C.J. Spiller took the opening kickoff of the season back 96 yards for a touchdown and Clemson never looked back in its 37-14 victory over Middle Tennessee at Memorial Stadium on September 5. It was the second-ever meeting between the two schools and featured former Tiger assistant coach and current Blue Raider Head Coach Rick Stockstill on the opposing sideline.

After a 68-yard fumble return by Chris McCoy early in the second quarter cut Clemson's lead to 10-7, the Tigers added 20 points to take a 30-7 halftime lead, highlighted by Jacoby Ford's 61-yard punt return for a touchdown and 43-yard receiving score. It was only the second time in school history that the Tigers had a kickoff return and punt return for a touchdown in one game.

Kyle Parker, Clemson's first freshman quarterback to start a season-opener since 1945, was 9-20 for 159 yards and two scores. Ford (190) and Spiller (171) each had over 170 all-purpose yards, while Spiller earned ACC Specialist-of-the-Week honors. Brandon Maye had one of Clemson's three interceptions and added a team-tying-high 14 tackles, a tackle-for-loss, and caused fumble to earn ACC Defensive Lineman-of-the-Week honors.

The #13 Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets jumped out to a 24-0 lead and overcame a furious comeback in their 30-27 win over Clemson at Bobby Dodd Stadium on September 10. The Tigers scored 27 consecutive points only to have Scott Blair kick the game-winning 36-yard field goal with 57 seconds left.

Georgia Tech used an 82-yard touchdown run, an 85-yard punt return for a score, and a 34-yard touchdown pass on a fake field goal to take an early lead. But the Tigers stormed back to take a 27-24 lead in the fourth quarter, highlighted by Kyle Parker's 77-yard touchdown pass to Jacoby Ford in the third quarter. Richard Jackson later booted a 53-yard field goal to put Clemson ahead by three points early in the fourth quarter.

With the score tied and just over three minutes left, Parker hit Ford on third-and-11 for a would-be 38-yard pass to the Georgia Tech 18, but the Tigers were flagged for holding. The Yellow Jackets took over and set up the game-winning field goal.

Parker was named ACC Rookie-of-the-Week after passing for 261 yards and three touchdowns. Ford added five catches for 109 yards and C.J. Spiller totaled 234 all-purpose yards.

Richard Jackson tied a school record with six field goals and Clemson limited Boston College to just 54 yards of total offense in the Tigers' 25-7 win at Memorial Stadium on September 19. On a rainy afternoon, the Tigers held their opponent to the fewest yards since 1963. The game was delayed twice for a total of 103 minutes due to lightning as well.

C.J. Spiller scored the game's only touchdown on a 77-yard punt return in the first quarter. He totaled 225 all-purpose yards.

Jackson was a perfect 6-6 on field goals and accounted for 19 of Clemson's 25 points. His long boot was 52 yards during a steady rain, as he earned ACC Specialist-of-the-Week honors and won the Leather Helmet Award as the game MVP.

Meanwhile, Clemson's defense held the Eagles to four first downs, 29 rushing yards on 28 carries, and 5-21 passing for 25 yards. Boston College's only score came on a 13-yard pass on the play after a Tiger fumble. The Eagles, who were 1-12 on third down, also had just one drive that lasted more than four plays.

Ricky Sapp was named ACC Defensive Lineman-of-the-Week with three tackles for loss and two sacks. Rashard Hall, DeAndre McDaniel, and Jonathan Meeks each added an interception.

Andy Dalton had 312 yards of total offense to lead #14 Texas Christian to a 14-10 win over Clemson at Memorial Stadium on September 26. It was the first meeting between the two in 44 years. Dalton was 17-26 for 226 yards and two scores, including the game-winner in the fourth quarter, and had 86 rushing yards.

The Horned Frogs amassed 388 yards of offense, but they had just two offensive snaps inside the Tiger 25 thanks to Clemson's defense. The game did not feature a turnover by either squad despite heavy rain falling during most of the second half.

After the Tigers drove 72 yards on the game's opening possession, they stalled and settled for a field goal. The Horned Frogs responded with a 91-yard drive that ended in Curtis Clay's six-yard touchdown catch. The drive was kept alive by a 58-yard pass to Ed Wesley on third-and-13 that was deflected at the line of scrimmage and was not even intended for Wesley.

Clemson regained the lead with 33 seconds left in the second quarter when C.J. Spiller rushed for a one-yard score. Three plays earlier, Spiller's 60-yard catch from Kyle Parker set up the score that gave Clemson a 10-7 halftime lead. Spiller rushed for 112 yards and had three receptions for 79 yards in the game.

