- Taylor Leib and Elle Bissinger each netted their first career goals with Bissinger's coming in the 89th minute.
- Stanford scored with one second left on the clock that ultimately was negated for offsides.

The Harris Effect

- Harris, a freshman, is tied for sixth in the nation with three game-winning goals.
- She leads the Tigers with 10 points (four goals, two assists).
- Of Harris' four goals on the season, three have come before the 10th minute of the match.
- Harris has started all Eight matches this season with the seventh-most minutes played for Clemson (530).
- She is has the most shots taken (18) and has the second-most shots on goal (seven) for the Tigers.

- Clemson finished the 2024-25 recruiting cycle with 11 signees who collectively made up the No. 2 ranked recruiting class according to TopDrawerSoccer. The Tigers also gain Gr. Baleigh Bruster, a Duke transfer.




