#### INSIDE THE GAME

##### PENN STATE MEETS CLEMSON IN BAD BOY MOWERS PINSTRIPE BOWL

- OPENING KICK:** Penn State is set to take on Clemson in the Bad Boy Mowers Pinstripe Bowl on Saturday, December 27 in Yankee Stadium. Kickoff is set for noon on ABC.
- SERIES HISTORY:** Penn State meets Clemson for the second time in program history, previously meeting in the 1988 Citrus Bowl. The Tigers won 35-10 in that bowl game. Penn State's Matt Knizner threw for 148 yards and a touchdown, connecting on a 39-yard pass to Mike Alexander. Leroy Thompson and Gary Brown combined for 106 rushing yards.
- DYNAMIC DUO:** Kaytron Allen, an All-Big Ten first-team selection, continued his strong 2025 campaign with 226 rushing yards and a touchdown at Rutgers, posting the 12th-most rushing yards in a game in program history and the most since Larry Johnson's 279 against Michigan State in 2002. Allen had runs of 55, 43 and 50 yards while becoming the 23rd player in Big Ten history to reach the 4,000 career rushing yards mark. Allen now ranks 18th in Big Ten laurels with 4,180 career rushing yards, while sitting third all-time at Penn State in rushing touchdowns (39) and total touchdowns (43). Nicholas Singleton became Penn State's career leader in rushing touchdowns (45), total touchdowns (55) and all-purpose yards (5,586), topping Saquon Barkley in all three categories. Singleton is tied-7th in Big Ten history in total touchdowns, tied-10th in rushing touchdowns and 12th in all-purpose yards.
- CAMPBELL, DENNIS-SUTTON HIGHLIGHT ALL-BIG TEN DEFENSIVE HONORS:** Junior LB Amare Campbell and senior DE Dani Dennis-Sutton picked up third-team All-Big Ten selections. Campbell leads the Nittany Lions with 96 tackles this season to go with 9.5 tackles for loss and three sacks. He is the only Big Ten player with 90+ tackles and 9.5+ tackles for loss this season. He had a 61-yard fumble return for a touchdown for the go-ahead score at Rutgers. Dennis-Sutton has recorded 38 tackles, 10 tackles for loss, 6.5 sacks, three forced fumbles and three blocked punts this season. He is tied for fifth all-time at PSU with seven forced fumbles and tied for eighth with 21.5 sacks, while tying for the PSU season blocked punts record.
- THE OPPOSITION:** Clemson is 7-5 this season, including a 4-4 mark in ACC play. The Tigers finished the regular season with a 28-14 win over South Carolina. Cade Klubnik threw for 268 yards, including 101 yards to T.J. Moore, and scored on a 3-yard run. On the ground, Adam Randall gained 102 yards and had a 10-yard touchdown. Clemson held South Carolina to 41 rushing yards and forced four takeaways.

# 2 2025 PENN STATE FOOTBALL

## PROGRAM NOTES

### RECENT SUCCESS

Since 2016, Penn State holds a .721 winning percentage, with a record of 93-36, the ninth-best winning percentage among Power Four programs. Penn State has won at least nine games in six of the last eight seasons and has 10 wins in each of the last three seasons.

### ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

A total of 692 of Penn State football student-athletes have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors since 1993 for owning at least a 3.0 grade point average and being a letterwinner.

### ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST HOME VENUES

Penn State owns a superlative 327-85 (.794) record inside Beaver Stadium, the nation's second-largest facility, which opened in 1960 and has a capacity of 106,572. The Nittany Lions are 56-13 in Beaver Stadium since 2016, an .812 winning percentage, the 11th-best home record among Power Four teams.

