THIS WEEK: MAY 16-18 | CLEMSON REGIONALS

Northwestern secured one of 33 at-large bids to this year's NCAA Tournament and heads to the Clemson Regional with the No. 11 overall seed Clemson, Kentucky and USC-Upstate.

This marks the seventh-consecutive NCAA Tournament that Northwestern has qualified for, matching a program record (also done 2003-09). The Wildcats have earned a berth in 10 of the last 11 NCAA Tournaments, and 18 of the 24 years under Kate Drohan and Caryl Drohan. Under the Drohan's, Northwestern has won seven regional titles and made three trips to the Women's College World Series, most recently in 2022.

To finish the regular season, Northwestern earned a series victory at No. 8 UCLA. The 'Cats opened with an 8-0 run-rule victory over the Bruins on Friday before locking up the series victory on Sunday with a four-run rally in the sixth inning en route to a 5-3 victory.

- It marked the first time a team has taken a series at UCLA since Arizona in 2019.
- The Wildcats also snapped a 24-game home winning streak for UCLA with their run-rule win on Friday (UCLA entered the weekend 18-0 on the season at Easton Stadium).
- The 'Cats also became the first team to score 8+ runs in back-to-back games against the Bruins since Oregon in 2014.

Lauren Boyd was named the National Pitcher of the Week by D1Softball following her dominant showing at UCLA in which she went 2-0 with two complete games and a 1.62 ERA (3 ER/13.0 IP) while striking out seven and limiting UCLA's lineup to a .156 opponent average. In her last six starts, Boyd is 6-0 with a 1.60 ERA (8 ER/35.0 IP) with four complete game performances. As a team Northwestern is 17-5 in games that Boyd has pitched in.

Northwestern joins Florida, Arkansas, Texas, Tennessee, South Carolina and Oklahoma as the only teams in the nation this season to earn a three-game series victory on the road over an opponent currently ranked in the RPI Top-10.

Northwestern finished 16-6 in the Big Ten, tied for fourth place in the conference standings in what marks the Wildcats' seventh-consecutive Top-4 finish in the Big Ten.

The Wildcats earned four wins over "Quad-1" opponents (ranked in the latest RPI Top 25) defeating Duke on February 8, Mississippi State on March 22, and winning two of three games at UCLA in the final series of the regular season. NU tripled its number of ranked opponents faced from the 2024 season (5), with 15 ranked matchups to date this year.

In Northwestern's last three weeks of the regular season, the Wildcats went 9-2 with five run-rule victories while outscoring their opponents 83-34 in that span. In those 11 games, the 'Cats were hitting .330 (99-for-300) to go along with a .547 slugging percentage.

Northwestern clinched back-to-back-to-back regular season titles in 2024, just the second time "three-peating" in school history and first since a four-year run from 1984-87. It marked the 10th conference title in program history – five of which were won by Sharon Drysdale and five of which were won by Kate Drohan.

Northwestern head coach **Kate Drohan** returns for her 24th season after capturing her sixth Big Ten Coach of the Year award in 2024, her fourth in a five-year span. This year, Drohan surpassed her predecessor, Sharon Drysdale, as the longest-tenured head coach in program history. Drohan and her twin sister, associate head coach **Caryl Drohan**, are Northwestern's all-time wins leaders with 809 victories.

Entering this weekend, Kate Drohan has a 48-39 career record (.552) in the postseason and is 36-23 (.610) in the NCAA Regional round. The Wildcats have advanced to its Regional Final 11 times under Drohan. This marks the fourth time Northwestern and Kentucky have been matched up in the same regional since 2015.

POSTSEASON HISTORY

Northwestern has made 23 appearances in the NCAA Tournament.

- 18 of its 23 appearances have come in the last 24 years under Kate and Caryl Drohan.
- The Wildcats have earned a berth in 7 straight NCAA Tournaments, as well as 10 of the last 11 tournaments.

Kate Drohan has a 48-39 career record (.552) in the postseason.

- She has won 7 Regional Titles (05, 06, 07, 08, 19, 22, 23) and made 3 trips to the Women's College World Series (06, 07, 22).

Drohan is 36-23 (.610) in the NCAA Regional round.

- Including this year, 12 of the 18 Regionals under Drohan have been on the road.
- Under Drohan, Northwestern has a 13-4 record in its first game of each NCAA Tournament.
- The Wildcats have advanced to its Regional Final 11 times under Drohan.

