CLEMSON NOTES

PREVIEW

- Clemson enters its first ever NCAA Tournament after a 13-6 season and making it to the ACC Semifinals. The Tigers came back to defeat Navy, 11-8, and will face North Carolina for the third time this season. The Tar Heels enter the contest as the No. 1 overall seed in the tournament.

LAST TIME OUT

- The Tigers downed the Midshipmen, 11-8, thanks to a 5-1 fourth quarter scoring effort.
- Lindsey Marshall was monumental for Clemson in the fourth quarter and secured a hat trick in the final frame. She also tacked on an assist to tie a team-high four points. Brooke Goldstein entered herself and tallied a pair of goals and assists, including a momentum shifting play that caused Navy's goalie to throw the ball out of bounds.
- Summer Agostino had a defensive showcase and secured four ground balls and five caused turnovers. Bridget Babcock filled up the stat sheet with a pair of goals, an assist, two ground balls, a draw controls and three caused turnovers.

RPI & AWARDS WATCH

- As of May 4, Clemson is ranked 17 in the RPI with UNC ranked at 1.
- Shurtleff, Agostino, and Kayla MacLeod were all added to the Tewaaron Award Watch List on March 6. This is the first time any Clemson player has been named to the watch list for lacrosse's most prestigious award. The trio alongside Kira Balis were all named to Inside Lacrosse's Mid-season All-America list. Agostino and Shurtleff were selected to the Third Team while Balis and MacLeod were Honorable Mentions.
- Six Tigers were given All-ACC honors. Shurtleff earned All-ACC First Team honors, Agostino, MacLeod and Emily Lamparter were named to the All-ACC Second Team and Marshall and Kira Balis were selected to the All-ACC Third Team. Shurtleff and Masaracchia both earned ACC All-Tournament Team honors.
- Shurtleff and Agostino were selected as members of the USA Lacrosse All-America Third Team.

STAND OUT TIGERS.

- Marshall has amassed 59 goals and 72 points this year, passing her career-high of 45 goals and 53 points at Towson, while MacLeod has 47 goals and 57 points on the year. Marshall is in the top-five in the ACC in total goals scored and in seventh in goals per game while MacLeod is in top-10 in each category, respectively.
- Shurtleff has had a spectacular sophomore campaign in the midfield. Her 36 goals and 56 points are both fourth on the team while her 20 assists are second. She is one of three players on the team with at least 20 ground balls, 30 draw controls and 10 caused turnovers and the only one with over 15 goals.
- Edmonds follow MacLeod and Marshall, with 40 goals and 52 points on the year. Goldstein, Babcock, Katie Castiello and Regan Byrne have all also notched double-digit goals.
- With a team-high 42 assists, Goldstein has 61 points, the second-highest on the team. Goldstein is ranked sixth in total assists and assists per game in the ACC and is the second-ranked freshman nationally in each. Goldstein also has the most points by a freshman in the ACC and is sixth in the nation by the same metric.
- The defensive unit is third in the ACC in terms of scoring defense (9.00). The Tigers have the best corps in the ACC when it comes to picking up ground balls (19.55) and have the best unit in the ACC in causing turnovers (12.10) while being top-six in the nation in each.
- Agostino has caused a team-high 58 turnovers, the most in a single season for Clemson Lacrosse and tied for the fifth-most caused turnovers nationally while being the sixth-highest per game average (2.90) in Division 1. Additionally, Agostino has picked up 54 ground balls, the highest total in the ACC and best per game mark in the ACC (2.70). She is one of two players in a Power 4 conference to record at least 50 ground balls and 50 caused turnovers this season.
- Masaracchia has had another impressive season. She's had 34 ground balls and 26 caused turnovers so far with a dominant effort during the ACC Tournament that saw her put up 11 ground balls and seven caused turnovers in two games.
- Lamparter has put together one of the best years of her illustrious career. The senior is third in the ACC with 9.20 goals against her per game and fourth in the conference with a 47.2% save percentage. Both are also top-20 nationally.

Since being hired on August 2, 2021, Head Coach Allison Kwolek has established Clemson lacrosse as one of the nations premiere programs. She recruited her first two classes in three months time and then brought on board transfers from across the country to solidify her inaugural roster. The 2027 class that Kwolek recruited was named the No. 4 overall class in the country. Unlike other first year programs, Clemson jumped right into playing games when its players arrived on campus in August of 2022.

In her first season at Clemson, Coach Kwolek led the Tigers to win four games in the ACC, upset No. 13 Duke, be ranked in the top 25 nationally for nine straight weeks, earn an automatic bid to the ACC quarterfinals and finish sixth in the ACC. She coached two players to earn ACC All-Freshmen Team, two players to the South's All-Region Second Team, and one player to Honorable Mention for USA Lacrosse's All-American Team.

