2025 Season

- The Eagles are off to an 19-21 start after beginning their season with the FGCU Kickoff Classic in Fort Myers, Fla., followed by five games in the Bubby Invitational hosted by the University of Florida, a three game trip to East Carolina University, and a spring break trip to California, where they opened ACC play vs. Cal.
- A month ago, BC dropped three straight to No. 24 Virginia, before dropping a midweek at Providence and picking up a victory at Bryant.
- BC had their home-opening series against NC State, dropping the first two games, before earning their first home and ACC win of the season in a 10-7 victory. The Eagles notched their second home victory last Tuesday vs. Stonehill.
- Three weekends ago, BC secured their first series win of the season, taking two of three games vs. Pitt, and dropped midweek games two weeks ago to UConn and UMass.
- Two weekends ago in the Eagle invitational, the Eagles picked up wins over Army and Villanova, and lost their final game to the Wildcats, before dropping a midweek game to cross-town rival Boston University.
- BC notched another ACC win last weekend over Louisville, before dropping the final two games of the series.
- The Eagles began the season by playing 24 games on the road or at neutral sites, and just completed an 18-game homestand.
- The season will conclude with the ACC Tournament being hosted at the Harrington Athletics Village on the campus of Boston College, the first time BC has hosted the tournament.
- This is the 42nd Boston College Softball team.
- BC Softball had it's innagural season in 1984, with Sue Tougas as the team's first head coach.

What to Know

- This will be the sixth season at BC for head coach Amy Kvilhaug, who was hired on July 2, 2019. Kvilhaug led BC to a 30-24 record last season, the program's best record since 2016
- BC returns six position starters from 2024, along with two primary pitchers from last season's squad.
- The Eagles have eight newcomers on the roster - six freshmen and two transfers.
- BC was picked 12th of 15 teams in the preseason ACC poll, earning 66 total points.

New Faces

- The 2028 class includes two pitchers, Bailey Kendziorski and Shannon MacLeod and two catchers, Abby Ptak and Carly Bunnell. Kendziorski has seen significant time in the circle, leading BC in innings pitched and strikeouts.
- Tavye Borders (OF) and Adriana Martinez (1B/UTL) attended the same high school (Buford, Ga.).
- Janis Espinoza (3B) joins the Eagles after two seasons at Mt. San Antonio College, and has been the starting third baseman this season.
- Pitcher Kelly Colleran joins the maroon and gold after a stop at Boston University and has played a key role in the pitching rotation.

At the Helm

- Amy Kvilhaug is in her sixth year as the leader of the BC softball program.
- She has made head coaching stops at Radford and St. John's, amassing 519 wins throughout her career.
- She competed collegiately at Providence, where she holds seven PC career records, including starts (92), games won (72), complete games (84), earned run average (1.20) and shutouts (27).
- Kvilhaug is also a Hall of Famer at Providence College, and is the only softball player to be inducted.

BC SOFTBALL

Bringing the Boom

- Senior Jordan Stephens leads the team in batting average (.372), OPS (1.060), home runs (8), RBIs (30), and slugging percentage (.669=).
- She is one of 29 hitters in the ACC to record eight or more home runs and has set new career highs in every offensive category so far this season.
- This past weekend in the Eagles' 13-14 loss to Louisville, Stephens became the sixth player in BCSB history to drive in six or more runs in a single game, and the first since 2017.
- In addition to being an offensive producer for the Eagles, she has only struck out four times, which is the second-fewest in the ACC among hitters who have had at least 50 at bats.

Super Slike

- Senior Hannah Slike was a producer on offense for the Eagles throughout the 2024 campaign.
- Hannah lead the Eagles offense in most major hitting categories, including batting average (.341), OPS (.948), hits (62), RBIs (27), home runs (8), and slugging percentage (.568)
- She ranked 8th in the conference for doubles (15) and at bats (180), and 14th for hits.
- The senior also ranked eighth in the ACC in fielding. Predominantly in the catcher position, Slike recorded 294 catches on 270 putouts. With a .990 fielding percentage.
- Slike ranked t-12th in the nation for catching runners stealing with 15 on the season.
- Slike is back at it this season, slashing .300/.333/.414 with one homer, while driving in 22 runs in 120 at bats.