Northwestern has made 7 straight NCAA Tournaments, dating back to 2018.

- It matches Northwestern's longest streak of making the NCAA Tournament in program history (2003-09).
- Northwestern has made the super regionals 7 times with Drohan as its head coach, including 3 of the last 5 tournaments and each of the last two years.

Northwestern has outscored opponents 345-317 in 87 career postseason games under Kate Drohan.

The 'Cats average 4.6 runs per game in the Regional round (59 games) under Drohan while allowing just 3.7 runs per game.

Northwestern has advanced to the NCAA Super Regionals in 3 of the last 5 NCAA Tournaments.

- In each of those last 5 NCAA Tournaments, the Wildcats have had to play on the road for at least one round:
 - 2019 (at Oklahoma - Super Regional)
 - 2021 (at Kentucky - Regional)
 - 2022 (at Arizona State, Super Regional)
 - 2023 (at Alabama, Super Regional)
- - 2024 (at Texas, Regional)

Northwestern has advanced to the Women's College World Series 6 times in program history

- 3 times with former head coach Sharon Drysdale (three-straight years in 1984, 1985 and 1986)
- 3 times with Kate Drohan (back-to-back years in 2006 and 2007, returned in 2022)

Last season, Northwestern travelled to Austin for the NCAA Regional hosted by No. 1 overall seed Texas.

- The 'Cats defeated Saint Francis (PA) twice (7-2 on Friday, 5-1 on Saturday) en route to advancing to the Regional Final, but fell to the top-seeded Longhorns twice (14-2 on Saturday, 7-0 on Sunday).

This will mark the Wildcats' first time traveling to **Clemson** for an NCAA Regional.

- Northwestern's only prior trip to Clemson came in 2023 during the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, with Clemson winning a pair of meetings, the latter of which Lauren Boyd finished with a complete game 7.0 inning performance while allowing just three earned runs, six hits and striking out five in a 3-2 setback to the Tigers.
- The 'Cats and Tigers met for the first time in 2022 at the SPC Clearwater Elite Invitational, with Northwestern winning 7-0.

This marks the fourth time **Northwestern** and **Kentucky** have been matched up in the same regional since 2015.

- In 2015, both teams met in the South Bend Regional, hosted by No. 16 overall seed Notre Dame. Kentucky earned a 5-4 win over Northwestern in game one and eventually advanced out of the region.
- In 2021, both teams met in the Lexington Regional, hosted by No. 14 overall seed Kentucky. Kentucky took game one vs. the Wildcats, 3-2, and later earned a 7-2 victory over NU in the consolation ladder while eventually advancing out of the region.
- In 2023, both teams met in the Evanston Regional, hosted by No. 12 overall seed Northwestern. Northwestern came away with a 10-8 victory following an 8-run rally in the third inning—during which first-year Kansas Robinson hit two home runs in the same inning. Northwestern eventually advanced out of the region.

2025 NORTHWESTERN SOFTBALL GAME NOTES

First-year **Kaylie Avvisato** was named to the All-Big Ten Freshman team following a breakout rookie campaign. Avvisato leads Northwestern with 55 hits and 83 total bases on the season. Her 55 hits are the most by an NU rookie since Jordyn Rudd (57) in 2019, while her .355 batting average is the highest by a Wildcat first-year since Sabrina Rabin (.394) in 2015.

- With a team-high 22 stolen bases on the season, Avvisato leads all first-years in the conference and ranks fifth among all Big Ten players. She is the first Wildcat to steal 20+ bases in a season since Skyler Shellmyer in 2023, and the first NU rookie to do so since Rachel Lewis in 2018.
- In Big Ten play this season, Avvisato hit .329 (25-for-76), the highest mark in conference play by a Wildcat rookie since Grace Nieto hit .356 as a first-year in 24 conference games in 2022.
- Avvisato has now turned in 14 multi-hit games on the season—third on the team—including seven three-hit games which ranks as the most by a Wildcat since 2018 (Sabrina Rabin; 8)
- Avvisato finished with a team-high six hits and three RBI in the series vs. Wisconsin, hitting .545 (6-for-11) with three doubles, three runs scored and a walk-off home run to complete a four-run rally in Sunday's win. She reached base multiple times in all three games against the Badgers, including a two-hit effort on Saturday followed by a 3-for-4 showing on Sunday.
- To open conference play in OKC, Avvisato led the Wildcats with eight hits, four stolen bases and nine RBI in four games. Avvisato recorded hits in every game. The first-year from Leesburg, Virginia recorded three hits and four RBI in two different games, going 3-for-4 with a home run in a run-rule victory over Penn State while driving in four runs once again in Sunday's win over Michigan State, going 3-for-5 with a double.
- Avvisato broke onto the scene in a big way in her first weekend of collegiate action, leading the Northwestern offense with a team-high nine hits, a .563 batting average and three multi-hit games at the NFCA Leadoff Classic. Avvisato's nine hits over opening weekend were tied for the most by any true first-year in a power four conference. She recorded a team-high six hits the next weekend at LSU, while hitting .353 (6-for-17) with three RBI and two runs scored.
- Northwestern has now landed a player on the All-Big Ten Freshman Team in each of the last four seasons, all of whom are still on the team (Avvisato in 2025, Emma Raye in 2024, Kansas Robinson and Kelsey Nader in 2023, Grace Nieto in 2022).