That spring, not only did Kwolek have to navigate coaching a brand new team through their first season, but she also had to fight breast cancer. After upsetting No. 13 Duke, Kwolek announced her diagnosis to the public and began treatment. Coach Kwolek would only miss several games before returning to the sidelines.

In her second season leading the Tigers, Kwolek and her team went 11-7 in overall play including three conference wins with an overwhelming win over ACC opponent Duke. Clemson also made their second official appearance in the ACC Championship, where they reached the Quarterfinal round for the second consecutive year. In addition to the team's success on the field, a franchise record of 16 Tigers were placed on the Academic All-ACC list. Paris Masaracchia and Emily Lamparter were named Preseason All-Americans, while Regan Byrne, Kayla MacLeod, and Natalie Shurtleff made the 2024 ACC All-Freshman team. That fall, Kwolek went on to sign *Inside Lacrosse's* No. 1-ranked recruiting class. The historic class features five five-star recruits, including the No. 1 and No. 2-ranked players in the country, state champions and multiple multi-time All-Americans. The class is made up of four midfielders, four attackers, a defender and a goalie and hails from Connecticut, Georgia, Massachusetts, Maryland, New Jersey, New York and South Carolina.

Before Clemson, Kwolek has served as head coach at the University of Richmond since 2013, which includes a 64-16 (.800) winning percentage, a 27-5 conference record and two conference tournament and two league regular-season championships in the past five seasons. Richmond was nationally ranked in the top-10 during the last two seasons under Kwolek and has qualified for the NCAA postseason in 2018 and 2019. Kwolek's Spiders started 7-0 and defeated No. 6 UVA before the 2020 season was cut short due to COVID-19. Richmond enjoyed their most successful run in their program's history while under Kwolek's leadership. When the William and Mary graduate took over the program in 2013, Richmond had accumulated just 10 winning seasons since their inaugural season in 1983. Kwolek racked up seven winning records in her nine seasons as the head coach.

Kwolek's success was not limited to the regular season, although she did garner two A10 regular-season championships over the past five campaigns. The Spiders are 11-5 in postseason play under Kwolek, including a 3-0 run in the 2019 A10 Tournament, culminating in being crowned conference champions for a second-straight year. Kwolek has qualified for seven straight A10 Tournaments and has reached the championship game in six of those appearances. She has coached five Atlantic 10 Players of the Year, along with numerous all-conference selections. Two of her players have been named to the watch list for the Tewaaron Award, a recognition earned by the best player in NCAA men's and women's lacrosse.

Prior to her time at Richmond, she served as an assistant at the College of William and Mary, Columbia University, and Dartmouth College. Formerly known as Allison Evans, Kwolek was an All-CAA midfielder at William & Mary and defender on the USA Team. She was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame, Potomac Chapter in February 2015 and named to the William & Mary Athletics Hall of Fame in 2020.

SEASON PREVIEW



The Clemson Lacrosse program is set to begin its third season under the tenure of Head Coach Allison Kwolek alongside Associate Head Coach Bill Olin and Assistant Coaches Christina Esposito and Landyn White. Clemson is coming off an 11-7 season where they earned their first victory in the ACC Tournament and are looking to claim its first berth to the NCAA Tournament.

The Tigers are set to return 20 players from last year's 11-7 squad, with Paris Masaracchia and Katie Castiello leading the way as captains for the 2025 campaign. In addition to Masaracchia, Clemson will return an additional four players who were named to an All-ACC team during the 2024 campaign: Emily Lamparter, Regan Byrne, Natalie Shurtleff and Kayla MacLeod.

Masaracchia has been a defensive force since her time began in Tigertown; the Pennsylvania native has started every game in a Clemson uniform while recording 39 caused turnovers, 60 ground balls, and 87 draw controls for the Orange and Regalia. She has recorded the most ground balls for the Tigers in consecutive years and had the most caused turnovers for Clemson over the past two seasons. The junior defender also had the sixth-highest total in the ACC for caused turnovers and caused turnovers per game while being the highest-ranked underclassman in the ACC in both categories. The team captain has earned her share of accolades as she was named to the ACC All-Freshman Team in 2023, Second-Team All-ACC in 2024, the 2024 Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IWLCA) All-South Region First-Team honors and named to the All-ACC Academic Team the last two years. Along with her past accolades, Masaracchia has recently been named to the 2025 USA Lacrosse All-America Second Team and the 2025 Nike Lacrosse Preseason Women's DI Media All-America Third Team.

Lamparter has been a stalwart at the cage for the Tigers. During her Second-Team All-ACC campaign last season, she was in the top six in the ACC for every major goalie statistic, including being second with a save rate of 46.2% and third with 8.17 saves per game. The South Carolinian had a career-high 16 saves in 2024 and played a pivotal role in keeping Clemson close to Notre Dame in both contests as she produced two game-saving stops at the end of regulation and in the first overtime. In 2023, she was second in the ACC with a save rate of 47.3% and was top-20 nationally. In addition to her All-ACC nod last season, she earned

an IWLCA Defensive Player of the Week in 2023, was named to the 2024 IWLCA All-South Region First Team, is a two-time All-ACC Academic Team honoree and was selected to the 2024 CSC Academic All-District Team. Like Masaracchia, she was recently named to the 2025 USA Lacrosse All-America team as an honorable mention.