### COACHING ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- A standout wide receiver at Penn State, Terry M. Smith took over as Interim Head Coach on October 12, 2025.
- Smith has served 12 seasons in as the Nittany Lions' defensive recruiting coordinator and cornerbacks coach, and five as associate head coach.
- The No. 4-ranked recruiter in the Big Ten in 2023 by 247Sports, Smith has helped PSU secure 12-straight top-25 classes, including a top-5 class in 2018, a top-6 class in 2022 and top-15 classes in nine of the last 11 years.
- Smith has played a pivotal role developing seven Penn State cornerback draft picks since 2015, tied for first nationally.
- With new starting corners in 2024, Penn State ranked fourth in the FBS in interceptions, seventh in total defense (294.8), eighth in scoring defense (16.5), 10th in takeaways (26) and 13th in passes defended (72).
- In their first year with the program in 2024, cornerbacks A.J. Harris (third team) and Jalen Kimber (honorable mention) earned All-Big Ten honors.
- He led a cornerback room in 2023 which featured three All-Big Ten honorees in Kalen King (second team), Johnny Dixon (third team) and Daequan Hardy (third team), as Penn State finished second in the country in total defense and seventh in passing defense (172.1).
- Hardy (Bills) and King (Packers) were selected in the NFL Draft, marking the third-straight year PSU has had multiple defensive backs drafted.
- The Nittany Lions finished first nationally in 2022 with 85 pass breakups, and second in defensive pass efficiency and completion percentage.
- Smith tutored a pair of second-team All-Americans in 2022 in Joey Porter Jr. and King, the fourth and fifth All-American corners in program history, who both earned All-Big Ten honors along with Dixon.
- Porter became the highest-drafted Penn State defensive back ever, as he went 32nd overall to the Pittsburgh Steelers in the 2023 NFL Draft.
- King led all Power Five players in passes defended (21) in 2022.
- Penn State's defense allowed just 17.3 points per game in 2021 (6th nationally) and just 11 passing touchdowns (4th).
- The cornerback room had a pair of All-Big Ten honorees in Porter (third team) and Tariq Castro-Fields (honorable mention).
- Both of Penn State's starting cornerbacks, Porter (third team) and Castro-Fields (honorable mention), earned All-Big Ten honors in 2020.
- Penn State allowed just 10 passing touchdowns (T-3rd nationally) and broke up 52 passes (T-23rd) in 2019. The secondary contributed to 11 of PSU's nation's best 22 forced fumbles while John Reid and Castro-Fields earned honorable mention All-Big Ten honors.
- In 2018, PSU's defense finished fifth nationally in yards per pass attempt, eighth in passing efficiency and 15th in passing yards allowed.
- Cornerbacks Amani Oruwariye (first team) and Reid (honorable mention) each earned 2018 All-Big Ten honors.
- The Nittany Lions held three opponents to 60 or less yards in 2018, the first time since 1976 that PSU has held three teams to 60 or less passing yards.
- In addition, Oruwariye collected second-team All-Big Ten honors in 2017 after grabbing a team-high four picks to go with eight pass breakups.
- In 2016, Haley scooped up the blocked field goal attempt and returned it 60 yards for the game-winning touchdown in the win over No. 2 Ohio State. He also made the game-sealing tackle on fourth-and-1 on Wisconsin's final drive of the Big Ten Championship Game.
- Smith's second season saw the secondary rank eighth in the FBS in passing yards allowed (173.5), while cornerbacks Trevor Williams and Haley each earned honorable mention All-Big Ten accolades in 2015.
- In his first year back at Penn State, he developed a secondary that pushed the Nittany Lions to finish No. 2 nationally in pass efficiency defense.
- Smith was the wide receivers coach at Temple in 2013, where the Owls set a school record for passing yards (2,996) and tied the school standard with 23 receiving touchdowns in 2013, with current Miami Dolphin Robby Chosen gaining a school game-record 249 yards.
- A standout player at Gateway High School near Pittsburgh, Smith was a highly successful head coach at his alma mater from 2002-12, compiling a record of 101-30 and posting four WPIAL AAAA runner-up finishes.

- Smith was a three-year starter at wide receiver at Penn State.
- He still dots the Penn State record books, ranking tied for 12th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 16th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 18th in career receptions (108).
- He helped Penn State play in three consecutive bowl games, including wins over BYU in the 1989 Holiday Bowl and Tennessee in the 1991 Fiesta Bowl, compiling an 11-2 record and No. 3 final ranking in the polls.
- Smith's professional career spanned the NFL, Arena Football League and Canadian Football League.
- He was inducted into the WPIAL Hall of Fame in June 2018.



# Head Coach Matt Campbell @CoachMC\_PSU

**Matt Campbell** was named the 17th head coach in the storied history of Penn State Football on December 8, 2025.

Campbell joins Penn State after a decade as Iowa State's head coach, where he leaves the Cyclones as the winningest coach in the program's history. A three-time Big 12 Coach of the Year (2017, 2018, 2020), Campbell led ISU to its only two Top 15 AP Poll finishes ever and coached 18 Cyclone All-Americans. In his coaching career, which also includes stops at Toledo, Bowling Green and Mount Union, he has tutored 39 players who went on to play in the NFL. Campbell is the only coach in Iowa State history to post five-straight winning seasons (2017-21) and owns eight of ISU's nine winning conference seasons in the Big 12 era.

Tied for second-longest tenured active coach in the Big 12 and in program history entering 2025, Campbell led ISU to its first Big 12 regular-season title in 2020 (8-1) and did so again in 2024 (7-2). The Cyclones set the school record for conference wins in 2020 and broke the school record for overall wins in 2024 (11-3). The 2020 season marked the first time in school history ISU ended the conference regular season in sole possession of first place.

