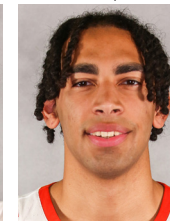

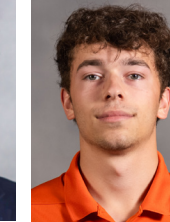

SEASON OUTLOOK

It's been 44 years since Clemson entered a new year coming off an Elite Eight NCAA Tournament season.

The 2023-24 Clemson Tigers will rank among the most successful in school history in several categories.

- First Clemson team to reach the Elite Eight since 1979-80, just the second in school history.
- Record 24 victories, tied for fourth most in school history and just one off of the school record. Twelve of those wins were away from home, a school record.
- Reached the Elite Eight with wins over No. 3 seed Baylor and No. 2 Seed Arizona. The win over Arizona was the highest seeded team Clemson has beaten in its history.
- Won three games in the NCAA Tournament as the underdog in three consecutive games, the first team to do that since 1985.
- Defeated nine NCAA Tournament teams during the season, the most in one season in Clemson history. Seven of those wins were recorded away from home, also a school record. One of those was a win at #3 ranked North Carolina, Clemson's first win over a ranked Tar Heel team in Chapel Hill. It was Clemson's highest ranked road win against anyone since 1976.
- Beat four Top 25 teams, all away from home, including Final Four team Alabama, Elite Eight team North Carolina and Sweet 16 team Arizona. It was the most wins away from home over ranked teams in school history.

The 2023-24 season was not a one-year wonder. Over the last two years Clemson has won 47 games, and 25 of those have come in regular season league play, five more than any other two-year conference run in school history.

What is the outlook for the program for a third consecutive winning season in league play? Something that has happened just once previously in school history.

There are some big shoes to fill, most notably the large shoes of 6-11 center PJ Hall, one of the top players in Clemson history. Hall finished his career with 1,702 career points, seventh in school history, including a school record 659 as a senior. He was named First Team All-ACC and Honorable Mention Associated Press All-American. He led the Tigers in scoring average a year ago at 18.3 points per game.

"PJ must be regarded as one of Clemson's best players in history," said Head Coach Brad Brownell. "He influ-

enced the game because he could score inside and out. He is a winner. It was reassuring to have him out there the last three years. He was our security blanket."

"We don't have anyone like him this year. His production will be replaced by committee."

Clemson must also replace Joseph Girard III, perhaps the most impactful transfer in Clemson history in any sport. Girard III had 105 three-point goals and averaged 15.1 points per game a year ago.

"Joe and PJ fed off each other last year. They opened things up for each other all year. That is 33 points per game we must replace."

The Tigers also must replace Jack Clark, a defensive stalwart in many key games when he was healthy during the second half of the season, and RJ Godfrey, a key reserve in the front court.

The Tigers must replace three of their top five scorers from last year, but two returnees are multi-year veterans of the program. Chase Hunter and Ian Schieffelin were both named to the NCAA All-West Regional Team along with Hall and were keys to Clemson's historic NCAA Tournament run.

Hunter is a 6-5 guard who has played the point and the wing over his Clemson career that dates to 2019. The native of Atlanta, Ga. averaged 12.9 points and 3.3 assists per game last year, but he averaged 17.8 points and shot 50.0 percent from the field in the four NCAA games.

Hunter scored 463 points last year and has 1,228 entering the 2024-25 season. Another 450-point season will move him into the top 10 in Clemson history. He is already a veteran of 133 games, 90 as a starter.

Schieffelin was named the ACC's Most Improved Player last year when he averaged 10.1 points and 9.4 rebounds per game. He finished the season third in the ACC in overall rebounding and offensive rebounds. The native of Atlanta, Ga. shot 56.4 percent from the field, including a team best 46.9 percent on three-point shots. He had 11 double-doubles – third most in the ACC.

"We have two very experienced players returning in Chase Hunter and Ian Schieffelin," said Brownell. "Last year we had some vocal leaders. It will be a new step for Ian and Chase. They must realize they are the elder statesmen of the team. Guys are going to look to them for leadership."

SEASON OUTLOOK

"We have worked a lot with Ian on his perimeter skills so he will be more of a threat away from the basket. But we don't want to lose what he does so well, and that is offensive rebound and score around the basket."

"He will be more of a focal point in the scouting report this year with PJ gone and what he accomplished last year. That will be a real change for him. He will see the best opposing defensive player on the inside whereas last year they were on PJ."

Another returning veteran with experience is Chauncey Wiggins, a 6-10 player from Grayson High School in Georgia, the same high school as Schieffelin. Wiggins made 18 starts in 36 games last year and averaged 5.4 points, 2.1 rebounds, and shot 44.2 percent from the field and 34.9 percent from three. He showed his capabilities at Memphis when he made 8-of-12 shots and scored 19 points.

"We have challenged Chauncey to be more aggressive and get to the foul line. We want him to take the next step, and I think he will."

"We would like to see Ian shoot more threes and see Chauncey drive to the bucket more. With Joe Girard gone we will have to see Ian and Chauncey expand their games."

