## FLORIDA STATE RETURNS HOME FOR SECOND GAME AGAINST CLEMSON

Florida State, which has won two consecutive ACC games, plays host to Clemson on Saturday, February 15, 2025 at the Donald L. Tucker Center at 12 Noon. The Seminoles are back at home for the first time since defeating Notre Dame, 67-60, on February 4 and have a 9-3 record this season at the Tucker Center with wins in four of their last five ACC games. Florida State's home ACC wins have come against Syracuse (90-74, January 4), Pittsburgh (82-70, January 15), Georgia Tech (91-78, January 18), and Notre Dame (67-60). The Seminoles arrive back in Tallahassee following a 72-70 win at Wake Forest on Wednesday night in Winston-Salem during which Florida State scored five of the last eight points of the game in the final 24 seconds to secure their second ACC road win of the season. The Seminoles now have two ACC road wins – at Miami (80-65, January 8) and at Wake Forest (72-70, February 12). Following Saturday's game against Clemson, the Seminoles play host to Miami (February 19, 9:00 p.m.) before traveling to play at Louisville (February 22, 12 Noon). The Seminoles' games against Clemson, Miami, and Louisville are against the three teams the Seminoles play two times each during the 2024-25 regular season ACC schedule.

## HAMILTON NEEDS TWO ACC WINS TO EARN 200 CAREER ACC REGULAR SEASON VICTORIES

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton enters Saturday's game against Clemson ranked fourth in ACC history with 198 career regular season ACC victories. He needs just two regular season ACC wins to become just the fourth coach in the illustrious history of the league to win 200 or more regular season conference games.

## FLORIDA STATE'S HAMILTON HOLDS NATIONAL RECORD AGAINST NATIONALLY RANKED TEAMS

Florida State's 77-71 overtime victory over No. 18/21 Colorado on November 21, 2023 marked Leonard Hamilton's NCAA record 57<sup>th</sup> win over a ranked team as the coach of an unranked team. Hamilton set the ongoing record for victories over a ranked team by a non-ranked team with a 79-78 overtime win over Duke on January 18, 2022.

## FLORIDA STATE AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

Entering Florida State's game against No. 19/23 Clemson on Saturday at the Donald L. Tucker Center, the Seminoles have defeated at least one nationally ranked opponent in 11 consecutive and 15 of the last 16 seasons. The Seminoles' current 11-consecutive season streak with at least win over a ranked opponent began in the 2013-14 season with a victory over No. 20 ranked (AP Poll) UMass (60-55, December 21, 2013) in the Orange Bowl Classic in Sunrise, Fla. Florida State's most recent victory over a ranked Clemson team came against the No. 20 ranked Tigers in an 81-79 overtime win on February 14, 2018 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Florida State has five victories over nationally ranked Clemson teams (67-65, February 23, 1977, Clemson ranked No. 8/14 in Tallahassee), (64-55, February 19, 2008, Clemson ranked No. 22 in Tallahassee), (65-61, February 7, 2009, Clemson ranked No. 24 in Tallahassee), (73-66, February 28, 2009, Clemson ranked No. 24 in Tallahassee), (81-79, February 14, 2018, Clemson ranked No. 20 in Tallahassee).

## ALL-AMERICAN CANDIDATE WATKINS APPROACHING SCORING MILESTONES

Senior All-American candidate Jamir Watkins enters Saturday's game against Clemson having scored 1,472 career points and needs 28 points to reach the 1,500 career point plateau. The second-year Seminole has also scored 950 points in his 57-game Florida State career and needs 50 points to reach 1,000 points as a Seminole. Watkins is currently ranked fourth in the ACC in scoring (all games, 18.4 ppg).

## ALL-ACC CANDIDATE EWIN EARNS NINTH DOUBLE-DOUBLE OF SEASON AGAINST WAKE FOREST

Junior All-ACC candidate Malique Ewin earned a double-double of 14 points and 12 rebounds in Florida State's victory over Wake Forest on February 12 – his team-leading ninth of the season and the eighth of his career. The last person with nine or more double-doubles in a single season was Matthew Cleveland who earned 11 double-doubles during the 2022-23 season

I wore both No. 0 and No. 1 in high school at Trenton Catholic, No. 0 during my career at VCU, and No. 2 during my first season at Florida State. I think it's a great looking number. I will also become the first player in my family to earn a college degree and I want to show the younger members of my family that they, too, can earn a college degree."