Campbell owns 45.2% of ISU's all-time wins over ranked opponents and has 14 victories over ranked foes during his time at Iowa State. His 50 Big 12 wins are the most by a Cyclone head coach versus conference teams and owns 53.32% of ISU's 93 all-time Big 12 wins. In earning 50 Big 12 wins, Campbell joins Bob Stoops, Bill Snyder, Mike Gundy and Mack Brown as the only coaches to do so in conference history.

Among active head coaches since 2016, according to Coaches by the Numbers, Campbell is tied for the fourth-best winning percentage against AP Top 5 opponents (.500; 2-2) and the tied for the fifth-best winning percentage against AP Top 10 opponents (.400; 4-6). He has coached nine All-Americans (T-6th) and three first-team All-Americans (T-8th) during that time.

Offensively since 2016, he ranks third in red zone scoring percentage (87.58%), fifth in completion percentage (63.7%), sixth in passing yards per game (257.3), seventh in passing yards per season (3,272.2) and scoring percentage (39.5%), eighth in QBR (95.7) and 10th in 20+ yard play percentage (7.2%). Defensively, he is third in fewest points allowed in the fourth quarter (4.9), fourth in rushing touchdowns allowed per game (1.0), fifth in rushing touchdowns allowed per season (13.1), sixth in points allowed per second half (10.33) and punt percentage defense (41.8%), and seventh in lowest touchdown percentage defense (22.5%), fewest yards per completion (11.4) and lowest 20+ yard play percentage (5.95%).

As a player, Campbell was a defensive end at Mount Union (1999-2002), where he was an All-American, College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-American and two-time Ohio Athletic Conference Lineman of the Year. During his time with the Purple Raiders, his squad won four conference titles, three NCAA Division III National Championships and went 54-1 in his four-year career. He was inducted into the Mount Union Hall of Fame in 2018 and the CSC Academic All-America Hall of Fame in 2022.

A native of Massillon, Ohio, Campbell graduated from Mount Union in 2002, where he earned a bachelor's degree in history. Campbell and his wife, Erica, have four children, Katie, Izzy, Rudy and Rocco.

- Penn State is 61-29 in the Big Ten since 2016.
- PSU won 13 consecutive games against Big Ten opponents from 2016-17, breaking its record of 12 from 1993-94.
- Penn State owns a 267-138-3 mark against Big Ten Conference teams since the Nittany Lions first opposed Ohio State in 1912.
- The Nittany Lions began play as a member of the Big Ten Conference in 1993 and have a 172-101 mark.
- Penn State played 132 games vs. the current Big Ten alignment when either or both Penn State itself (prior to 1993) or the opponent (Nebraska prior to 2011; Maryland and Rutgers prior to 2014; Oregon, UCLA, USC and Washington prior to 2024) was not yet a member of the Big Ten. The Nittany Lions went 92-37-3 in those games.

## NITTANY LIONS IN THE NFL

- A total of 50 Penn State football alumni are populating the rosters of 26 National Football League teams.
- The Nittany Lions annually are among the top 20 programs nationally in producing players in the NFL. In addition, four former Nittany Lions are members of NFL coaching staffs.
- Penn State is one of three schools to produce at least five picks in each of the last eight NFL drafts and has 59 selections since 2016.
- Seven players from PSU's 2024 squad are on NFL teams.

## LETTERMEN ON STAFF

- Seventeen members of the Penn State coaching staff, support staff and athletic department played at Penn State.
- Interim head coach **Terry M. Smith** was a three-year starter at wide receiver from 1989-91.
- Defensive line coach **Deion Barnes** made 31 starts as a Nittany Lion from 2012-14. In 2014, Barnes tallied 12.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He led PSU with 10 tackles for loss and six sacks in 2012 to earn consensus freshman All-American honors.
- Linebacker coach **Dan Connor** was a two-time first-team All-America linebacker for Penn State in 2006 and 2007, the 14th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American. He finished his career as Penn State's all-time leader with 419 tackles.
- Defensive graduate assistant **Jordan Lucas** was a reliable member of the defensive backfield during his Penn State career, appearing in 46 games (2012-15).
- Assistant quarterbacks coach **Trace McSorley** was a three-time All-Big Ten selection and helped Penn State to a Big Ten Championship in 2016.
- Director of performance science **Andrew Nelson** was a four-year letterwinner on the offensive line for Penn State (2014-17) and appeared in 33 games, making 28 starts.
- Assistant director of performance enhancement **Tyrone Smith** was a defensive tackle for Penn State and lettered during the 2014 season.
- Assistant director of high performance **Dan Vasey** was a defensive end with the Nittany Lions (2017-21).
- Senior defensive analyst **Greg Gattuso** was a defensive lineman at Penn State from 1981-83.

