

# Game Reviews

## Game 1

Texas A&M	24

Jad Dean set a school record with six field goals, including the game-winner with two seconds left, to give the Tigers a dramatic 25-24 win over #17 Texas A&M in the season opener for both teams at Memorial Stadium. It was Clemson's first win over a ranked team on opening day since 1959.

The Aggies took the opening kickoff and marched down the field to the Clemson 13-yard line before a holding call wiped out what would have been a touchdown run by Courtney Lewis. Instead, Texas A&M settled for a 35-yard field goal by Todd Pegram.

The Tigers' first scoring drive of the year covered 61 yards on eight plays, and ended with a 21-yard field goal by Dean. Clemson forced a three-and-out on the Aggies' next possession, and after a Justin Brantly 40-yard punt, Stuckey fielded the ball and raced down the left sideline and into the endzone for a 47-yard return for a touchdown.

Texas A&M answered with an eight-play, 86 yard drive that ended with a three-yard score run by Lewis. All 86 yards were gained on the ground.

The Tigers moved 96 yards in the third quarter, draining 7:46 off the clock, but the drive ended at the one-yard line, and Dean made his fourth field goal of the night, this time from 18 yards out.

The Aggies wasted no time in cutting into the Clemson lead, as Lewis scored his second touchdown of the night on the final play of the third quarter. His one-yard run completed a 51-yard drive.

On the ensuing possession, Charlie Whitehurst was injured and backup Will Proctor was forced into action. His first pass completion of his career went to Stuckey for 15 yards and a first down. True-freshman running back James Davis had a 21-yard run on the drive, and Dean tied the school record with his fifth field goal of the game, this time from 44 yards.

McNeal carried for 49 yards on the first play of Texas A&M's next drive, and two plays later he found Chad Schroeder for a 31-yard touchdown pass. The score gave the Aggies a 24-22 lead.

Proctor handed the ball off to Davis on eight consecutive plays and moved the ball to the Aggie 25 before a timeout stopped play with six seconds to go. Dean came on for his sixth attempt of the night, and holder Cole Chason did a tremendous job of getting the ball placed on a subpar snap. Dean drilled the 42-yard attempt, giving Clemson the win. It was the latest a Tiger had made a game-winning kick since 1987. Dean's perfect day helped him garner ACC Specialist-of-the-Week honors.

Davis had 101 yards rushing, and became the first, first-year freshman to gain 100 rushing yards in his first game since 1945. He earned ACC Rookie-of-the-Week honors for his efforts. The Tigers also held the ball for 37:58 of the game, the highest time of possession total during Tommy Bowden's tenure as head coach at Clemson, and gained 396 yards of total offense.

## Game 2

Clemson, ranked #25 by AP, scored 14 points in the final 7:35 to earn a come-from-behind 28-24 win at Maryland. Charlie Whitehurst completed 18-22 passes for 178 yards and two touchdowns in leading Clemson to its second straight fourth quarter win. It was only the fourth home loss for the Terrapins under Ralph Friedgen.

The Tigers opened the game with the longest drive in terms of time of possession in school history, capped by a Reggie Merriweather one-yard touchdown run on fourth down. The drive covered 75 yards in 17 plays and lasted 9:47.

Maryland answered with a scoring drive of its own with the aid of a 44-yard pass from Sam Hollenbach to tight end Vernon Davis. The Tiger defense was able to hold the Terrapins out of the endzone, and a 21-yard field goal by Dan Ennis put Maryland on the board.

A snap over the head of punter Cole Chason on Clemson's next drive enabled the Terrapins to start their next possession on the Tiger two. Hollenbach dove over on a quarterback sneak from the one on fourth down.

Tye Hill recorded his first interception since 2003 when he picked off Hollenbach three minutes

into the second half. Clemson quickly moved down the field with the aid of two Terrapin personal-foul penalties, and Whitehurst found a wide-open Curtis Baham in the endzone from the six.

Maryland came back, as Hollenbach hit Davis for a 30-yard completion to move the ball into Tiger territory. Three plays later, Hollenbach again went to Davis, this time for 29 yards and a score.

Hollenbach was 5-for-5 on their next drive, and it ended with his three-yard touchdown pass to tight end Joey Haynos, giving Maryland a 10-point lead.