Junior **Bridget Donahey** leads the team this season in OPS (1.047), slugging percentage (.595), and home runs (8).

- Donahey ranks second on the team behind only Kelsey Nader in on-base percentage with a .452 mark this year. Last season, she also ranked second on the team with an OBP of .450; Donahey is looking to become the first Wildcat to post consecutive seasons with an on-base percentage of .450 or better since Rachel Lewis did so in 2021 and 2022.
- Donahey has reached base in 18 of her last 33 plate appearances (.545 OBP) over Northwestern's last 12 games.
- She led the Wildcats with a .660 slugging percentage in Big Ten play this season.
- Had never recorded a three-hit game in her first 113 career games played, then turned in two separate three-hit performances across four games (vs. Northern Illinois on March 26; at Minnesota on March 29). During that four-game stretch vs. Northern Illinois/Minnesota, Donahey hit .636 (7-for-11) with two doubles, two homers, eight RBI and four runs scored to go along with a 1.364 slugging percentage and a .615 on-base percentage.
- Donahey posted a .500 on-base percentage to open conference play in OKC, driving in five runs that included a bases-clearing three-RBI triple to tie the game vs. Michigan State, as well as a homer on Thursday's win vs. Penn State.
- Donahey scored a team-high five runs in four games at Louisville this season, posting a .983 OPS. One week prior, she also led the Wildcats in slugging percentage (.875) and on-base percentage (.545) in four games at the Mary Nutter Classic.
- Last season, Donahey led Northwestern with 32 walks, which ranked sixth in the Big Ten, while her .450 on-base percentage ranked 11th in the conference and second on the team behind only Kansas Robinson.

Kelsey Nader currently leads the team with a .457 on-base percentage, 27 walks and 38 runs scored. She has seen her average on the season jump from .214 up to .343 (fourth-best on the team) since the start of March.

- Nader leads the team this season with 16 multi-hit games.
- Nader posted the first four-hit performance of her career on March 29 at Minnesota, going 4-for-5 at the plate with two doubles, three RBI and two runs scored. Nader is the third-different Wildcat to record a four-hit game this season, joining Kansas Robinson (February 16 vs. UT Arlington; April 1 vs. Notre Dame) and Avery Garden (March 16 vs. Michigan State).
- Reached base in 7-of-9 plate appearances vs. Mississippi State (.778 on-base percentage). Finished the weekend going 4-for-6 at the plate while drawing a team-high three walks.
- Nader reached base in 13-of-18 at-bats to open conference play in OKC, drawing seven walks while recording six RBI, four runs scored, three extra-base hits and three stolen bases.
- After the start of Big Ten play in 2024, Nader raised her batting average on the season from .266 up to .377 on her way to earning Third-Team NFCA All-American honors.
- Last season, Nader led the Wildcats in Big Ten play with a jaw-dropping .473 batting average (35-for-74) in 22 Big Ten games to go along with a team-best 20 RBI and 22 runs scored. Her 35 hits and .473 batting average in conference play ranked second among all players in the conference, trailing only the Big Ten Player of the Year, Jess Oakland (Minnesota).

Izzy Cunnea leads the team this season with a .357 average (41-for-115), as well as a .368 mark (21-for-57) in conference play.