## BOWL NOTES

## PENN STATE EARNS 57TH POSTSEASON APPEARANCE

- Penn State is making its 57th postseason appearance, including bowl and CFP appearances, tied for eighth all-time.
- Penn State's 33 postseason victories (bowl and CFP) are fourth nationally and lead all Big Ten schools.
- The Nittany Lions' 60.9 winning percentage in postseason games (bowl and CFP, 33-21-2 record) is No. 8 nationally among teams with at least 20 bowl appearances.
- Penn State has played in 16 different bowl games and has played in each of the New Year's Six bowls.
- Penn State made its first postseason appearance in 1923 when it traveled across the country to face USC in the Rose Bowl Game to cap off the 1922 season.

## PENN STATE IN THE PINSTRIPE BOWL

- Penn State has played one previous game in the Pinstripe Bowl, earning a 31-30 overtime win in a thrilling game against Boston College in 2014.
- Trailing 21-14 entering the fourth quarter, the Nittany Lions tied the game with 6:48 to go on a 16-yard touchdown pass from Christian Hackenberg to DaeSean Hamilton.
- Boston College re-took the lead with 2:10 remaining on a 20-yard field goal. However, the Nittany Lions answered as Sam Ficken knocked in a 45-yard field goal with 20 seconds left.
- In overtime, the Eagles scored a touchdown on their possession on a 21-yard pass from Tyler Murphy to David Dudek, but missed the extra-point attempt.
- On their possession, the Nittany Lions found the end zone on a 10-yard strike from Hackenberg to Kyle Carter before Ficken hit the game-winning extra-point.
- The Nittany Lions gained 453 total yards, including Hackenberg's 371 yards passing on 34-of-50 attempts.
- Chris Godwin caught seven passes for 140 yards, including a 72-yard score. Eugene Lewis added seven catches for 82 yards and Hamilton had seven grabs for 51 yards.
- Penn State defensive line coach **Deion Barnes**, defensive graduate assistant **Jordan Lucas** and director of performance science **Andrew Nelson** all played in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.

## PENN STATE IN DECEMBER POSTSEASON GAMES

- Penn State has played in December bowl games on 21 occasions and owns a 15-6-1 record in the month.
- This is Penn State's third time playing on December 27.

## BOWL/CFP HISTORY VS. ACC

- Penn State has a 5-3-2 record in 10 previous bowl/CFP games against current ACC teams, including one matchup against Clemson (L, 1988 Citrus Bowl).
- The Nittany Lions earned a 38-10 win over SMU in the first round of the College Football Playoff in 2025 to improve to 1-0-1 in postseason games against the Mustangs. The teams also met in the 1948 Cotton Bowl (T, 13-13).
- Penn State has met Florida State in three bowl games, the 1962 Gator Bowl (T, 17-17), the 1990 Blockbuster Bowl (L, 17-24) and the 2006 Orange Bowl (W, 26-23, 3 OT).
- The Nittany Lions have played in one bowl each against Boston College (W, 2014 Pinstripe Bowl), Georgia Tech (W, 1961 Gator Bowl), Miami (W, 1987 Fiesta Bowl) and Stanford (L, 1993 Blockbuster Bowl).

## PENN STATE VS. CLEMSON

- Penn State and Clemson are set to battle for the second time in program history.
- The Tigers claimed a 35-10 win over the Nittany Lions in the 1988 Citrus Bowl.
- Clemson rushed for 285 yards and quarterback Danny Williams threw for 214 in that game.
- The Nittany Lions, playing without leading rusher Blair Thomas sidelined due to injury, tallied 305 total yards.

- Freshmen running backs Leroy Thompson and Gary Brown combined for 106 yards.
- Matt Knizner threw for 148 yards, including a 39-yard strike to Mike Alexander.
- Linebacker Trey Bauer was PSU's defensive MVP with six tackles, three tackles for loss and a sack.

## AMONG TOP PROGRAMS SINCE 2016

- Penn State and Clemson have been among college football's most accomplished teams since 2016.
- The Nittany Lions own 93 wins since 2016, ranking ninth among FBS teams, while Clemson has 112 wins, sitting fourth.
- Penn State has a .721 win percentage, holding 10th in the FBS, while Clemson owns a .818 winning percentage, good for fourth.
- In home games, Penn State has a 56-13 record and a .817 win percentage, good for 11th among Power 4 schools, while Clemson has a 59-9 record and .868 win percentage, holding sixth.
- Penn State has played in eight New Year's Six/CFP games since 2016 with a 5-3 record and Clemson has played in 10 with a 5-5 mark.