Whitehurst hit Stuckey for six yards on first down, and a personal-foul penalty and 14-yard run by Merriweather moved the ball to midfield. After two incompletions, Whitehurst lofted a pass to Baham over the top of the secondary for the duo's second touchdown connection of the game. The 51-yard scoring play cut the Terrapin lead to 24-21.

Freshman James Davis had a 17-yard run to move the ball into Maryland territory on the Tigers' next drive. Facing third-and-seven at the Terrapin 38, Clemson called a running play to Merriweather, who bounced outside and went untouched down the sideline for the score, which proved to be the game-winner.

The Terrapins had one final chance and moved the ball as far as the Tiger 40. A holding call moved the ball back to midfield, and on second down, Gaines Adams recorded another sack. A screen pass on third down was stopped for a one-yard loss by Rashaad Jackson, and Hollenbach's fourth-down pass was incomplete, as the Tigers were able to celebrate their first win at Maryland since 1999.

For the second consecutive year, Clemson and Miami (FL) battled to a tie after 60 minutes and settled the contest in overtime. This time, the #13 Hurricanes emerged as the survivor against the #20 Tigers in three overtime periods and won the game 36-30. It was the longest game in Clemson history.

Each team struggled in the opening quarter offensively, and the first points of the day were not recorded until Miami's John Peattie connected on a 37-yard field goal with 0:26 left in the first quarter.

Clemson answered the score with a touchdown of its own. On a first-down play from its own 27, Charlie Whitehurst kept the ball on a career-long 65-yard run. On the following play, Whitehurst hit tight end Cole Downer over the middle for eight yards and a touchdown, Downer's first score as a Tiger.

After a Tiger field goal, the Hurricanes answered with the help of a 36-yard run by Devin Hester. Peattie again made a 37-yarder, and the two went into halftime with Clemson ahead 10-6.

After an exchange of punts in the second half, Miami went on a nine-play, 47-yard drive, with Kyle Wright finding Quadtrine Hill for an eight-yard score.

Miami moved the ball effectively again on its next drive, and on the final play of the third quarter,

Wright hit Sinorice Moss for a 40-yard pass play down to the Clemson six-yard line. Two plays later, Tyrone Moss found the endzone on a one-yard touchdown run, and the Hurricanes had a 20-10 lead.

After an incomplection, Whitehurst hit five straight passes to four different receivers, highlighted by a leaping catch by Aaron Kelly and a 24-yard completion to Baham. Whitehurst dove over for a touchdown from the one with just under three minutes to play to cut the Hurricane lead to 20-17.

The Tigers kicked the ball off deep rather than trying an onside kick. Tyrone Moss gained four yards on the first two plays, setting up a crucial third down. Charles Bennett busted through and sacked Wright.

After Miami's punt, Clemson took over at its own 44 with 1:20 to play. Whitehurst hit three passes in four attempts to move to the Hurricane 10. On third down, Whitehurst barely missed a wide-open Stuckey in the endzone. Clemson settled for a 27-yard field goal, which sent the game into overtime.

In the first overtime, Wright found Ryan Moore for a 20-yard completion on third-down. Two plays later, Tyrone Moss scored to give Miami a 27-20 lead.

Needing a touchdown, Clemson moved the ball to the five before facing a fourth-and-two. Whitehurst dropped back, avoided pressure, and rolled left before tossing a pass to Baham in the endzone. He made a fingertip catch to force a second overtime.

The two teams traded field goals in the second overtime. On the second play of the third overtime, Tyrone Moss scored on a 25-yard run.

The Tigers were unable to match Miami, as Kenny Phillips picked off Whitehurst to end the game.

Making its first trip to Death Valley since 1982 and playing its first ACC road game, #25 Boston College outlasted Clemson in overtime 16-13.

After the Tigers were forced to punt to open the game, the Eagles moved the ball 33 yards in seven plays to set up the first points of the day. Ryan Ohliger connected on a 33-yard field goal.

Ryan completed six straight passes, and Andre Callender had an 18-yard run down to the one-yard line. Ryan dove over on a quarterback sneak to cap an 11-play, 64-yard scoring drive.

Clemson quickly answered. James Davis ran for 39 yards on three carries, and Charlie Whitehurst completed two passes to Thomas Hunter. A third-down sack forced Jad Dean's 36-yard field goal.

