

# Second private airstrip brought to commission

For the second time in under a month, an air-plane-related case will be coming before the Buck-ingham planning commission. The group heard the introduction to this latest case on Monday, Nov. 18 before unanimously sending it to a hearing. The case involves a piece of land at 1467 Hund-ley Branch Road in Scottsville. Deborah Blake and

her husband want to build an airplane hanger and her husband want to build an airpinen nanger and grass afstrip. Deborah's husband has a FAA private pilot license to fly single engine aircraft and her daughter is a 16-year-old student pilot who wants to fly commercial airplanes. To become a commercial pilot, one of the requirements is a thousand flight

"(We're) wanting to use this to help log some of those flight hours," Deborah Blake told the commis-

If the airstrip project isn't approved, the closest flight school where her daughter would have access to a plane is in Weyers Cave, at Blue Ridge Aviation. That's more than an hour and a half away. With all

That's more than an hour and a half away. With all the variables, figuring out how to get regular fight hours for the 16-year-old can be hit or miss. This would help fix that problem.

The goal is to buy a Piper Cub aircraft and house it in the hanger. Deborah told the commission the plan is to start with one plane and maybe add a second one down the line. An average Pipe Cub airplane needs on average roughly 600 feet to take off. Deborah told the commission, so a 1,300-ft. airstrip should more than do the job.

"It's') currently fust a grass strip now." Deborah

"(It's) currently just a grass strip now," Deborah said. "We're only gonna take as much space as we need to land."

#### WHY IS A PERMIT NEEDED?

without a conditional use permit. If a permit is
granted, commission members pointed out, the

One of those that's common in Buckingham is to make it clear all commercial aircraft is prohibed on the private strip. Deborah Blake said that wouldn't be a problem, as this is just something the family members will use.

This also marks the second private airstrip going

Back in October, supervisors granted a request by Dillwyn restdent John Demaio to build a private airstrip on his Gravel Hill Road property. That project is just being built to house his plane, a Cessna 182P. Demaio owns a house in Forda and said he'd like at any given time to be able to walk out of the house in Dillwyn, get into the plane and go down there. As for the Bake family, their case will now go to a public hearing at the next Buckingham planning commission meeting. That will take place on Mon-

An IRP, as defined by Code § 56-597, is "a document developed by an electric utility that provides a forecast of its load obligations and a plan to meet those obligations by supply side and demand side resources over the ensuing 15 years to promote reasonable prices, reliable service, energy independence, and environmental responsibility." Pursuant to Code § 56-599 A, Dominion files its IRP in each year immediately preceding the year the utility is subject to a biennial review of rates for generation and distribution services filing. Pursuant to Code § 56-599 E, the Commission determines whether an IRP is reasonable and in the public interest.

As indicated in its IRP, Dominion is a member of PJM Interconnection, L.L.C. ("PJM"), a regional transmission organization in the Mid-Atlantic region of the United States. The Company states that the IRP was prepared for its service territories in Virginia and North Carolina, which are both within the PJM region. Dominion states that it serves approximately 2.7 million electric customers in Virginia and North Carolina, and that the Company's combined service territory in these two states covers approximately 30,000 square miles.

According to the Company, the IRP presents multiple potential portfolios ("Portfolios") that Dominion could use to meet customers' capacity and energy needs over the next 15 years. Dominion forecasts a 5.5% annual increase in demand over the next decade, and for demand to double by 2039 in the Company's felivery zone within PJM, the Dominion Energy Zone ("DOM Zone"). Dominion asserts that the Company's IRP "highlights the need to address significant demand growth through resource adequacy across all functions of the utility, the balance between clean energy priorities and the paramount requirement of service reliability, and maintaining rates that continue to be affordable for (the Company's) customers..." Dominion also recognizes that the IRP is a "snapshot in time" and not a request to approve any specific resource or Portfolio.

Dominion states in its filing that two dynamics within PJM since the last IRP filing have underscored the need for additional power generation and electric transmission resources within the Company's delivery zone. First, the Company states the most recent PJM capacity auction in July 2024 yielded the highest capacity price ever for the DOM Zone. The DOM Zone, according to the Company, has the highest forecasted load growth of any area within PJM. Dominion represents that the capacity price within the DOM Zone was 65% higher than the capacity price for PJM generally, and more than 15 times the prior year's clearing capacity price for the rest of PJM in this most recent capacity auction.

