OPENING TIP

• NATIONAL TEAM OF THE WEEK

- Following Clemson's performance two weeks ago, the Tigers were named the USBWA National Team of the Week.
- With a 69-58 win over the no. 20 California Golden Bears, Clemson notched its first victory over a ranked team in nearly two years.
- The Tigers also picked up their first overtime win since 2021 with a 65-61 thriller against the Stanford Cardinal.
- Cal and Stanford entered last week as two of the top ten three-point shooting teams in the nation, but the Tiger defense held both west coast schools to a combined 23% from outside.
- With the wins, the Tigers achieved a 3-1 record to start ACC play for the first time since 2020-21.

THREE-POINT THREATS

- Clemson is one of three teams (Iowa State, Eastern Michigan) in the nation that brought in at least two players (Hannah Kohn, Summah Evans) from the transfer portal that shot over 40% from three-point range with at least 25 attempts.
- In Clemson's game against NC State, the Tigers made 15 three pointers which set a new program record for most three pointers in a game.
- The Tigers currently have five players who are shooting 36% or higher from three (Cluse, Kohn, McQueen, T. Miller, Moore).

HOMECOURT ADVANTAGE

- Clemson's game against Presbyterian had 6,589 fans in attendance - the second highest attended game in program history.
- Clemson's win over Cal is Clemson's first home win against a ranked opponent since beating no. 23 Florida State in 2023.
- Clemson notched its first overtime win since January 4, 2021 (86-77 vs Syracuse) earlier this year against Stanford.
- In Clemson's game in Littlejohn Coliseum against NC Central, the Tigers recorded their largest win since 1998 (91-33).
- Clemson has increased its average attendance by 99% over the 2023-24 season.

TIGER NEWCOMERS

- When Shawn Poppie was hired this offseason, he immediately went to work and got 10 newcomers to join the Tigers.
- Clemson ranks tied for second in the nation for most newcomers on a team (Kentucky - 11; Clemson, Central Michigan, Colorado, New Mexico - 10).
- Clemson recently announced the signing of Holland Harris - a four-star recruit and the no. 44 player in the nation - and Amaia Jackson - a four-star recruit and the no. 77 player in the nation out of Montverde Academy - to the 2025 recruiting class.
- Of Clemson's new transfers, five of them (Hannah Kohn, Summah Evans, Mia Moore, Tessa Miller, Raven Thompson) have received all-conference accolades.

TEAM NOTES

TOUGH SCHEDULE TIGERS

- The Tigers will play 13 regular season games against teams that played in the NCAA tournament last season.
- The teams Clemson is scheduled to play this season not only made the tournament, but advanced far. The Tigers' 2024-25 opponents won a total of 21 games in last season's tournament.
- The 13 games that Clemson will play against last season's tournament teams is the third most such games in the nation this season.
- Nine of Clemson's games this year are against ACC teams who advanced to the NCAA tournament.
- In addition to the 13 games the Tigers can play against NCAA tournament teams, an additional eight games are scheduled against teams that played in either the WBIT or WNIT last season.

LOYAL RETURNS HOME & GIVES BACK

- After four years away from home, Loyal McQueen returns to her home state where she was the Gatorade Player of the Year at Wilson High School to finish her collegiate career.
- Through the first 22 games of the season, McQueen is averaging career highs in points (13.4), field goal percentage (.421), three point percentage (.412), rebounds per game (3.2), and assists per game (4.9).
- In Clemson's game against Notre Dame, McQueen logged her 1,000th career point
- McQueen logged the first double-double of her career in Clemson's 65-59 win at Wake Forest (17 points, 10 assists)
- After returning to play for Clemson, McQueen hosted a basketball camp in her hometown that was free for kids ages 6-13. In addition to learning how to play basketball, McQueen provided all attendees with school supplies for the upcoming school year.
- During the offseason, McQueen returned to Florence where she donated \$500 to the South Florence, West Florence, and Wilson High School girls basketball teams.
- After a legendary high school career at Wilson High, it was recently announced that McQueen's jersey would be retired at Wilson.

MIA MOORE DOES IT ALL

- Through Clemson's first 22 games, Mia Moore is Clemson's second leading scorer with 11.2 points per game, is second on the team in rebounding (5.6 rpg) leads the team in steals (1.5 spg), and is one of the leading shooters on the team (.403/.385).
- Scored a season-high 23 points in Clemson's game against NC State - the most scored by a Tiger in a single game this season.
- In Clemson's game against Virginia, Moore scored 20 points - her second highest total of the season, and she recorded a new career high in made three pointer
- Last season, Moore was one of 25 players in the nation to lead her team in points, points per game, field goal percentage, rebounds, rebounds per game, and steals per game.
- Standing at just 5'6", Moore averaged almost nine rebounds per game and notched 13 double-doubles.
- Moore ranked fifth in the AAC for most rebounds per game.
- Once recorded a quadruple double in high school (15 points, 11 assists, 10 steals, 10 rebounds).

BIG TIME TESSA

- Miller had a career year for a 26-win Belmont team last season, averaging 14.4 points, 6.2 boards, and 3.2 assists per game en route to being an all-conference selection.
- In seven games against power-four competition last season, including games against Georgia, Mississippi State, Ohio State, Penn State, and Stanford, Miller averaged 14.4 points, 5.4 rebounds, and 2.3 assists per game while shooting 60% from the floor.
- Miller notched a her first double-double of this season with 15 points and 11 boards against Kennesaw State
- She logged another double-double with 16 points and 10 rebounds - including her 1,000th career point - in Clemson's win against Radford
- Her third double-double of the season came at Florida State where she tallied 13 points and 13 rebounds
- In Clemson's game against Boston College, Miller tallied a season-high and team-leading 19 points
- She has been the best rebounder for the Tigers this year, leading the team in rebounds (6.5 rpg). She also set a new season high with 15 rebounds in the Tigers' win against Wake Forest.
- Playing against a Stanford team that featured Cameron Brink and Kiki Iriafen, Miller scored 18 points with nine made field goals.
- In the season-opening game against Jackson State, Miller scored a team-high of 17 points on an ultra-efficient 7-8 from the floor and 3-3 from the free-throw line.

1,000-POINT TIGERS

- Clemson entered the season with zero players in the 1,000-point club
- The Tigers are one of two teams in the country that entered the season with zero 1,000-point scorers and now have three.
- Tessa Miller scored her 1,000th career point in Clemson's win against Radford earlier this season
- Raven Thompson joined the 1,000-point club in the Tigers' win against Wake Forest
- Loyal McQueen, the Tigers leading scorer, logged her 1,000th point in Clemson's game against Notre Dame

HISTORIC COMEBACK

- Clemson's comeback victory against Miami (16 points) is the Tigers' second largest comeback since 2013-14 (vs. Pitt, 17 points, 72-57).
- In the Tiger victory, Raven Thompson tied her season high with 17 points and set a new season high with 11 rebounds, notching her first double-double as a Tiger.
- After entering the game in the third quarter with a 16-point deficit, senior Madi Ott entered the game, never left, and went a team-leading +19 as the Tigers recorded a three-point victory.
- The win was Clemson's first against Miami since beating the Canes in the ACC tournament on 3/4/2020 (71-56)