Reggie Merriweather got in on the action by carrying four times for 37 yards on a drive that was capped by Whitehurst's one-yard sneak. Clemson had 75 yards rushing in the second quarter.

After both teams went scoreless for the third quarter, Ryan completed three passes late in the fourth quarter, and Andre Callender ran four times

for 19 yards to set up a 48-yard field goal attempt by Ohliger. His kick with 1:14 remaining missed short and to the right, and the Tigers had one last chance to win in regulation.

Clemson could not pick up a first down and punted the ball back to Boston College with 0:22 to play. Ryan hit Miller for a 29-yard completion into Clemson territory, but Tye Hill intercepted Ryan two plays later to send the game into overtime.

Just as they were the last time the two met in Death Valley in 1982, Clemson and Boston College were tied after 60 minutes of play.

The Tigers went on offense first in overtime, and Whitehurst hit Kelly for a first down. But Clemson could not get closer than the Eagle six-yard line. Dean booted a 24-yard field goal to the Tigers their first lead of the day by a score of 13-10.

On Boston College's drive, Ryan hit Larry Lester for 10 yards on third down. Callender, who totaled 116 yards on 22 carries, followed with a 10-yard run down to the one-yard line, and two plays later, Brian Toal scored from one-yard out to give the Eagles the win 16-13.

The Eagles ran 90 plays to the Tigers' 57 and outgained Clemson 385-251. Boston College also won the time-of-possession battle (35:42 to 24:18) and converted 10 of 20 third downs, while the Tigers were 0-11 on third downs. It was the first time in recorded history (since 1978) that Clemson went an entire game without a converted third down.

Anthony Waters led the defense with 14 tackles, while Tramaine Billie added 13 stops. Jackson also had two of the team's four tackles for loss.

## Game 5

Wake Forest scored 10 fourth-quarter points, including a touchdown with 33 seconds remaining, to defeat Clemson 31-27. Following the Demon Deacon touchdown, the Tigers moved the ball 77 yards in four plays, but wide receiver Curtis Baham was stopped at the three-yard line as time expired.

After three Reggie Merriweather runs gained 19 yards to start the game, Charlie Whitehurst's first pass attempt was deflected into the air, and Jon Abbate intercepted the ball. The Demon Deacons needed only six plays to move 37 yards, and Cory Randolph capped the drive with a four-yard score.

The Tigers answered on their next possession with a 15-play, 80-yard drive that culminated with a one-yard touchdown run by James Davis.

It took the Demon Deacons three plays to regain the lead. On third down from the Wake Forest 26, Randolph found Kenneth Moore along the sideline, and he raced untouched into the endzone.

Wake Forest blocked a Tiger punt, and on a third-and-15 play, Randolph rolled left and found Nate Morton all alone behind the Tiger secondary for a 34-yard touchdown and a 21-7 lead.

Whitehurst hit Kelvin Grant for a 21-yard gain to put Clemson in scoring position, and Merriweather

scored on a 14-yard run. After a three-and-out by Wake Forest, the Tigers went on the offensive again.

Another big pass play helped move the Tigers deep into Demon Deacon territory, as Whitehurst hit Baham over the middle for 37 yards. On third down from the Wake Forest 11, Davis ran left and dove over the pylon for a touchdown.

After two Jad Dean field goals, Wake Forest had its longest drive of the day, as the Demon Deacons marched 64 yards in 17 plays. Swank's 33-yard field goal ended a 7:41 drive.

The Tigers could not pick up a first down late in the game, and a fake-field goal attempt was stopped by Wake Forest, shifting the momentum.

With under three minutes left, Wake Forest began a six-play drive that ended with a six-yard touchdown pass from Randolph to Kevin Marion.

Clemson got the ball back at its 20 with 33 seconds left. Whitehurst hit Chansi Stuckey for 30 yards, as he made a spectacular one-handed grab. Two passes to Davis gained 20 yards, and with eight seconds left, Whitehurst found Baham over the middle, but he was tackled by four defenders at the three as time expired. It was the third consecutive loss for the Tigers that was decided on the final play of the game.

Clemson outgained Wake Forest 454-355 and outrushed the Demon Deacons 150-133 despite them leading the ACC in rushing entering the game.

Whitehurst connected on 28-42 passes for 304 yards. Merriweather led the Tigers in rushing with 92 yards on 17 carries. Stuckey caught seven passes for 74 yards.