## ALL-AMERICANS

- Redshirt junior OL **Olavavega Ioane** and senior RB **Kaytron Allen** became the 158th and 159th Nittany Lions to be selected as an All-American by an NCAA-recognized outlet (Associated Press, AFCA, FWAA, The Sporting News, Walter Camp Football Foundation).
- Penn State has had an All-American in 53 of the last 59 years. The Nittany Lions have an All-American in each of the last five seasons.
- Ioane was named a second-team All-American by the Associated Press, FWAA and the Walter Camp Football Foundation.
- He was selected a first-team All-American by CBS Sports and On3 and second-team by The Athletic and Sports Illustrated.
- Allen was tabbed a second-team All-American by the AFCA and a third-team All-American by the Associated Press.
- He garnered second-team All-American honors by On3.

# 10 2025 PENN STATE FOOTBALL

## 1988 CITRUS: January 1, 1988

Clemson successfully blended the expected with the unexpected to post a 35-10 conquest of Penn State in the 1988 Florida Citrus Bowl, the first-ever meeting between the two schools. The Tigers rushed for 285 yards and quarterback Danny Williams threw for an uncharacteristic 214 yards (15-of-24) in the Nittany Lions' first appearance in Orlando.

The Lions played without leading rusher and receiver Blair Thomas, who suffered a serious knee injury in an early December practice which would sideline him for the 1988 season. He had rushed for 1,414 yards and 11 touchdowns in 1987. Freshmen Leroy Thompson and Gary Brown posted 106 yards from the tailback position in Thomas' absence. Thompson, who rushed for 55 yards and added 146 more on pass receptions (19) and kickoff returns (127), was voted the Lions' offensive MVP with 201 all-purpose yards.

Penn State's touchdown came on a perfect 39-yard pass from Matt Knizner to Mike Alexander that tied the issue at 7-7 in the second quarter. The Tigers led 14-7 at halftime but, Penn State cut it to 14-10 on a 27-yard field goal by Eric Etze early in the third stanza. Clemson responded with a TD and added two more scores in the fourth period to hand the Lions their worst bowl loss.

Senior linebacker Trey Bauer, who had six stops, three tackles for losses and a quarterback sack, was Penn State's defensive MVP.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- The Nittany Lions had 42 players selected as Academic All-Big Ten in Fall 2025.
- Olumuyiwa Fashanu** was a finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman", and an National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete. He was the 20th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2024, Penn State posted a program-record 93% graduation success rate. The 93% mark tops the previous high GSR of 91% set in 2005 and is just the second time in program history topping 90%. PSU's 85% in 2025 is the 16th consecutive year the football team has surpassed the national average GSR for its sport.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increased Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).

TEAM NOTES

DUZANSKY AMONG MANNELLY FINALISTS

- Redshirt senior LS **Tyler Duzansky** was named as one of three Patrick Mannelly Award finalists on December 1.
- Serving as a team captain in 2025, Duzansky has appeared in 49 games at Penn State, including the last 41 games as PSU's primary long snapper.
- Duzansky earned All-Big Ten third team honors in 2024 and All-Big Ten honorable mention in 2025.
- He was an Academic All-Big Ten honoree in 2023, 2024 and 2025.
- In 2025, he has helped **Ryan Barker** to go 15-of-16 on field goal attempts and 43-of-44 on extra-point attempts.
- He has also aided **Gabriel Nwosu** to average 46.11 yards per punt, currently the best punt average in a season in program history, while landing 14 punts inside the 20, seven inside the 10 and blasting 10 punts of 50+ yards.

STREAKING

- Penn State has not allowed a special teams touchdown in 89-straight games, dating back to the start of the 2019 season.
- Penn State has won 25-consecutive games over non-conference opponents during the regular season, dating back to a win over Temple in 2016.
- Penn State has won 31-straight non-conference home games, dating back to a win over Kent State in 2013.

RUTGERS NOTES

- Penn State is now 33-2 all-time against Rutgers, including an 9-0 mark in road games.
- According to Big Ten Network, since 2015, only 9 percent of teams who started a season 3-6 have finished 6-6.
- The Nittany Lions gained 300 rushing yards in a game for the first time since September 21, 2024 vs. Kent State (309) and the first time in a Big Ten game since November 24, 2018 vs. Maryland (310).
- The Nittany Lions had four rushes of 40+ yards (55 by **Kaytron Allen**, 53 by **Nicholas Singleton**, 43 by Allen, 50 by Allen).
- Allen's 226 yards are PSU's most in a game since Larry Johnson's 279 against Michigan State in 2002. His 226 rushing yards are the 12th-most in a game in program history.
- Allen is the first Nittany Lion with 200+ rushing yards in a game since Journey Brown's 202 vs. Memphis in the 2019 Cotton Bowl.
- On a 55-yard run in the first quarter, Allen became the 23rd Big Ten player to reach the 4,000 career rushing yards mark.
- Allen is the first Nittany Lion with four 100-yard rushing games in Big Ten play since Miles Sanders in 2018 (200 at Illinois, 162 vs. Michigan State, 159 at Wisconsin, 128 vs. Maryland).
- Singleton scored on an 11-yard run in the first quarter. With that run, Singleton broke Penn State career records for rushing touchdowns (44) and total touchdowns (54), passing Saquon Barkley (43 rushing touchdowns, 53 total touchdowns; 2015-17).
- On a 14-yard reception in the third quarter, Singleton broke the all-time career all-purpose yards record at Penn State, passing Barkley (5,538; 2015-17).
- With two receptions on Saturday, Singleton now has 102 career receptions. He tied Barkley (102; 2015-17) for the Penn State running backs record and is tied with Barkley for 20th in career receptions by any player at PSU.
- LB **Amare Campbell** picked up a fumble and returned it 61 yards for a touchdown. It was Penn State's first fumble return for a touchdown since Kobe King (14 yards) and Ji' Ayir Brown (70 yards) against Rutgers in 2022.