- Over the last three weeks of the regular season, Cunnea hit a team-best .467 (14-for-30) with a .600 slugging percentage, a .500 on-base percentage and a team-high 10 RBI over 11 games. She recorded a multi-hit game in 5 of the last 9 games.
- From 2024 to 2025, Cunnea has raised her average this season by .145 points, along with jumps in every statistical category:
2024 - .212 batting average / .389 slugging percentage / .315 on-base percentage / 19 RBI / 16 runs scored
2025 - .357 batting average / .513 slugging percentage / .422 on-base percentage / 24 RBI / 17 runs scored

2025 NORTHWESTERN SOFTBALL GAME NOTES

Lauren Boyd has posted career-bests this season in innings pitched (109), strikeouts (104), wins (14), ERA (2.57) and opponent batting average (.216). Boyd earned Second Team All-Big Ten recognition, her first-ever All-Big Ten selection.

- Boyd has 10 complete games in 19 games started this season, one of just six pitchers in the conference to throw 10+ complete games this season. As a team, Northwestern is 17-5 in games that Boyd has pitched in.
- In Big Ten play, Boyd finished with a 9-2 record and ranked fourth among all pitchers with a 2.33 ERA (21 ER/63.0 IP) and third with a .204 opponent batting average. Boyd was one of just 10 pitchers in the conference to throw 60.0+ innings during league play; of that group, her 2.33 ERA ranked second only behind the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year, Jordy Bahl.
- Over her last six starts, Boyd is 6-0 with a 1.60 ERA (8 ER/35.0 IP) with four complete game performances.
- Boyd delivered two gems in the circle for the Wildcats at UCLA, going 2-0 with a 1.62 ERA (3 ER/13.0 IP) while throwing two complete games. Boyd struck out seven and allowed just seven hits across her 13.0 innings pitched over the weekend, limiting UCLA's lineup to just a .156 combined batting average. In her outing on Friday, Boyd threw a complete game shutout, allowing just three hits and no walks while facing just 21 batters in 6.0 innings of work. On Sunday, Boyd allowed just four hits and three runs in 7.0 innings, stranding six Bruins on base and retiring 14 of the final 16 batters she faced.
- Following the Wildcats' UCLA series win to close the regular season, Boyd was named the National Pitcher of the Week by D1Softball and was named as one of four players in the country to Softball America's "Stars of the Week," joining Ava Brown (Florida), Jazzy Francis (Florida State) and Emily Kennedy (Texas A&M).
- Against Wisconsin, Boyd went 2-0 with a pair of complete games, totaling a 2.92 ERA (5 ER/12.0 IP) while striking out eight batters and stranding a total of 16 badgers on-base across 12.0 innings pitched.
- In her two outings at Rutgers, Boyd allowed no runs and only three hits while striking out 16 in 10.0 innings of work.
- Boyd went 7-0 with two saves, 51 strikeouts and a 1.66 ERA (11 ER/46.1 IP) over a stretch of nine outings (Feb. 22 to April 5)
- Turned in a 123-pitch performance in what marked her third-straight complete game a 4-3 win over Illinois on April 5. She allowed just one earned run and six hits over 7.0 innings, while striking out seven.
- Tossed a complete game shutout in a 2-0 victory at Minnesota on March 28, allowing just three hits and one walk while striking out 10. It marks the second double-digit strikeout performance of the season for Boyd, as well as her first complete game shutout since April 2, 2023 at Iowa.
- Earned the win on March 22 vs. #19 Mississippi State, throwing 127 pitches in what marked her fourth complete game of the season and the 13th of her career. Boyd faced 27 batters, striking out five and allowing just four hits and two runs.
- Boyd earned two victories in two complete game performances while striking out 14 and allowing just two earned runs in 12.0 innings during the Wildcats' weekend in Louisville. In the weekend finale win over Louisville, Boyd recorded a career-high 11 strikeouts while allowing just five hits in 7.0 innings. It marked the first double-digit strikeout performance by a Wildcat since Ashley Miller did so on April 16, 2024.
- Delivered a gem in the circle in just her second start of the season after missing the entire 2024 season due to injury, throwing a complete game 7.0 innings while allowing just seven hits and one run while striking out seven in a 4-1 win over #8 Duke

Grace Nieto is leading the team in two-out hitting (.533; 16-for-30), hitting with runners in scoring position (.412; 14-for-34) and hitting with runners on base (.421; 24-for-57). Her .347 batting average is on track for a single-season career high, and her 14 stolen bases is already a career best.