Clemson scored 28 points in the first half and cruised to a 31-10 win at N.C. State. The victory was Clemson's first on an ESPN Thursday night telecast, as the Tigers also held on to possession of the Textile Bowl Trophy.

Clemson began a drive at its own 17 late in the first quarter. A Charlie Whitehurst to Thomas Hunter pass gained 17 yards, and three plays later, Whitehurst hit Chansi Stuckey for 22 yards on a tipped screen pass. James Davis followed with a 19-yard run. On third down, Whitehurst found a wide-open Curtis Baham for a touchdown.

The Tiger defense forced a three-and-out, and the Clemson offense went to work from its 27. A third-down pass from Whitehurst to Aaron Kelly gained 12 yards, and two plays later, Davis dashed 30 yards. Two more plays later, Whitehurst hit Bobby Williamson in the endzone for six points.

Davis ran for 16 yards on the first play of its next drive, and Whitehurst followed with a nine-yard pass to Williamson. Two consecutive runs by Davis gained 19 yards, and two plays later, he scampered 12 yards for a score, giving Clemson a 21-0 lead.

On the second play of the next drive after N.C. State got on the board, Whitehurst hit Stuckey for a

39-yard pass play into Wolfpack territory. Whitehurst then hit Hunter for a gain of nine, followed by a 23-yard run by Davis. On the next play, Davis outran the N.C. State defense for his second score of the night.

Stuckey took the pitch on a reverse play to move the ball into Wolfpack territory, and a touchdown pass from Whitehurst to La'Donte Harris was erased after an ineligible receiver downfield penalty. The Tigers moved to the N.C. State 13-yard line, and Dean came on to boot a 30-yard field goal, pushing the Clemson lead back to 21 points.

The Wolfpack were forced to punt on their next possession, and Deraney's punt was downed at the Tiger two-yard line as time expired in the third quarter.

Whitehurst was intercepted by Garland Heath two plays later after the ball bounced off the hands of Stuckey, giving the Wolfpack the ball deep in Clemson territory. After two plays lost two yards, Davis was intercepted by Tye Hill, and the Tiger cornerback returned the ball 24 yards.

Two drives later, Clemson did not produce any points on the scoreboard, but was very effective. The Tigers moved 62 yards and drained 7:22 off the clock, with a 30-yard run by Reggie Merriweather the key play.

Davis rushed for 143 yards on 12 carries and two touchdowns, and only played one play in the second half after leaving the game with a fractured wrist. Clemson gained 489 yards of total offense against a defense that had three first-round draft picks the following April.

## Game 7

Clemson racked up over 500 yards of total offense for the first time since 2003 in a 37-7 win over visiting Temple. It was the second meeting all-time between the Tigers and the Owls. Clemson also won that game in 1991 by a score of 37-7.

The Tigers wasted little time getting on the scoreboard after forcing Temple to go three-and-out on its opening possession. Charlie Whitehurst hit three consecutive passes, with the third a 41-yard touchdown strike to Kyle Browning over the middle.

Temple picked up one first down before being forced to punt again, and Clemson began its next drive with a reverse to Chansi Stuckey that covered 18 yards. Three plays later, Reggie Merriweather ran around left end untouched for a 21-yard score.

Temple followed with its first scoring threat of the day, as Mike McGann completed 6-6 passes in leading the Owls to the Clemson 14. A third-down screen pass to Umar Ferguson looked as though it would go for a first down, but Gaddis knocked the ball loose and Dorell Scott recovered at the four.

Neither offense could get anything going to begin the second half, and the Tigers began their second drive of the third quarter at their own 10. Whitehurst hit Stuckey for 17 yards, and two plays

later found Aaron Kelly for 41 yards. Clemson could not pick up another first down, and Dean made his second field goal, this time from 27 yards.

On the next drive, Whitehurst faked a handoff and found a wide-open Kelly behind the Temple secondary for a 34-yard touchdown pass. It was the first career touchdown for Kelly.

The Tiger offense only gained 18 yards on its next drive, and Clemson punted for only the second time in the game. Temple followed with a drive into Tiger territory, but McGann's fourth-down pass fell incomplete and Clemson took over on downs.

Merriweather carried four times for 33 yards on the next drive, but a sack of Whitehurst helped make the drive stall. Dean's 39-yard field goal was good to give Clemson a 30-0 lead.