NEBRASKA NOTES

- Penn State is now 9-10 all-time against Nebraska.
- Interim head coach **Terry Smith** became the fifth Penn State coach to win a game at West Shore Home Field at Beaver Stadium since it opened in 1960.
- QB **Ethan Grunkemeyer** completed 11-of-12 passes, becoming the first Penn State quarterback to complete 90% of their passes on 10+ attempts in a game since Todd Blackledge was 10-of-11 at Syracuse in 1981.

- On a 3-yard rush in the fourth quarter, RB **Kaytron Allen** became the all-time career rushing yards leader at Penn State, passing Evan Royster (3,932; 2007-10). Allen (3,954 career rushing yards) also moved past Saquon Barkley (3,843; 2015-17).
- On his second rushing touchdown, Singleton earned his 43rd career rushing touchdown, tying Barkley (43; 2015-17) for the Penn State all-time record, and earned his 53rd career total touchdown (43 rushing, 9 receiving, 1 kick return), tying Barkley (53; 2015-17) for the all-time mark at Penn State.
- On a reception in the third quarter, Singleton notched his 100th career reception. He became the 21st Nittany Lion and second running back (joining Barkley) to reach 100 career receptions.
- Penn State earned five fourth-down stops in the game and now has 14 this season.

MICHIGAN STATE NOTES

- Penn State is now 20-18-1 all-time against Michigan State, including 8-11 in road matchups.
- The Nittany Lions are 19-10 in Land Grant Trophy games.
- Terry Smith** earned his first win as Penn State Interim Head Coach.
- Penn State rushed for 240 yards on 50 carries. The Nittany Lions rushed for 240+ yards in a game for the first time since December 7, 2024 against Oregon.
- QB **Ethan Grunkemeyer** connected with WR **Devonte Ross** on a 75-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter. It was Penn State's longest completion since Drew Allar to Tyler Warren for 75 yards in the 2023 Peach Bowl vs. Ole Miss and Penn State's longest touchdown pass since Sean Clifford to KeAndre Lambert-Smith for 88 yards in the 2023 Rose Bowl vs. Utah.
- RB **Kaytron Allen** finished the game with a career-high 181 yards and two touchdowns on 25 carries, averaging 7.2 yards per rush. Allen was the first Nittany Lion to rush for 180+ yards since Journey Brown rushed for 202 yards against Memphis in the 2019 Cotton Bowl. Allen was named Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week.
- Penn State shutout Michigan State in the second half. It was PSU's first second-half shutout in a Big Ten game since November 30, 2024 vs. Maryland.
- DE **Dani Dennis-Sutton** recorded two sacks to earn Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors.
- Dennis-Sutton also blocked a punt in the second quarter. It was his third blocked punt this season and Penn State's fourth blocked punt of the year. The Nittany Lions have four blocked punts in a season for the first time since 1999 (4).
- With his third blocked punt this season, Dennis-Sutton tied Jack Ham (3; 1968) and Andre Collins (3; 1989) for the PSU season record.
- Penn State has five blocked kicks (four punts, one field goal) in a season for the first time since 2004 (7; two punts, five field goals).

INDIANA NOTES

- Penn State is now 25-3 all-time against Indiana, including 13-1 in home matchups.
- The Nittany Lions are 8-27 all-time against teams ranked Top 2 in the AP Poll.
- On his ninth carry of the day, RB **Kaytron Allen** became the career rushing attempts leader at Penn State, passing Evan Royster (686; 2007-10).
- RB **Nicholas Singleton** tallied 143 all-purpose yards (71 rushing, 22 receiving, 50 kick return) and scored three touchdowns (two rushing, one receiving).