**FLORIDA STATE IS THE SECOND-TALLEST TEAM IN THE NATION**

Florida State has been measured as the nation's second-tallest team in the nation by Ken Pomeroy's analytics. The Seminoles' roster contains 12 players listed at 6'5 or taller, 10 at 6'7 or taller, five taller than 6'10, and one seven-footer. Florida State is annually one of the tallest and lengthiest teams in all of college basketball. According to analytics supplied by the legendary Ken Pom, Florida State was the tallest team in the nation during the 2023-24 season.

**HAMILTON NEEDS JUST FOUR REGULAR SEASON ACC WINS TO REACH 200 FOR HIS CAREER**

Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton needs just two regular season ACC victories to become just the FOURTH coach in the history of the ACC to win 200 regular season ACC games. He is the fourth-winningest coach in ACC history with 198 regular season victories and took sole possession of fourth place in the annals of the ACC with the Seminoles' win over Syracuse on January 4<sup>th</sup> in Tallahassee.

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton enters Saturday's game against Clemson ranked fifth in ACC history with 436 overall wins, fifth in ACC regular season and ACC Tournament victories with 213, tied for ninth with 15 ACC Tournament victories, fifth among ACC coaches with 18 career NCAA Tournament victories, fourth in the ACC with 128 ACC homecourt wins, and sixth with 95 ACC road wins.

**FLORIDA STATE WITH 17 VICTORIES OVER AP TOP 25 TEAMS IN LAST SIX SEASONS**

**SEMINOLES HOLDING ONTO THE BASKETBALL**

Florida State committed only nine turnovers – including just two in the second half – during its 72-70 win over Wake Forest on Wednesday night in Winston-Salem. The Seminoles did not allow a point to Wake Forest off of turnovers in outscoring the Demon Deacons in the second by a 51-35 margin in the second half – a big reason why the Seminoles earned the ACC road victory. The Seminoles totaled seven first half turnovers and gave the Demon Deacons 10 points off of those turnovers in trailing by a 35-21 margin at the intermission. Florida State's nine turnovers against Wake Forest marked the fifth time this season this season (and fourth time in an ACC game) that they had committed single-digit turnovers in a game this season.

**FLORIDA STATE VS. CLEMSON – THE LAST GAME**

Junior Malique Ewin scored 15 points and pulled down 10 rebounds while Jamir Watkins and Jerry Deng scored 11 points each as Florida State fell to Clemson at Littlejohn Coliseum on January 11, 2025 by a 77-57 margin. The Tigers made 13 3-point shots, outscored Florida State 13-2 to begin the second half, and scored 41 second half points to win their fifth ACC game of the season. Ewin and Watkins had scored in double figures in 13 consecutive games. Both players have scored in double-figures in each Florida State game since November 15. Ewin led the Seminoles with nine rebounds. Ewin finished with his fourth career double-double of 15 points and 10 rebounds. Florida State entered the game as the ACC leader in both blocked shots and steals and continued to play well on the defensive end of the court against Clemson. The Seminoles earned six steals (two each by Watkins and Taylor Bol Bowen) and blocked four shots (one each by Watkins, Ewin, Deng and Alier Maluk).

**FLORIDA STATE CONTINUES TO LEAD THE ACC IN STEALS AND BLOCKED SHOTS**

Florida State totaled six steals and four blocked shots in its win over Wake Forest on Wednesday night, and enters its game against Clemson as the ACC leader in BOTH the blocked shots and steals category. The Seminoles, Pittsburgh (second and fourth) and Wake Forest (third and third), are the only three teams in the ACC who are ranked in the top five of both of the blocked shots and steals statistical categories.

**HOLT INTO DOUBLE FIGURES FOR STEALS**

Senior Bostyn Holt earned one steal in Florida State's win over Wake Forest, has three steals in the last three games, and has earned 10 steals in his first season as a Seminole. He totaled a single-season career-high 15 steals during the 2023-24 season at South Dakota and has earned double-figure steals in both of his last two seasons. Holt is one of eight Seminoles with at least 10 steals this season for Florida State which leads the ACC in steals in the team statistics.

