Dear Block Club Commission:

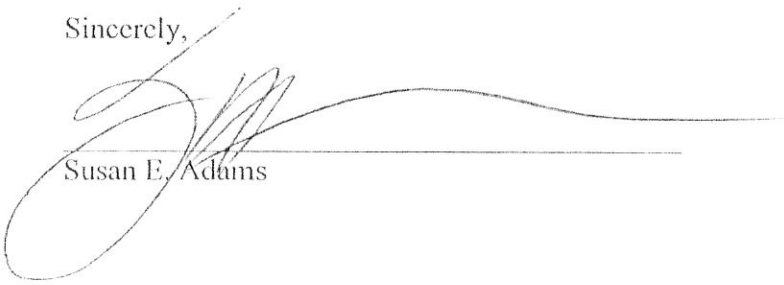
It is with my deepest regret that I submit a resignation letter to the City of Compton's Mayor and Councilmember's Office, the Block Club Commission and City Staff.

SUBJECT: **REQUEST TO HIRE LEGAL COUNSEL FOR LEGAL OPINION**

SUMMARY

Councilmember Galvan requested that the City Council consider hiring an independent Counsel to advise and represent City Council members on general matters on an as needed basis.

BACKGROUND

On September 1, 2015, City Council considered an item on the agenda to hire independent Counsel to advise and represent City Council members on an as needed basis. At the meeting, the City Attorney stated that the proposal is not permitted by the City Charter as well as current court case law. The request was subsequently voted down with a request from Councilmembers to receive a second opinion from another attorney regarding the validity of the City Attorney's opinion.

STATEMENT OF THE ISSUE

In an effort to select a law firm to review the City Attorney's Opinion, attached are three law firms that specialize in municipal law representation. These law firms are not currently representing the City of Compton on any matter and have not requested to do business with the City of Compton. The name of the firms are Renne Sloan Holtzman Sakai LLP, Hensley Law Group and Jenkins & Hogin.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

An estimated cost for the legal opinion is \$5,000.00 which funds are available in the City Attorney's 2015 - 2016 FY Budget.

SUMMARY

Adoption of this resolution will amend the 2015-2016 Fiscal Year budget to move unexpended funds from prior years to the current budget, authorize the City Manager to accept the bid of and enter into a contract with BMI Consulting Group, Inc. (BMI”) to purchase and install a pool slide at the Lueders Park - William Love Pool, located at 1500 East Rosecrans Boulevard, Compton.

BACKGROUND

The Parks and Recreation Department is responsible for the daily management and operation of the Lueders Park – William Love Pool. The William Love Pool operates during the summer months of May thru September and offers a variety of youth and adult aquatic classes. The William Love Pool includes a competition swimming pool and a single tube pool slide.

In the spring of 2012, several improvements were made to the William Love Pool including: installation of an ADA chair, installation of new pool lights, chemical feeding pumps, and acid washing of pool surface. The pool slide was identified as an alternative replacement option, but due to limited funding the slide was not replaced. The pool slide is roughly over twenty years old and due to normal wear and tear to the slide and extensive rust that is deteriorating the slides support structure, its needs to be replaced.

STATEMENT OF ISSUE

On Wednesday, June 17, 2015, a Notice Inviting Bids was released and advertised in the Compton Bulletin, City’s website and on bidclerk.com. to provide construction services for the procurement and installation of the William Love Pool Slide Project. On June 24, 2015, the pre-bid meeting was held in which four (4) pool construction companies (BMI Consulting, Nadar, California Commercial Pools, and Knorr Pool

Systems) were present. On Wednesday, July 22, 2015, the City Clerk received one (1) only bid from BMI in the amount of Eighty Eight Thousand Four Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$88,450.00). Staff reviewed the proposal/bid submitted by BMI and found it to be responsive to the needs of the City as concerns this project and for a reasonable price and thus, are recommending that the Council accept the bid and authorize awarding the contract to BMI.