## TEAM NOTES

- The Nittany Lions tallied 24 points and 336 total yards against Indiana. The Hoosiers entered the game allowing 10.8 ppg (3rd in FBS) and 248.3 ypg (3rd in FBS).
- Penn State held Indiana to 326 total yards after the Hoosiers entered the game averaging 504.9 yards per game.
- PSU also limited the Hoosiers to 5-of-12 on third down (41.7 percent) after Indiana entered the game leading the country with a 58.2 conversion rate.

### OHIO STATE NOTES

- Penn State is now 14-27 all-time against Ohio State, including 7-16 in road matchups.
- The Nittany Lions are 4-14 all-time against teams ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll.
- Penn State scored a touchdown on a 15-play, 75-yard drive in the second quarter. It was the first first-half touchdown given up by Ohio State this season. The 15-play, 75-yard drive covered 7:50, was PSU's second longest by time, behind 8:21 against Iowa, and tied-second longest by plays.
- In the second quarter, DE **Dani Dennis-Sutton** forced a fumble, which was recovered by DE **Chaz Coleman** and returned 8 yards to the OSU 14.
- P **Gabriel Nwosu** averaged 49.8 yards per punt on six punts, landing two inside the 20 and hitting three 50+ yard punts.

### IOWA NOTES

- Penn State is now 18-15 all-time against Iowa.
- The Nittany Lions are 10-7 in road matchups against the Hawkeyes.
- **Terry M. Smith** coached his first game as Penn State Interim Head Coach.
- RB **Kaytron Allen** rushed for a career-high 145 yards and two touchdowns on 28 carries. It was his first career game with 100+ rushing yards and multiple rushing touchdowns.
- Penn State held Iowa to 11 first downs. The Nittany Lions matched their season low for first downs allowed (11 against Villanova) and posted its lowest first downs allowed total since November 24, 2023 against Michigan State (5).
- In the second quarter, **Xavier Gilliam** blocked a field goal, which was returned 35 yards for a touchdown by Elliot Washington II. It was Penn State's first blocked field goal returned for a touchdown since Grant Haley (60 yards) against Ohio State in 2016.
- It was Penn State's first blocked field goal since Arnold Ebiketie against Indiana in 2021.

### NORTHWESTERN NOTES

- Penn State is now 16-6 all-time against Northwestern.
- The Nittany Lions are 75-25-5 in homecoming games.
- WR **Devonte Ross** finished the game with seven receptions for 115 yards. It was his fifth career 100-yard receiving game and first as a Nittany Lion.
- CB **Audavion Collins** recovered a muffed punt in the second quarter.
- DT **Zane Durant** finished the game with a career-high eight stops. Durant recorded a solo sack in the first quarter.
- DE **Dani Dennis-Sutton** blocked a punt in the first quarter. It was his second blocked punt and Penn State's third blocked punt this season. Penn State has three blocked punts in a season for the first time since 2019 (2 vs. Idaho; 1 vs. Buffalo; 1 at Michigan State).
- Dennis-Sutton became Penn State's first Nittany Lion with a blocked punt in back-to-back games (at UCLA, vs. Northwestern) since Andre Collins in 1989 (at Texas, at Rutgers).
- P **Gabriel Nwosu** landed two punts inside the 10.

### UCLA NOTES

- Penn State is now 3-5 all-time against UCLA and 1-3 in road matchups.
- Penn State snapped a streak of 34-straight wins against teams unranked in the AP Poll.
- Penn State blocked a punt in the third quarter and returned it for a touchdown on a block by DE **Dani Dennis-Sutton** and a scoop-and-score by WR **Liam Clifford**.

- It was Penn State's first punt block for a touchdown since a block by Mike Hull and a touchdown recovery by Michael Yancich against Ohio State in 2012.
- Dennis-Sutton's blocked punt was Penn State's second this season, joining LB **Dominic DeLuca's** blocked punt against FIU.
- Penn State has two blocked punts in a season for the first time since 2021 (at Wisconsin, at Indiana).

### OREGON NOTES

- Penn State is now 3-3 all-time against Oregon.
- PSU is now 9-8 in overtime games, falling in OT for the first time since a 20-18 loss to Illinois in nine overtimes in 2021.
- Penn State is now 2-4 in multiple-overtime games.
- Penn State welcomed 111,015 fans, its largest Penn State White Out attendance and second-largest crowd in West Shore Home Field at Beaver Stadium history.
- The Nittany Lions are 11-7 all-time in full-stadium White Outs.
- WR **Devonte Ross** hauled in a 35-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter, followed by a 7-yard touchdown grab late in the fourth quarter, marking his third career game with multiple receiving touchdowns.
- LB **Amare Campbell** recorded 11 tackles in the first half and finished the game with a career-high 15 stops.
- Campbell's 15 tackles are Penn State's most since **Zakee Wheatley's** 16 stops against Notre Dame in the 2025 Orange Bowl.
- K **Ryan Barker** hit a 49-yard field goal, matching a career long.