- Nieto enters this weekend's regional on a 7-game hitting streak and a 10-game reached base streak.
- Nieto reached base multiple times in all three games of the UCLA series and finished hitting .600 (6-for-10) to go along with a .667 on-base percentage. In an 8-0 run-rule win on Friday, Nieto reached base in all four of her plate appearances, and matched her career high with three hits while hitting a solo home run in the second inning.
- In an 8-2 win on April 6, Nieto hit a two-run home run in the bottom of the sixth inning which marked her second homer of the season, fourth of her career and her first-ever at Sharon J. Drysdale Field.
- Nieto led the Wildcats at the plate in back-to-back weekends at LSU and the Mary Nutter Classic after missing the entirety of the 2024 season due to injury. In five games at LSU, Nieto went 5-for-12 and matched her single-game career highs in both hits (3) and RBI (2) in a win over UT Arlington on February 15. At the Mary Nutter Classic, Nieto went 5-for-11 with four runs scored, a double, a homer and two RBI. Against Cal on February 23, she went 3-for-3 with three runs scored, in what marked her third three-hit performance on the year. Batting in the leadoff spot for the first time of the season vs. Cal, Nieto led off the game with her first home run in three years (April 23, 2022).

Riley Grudzielanek posted a 2.94 ERA (14 ER/33.1 IP) in nine conference games this season, second on the team only to Boyd and seventh among all Big Ten pitchers.

- Grudzielanek threw her first-career no-hitter at UIC on April 22, striking out five in five scoreless innings. Grudzielanek is the 18th different Wildcat in program history to throw a no-hitter, and the first to do so since Danielle Williams on March 20, 2022 vs. Stanford.
- Grudzielanek recorded a career-high 11 strikeouts while allowing six hits and no earned runs in the Wildcats' 2-1 setback to Illinois on April 6. It marked the third double-digit strikeout performance from a Wildcat pitcher this season (also Lauren Boyd vs. Louisville, at Minnesota) and more than doubled Grudzielanek's previous career high of five.
- Grudzielanek earned her seventh win of the season in a 3-2 win at Minnesota on March 28 in what marked her fourth complete game performance, allowing just three hits while striking out four. Grudzielanek allowed just two runs, both of which came in the first inning, before tossing six-straight scoreless innings to close out the game.
- Led the Wildcats in the circle during the opening weekend of Big Ten play in OKC, going 3-0 in three appearances with a 1.66 ERA (3 ER/12.2 IP) and a .190 opposing batting average while adding 10 strikeouts. Entering in relief on both Saturday and Sunday's games vs. Michigan State, Grudzielanek earned a pair of wins in the circle. On Saturday, she tossed 4.2 scoreless innings, helping keep the game tied heading into extra innings before handing it over to Lauren Boyd for a save.

2025 NORTHWESTERN SOFTBALL GAME NOTES

Kansas Robinson leads the team this season with 38 RBI, 22 of which came during Big Ten play. She is on track to become the first Wildcat to lead the team in RBI in consecutive seasons since Andrea Filler did so in 2016 and 2017.

- Robinson hit her eighth home run of the year on Saturday, May 3 at UCLA to kick off a sequence of three-straight home runs in the top of the fifth inning (Robinson, Izzy Cunnea, Lauren Sciborski), tying an NCAA record.
- Robinson blasted her sixth home run of the season, and her fourth in a seven-game span, on Sunday, April 13 vs. Nebraska.
- Robinson drove in six of Northwestern's 12 total runs scored during the Illinois weekend series.
- In a six-game span from March 28-April 6, Robinson hit .571 (12-for-21) with 18 RBI, a 1.143 slugging percentage and a .591 on-base percentage, raising her batting average by .60 points in that span.
- Against Notre Dame on April 1, Robinson hit a game tying grand slam with two strikes and two outs to force a 10-10 tie. Robinson finished the game going 4-for-4 with a walk, a homer, six RBI and two runs scored. It tied a career high for Robinson in both hits (4) and RBI (6), having previously recorded a four-hit performance earlier this season vs. UT Arlington on Feb. 16 and driving in six RBI during her rookie season against Nebraska on April 28, 2023.

Ayana Lindsey hit .313 (10-for-32) with a .406 on-base percentage with 11 runs scored and 8 RBI in Big Ten play this season. Last year in Big Ten play, she hit 288 (15-of-52) with nine RBI and 14 runs scored, a .424 on-base percentage and .866 OPS.