Temple followed with its most impressive drive of the day, as the Owls marched 80 yards in 15 plays. McGann capped the touchdown drive with a four-yard pass to DoMerio Hamilton on third-and-goal.

Tyler Grisham returned the ensuing kickoff 24 yards out to the Clemson 45, and Tiger backup quarterback Will Proctor came into the game and connected on his first two passes. After a Merriweather run, Proctor's first career touchdown pass went to La'Donte Harris for 16 yards. It was also the first career touchdown reception for Harris.

Kelly caught seven passes for 155 yards, a Clemson freshman yardage record. Whitehurst connected on 19-27 passes for 307 yards, and Proctor added 52 yards through the air. The 359 passing yards were the third most in a game in Tiger history, and the most ever in a game at Death Valley.

The two teams traded punts before Clemson began a drive with 0:14 to play in the third quarter at its own 26. The Tigers moved 49 yards on nine plays and could not get closer than the Yellow Jacket 25. Dean's 42-yard field goal glanced off of the right upright and went through to give Clemson a 6-3 lead.

Georgia Tech wasted little time answering the Clemson score. Ball hit Johnson for 21 yards on the first play of the drive, and Tashard Choice followed with a 32-yard run. P.J. Daniels had a 16-yard run, and three plays later scored from three yards out to give the Yellow Jackets their first lead.

Aaron Kelly returned the ensuing kickoff 81 yards to the Georgia Tech 17. It was his first career kickoff return. Merriweather gained 11 yards on first down, but Clemson could not get the ball into the endzone. Dean then drilled his third field goal, a 21-yarder to cut the Georgia Tech lead to 10-9.

The Tigers forced Georgia Tech to a three-and-out on its next drive, and Clemson got the ball back with 3:30 left at its own 48. A first-down pass to Curtis Baham gained 11 yards, but a holding call on the next play backed the Tigers up. Three plays gained 13 yards, and a fourth-down pass to Baham was completed short of the first-down marker, as the Yellow Jackets took over on downs.

Clemson had used all of its timeouts, and Georgia Tech was nearly able to run off the remaining 2:05. The Tigers got the ball back with 0:03 left after a punt, but Whitehurst's desperation pass was intercepted by Dawan Landry.

Merriweather gained 128 yards on 23 carries, his second consecutive 100-yard rushing game.

Will Proctor completed 13 of 21 passes for 201 yards and two touchdowns in helping lead the Tigers to a 49-20 Homecoming victory over Duke.

Charlie Whitehurst missed practice time during the week leading up to the game due to a sore shoulder, meaning the Tigers would turn to another starting signal-caller for the first time since 2002.

Clemson got on the board early after taking the opening kickoff and moving 72 yards in 12 plays for a score. Reggie Merriweather gained 20 yards on four carries, and the big play was a 36-yard pass from Proctor to Stuckey down to the one yard line on third down. Proctor scored on a quarterback sneak on the following play.

The ensuing drive for the Tigers resulted in another touchdown, with the score being registered by James Davis on an 18-yard run.

Duke then went on a scoring drive of its own, as Zack Asack completed four consecutive passes to begin the drive, and Joe Surgan nailed a 34-yard field goal to get the Blue Devils on the scoreboard.

The next Clemson scoring drive began at its own 36-yard line, and the Tigers used eight plays to cover the 64 yards in 3:29. Reggie Merriweather scampered in from 19 yards out for the score.

Following a personal foul after a field-goal block, Clemson moved 33 yards in four plays in only 25 seconds. Proctor hit Chansi Stuckey for an 11-yard touchdown pass with only seven seconds remaining, giving the Tigers a 28-3 halftime lead.

Duke chewed up 7:19 off the clock on a 15-play, 77 yard drive in the third quarter. Asack hit Ben Patrick for a 20-yard gain to move to the Tiger 20. Justin Boyle later scored on a one-yard run.

Clemson answered with another touchdown drive. Stuckey returned the kickoff to the Tiger 49, and three plays later, Proctor found a wide-open Stuckey for a 40-yard touchdown strike.

The teams then traded punts, and it did not take Duke long to score on its next possession. Asack hit Riley deep over the middle for 66 yards and a touchdown to cut Clemson's lead to 35-17.