### VILLANOVA NOTES

- QB **Ethan Grunkemeyer** and Joey Schlawfer (19-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter) became the first Penn State teammates to combine on their first career touchdown pass and first career reception as a touchdown reception since **Drew Allar** and Omari Evans against Ohio in 2022.
- Penn State held opponents scoreless for seven-straight quarters until Villanova's touchdown as time expired. This marked the first time since 2019 that the Nittany Lions have shut out an opponent for seven consecutive quarters.
- CB **Jahmir Joseph** picked off a pass in the fourth quarter and returned it 49 yards for a touchdown. He is the first Nittany Lion with an interception return for a touchdown this season and the first Nittany Lion with an interception return for a touchdown since Dominic DeLuca (23 yards) and Tony Rojas (59 yards) against SMU in 2024.

### FIU NOTES

- Penn State has outscored FIU, 93-0, in two all-time matchups.
- RB **Kaytron Allen's** 144 rushing yards rushing moved him to 3,064 for his career, while RB **Nicholas Singleton's** 76 rushing yards moved him to 3,007 career rushing yards. They became the first Penn State teammates with 3,000 career rushing yards at the same time.
- Allen and Singleton are the first FBS teammates with 3,000 career rushing yards at the same time since Louisiana's Trey Ragas and Elijah Mitchell in 2020 and the first Power 4 teammates since Georgia's Nick Chubb and Sony Michel in 2017.
- Penn State has shut out an opponent in each of the last five seasons. The last time Penn State recorded a shutout in five-straight seasons was 1972-76.
- DT **Alonzo Ford Jr.** intercepted a pass in the second quarter, joining **Zane Durant** (vs. Nevada) as Penn State defensive tackles with interceptions this season. The Nittany Lions have interceptions by multiple defensive tackles in a season for the first time since 1990 (Jim Deter vs. Notre Dame; Frank Giannetti vs. Alabama).
- LB **Dominic DeLuca** blocked a punt in the second quarter. It was his third career blocked punt.

### NEVADA NOTES

- The Nittany Lions have won 21 of its last 24 season-opening contests and nine of its last 10. Penn State is 115-22-2 all-time in season openers and 122-13-1 all-time in home openers.
- The 46 points scored by Penn State marked the most points scored by the Nittany Lions in a season opener since notching 79 against Idaho in 2019.
- Penn State scored on its first nine possessions of the game and of the season, alternating touchdowns and field goals (5 TD, 4 FG).

TEAM NOTES

- Penn State scored on its first nine possessions to open the season for the first time since at least 1952.
- In the fourth quarter, Penn State scored a touchdown on a 15-play, 94-yard drive, the longest drive by the Nittany Lions in terms of yards since a 97-yard drive against Oregon in last season's Big Ten Championship Game.
- Penn State forced a takeaway on Nevada's opening drive. DE **Dani Dennis-Sutton** forced a fumble, which was recovered by **CB A.J. Harris**.
- Penn State had a takeaway on its first defensive possession of the season for the first time since 1994 vs. Minnesota (Terry Killens recovered).
- Dennis-Sutton recorded his first career game with two forced fumbles. He is the first Nittany Lion with two forced fumbles in a game since Micah Parsons in the 2019 Cotton Bowl against Memphis.

LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

- Penn State battled Oregon at 7:30 p.m. on NBC on September 27, took on Iowa on October 18 and faced Nebraska on NBC on November 22. The 2025 season marks the 25th-straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule.
- Penn State is 67-37 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 24-12 at home, 30-16 on the road and 13-9 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-7 in bowl games and 1-1 in conference championship games.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the then-longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

PENN STATE WHITE OUT

- A tradition stretching back to a student section White Out in 2004, Penn State White Outs have created an unrivaled atmosphere inside Beaver Stadium.
- Penn State's CFP First Round game vs. SMU marked the 17th time the Nittany Lions hosted a full-stadium Penn State White Out.
- Penn State holds a 11-7 record when the full stadium wears white.
- Six of Penn State's Top 10 most-attended games have been White Outs, including 111,015 fans against Oregon in 2025, which ranks second all-time.
- Penn State's first full-stadium White Out was against Notre Dame in 2007.

ON TV

- Penn State has had 386 of its last 388 games televised, including 284 consecutive games.
- Over the last 21 seasons, every Penn State game has aired on ABC, BTN, CBS, NBC, Peacock or an ESPN or FOX channel.
- Penn State has made 363 regular season TV appearances since 1995.
- The Nittany Lions averaged 4.59 million viewers in 2024.

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 17 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Eleven of the 17 overtime tilts have come at home, four in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 9-8 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-6 record at Beaver Stadium, 2-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 in contests at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.