- On April 29, Lindsey was named to the Allstate NACDA Goodworks Team, highlighting 60 student-athletes (20 per season) who go above and beyond in volunteerism and civic engagement. Lindsey was one of two D1 Softball players to be named to the team, and also joined Northwestern Baseball's Tyler Ganus on the team. During her four years in Evanston, Lindsey launched a literacy program with Chicago HOPES for Kids to support children experiencing homelessness. In addition, she mentors middle schoolers, volunteers at a domestic violence shelter, fosters rescue animals.

Kaylie Avvisato and fellow first-year **Avery Garden** were a formidable rookie duo in Big Ten play.

- Garden blasted towering home runs in back-to-back games during the UCLA series on Friday and Saturday, bringing her total to five homers on the season. Garden finished the UCLA weekend with a team-high six RBI, driving in three runs (a single-game career high) in back-to-back games.
- Garden is hitting .326 (15-for-46) with 14 RBI and a .543 slugging percentage in Big Ten play this season.
- Avvisato meanwhile is hitting .329 (25-for-76) with 17 RBI and a .873 OPS against conference opponents to go along with twelve stolen bases in conference play.

Emma Raye has allowed just three stolen bases in four total attempts throughout Big Ten play this season.

- Raye belted two home runs, scored a run in all four games and led the Wildcats with 13 total bases over the opening weekend of conference play in OKC, hitting .462 (6-for-13) with six RBI. In Thursday's 13-7 win vs. Penn State, Raye drove in a career-high five RBI and tallied the first three-hit game of her career. She followed that up the next game with another multi-hit effort, going 2-for-3 against the Nittany Lions while homering for the second game in a row.

On the basepaths, the Wildcats racked up 83 stolen bases, including a Big Ten-leading 51 in conference play.

- With 22 stolen bases, **Kaylie Avvisato** is the first Wildcat to steal 20 bases in a season since Skyler Shellmyer in 2023 and the first Wildcat rookie to do so since Rachel Lewis in 2018 (24). **Grace Neito** is a perfect 14-for-14 on stolen base attempts this season, the second-highest mark without being caught among all players in the Big Ten.

Northwestern is 22-4 this season in games that the Wildcats have scored first in.

- Additionally, Northwestern is 27-0-1 when out-hitting its opponent this season.
- When scoring 3+ runs this season, Northwestern is 27-3.

2025 NORTHWESTERN SOFTBALL GAME NOTES

BEST in the B1G (x3): Northwestern clinched back-to-back-to-back regular season titles last year, just the second time “three-peating” in school history and first since a four-year run from 1984-87. It marked the 10th conference title in program history – five of which were won by Sharon Drysdale and five of which were won by Kate Drohan.

RETURNING PRODUCTION: Northwestern returned seven of nine starters in its lineup, who accounted for nearly 78% of hits, 80% of home runs, and 83% of RBI in 2024.

All-BIG TEN TROPHY CASE: Northwestern landed the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and Coach of the Year, in addition to Three First Team All-Big Ten selections in 2024. It marked the sixth season in a row that Northwestern has earned multiple First Team selections. For each of the Wildcats’ three First-Team nods (Nader, Robinson, Ashley Miller), it marked their first time receiving All-Big Ten status.

KANSAS ‘KR’ ROBINSON IN YEAR THREE: **Kansas Robinson** was named a Preseason All-American by D1Softball, one of six Big Ten players to earn the honor. Robinson enters her junior campaign having been named a Second Team All-American by Softball America, while also earning First Team All-Big Ten and NFCA First Team All-Great Lakes Region selections in 2024. As a sophomore, Robinson led Northwestern in batting average (.383), slugging percentage (.705), on-base percentage (.486), home runs (11), and RBI (36).

- During her sophomore season, Robinson finished the year with an impressive 1.191 OPS, ranking fourth in the conference. Her .486 on-base percentage was the third-highest in the Big Ten. She opened the season by reaching base in 34 consecutive games, tying for the fifth-longest streak in Big Ten history.
- Robinson had a breakout rookie campaign in 2023 that saw her earn NFCA All-Region honors. Robinson ranked second on the team with a 1.001 OPS, the highest mark by a NU first-year since Rachel Lewis in 2018, and tied for second on the team with nine home runs—all of which came over the final two months of the season. .

RAYE RETURNS: **Emma Raye** finished second on the team in home runs (10), and RBI (32) as a rookie in 2024.

- Raye’s ten homers were the most by a Wildcat rookie since Maeve Nelson belted 11 in 2019.
- Raye became the fifth Wildcat in the last five years to record 25+ RBI in her rookie campaign, joining Kansas Robinson in 2023 (26), and Jordyn Rudd (51), Nikki Cuchran (35) and Maeve Nelson (31) in 2019.