Duke was forced to punt on its next drive, and Davis' 23-yard run was the key play on a 49-yard drive that ended with a Merriweather eight-yard run.

Asack threw on eight consecutive plays to begin the next Blue Devil drive, and he completed five. However, Duke could get no closer than the Clemson 24, as an offensive pass interference penalty and a sack took the Blue Devils out of field-goal range.

The final Blue Devil scoring drive went only four yards and lasted only four plays, but Surgan was good on a 49-yard field goal attempt with plenty to spare with 2:56 remaining.

Cullen Harper hit Rendrick Taylor for 15 yards on first down, and then Merriweather registered his third-straight 100-yard rushing day on the next play with a 12-yard touchdown run with 0:39 left.

## Game 10

Clemson scored 21 third-quarter points to break open a tie game at halftime for a 35-14 win over #16 Florida State. It was the Tigers' second straight win over the Seminoles in Death Valley.

The Tigers took the opening kickoff and marched 72 yards in 12 plays for a score. Charlie Whitehurst completed 6-7 passes on the drive, with his final one a 22-yard touchdown to Chansi Stuckey.

The Tiger offense went right back to work with James Davis beginning the next drive with an 11-yard run. After Whitehurst hit Stuckey for a 36-yard pass, Davis scored on a one-yard plunge.

Florida State responded with a scoring drive of its own, moving 47 yards in eight plays, with Gary Cismesia connecting on a 31-yard field goal to get the Seminoles on the scoreboard.

On first down of their next drive, Drew Weatherford hit Matt Henshaw for 26 yards. Three more plays produced only one yard, and Cismesia came on and drilled a 47-yard field goal.

The two teams traded punts before Clemson began its next drive at its own 33. The Tigers could not pick up a first down, and Cole Chason's punt was blocked by Lawrence Timmons and recovered in the endzone for a touchdown by Geno Hayes.

Weatherford hit De'Cody Fagg over the middle for the two-point conversion, tying the score 14-14.

On third-and-eight, Whitehurst hit Stuckey for 20 yards to the Seminole 34. Two plays later, Whitehurst found Stuckey again for 32 yards on a screen pass for a score.

Two penalties helped move the Seminoles backwards on their next drive, and Stuckey returned Hall's punt nine yards to the Clemson 48.

The Tigers followed with an eight-play, 52-yard drive that ended with an eight-yard touchdown run by Davis. Seven of the eight plays on the drive gained at least six yards.

After an exchange of punts, Florida State began its next drive at its own 20. Weatherford's pass on first down was intercepted by C.J. Gaddis, and he returned it 23 yards to the Seminole 11.

On third down from the four, Whitehurst lofted a pass to the back pylon and Aaron Kelly made a diving grab. Initially, Kelly was ruled out of bounds. But after a replay review, he was ruled to have been in bounds for a touchdown. Dean's extra point gave Clemson a 35-14 lead. The 21 third-quarter points were the most by Clemson against the Seminoles since they scored 21 in a quarter in 1989.

Whitehurst had a day to remember in his final game at Death Valley, completing 21 of 32 passes for 269 yards and three touchdowns. Stuckey caught 11 passes for 156 yards and two scores. Stuckey became the first wideout in Clemson history to have at least two touchdown receptions in consecutive games. Davis added 65 yards on the ground on 17 carries to earn ACC Rookie-of-the-Week honors.

## Game 11

<b>Clemson</b>	<b>13</b>
<b>South Carolina</b>	<b>9</b>

**November 19, 2005**  
Williams-Brice Stadium • Columbia, SC

Clemson beat a ranked team for the second straight week for the first time since 1983 after defeating #19 South Carolina 13-9 in Columbia. The Clemson 2005 senior class became the fourth senior class since 1983 to finish their careers with a 4-0 record against the Gamecocks.

South Carolina had its first scoring threat of the night in the first quarter, as Blake Mitchell hit Sidney Rice for a 22-yard gain to the Tiger 39. Two plays later, defensive end Gaines Adams sacked Mitchell and knocked the ball away, and Rashaad Jackson recovered for the Tigers.

After Clemson was forced to punt, the Gamecocks followed with the game's first scoring drive. Mitchell hit Rice for a 40-yard completion down to the Tiger eight-yard line, but South Carolina had to settle for a 23-yard Josh Brown field goal.