First Collegiate Wins

- Sophomore Kelly Colleran and Freshman Shannon MacLeod (right) both earned their first collegiate wins during the FGCU Kickoff Classic.
- Colleran threw **17.2 innings** across three games in the first series, giving up **nine hits** and **four earned runs**, while striking out **seven batters**. So far this season, she has a **3.77 ERA** and has held opponents to a **.257 batting average**.
- Against Pitt, Colleran struck out eight batters, a new career high.
- MacLeod also earned her first win in her first start at the FGCU Kickoff Classic, throwing a complete game, giving up just **two earned runs** on **four hits**, striking out four.
- Freshman **Bailey Kendziorski** picked up her first collegiate win against Santa Clara, tossing 4.1 innings and two strikeouts.
- Kendziorski leads the team in strikeouts (63), while only walking 21 batters.

Eagles of the Week

- For her performance in the FGCU Kickoff Classic, **Kelly Colleran** was named Eagle of the Week for the week of February 10.
- The following week, Freshman **Bailey Kendziorski** was named Eagle of the Week after earning her first two career saves against Binghamton and Providence, while holding the No. 2 ranked Florida Gators to just three runs in six innings of work.
- For the third week in a row, BC Softball won Eagle of the Week, as **Emma Jackson** earned the award after she recorded 6 hits in 9 ABs (.667 avg), 1 RBI, 2 doubles, and 1 stolen base for an **OPS of 1.589** in three games vs. Loyola Chicago, Canisius University, and East Carolina University.
- After hitting .454 on the California spring break trip, **Kali Case** was named Eagle of the Week.
- **Janis Espinoza** became the fifth BCSB player to win Eagle of the Week this season after hitting her first home run in the Maroon and Gold at Virginia.
- **Jordan Stephens** became the sixth consecutive Eagle of the Week, after she

hit .538 with 7 hits, 5 RBIs, and 2 HR in 13 at bats, with a 1.571 OPS two weeks ago.

- **Meghan Schouten** earned Eagle of the Week honors after going 6 for 9 with 6 RBIs in four games last week.
- Hannah Slike was named Eagle of the Week this past week after recording four hits in four games.

A Force on the BasePaths

- Sophomore shortstop Gator Robinson has the third-most walks in the conference (29) this season and is tied for the fourth-most stolen bases (13).
- She is tied for fourth on the team in RBIs (17) and has the third-best on-base percentage among qualified hitters (.390).

ACC Ranks

- Hannah Slike's is tied for the second-most runners caught stealing (8).
- Kelly Colleran ranks 7th in the conference for innings pitched (113) and ranks 13th for strikeouts (73). Colleran also has recorded 23 looking strikeouts, the 10th-most in the conference.
- Bailey Kendziorski ranks 10th in the ACC for innings pitched (106). Her 63 strikeouts are ranked 19th in the conference.
- Sophomore shortstop Gator Robinson has the third-most walks in the conference (29) this season and is tied for the fourth-most stolen bases (13). Robinson also ranks t-7th in the ACC for sacrifice bunts.
- Senior Kali Case is one of seven players with a perfect fielding percentage this season.
- Emma Jackson is tied for the sixth-most triples (4).



Amy Kvilhaug is the fifth head coach in Boston College history after a successful 12-year tenure as head coach at St. John's. She is in her sixth season at BC.

During her 12-year tenure, Kvilhaug helped the Johnnies to seven BIG EAST tournament appearances. The pinnacle of her coaching career at St. John's came during the 2015 campaign when she guided the team to the program's first NCAA tournament appearance in 35 years.

The Pete Frates Center is the home of Boston College Softball. The 31,000-square foot indoor baseball and softball facility features locker rooms, hitting tunnels, indoor turf field, strength and conditioning space, and a hospitality area. It is located adjacent at the Harrington Athletics Village, which opened in 2018.

Frates was diagnosed with amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS) at age 27, and was a leader in the fight for a cure since 2012, most notably through his role as the inspiration for the Ice Bucket Challenge campaign in 2014.

The center provide student-athletes with a space to practice and train year-round, and includes sports medicine areas for treatment and recovery, as well as seven hitting tunnels with retractable cages, and space for a full-team practice on a turf surface.