After a scoreless third quarter, Antoine Hicks hauled in a 25-yard touchdown catch early in the fourth quarter. Clemson answered with a 59-yard drive, but Richard Jackson's 34-yard field-goal try sailed wide-left. The Tigers regained possession with 6:52 remaining and again drove 59 yards, but Parker's pass in the endzone on fourth-and-13 fell incomplete with 1:55 left.

Maryland scored 17 points in the second quarter to take the lead and held on to defeat Clemson 24-21 at Byrd Stadium on October 3. The Tigers took a 10-0 lead in the first quarter, but the Terrapins mounted two touchdown drives of 76 and 81 yards in the second quarter and never relinquished the lead.

Jacoby Ford gave Clemson a 10-0 lead when he scored on a 17-yard reverse. Chris Turner's 29-yard touchdown pass to Torrey Smith cut Clemson's lead to 13-10, then Maryland marched down the field on its next drive and scored on Turner's four-yard pass to Ronnie Tyler with 35 seconds left in the second quarter.

Maryland upped its lead to 24-13 in the third quarter thanks in part to Tony Logan's 43-yard punt return to the Tiger one. Three plays later, Davin Meggett scored on a one-yard touchdown run. However, C.J. Spiller, who became the ACC's all-time leader in career all-purpose yards in the game, returned the ensuing kickoff 92 yards for a touchdown after breaking several tackles and losing a shoe in Tiger territory.

But Clemson was unable to capitalize on three drives inside the Maryland 31 in the fourth quarter and fell by three points.

Clemson held Wake Forest to its fewest yards under Head Coach Jim Grobe in the Tigers' 38-3 victory at Memorial Stadium on October 17. The Tigers held the Demon Deacons' potent offense in check, allowing just 178 yards while tallying five sacks and 12 tackles for loss, including three by Da'Quan Bowers.

DeAndre McDaniel had one of two Tiger interceptions and was named ACC Defensive Back-of-the-Week for his efforts. He was a big reason Wake Forest's longest play was only 19 yards.

Meanwhile, Clemson's offense was efficient, as it scored on all five of its red-zone possessions with four touchdowns. The Tigers, who jumped out to a 31-3 halftime lead, totaled 382 yards, including 195 rushing and 187 passing, and 6.7 yards per play.

C.J. Spiller rushed for 106 yards on nine carries, including scores of 66 and 14 yards. Kyle Parker was 10-17 passing for 132 yards and a touchdown along with a rushing score, while Michael Palmer had a game-high four catches for 49 yards and a score.

The #18 Clemson Tigers topped Virginia 34-21 on Senior Day at Memorial Stadium on November 21. The Tigers clinched the best record (6-2) in the ACC Atlantic Division with the victory.

Both teams put up big offensive numbers in the first half, as Clemson took a 24-21 lead into halftime. Kyle Parker threw two touchdown passes in the first half, including strikes to Dwayne Allen and Jacoby Ford. But Virginia narrowed the margin to three points on Jameel Sewell's 23-yard touchdown pass to Mikell Simpson on the last play of the first half.

But the Tiger defense held Virginia scoreless in the second half. The Cavaliers had just 40 total yards, including -41 rushing yards, in the second half. The Tigers also had all seven of their sacks in the second half, including six sacks in the fourth quarter.

Ford had a game-high 211 all-purpose yards in his last home game, including six catches for 106 yards. Parker was 19-26 passing for 234 yards and two touchdowns against no interceptions.

Kavell Conner had a game-high 13 tackles against his home-state team, while Rennie Moore added a game-high two sacks. Clemson was also aided by an average starting field position at its own 48, while Virginia's was at its own 23.

South Carolina rushed for 223 yards, including 114 by Kenny Miles, in its 34-17 win over #15 Clemson at Williams-Brice Stadium on November 28. It was just the second Gamecock win in Columbia in the last 11 meetings in the capital city.

C.J. Spiller opened the game with an 88-yard kickoff return for a score, the seventh of his career to set an FBS record. But the Gamecocks outscored Clemson 17-0 the rest of the first half.

In the second half, South Carolina extended its lead to 24-7 on Stephen Garcia's 14-yard touchdown pass to Tori Gurley. After the teams traded field goals, Kyle Parker connected with Michael Palmer for a 22-yard touchdown pass to narrow the Gamecocks' lead to 27-17. But Weslye Saunders' one-yard touchdown catch on fourth down late in the contest sealed the victory.

The Gamecocks had a 38-31 advantage in average starting field position, including starting three drives at the Tiger 35 or better. Meanwhile, Clemson did not start a single drive outside its own 40. South Carolina also held the ball for 36:31 and scored a touchdown on all four of its red-zone possessions.

Palmer totaled eight receptions for 106 yards, both game-highs, while Jacoby Ford had five catches for 49 yards.