WHEREAS, on June 17, 2015, a Notice Inviting Bids was released and advertised in the Compton Bulletin, City’s website and on bidclerk.com. to provide construction services for the procurement and installation of the William Love Pool Slide Project; and

WHEREAS, while four (4) pool construction companies attended the pre-bid meeting, July 22, 2015, the City received one (1) only bid from BMI in the amount of Eighty Eight Thousand Four Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$88,450.00) which staff reviewed and found the proposal/bid to be responsive to the needs of the City as concerns this project and for a reasonable price and thus, are recommending that the Council accept the bid and authorize awarding the contract to BMI; and

SUMMARY

The City Council of the City of Compton ("Council") have requested that an ordinance be brought forth for Council consideration and approval that will delete Section 2-28 of Chapter 2 of the Compton Municipal Code ("CMC"), which established the City of Compton Housing Development Commission ("Commission"), in its entirety so as to dissolve the Compton Housing Development Commission.

BACKGROUND

On January 19, 1999, the Council adopted Ordinance No. 2,018 (codified at Section 2-28 of the Compton Municipal Code), which created and established the Compton Housing Development Commission as the governing body of all Housing Development issues, including but not limited to land acquisition and assimilation for the construction of new housing; subsidized public housing security; and United States Housing and Urban Development Department ("HUD") owned land transfers and acquisitions.

Section 2-28.2 of the CMC provides that the Commission shall have five (5) members and delegated the Mayor and Council as the members of the Commission.

STATEMENT OF ISSUE

Pursuant to request of the Council, staff has reviewed the various other legislative bodies created over the years by the Council upon which the City Council members serve as the governing body of such legislative bodies, which has revealed that the scope of duties of the Housing Development Commission has significantly lessen since its creation. Thus, it is recommended that the Compton Housing Development Commission be dissolved. This action will maximize the limited time and resources of the City Council members and administrative staff in conducting the business of the City.

WHEREAS, on January 19, 1999, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 2,018 (codified at Section 2-28 of the Compton Municipal Code), which created and established the Compton Housing Development Commission as the governing body of all Housing Development issues, including but not limited to land acquisition and assimilation for the construction of new housing; subsidized public housing security; and United States Housing and Urban Development Department (“HUD”) owned land transfers and acquisitions; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2-28.2 of the Compton Municipal Code, the Commission shall have five (5) members and delegated the Mayor and Council as the members of the Commission; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the request of the Council, staff has reviewed the various legislative bodies created over the years by the Council upon which the City Council members serve as the governing body of such legislative bodies, which has revealed that the scope of duties of the Housing Development Commission has significantly lessen since its creation, thus, to maximize the limited time and resources of the City Council members and administrative staff in conducting the business of the City, the Council desires to dissolve the Compton Housing Development Commission.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE COMPTON DOES
HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. That Section 2-28 (Housing Development Commission) of Chapter II of the Compton Municipal Code is hereby deleted in its entirety.

Section 2. The City Council declares that, should any provision, section, paragraph, sentence or word of this Ordinance hereby adopted be rendered or declared invalid by any final court action in a court of competent jurisdiction, or by reason of any preemptive legislation, the remaining provisions, sections, paragraphs, sentences or words of this Ordinance hereby adopted shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. That a copy of this Ordinance shall be filed in the offices of the City Clerk, City Manager, City Attorney and City Controller.

Section 4. That this Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption.

Section 5. That the Mayor shall sign and the City Clerk shall attest to the adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause the same to be published as required by law.

SUMMARY

The City Council of the City of Compton ("Council") have requested that an ordinance be brought forth for Council consideration and approval that will delete Section 2-21 of Chapter 2 of the Compton Municipal Code ("CMC"), which established the City of Compton Gaming Commission ("Commission"), in its entirety so as to dissolve the Compton Gaming Commission.

BACKGROUND

On September 28, 1993, the Council adopted Ordinance No. 1,905 (codified at Section 2-21 of the Compton Municipal Code), which created and established the Compton Gaming Commission as the governing body for the regular review of each bingo and card club license and permit, in addition to conducting public hearings in connection with such reviews, to assess compliance with conditions of the licenses and permits and compatibility of the operation(s) within the community. This Commission is also the designated legislative body to receive and process information from individuals and/or groups relating to gaming in the City of the operation of any particular card club or bingo game and carry out other functions delegated to it by the Council.