SOPHOMORE PITCHERS RETURN: Sophomore pitchers **Renae Cunningham** and **Riley Grudzielanek** return for the ‘Cats, on a staff that graduated Big Ten Pitcher of the Year, Ashley Miller.

- Cunningham finished with a 3.39 ERA in 51.2 innings pitched, and her 1.10 WHIP ranked third in the Big Ten.
- Grudzielanek posted an 8-2 record in 18 appearances and 12 starts. She finished with a 3.46 ERA and 31 strikeouts in 60.2 innings pitched.

TIME TO BUILD A STADIUM: In March 2024, Northwestern announced plans to construct a new Softball Stadium.

- Construction will break ground on June 1, 2025 with completion anticipated by the start of team’s 2026 home season, meaning NU will not miss a home game there.
- The project will increase the stadium’s seating capacity, create new spaces for the student-athletes (including a team clubhouse, a players’ lounge, a new locker room, centrally located training and team development spaces), a fully renovated press box for TV and radio coverage, and elevated fan experience amenities—such as a new courtyard entrance to accommodate tailgating for fans.
- The lead gift for the project was a \$5 million contribution from former Northwestern basketball player, Kip Kirkpatrick (Class of 1994) and his wife, Sarah.
- The new facility will be named “Kip and Sarah Kirkpatrick Stadium,” while the playing field within the stadium will retain the name “Sharon J. Drysdale Field.”

DARTH NADER: **Kelsey Nader** took home First Team All-Big Ten accolades and was named an NFCA Third Team All-American after being named to the All-Freshman Team as a starter in 2023. In 2024, Nader led the Wildcats in runs scored (41) and tied for the team lead in hits (57).

- Nader finished 2024 with a 1.016 OPS on the season with .586 slugging percentage (.187 increase from 2023) and .430 on-base percentage (.047 increase from 2023).
- Nader’s 35 hits and .473 batting average in conference play trailed only the Big Ten Player of the Year, Jess Oakland, while her 1.261 OPS ranked seventh in the conference and second on the team behind only Robinson (1.320).
- Nader hit her stride last season after conference play started on March 23, raising her batting average from .266 up to .376. She also finished the regular season with a team-leading 37 runs scored and 20 multi-hit games, becoming one of just five Wildcats since 2012 to finished with 20+ multi-hit games in a single season (Skyler Shellmyer, Sabrina Rabin, Emily Allard and Marisa Bast).
- In the Wildcats’ first two games of last year’s Big Ten season, Nader went 5-for-7 with three home runs, 7 RBI and 3 runs scored in a pair of wins over Michigan State. Nader hit more home runs in those two games (3) than she had in 74 career games prior to that (2).

DON’T RUN on EMMA RAYE: **Emma Raye** was one of just three rookies named to the Big Ten’s All-Defensive Team in 2024. It marked the fourth-consecutive season in which a Northwestern catcher has earned Big Ten All-Defensive Team honors, with Jordyn Rudd taking home the honor in each of the last three seasons including a 2022 campaign that saw her win the inaugural Rawlings Gold Glove.

- Raye started every game for the Wildcats in 2024 and all but one at catcher. Raye has caught 13 runners attempting to steal so far this season, which ranked third in the Big Ten and 25th in the nation. As a team, Northwestern allowed the fewest stolen bases in the conference (13, next closest 20) and the lowest stolen base percentage (.520, next closet .645)

2025 NORTHWESTERN SOFTBALL GAME NOTES

BRIDGET'S BREAKOUT: The third member of Northwestern's breakout sophomore class from 2024, **Bridget Donahey** led the team last season with 32 walks (sixth in the Big Ten) and a .450 OBP (11th in the Big Ten).

- After the 2024 season's opening weekend, Bridget Donahey raised her batting average from .111 up to .265, posting a .475 on-base percentage, a .629 slugging percentage, 28 runs scored and a team-leading 28 walks in the last 38 games of the regular season.
- In a weekend series vs. Maryland (April 12-14), Donahey reached base in 6-of-9 plate appearances, walking a team-high four times and scoring a team-high four runs along with a 1.200 SLG%.
- Donahey recorded the first multi-home run game of her career on April 19 at Purdue, going 2-for-2 with a pair of two run homers in a 9-0 run-rule win.
- Donahey led the 'Cats with a .690 slugging percentage in the month of April (13 games).