**THE CHANDLER JACKSON TURNOVER-LESS STORY**

Junior Chandler Jackson is one of the most solid ballhandlers in the ACC who, if he qualified for the ACC statistics with at least 3.0 assists per game, would rank third and be one of only three players in the ACC with a better than 3:1 assist:turnover ratio. In the last two seasons and 980 minutes played, Jackson has committed a total of only 27 turnovers – an average of only 1 turnover for every 36.3 minutes played. Jackson's 15 turnovers is the fewest by any of the 90 starters in the ACC. In the last two seasons and 980 minutes played, Jackson has committed only one turnover for every 36.3 minutes played in 52 games.

## **Seminoles Play For Champions For Literacy As They Tip-Off Against Clemson**

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- The Florida State Seminoles continue their commitment to childhood literacy as they play host to a Fight for Literacy game at the Donald L. Tucker Civic Center on Saturday, February 15, 2025, against Clemson.

Champions for Literacy, a non-profit organization founded in 2014, leverages the influence of sports to promote childhood reading. The organization operates under the belief that "athletes can inspire social change," which is the driving force behind their mission. "Why Literacy? Everyone deserves to be a great reader," Champions for Literacy states on their website.

Earlier this month, the Seminoles visited Sabal Palm Elementary School in Tallahassee, where the players read to and interacted with young students, further showing the importance of literacy and reading.

"It feels like I jumped into the future like I was just these kids not too long ago," said freshman Alier Maluk.

The players cherished the experience, and their presence had a significant impact on the students, who were thrilled to meet them.

"The opportunity to talk them, give them advice about just life, encourage them to go to college, and further their education was very gratifying," said senior Bostyn Holt.

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton has long emphasized the importance of education for his student-athletes. Under his leadership, nearly all of his players have graduated, demonstrating his strong belief that academic success is just as vital as athletic performance.

"Reading is one of the things that you develop along the way that far exceeds anything else," said Hamilton.

Florida State's opponent on Saturday, Clemson, is also a strong supporter of Champions for Literacy and has hosted numerous Champions for Literacy games.

Champions for Literacy highlighted Clemson's efforts, stating: "The Clemson community rallies for Literacy with \$55,934 Raised and 550+ students impacted as the Clemson University's Men's Basketball Team partners annually with Champions for Literacy to host a Fight for Literacy Game. The awareness and fundraising around the game benefits award-winning Camp iRock, a local summer reading camp supporting 550+ elementary students in need of literacy intervention work."

The Fight for Literacy initiative was established to empower individuals nationwide to address the urgent challenge of childhood literacy. At Champions for Literacy, creating a meaningful impact remains the core mission. While the issue of literacy may not be solved in our lifetime, Florida State University is determined to drive the movement forward.

## Game 16 -- Clemson 77, Florida State 57

CLEMSON -- Junior Malique Ewin earned his fourth career double-double of 15 points and 10 rebounds while Jamir Watkins and Jerry Deng scored 11 points each as Florida State fell to Clemson at Littlejohn Coliseum by a 77-57 margin. The Tigers made 13 3-point shots, outscored Florida State 13-2 to begin the second half, and scored 41 second half points to win their fifth ACC game of the season. Ewin and Watkins have now scored in double figures in 13 consecutive games. Both players have scored in double-figures in each Florida State game since November 15. Ewin led the Seminoles with nine rebounds. Ewin finished one rebound shy of his fourth career double-double with his 15 points and nine rebounds. Florida State entered the game as the ACC leader in both

blocked shots and steals and continued to play well on the defensive end of the court against Clemson. The Seminoles each six steals (two each by Watkins and Taylor Bol Bowen) and blocked four shots (one each by Watkins, Ewin, Deng and Alier Maluk). TALLAHASSEE – Taylor Bol Bowen scored a career-high 20 points, and Malique Ewin earned his fourth consecutive double-double of 17 points and 11 rebounds to lead Florida State to its second consecutive ACC victory with a 91-78 win over Georgia Tech at the Donald L.