Section 2-21.2 of the CMC provides that the City Council members are authorized to serve as the Compton Gaming Commission.

STATEMENT OF ISSUE

Pursuant to request of the Council, staff has reviewed the various legislative bodies created over the years by the Council upon which the City Council members serve as the governing body of such legislative bodies.

Licenses and permits for the operation of bingo games and card club, by law may only be granted by the City Council. Staff has identified that bingo and card club license and permit reviews and other associated issues may be brought forth on Council meeting agendas, thus, to maximize the limited time and resources of

the City Council members and administrative staff in conducting the business of the City, it is recommended that the Compton Gaming Commission be dissolved and the duties and matters currently delegated to the Commission be retained by the Council.

ALTERNATIVE

None presented. To maximize the limited time and resources of the City Council members and administrative staff in conducting the business of the City of Compton, the Commission should be dissolved.

FISCAL IMPACT

Potential savings to the City's General Fund since the Gaming Commission will be dissolved, savings use of staff resources and eliminating the compensation that would be paid to the Chairperson and other Commissioners.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council adopt the attached Ordinance.

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COMPTON
AMENDING CHAPTER II OF THE COMPTON MUNICIPAL CODE TO

WHEREAS, the Gaming Commission is also the designated legislative body to receive and process information from individuals and/or groups relating to gaming in the City of the operation of any particular card club or bingo game and carry out other functions delegated to it by the City Council.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2-21.2 of the Compton Municipal Code, the City Council members are authorized to serve as the Compton Gaming Commission; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to request of the Council, staff has reviewed the various legislative bodies created over the years by the Council upon which the City Council members serve as the governing body of such legislative bodies; and

WHEREAS, staff has identified that bingo and card club license and permit reviews and other associated issues may be brought forth on Council meeting agendas, thus, to maximize the limited time and resources of the City Council members and administrative staff in conducting the business of the City, the Council desires to dissolve the Compton Gaming Commission and retain the duties and responsibilities currently delegated to the Commission.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE COMPTON DOES
HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. That Section 2-21 (Gaming Commission) of Chapter II of the Compton Municipal Code is hereby deleted in its entirety.

Section 2. The City Council declares that, should any provision, section, paragraph, sentence or word of this Ordinance hereby adopted be rendered or declared invalid by any final court action in a court of competent jurisdiction, or by reason of any preemptive legislation, the remaining provisions, sections, paragraphs, sentences or words of this Ordinance hereby adopted shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. That a copy of this Ordinance shall be filed in the offices of the City Clerk, City Manager, City Attorney, City Treasurer and City Controller.

Section 4. That this Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption.

Section 5. That the Mayor shall sign and the City Clerk shall attest to the adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause the same to be published as required by law.

The Department of Finance (Finance) is in receipt of your October 16, 2014 correspondence detailing the City of Compton's proposal for paying the \$5,872,173 that the City owes to the affected taxing entities pursuant to the Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund Due Diligence Review performed in accordance with Health and Safety Code section 34179.6. While the City was initially determined to owe \$6,159,729, Finance has confirmed with the Los Angeles County Auditor-Controller that the City has paid \$287,556 of the owed sum.

The City's plan proposes to pay \$5,328,000 to the County Auditor-Controller over a five-year period, as follows:

- \$700,000 on August 1, 2014 ✓
- \$1,000,000 on August 1, 2015
- \$1,000,000 on August 1, 2016
- \$1,300,000 on August 1, 2017
- \$1,328,000 on August 1, 2018

The City's plan further states a remaining \$544,173 will be paid to the County Auditor-Controller over the course of the five years, for a total remittance of \$5,872,173.

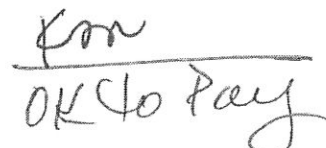
Finance is pleased to accept the City's proposed payment plan. We do note, however, that our acceptance of your payment plan does not mean that Finance will approve requests for the City or the Successor Agency to reimburse themselves for the payments via the Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule process.

When the City has remitted the entirety of the \$5,872,173 to the Los Angeles County Auditor-Controller's Office, Finance will issue a Finding of Completion to the Successor Agency.