The Tigers were able to move the ball into South Carolina territory in the second quarter, but again had to punt. The Gamecocks followed with a 10-play, 66-yard drive that ended with a 43-yard field goal by Brown.

Clemson answered with a score of its own, as a 10-play, 48-yard drive culminated with a 49-yard field goal by Jad Dean.

The Tigers opened the second half with a 19-play, 74-yard drive that chewed up 7:17 of the third quarter. James Davis carried nine times for 36 yards on the drive. Whitehurst completed his first five passes of the drive for 45 yards, but Clemson could not find the endzone. Dean came on to drill a 23-yard field goal to tie the score.

After Chansi Stuckey fumbled a punt at the Clemson 11, three plays resulted in negative yardage for the Gamecocks. Brown made his third field goal of the night, this time from 29-yards out to give South Carolina a 9-6 lead.

On the following drive, Whitehurst hit Kelly for 27 yards out to the Tiger 47. Two penalties followed, and Clemson faced a first-and-35. Whitehurst completed a shovel pass to Davis for nine yards, and on second down, he found Stuckey for 14 yards. On third-and-12, Whitehurst found Baham for 28 yards. Davis dashed through the middle for 23 yards on the following play. Two plays later, Davis scored the only touchdown of the night, as he dove in from two-yards out, and Clemson had its first lead of the night, 13-9. The Tigers had 105 yards of total offense on the drive.

After two runs by Davis and the final timeout of the night by the Gamecocks, Whitehurst ran for 10 yards on a quarterback draw to pick up a first down and seal the win. Whitehurst became the first quarterback in the history of the series to finish with a 4-0 record against the in-state rivals.

The win was Clemson's eighth in its last nine games against South Carolina, as well as its eighth in the last nine games at Williams-Brice Stadium.

## Game 12

Clemson won its 15th bowl game with a 19-10 victory over Colorado in the Champs Sports Bowl in Orlando, FL. It was only the second meeting between the two schools, with the first coming in the 1957 Orange Bowl, a 27-21 Buffalo win.

James Davis led the way for the Tigers, rushing for 150 yards on 28 carries to earn MVP honors. Charlie Whitehurst finished his career completing 21-29 passes for 205 yards, and also ran for a score.

Two runs by Davis gained 26 yards, and Whitehurst followed with a 20-yard strike to Curtis Baham. The drive stalled three plays later, and Jad Dean made a 26-yard field goal.

Hugh Charles picked up 13 yards and a first down at the Clemson 10, barely missing a score by stepping out of bounds. However, three more rushes by Charles resulted in a loss of eight yards, and Colorado settled for a Mason Crosby 36-yard field goal on the first play of the second quarter.

On Clemson's next possession, Whitehurst found Thomas Hunter for 10 yards on third down. After a penalty gave the Tigers another first down, Whitehurst completed a shovel pass to Davis for 22 yards down to the Colorado 10. Two rushes by Davis and another completion to Hunter moved the ball to

the two, and Clemson elected to take the lead with a field goal. Dean made his 24th field goal to set a school record for field goals in a season, and his 18-yarder also gave the Tigers a 6-3 lead.

On the second play of the third quarter, Davis broke free for a 40-yard run. Whitehurst found Aaron Kelly for 11 yards three plays later, and then Whitehurst dove into the endzone for a five-yard touchdown run on a third-and-goal play. The touchdown drive covered 67 yards in eight plays.

Each team punted several more times before Colorado began a drive at its own 31 with just over nine minutes left in the game. Cox was replaced by Brian White. After a pass-interference penalty on the Tigers, White hit two consecutive passes for 45 yards down to the Clemson nine. Three plays later on third down, White found Quinn Sypniewski for a two-yard touchdown pass to cut the lead to 13-10.

With just under six minutes left, Clemson went on a seven-play, 61-yard drive that took 4:07 off the clock and ended with a six-yard touchdown run by Davis. The key play on the drive was a 23-yard pass from Whitehurst to Kelly on third down, the senior quarterback's final pass attempt as a Tiger.

The extra point was blocked and was Dean's only missed extra point of the season. With the clock winding down, Colorado moved the ball as close as the Clemson 29, but the game ended with White throwing an incomplete pass in the endzone.

Clemson's defense held Colorado to 124 total yards of offense and 17 yards rushing, the top defensive performance by any team in a bowl game during the 2005 season.






