PUBLIC COMMENTS ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS

Lynn Boone, Compton resident, inquired about the citizen's ability to redress the Sheriff's Department, as it relates to those issues involving complaints or homicides. Ms. Boone stated that she's noticed three different law enforcement agencies simultaneously patrolling the city and thereby, requested the identity of the law enforcement agency hired to protect the citizens of Compton.

Joyce Kelly, Compton resident, stated that she has continued to request the same information related to the First Time Homebuyers Program, the Residential Rehabilitation program and the Section 8 Assistance Housing program on behalf of the citizens. Ms. Kelly asked that the Director of the Community Redevelopment Agency be ordered to address the citizens with the funding opportunities available in these programs.

COMMISSION COMMENTS

Commissioner Calhoun stated that National Awareness for Justice and Equality Association (NAJEA) meetings are conducted every month and announced in the Compton Bulletin, as well as on the dais. Ms. Calhoun informed Ms. Boone that the black and white vehicles traveling throughout the city's streets are school police officers. Ms. Calhoun acknowledged the presence of the Highway Patrol on the city's streets and clarified that these officers are authorized to travel anywhere their pursuits take them. Ms. Calhoun also noted that they have been very instrumental in tracking and citing the excessive commercial vehicle traffic coming off of the freeway and traveling throughout the City of Compton.

Chairperson Pro-Tem Arceneaux stated that the majority of the city's events, updates and proposed developments are aired on Channel 36.

Commissioner Calhoun also clarified that the Commission commonly refer citizens with complaints to the Lieutenant or the Deputy in attendance, simply because the Commission does not have the access or the authority to obtain any privileged information associated with a crime or homicide.