BOYD IS BACK: Graduate student **Lauren Boyd** returns for Northwestern after missing the 2024 season with an injury.

- In 2023, Boyd went 8-4 with a 2.24 ERA, and her 1.67 mark in Big Ten play ranked third in the conference.

B1G PITCHING: Northwestern's 2.27 team ERA in the 2024 regular season led the Big Ten and ranked 23rd in the nation.

- In conference play, the 'Cats posted a 2.51 ERA – 0.78 points higher than the next closest Big Ten team.

2025 SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS: Northwestern faces one of the nation's toughest schedules, including 11 opponents from the 2024 NCAA Tournament, 5 teams that advanced to the NCAA Super Regionals and 2 WCWS participants.

- 9 of Northwestern's first 14 games were against NCAA Tournament teams.

BIG TEN'S BEST: Northwestern is 65-10 (.867 win%) in Big Ten play since the start of the 2022 season, the highest mark in the conference in that span.

HOME WIN STREAK: Northwestern finally saw a 38-game home winning streak snapped on May 4, 2024 in an 8-3 setback to Indiana in what marked the longest home winning streak in Division I Softball throughout this 2024 season

- During that streak, 12 of the NU's 38 wins were a run-rule, and the 'Cats outscored opponents, 309-102.

AYANA ON THE B1G SCENE: **Ayana Lindsey** hit .288 (15-of-52) with nine RBI and 14 runs scored in 2024 Big Ten play. She boasted a .424 on-base percentage and .866 OPS in 22 games.

- Lindsey hit .500 (5-for-10) with a double, triple and two runs scored during the Ohio State series.
- During the Michigan series, Lindsey reached base in 4-of-9 plate appearances despite not recording a hit, scoring a team-leading four runs to help secure the sweep.
- Lindsey made a diving web gem in the first game doubleheader on April 6, 2024 which appeared as the No. 7 highlight on SportsCenter's Top 10 plays. It marked the second time last season Lindsey appeared on SC Top 10, having also been the No. 3 play on Feb. 9 for a diving catch she made on opening day.

RENAE TURNING HEADS: **Renae Cunningham** went 3-0 with three saves in nine appearances (one start) in Big Ten play last year, posting a 2.63 ERA (8 ER/21.1 IP) and a team-best 0.90 WHIP.

- Cunningham appeared in all four of the Wildcats' 2024 NCAA Regional games in Austin, pitching 9.0 innings and turning in scoreless outings in three of her four appearances, including 3.0 scoreless innings on May 19 against the eventual national runner-up No. 1 seed Texas.
- Cunningham helped lock up the Big Ten title over the final weekend series vs. Indiana, tossing 6.0 innings of relief in a 6-3 win on Friday while allowing just two runs, zero walks and four strikeouts.
- Cunningham hit a pinch hit home run—the first of her career—in the seventh inning of a 9-7 win at Ohio State on Saturday, March 30. She later entered in the bottom of the seventh to earn her first-career save.
- Cunningham homered in just her second-career at-bat, it marked the fastest a Wildcat has homered in their career since Emmie Farnam hit a home run in her first-career AB on March 8, 2020 vs. Oakland.
- Cunningham made her first career start against Weber State and dazzled in the weekend finale. Cunningham allowed just two hits in 5.0 scoreless innings while striking out eight and retiring the final eight batters she faced to earn her career complete game shutout.

WELCOME, IZZY: **Izzy Cunnea** broke onto the scene during her 2024 Rookie Campaign in a home series vs. Michigan, where she was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on April 8 after hitting .375 with an extra-base hit in all three games vs. the Wolverines, including back-to-back games with a home run (first two of her career), for a team-high five RBI and 1.250 slugging% on the weekend.

- Cunnea was the first 'Cat to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week since Kansas Robinson (April 10, 2023).
- A native of the Chicagoland area, Cunnea attended Marist High School and broke Marist's single-season home run record in 2023, hitting 23 to pass Angela Zedak.

SMARTY 'CATS: Northwestern posted a perfect 100% Graduation Success Rate (GSR) last year, the fifth straight year in which the softball program posted a perfect GSR.

- NFCA All-American selection Kelsey Nader is an Industrial Engineering major boasting a 3.57 GPA.
- Last year's Big Ten Pitcher of the Year (current grad assistant) Ashley Miller earned her Master's degree in Management at the prestigious Kellogg School of Business.
