John Peattie connected on a 35-yard field goal.

The Clemson offense got on track on its next possession, moving 43 yards in eight plays. The 20,000th point in Clemson history was recorded by Jad Dean when he made a 48-yard field goal.

Miami got the ball back after a Clemson punt with 1:47 left in the first half, and Gore scored again on a 14-yard run to give the Hurricanes a 17-3 lead with just 19 seconds left before halftime.

Each team was forced to punt on their first drive of the second half. On Clemson's next possession, Whitehurst hit Currie for 37 yards on a third-and-

long. Reggie Merriweather busted through the line on the next play for 27 yards and a touchdown.

The Tigers moved the ball to the Hurricane nine yard-line and faced a fourth-and-two. Tommy Bowden reached into his bag of tricks, as Dean took an over-the-shoulder pitch from holder Cole Chason on a fake field goal and ran to the Miami three-yard line. Merriweather barreled into the endzone on the next play to tie the score at 17-17.

Neither team scored during the remainder of regulation, and the game moved into overtime. Miami won the toss and elected to play defense first. After a pass interference penalty in the endzone moved the ball to the Hurricane 11 yard-line, Whitehurst found Currie at the Miami two, just shy of a first down. Merriweather scored his third touchdown of the night on the next play.

Brock Berlin hit Roscoe Parrish for 20 yards down to the Clemson 10. Tyrone Moss ran for five yards, and two incomplete Berlin passes brought up a fourth down. Berlin's last gasp throw into the endzone sailed wide of Lance Leggett.

The Tiger defense had 17 tackles for loss on the night, tied for second-most in a game in Tiger history. Eric Coleman also added two of the team's four sacks and was named the ACC Co-Defensive Lineman-of-the-Week.

Clemson had not played in the Orange Bowl since winning its only national title on January 1, 1982 by beating Nebraska 22-15. It was Miami's first loss at home against a league opponent since 1998. It was also only Miami's third loss in their last 177 games when leading after three quarters.

Matt Brooks' 53-yard field goal sailed through the uprights as time expired to give Duke a 16-13 come-from-behind victory over Clemson. The Blue Devils scored 10 points in the final 1:21 to beat the Tigers for the first time since 1998.

In the first quarter, Clemson moved 66 yards in eight plays, and the drive ended in a Jad Dean 20-yard field goal. The key play on the drive was a Charlie Whitehurst 40-yard pass to Airese Currie.

Duke answered the Tiger score with a field goal of its own, as Brooks connected from 27 yards out.

Clemson then fumbled the ensuing kickoff and the Blue Devils recovered the ball at the Tiger 19. Brooks hit his second field goal of the day, this time from 21 yards away.

The Tigers came back with a field goal of their own when Dean drilled a 32-yarder 1:56 into the second quarter. Reggie Merriweather carried six times on the drive for 46 yards.

The final quarter began with Clemson on its only touchdown drive of the day. It was a scoring march that covered 76 yards in 11 plays and ended with a Merriweather three-yard touchdown run.

The two defenses began to take over, as each team punted twice before Duke took over at its own

46-yard line with 4:25 remaining. Mike Schneider completed five of six passes and hit Ronnie Drummer for a four-yard touchdown pass with 1:21 left in the game. Leroy Hill was injured and did not play on the final two Blue Devil drives.

Clemson began its next drive at its 26-yard line. On the first play of the drive, Whitehurst threw over the middle for Michael Collins, but Collins was on the ground when Deonto McCormick came up with an interception at the 50. He returned it eight yards to the Tiger 42.

Three passes gained six yards to the Clemson 36-yard line to set up Brooks. The Tigers used two of their three timeouts to try and ice Brooks, but it did not work, as he was good on his third-straight attempt of the day, and Clemson saw its chances at winning season in the conference fade away. The 53-yarder was a career long for the senior kicker.

Merriweather led the Tiger rushing attack with 76 yards on 18 carries. Currie caught a game-high six passes for 75 yards and went over the 2,000-yard mark for his career.

The Clemson defense played well, as it allowed only 21 yards rushing and 234 total yards, while Duke had an average starting field position at its own 43. The rushing defense tied for the best by a Tiger team over the last 25 years in a loss. Clemson also had 14 tackles for loss and five sacks. Travis Pugh and Hill each had 10 tackles to lead the Tigers.

The loss was Clemson's fourth in its last eight trips to Durham. It was also the seventh time in 2004 that the team that lost the 2003 game gained revenge by winning in 2004.

Clemson scored 14 early points and only allowed South Carolina to snap the ball in Tiger territory four times, as Clemson beat the Gamecocks for the seventh time in eight years by the score of 29-7. It was Clemson's 11th win in its last 12 games at Death Valley since 2003 as well.

The game got off to an exciting start for the Tigers when David Dunham hit Cory Boyd on the opening kickoff, jarring the ball loose from the Gamecock return man. Steven Jackson recovered for Clemson on the nine.

After a Charlie Whitehurst pass to Cliff Harrell, Reggie Merriweather scored his first of three touchdowns on the day from three yards out, and Clemson had a 7-0 lead 52 seconds into the contest. It was the earliest Clemson had scored in a game since September 28, 1996, when Joe Woods caught a Nealon Greene pass and raced 80 yards on the game's first play from scrimmage in a 21-10 victory over Wake Forest.

The Tigers moved the ball 58 yards in nine plays, with the drive culminating in a seven-yard Merriweather scoring run. Seven of the nine plays on the drive gained five yards or more.

Neither team could sustain a drive for the remainder of the first quarter, and the Gamecocks finally struck seven minutes into the second quarter.

On a third-and-14 play, South Carolina quarterback Syvelle Newton scrambled and threw deep to Boyd. The Gamecock receiver made a diving catch and skidded across the goal line to cut the Clemson lead in half at 14-7.

Clemson went on one of its most impressive drives of the season to open the second half when it covered 80 yards in 14 plays and burned 7:14 off the clock. Merriweather carried seven times on the drive for 48 yards and scored his third touchdown of the day from 12 yards out.

On the next Gamecock possession, Gaines Adams tipped a Mike Rathe pass and Cory Groover intercepted the ball for the Tigers. It was the fourth interception of the season by a Clemson defensive lineman. After a seven-yard return, Clemson had the ball deep in Gamecock territory at the 12.

After forcing another punt, the Tiger offense went on its final scoring drive of 2004. Merriweather carried five times, and Whitehurst hit Curtis Baham for 23 yards for a key third-down conversion on a drive that ended with Dean converting his third field goal of the day, this time from 20 yards out.

Merriweather led the ground attack by carrying 28 times for 125 yards. Whitehurst completed 15 of 28 passes for 151 yards, and Chansi Stuckey caught seven passes for 74 yards. Tramaine Billie led the Tiger defense with nine tackles and a sack, while Tye Hill had four pass breakups.
