

### **HEARING EXAMINER'S RULING**

## January 31, 2025

On December 13, 2024, Virginia Electric and Power Company ("Dominion" or "Company") made a filing pursuant to § 56-585.1 A 5 of the Code of Virginia ("Code"); the Rules Governing Utility Rate Applications and Annual Informational Filings of Investor-Owned Electric Utilities<sup>1</sup> of the State Corporation Commission ("Commission"); the Commission's Rules Governing Utility Promotional Allowances;<sup>2</sup> the Commission's Rules Governing Cost/Benefit Measures Required for Demand-Side Management Programs;<sup>3</sup> the Commission's Rules Governing the Evaluation, Measurement, and Verification of the Effects of Utility-Sponsored Demand-Side Management Programs;<sup>4</sup> and the directive contained in Ordering Paragraph (4) of the Commission's July 26, 2024 Final Order in Case No. PUR-2023-00217.5 Specifically, Dominion filed with the Commission an application requesting: (1) approval to implement demand-side management programs (individually, "DSM Program" or "Program" and collectively with other DSM Programs, "DSM Portfolio" or "Portfolio") as "Phase XIII," which includes one new program, one pilot, five redesigned programs, and a modification to the measure mix of the Phase XI Residential Income and Age Qualifying Bundled [energy efficiency ("EE")] Program to supplement the overall DSM Portfolio; and (2) approval of an annual update to continue the rate adjustment clauses designated Riders C1A and C4A (collectively, "Application").<sup>6</sup>

On January 27, 2025, the Commission entered an Order for Notice and Hearing, which among other things: docketed the Company's Application; established a procedural schedule; required the Company to provide public notice of its Application; allowed interested persons an opportunity to file written comments on the Application; allowed any person or entity to participate as a respondent by filing a notice of participation; directed Staff to investigate the Application; scheduled a public witness hearing for May 19, 2025; scheduled a public evidentiary hearing on the Application for May 19, 2025, and if the evidentiary hearing should continue past that date, provided for the proceedings to be thereafter conducted virtually; granted the Company's request for waiver of the requirements of Rule 60 and Rule 90 of the Rate Case Rules; and assigned the case

to a Hearing Examiner to conduct all further proceedings in this matter on behalf of the Commission and file a final report.

On January 10, 2025, Appalachian Voices filed a Notice of Participation ("Notice of Participation"). Appalachian Voices is a nonprofit environmental organization dedicated to bringing people together to solve the environmental problems having the greatest impact on the central and southern Appalachian Mountains. As part of its mission, Appalachian Voices advocates for solutions that not only protect the land, air, and water of the region, but that also foster resilient local economies to ensure a just and equitable transition to a clean energy economy. This advocacy includes alternative rate options and cost-effective energy efficiency programs, conservation, and renewable energy resources as alternatives to fossil-fired power generation.<sup>7</sup>

On January 14, 2025, Appalachian Voices filed a Motion for Admission *Pro Hac Vice* of Emma Clancy on behalf of Appalachian Voices ("Motion"). Ms. Clancy is an attorney with the Southern Environmental Law Center ("SELC") and received her Juris Doctor from the University of Virginia School of Law. She is a member in good standing of the South Carolina Bar and the New York Bar. Nathaniel Benforado, Esquire, an attorney with SELC and an active member in good standing of the Virginia State Bar, moved for the admission of Ms. Clancy to appear *pro hac vice* in this matter. Ms. Clancy will be associated with Mr. Benforado, has reviewed and will abide by the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, and has agreed to conduct herself as other attorneys admitted to practice before the Commission.<sup>8</sup>

#### **HEARING EXAMINER'S RULING**

## May 27, 2025

On March 3, 2025, Virginia Electric and Power Company d/b/a Dominion Energy Virginia ("Dominion" or "Company") filed with the State Corporation Commission ("Commission") an application and supporting documents (collectively, the "Application") for approval of a certificate of public convenience and necessity ("CPCN") to construct and operate the Chesterfield Energy Reliability Center ("CERC"), an approximately 944 megawatt ("MW") nominal flexible fuel electric generating facility in Chesterfield County, Virginia, and its related transmission and interconnection facilities ("Project"), pursuant to §§ 56-580 D and 56-46.1 of the Code of Virginia ("Code") and the Commission's Filing Requirements in Support of Applications for Authority to Construct and Operate an Electric Generating Facility, 20 VAC 5-302-10 *et seq*. The Company also requested approval of a rate adjustment clause ("RAC"), designated Rider CERC, under Code § 56-585.1 A 6, for timely and current recovery of the costs of the proposed Project.

On April 22, 2025, the Commission entered an Order for Notice and Hearing, which among other things: docketed the Company's Application; established a procedural schedule; and appointed a Hearing Examiner to rule on any discovery matters or motions *pro hac vice* that may arise during the course of this proceeding.

On April 29, 2025, Appalachian Voices filed: (1) a Notice of Participation; and (2) a Motion for Admission *Pro Hac Vice* of Emma Clancy ("Motion"). Counsel for Appalachian Voices, Grayson Holmes, Esquire, of the Southern Environmental Law Center, a member of the Virginia State Bar, moved the admission *pro hac vice* of Emma Clancy, Esquire, to practice before the Commission in Case No. PUR-2025-00037. Mr. Homes stated Ms. Clancy is an attorney with the Southern Environmental Law Center in Charlottesville, Virginia. He stated Ms. Clancy is a member in good standing of the South Carolina and New York Bars. Mr. Holmes further represented, among other things, that Ms. Clancy will abide by the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure and will conduct herself as other attorneys admitted to practice before the Commission.
