10:00-10:15	Director's Update	<ul> <li>Shelly Baldwin, WTSC</li> <li>2023 was the deadliest year since 1981 and serious injuries have also increased.</li> <li>WTSC received \$300,000 from the legislature to receive telematics data.</li> <li>WTSC also received the GHSA Michelin grant (\$100,00) for telematics data and we got a GHSA Distracted Driving grant overseen by Janine Koffel.</li> <li>Representative Goodman shared the building momentum around .05 and he believes it will pass next year.</li> </ul>