Shurtleff was a key contributor to the Tigers' success in her ACC All-Freshman campaign. She led Clemson in assists with 20, the fifth most of a freshman nationally and second most of any freshman in the ACC. Additionally, the St. Paul's School for Girls alumnae had the second-most points for the program with 42, was fifth on the team in goals with 22, fourth in draw controls with 35 and fifth in caused turnovers with 12. The sophomore recorded five hat tricks and put the ball in the back of the net in 10 games. Shurtleff was responsible for both the game-tying and game-winning goal in overtime to secure the overtime victory for Clemson over Pitt.

Byrne immediately contributed as an offensive force for the Tigers in 2024. The Glenelg County product led the Tigers in goals per game in 2024 with 2.38, the highest rate in the ACC by an underclassman and the fourth-highest in the nation by a freshman, and recorded the second-most goals on the squad with 38, the second-highest total by an ACC underclassman, respectively. During her prolific freshman season, Byrne produced 11 multi-point outings with six hat tricks and placed herself in the Clemson record book after her six-goal debut against Davidson tied her for the second-most goals in a single game.

MacLeod established herself as one of the premier shooting threats in the nation in her All-Freshman campaign. The attacker was statically the best freshman in the ACC with .83 free position goals per game, converted her free position opportunities at 71.4%, and, overall, shot 54.5%, good for the top-ranked freshman nationally in all categories. The Georgia native led Clemson with 89.1% of her shots being on goal (minimum two attempts) and had 30 goals on the season, the third most by a Tiger. MacLeod had a season-high five goals against Notre Dame and scored a goal in 15 of her 18 games played in the season.

During the offseason, Kwolek and the Clemson Lacrosse program dipped into the portal to grab All-Conference contributors to the Tigers by grabbing Lindsey Marshall from Towson, Maggie Jordan of

Richmond and Bridget Babcock out of Cornell.

In her senior year with Towson, Marshall was named to the All-CAA Second Team and received a CAA Preseason All-Conference Team nomination. Marshall started all 16 games and finished second on the team in points with 52 from 42 goals and 10 assists in the 2024 season. In her junior and freshman seasons, Marshall received All-CAA First Team honors. Jordan was initially recruited by Kwolek, who was head coach of Richmond at the time. Jordan earned 2024 A-10 All-Conference Midfield Second-Team honors and was named the A-10 Defensive Player of the Week in March. In 2024, Jordan played in all 19 games for the Spiders, totaling 16 points from 14 goals and two assists on offense. On the defensive side of the game, Jordan is a force to be reckoned with, as she tallied 18 caused turnovers and 13 ground balls on defense during her final campaign. Babcock was an All-Ivy second-team selection for the 2024 season and was elected as one of Cornell's captains during her fourth and fifth years. In her last season, Babcock played and started in thirteen games, finishing with 18 goals, the second-most assists on the team with 14 and the third-best point total at 32. The previous season, in 2023, Babcock saw action in all of Cornell's contests as she recorded six goals and two assists for eight points.

The incoming freshman class for the Tigers is also expected to contribute to the third-year program. Kwolek and her staff brought in eight freshmen hailing from New York, Florida, Maryland, North Carolina and Massachusetts, featuring All-Americans, multi-sport athletes and state champions. Four of the eight freshmen were named to Inside Lacrosse's Women's Class of 2024 Power 100 Rankings: defender Maddie Wrenn earned the 20th overall ranking, with midfielder Kira Balis grabbing number 22 overall. Attacker Brooke Goldstein and midfielder Susan Lowther were both featured on the Power 100 Watchlist.

During its first season of operation, the Clemson Lacrosse Complex held 7,791 fans, the eighth-largest cumulative attendance in the country, while averaging 974 fans and 97.4% capacity per game, the sixth-most average attendance and third-highest in capacity in the country.





Clemson Lacrosse will continue to play at the second year, state-of-the-art Clemson Lacrosse Complex on the banks of Lake Hartwell.

The stunning new stadium is a part of Clemson's \$37M Women's Athletics Facility Expansion Project that features lakefront facilities for Clemson's Lacrosse, Gymnastics and Rowing teams. Clemson Lacrosse's new stadium includes bleacher seating for 1,000 fans, artificial turf, and a 9,000 square foot operations complex, including coaches' offices, locker rooms, player lounge and other amenities. These new facilities make Clemson home to the only collegiate program to have a stadium and facility be solely designated to its women's lacrosse program.

In addition to the lacrosse specific facilities, there is a brand new 10,000 square foot training and recovery center with designed space for sports science, nutrition, sports medicine, and strength and conditioning for all student-athletes at Clemson University.
