THREE-POINT THREATS

- As a team, Clemson is shooting .342 from behind the arc, which ranks 68th nationally.
- The Tigers now hold First Place in Clemson Women's Basketball History for most Three-point field goals made (218) in a season.
- In Clemson's game against NC State, the Tigers made 15 three pointers which set a new program record for most three pointers in a game, and has hit **ten or more three-pointers six times** this season.
- The Tigers currently have five players who are shooting 34% or higher from three (Kohn, McQueen, T. Miller, Moore, Cluse)
- Hannah Kohn is 2nd in school history in 3-pointers made in a season (75)

TAKE CARE

- Clemson has a **1.08 assist to turnover ratio**, its best mark in at least 15 seasons. Clemson turns the ball over on 13.83% of its possessions, the fewest in the past 15 seasons.
- Loyal McQueen is 5th in the ACC at 4.9 ast/gm; Clemson's 14.9