Dillon Hunter is a 6-4 guard who is the fourth returning player who had a significant impact on Clemson's 2024-25 season. Chase Hunter's younger brother averaged 2.3 points and 1.6 rebounds a game a year ago, but he had a 46/14 assist/turnover ratio with 15 steals. He was just the second Clemson guard in the last five years to have more steals than turnovers for an entire season (Nick Honor).

"Dillon worked hard in the offseason and is shooting the ball better. He is a veteran guard who is comfortable with how we play. He has a good spirit about him, a team guy. I feel he is going to take another step forward this year."

Clemson has five transfers who have significant experience at the Division I level. The group of transfers includes Jake Heidbreder, who was at Clemson last year as a redshirt after spending his first two years at Air Force.

Additionally, Clemson has four freshmen, including Asa Thomas, who redshirted at Clemson last year.

Clemson's five transfers have combined to play 388

Division I games, 282 as starters. They have played 9,692 minutes at the Division I level, scored 3,736 points, collected 1,663 rebounds and dealt out 647 assists.

Two of the transfers likely will take the minutes at the center position Hall held the last three years.

Viktor Lakhin is a 6-11 transfer from the University of Cincinnati. The native of Anapa, Russia played 91 games for the Bearcats, 56 as a starter. He had 774 points and 511 rebounds in his career, including averages of 9.2 points and 6.0 rebounds per game last year when he helped Cincinnati to 22 victories. He is capable of making three-point shots, just ask Georgia Tech who saw him make 5-of-6 from long distance last year.

Christian Reeves is a 7-2 transfer from Duke who played sparingly for the Blue Devils, appearing in just 16 games and 58 total minutes the last two years, as he was limited due to injury.

"Viktor is a skilled big man who is a good passer and can make a three. He will be good at the high post in our offense, triggering our offense. He has been in a lot of high major games. He won't be in awe of some of the venues we play."

"Christian is really improving and gaining confidence. He had been hurt at Duke a good bit. He has been working hard to get his strength and conditioning back. I think we are a new lease on life for Christian. Having a guy 7-2, he can impact the game. When he rolls down the lane the opposition is going to have to help. He can catch it and score inside."

Heidbreder and Jaeden Zackery are two guards who should help pick up the three point shooting slack left by Joe Girard's graduation.

Heidbreder spent last season at Clemson going through practice and learning Brownell's system, while getting stronger physically. In two years at Air Force, he scored 786 points, had 200 rebounds and 109 assists in 61 games, all as a starter. He led the Falcons in scoring in 2022-23 with a 15.1 average and was a third-team all-conference selection.

Zackery played 102 games in three years at Boston College, 100 as a starter. He already has 1,106 career points and

331 assists and averaged double figures all three years he was with the Eagles. He had a season high 22 points against Clemson in the ACC tournament last year. A solid on-ball defender, Zackery had 168 steals in 102 games and that 1.6 steals per game figure is fifth in Boston College history.

"Jake is a good player who can make shots. He is a great cutter, who moves well without the ball. Coming to Clemson last year has really benefitted him. He is embracing the defensive concepts of our program and adapting to our style of play. He can play couple of positions."

"Jaeden goes about his business in a professional manner. He is an efficient player and is willing to guard tough matchups. He will take some pressure off Chase defensively. There is a wearing down effect when you have to defend the opponent's top guard for the entire game."

The fifth transfer is Myles Foster. The native of Brooklyn, N.Y. is a veteran of 118 college games, 65 as a starter and has already eclipsed the 1,000 point mark (1,045) and has 606 career rebounds, more than any other active Clemson player.

Last year Foster averaged 12.4 points and 8.1 rebounds a game for Illinois State. He had 22 double figure scoring games. His top game of the year came against a talented Kentucky team when he had 20 points and 15 rebounds. He played the previous two seasons at Monmouth and averaged 12.5 points per game.

"Myles is an unusual player and presents problems for the opposition. He has been successful in his career scoring on the inside."

Four freshmen round out the Clemson roster. Dallas Thomas is a 6-9 forward from Little Rock, Arkansas who was ranked among the top 75 players in the nation by On3 Sports. Dell is a 6-3 guard from Landover, Md. who was ranked as the No. 66 player in the nation by ESPN.

Ace Buckner is a 6-3 guard from Dallas, Texas who is the son of former Clemson Hall of Fame forward Greg Buckner. Buckner is recovering from a shoulder injury and could redshirt his freshman year. Asa Thomas is a 6-7 wing from Illinois who sat out last year at Clemson. He missed a lot of time in the second semester with an injury.

Walk-ons who should contribute this year are Daniel Nauseef, a 6-7 senior forward from Dayton, Ohio, Andrew Latiff, a 6-7 senior guard from Clemson, Matt Kelly a 6-2 guard from Charleston, S.C., and Jackson Roberts, a 6-11 center from Tampa, Fla.

"I think we will have some depth this year," concluded Brownell. "I hope that will be a strength because it is a long season."

"It will be a challenge early to mesh a lot of players. We have a group of 10-11 guys who want to play and are very competitive. That has been great to see over the summer and early fall."

"This will be a team that can extend our defense relative to how we played last year. We are going to have to find some scoring with Joe and PJ moving on to professional basketball. I don't know that we have two guys who can score 15-18 points a game. We will have to do it by committee."

"I hope we will be more aggressive and disruptive on defense and force more turnovers."