Second, PJM adopted an approach called effective load carrying capability ("ELCC") in January 2024, which measures how much capacity may be provided by different generation resources at different times. Compared to PJM's prior approach. Dominion states that the ELCC methodology results in significant discounting of the capacity value of resources that cannot produce electricity upon demand (such as solar or wind) and higher capacity values of resources that can run on demand (including nuclear or gas units). An IRP, as defined by Code § 56-597, is "a document developed by an electric utility that provides a forecast of its load obligations and a plan to meet those obligations by supply side and demand side resources over the ensuing 15 years to promote reasonable prices, reliable service, energy independence, and environmental responsibility." Pursuant to Code § 56-599 A, Dominion files its IRP in each year immediately preceding the year the utility is subject to a biennial review of rates for generation and distribution services filing. Pursuant to Code § 56-599 E, the Commission determines whether an IRP is reasonable and in the public interest.

As indicated in its IRP, Dominion is a member of PJM Interconnection, L.L.C. ("PJM"), a regional transmission organization in the Mid-Atlantic region of the United States. The Company states that the IRP was prepared for its service territories in Virginia and North Carolina, which are both within the PJM region. Dominion states that it serves approximately 2.7 million electric customers in Virginia and North Carolina, and that the Company's combined service territory in these two states covers approximately 30,000 square miles.

According to the Company, the IRP presents multiple potential portfolios ("Portfolios") that Dominion could use to meet customers' capacity and energy needs over the next 15 years. Dominion forecasts a 5.5% annual increase in demand over the next decade, and for demand to double by 2039 in the Company's delivery zone within PJM, the Dominion Energy Zone ("DOM Zone"). Dominion asserts that the Company's IRP "highlights the need to address significant demand growth through resource adequacy across all functions of the utility, the balance between clean energy priorities and the paramount requirement of service reliability, and maintaining rates that continue to be affordable for [the Company's] customers..." Dominion also recognizes that the IRP is a "snapshot in time" and not a request to approve any specific resource or Portfolio.

Dominion states in its filing that two dynamics within PJM since the last IRP filing have underscored the need for additional power generation and electric transmission resources within the Company's delivery zone. First, the Company states the most recent PJM capacity auction in July 2024 yielded the highest capacity price ever for the DOM Zone. The DOM Zone, according to the Company, has the highest forecasted load growth of any area within PJM. Dominion represents that the capacity price within the DOM Zone was 65% higher than the capacity price for PJM generally, and more than 15 times the prior year's clearing capacity price for the rest of PJM in this most recent capacity auction.

# Activists vow to keep up fight for justice

Conference discusses how to move forward during Trump presidency

ST. LOUIS – They feed the hungry. They counter violence and racial injustice. They fight for criminal justice reform and against book bans. And more than 4,200 of them came together Nov. 20-22 in St. Louis to find solsce and support and to map out how to respond if President-elect Donald Trump delivers on campaign promises to dismantle programs that support their work.

work.
The effort comes as many racial jus-tice activists said they mourn Vice President Kamala Harris' defeat to

President Kamala Harris' defeat to Trump.

"We find ourselves at a crossroads," Glenn Harris, president of Race Forward, told activists. "We cannot allow ourselves to fall into hopelessness."

In the wake of the presidential election, the activists, educators, government workers and researchers participated in a two-day "Pacing Race" conference hosted by Race Forward, a proference hosted by Race Forward, a profession of the processing th

ference hosted by Race Forward, a pro-gressive-leaning national social justice organization.

The event took place 10 years after Michael Brown, an unarmed Black teen-ager, was killed by a white police officer a few miles away in Ferguson, Missouri. Brown's death sparked demonstrations and a focus on racial tensions there and other places.

and a focus on racial tensions there and other places.

Traditionally, the conference is held every two years and two weeks after Election Day.

Organizers said the convening provided activists an opportunity to discuss some concerns, including Trump's campalign promises to eliminate the federal Department of Education, deport millions of Immigrants and scrap programs centered on diversity. Other groups are also ramping up progressive activism efforts.

Harris praised activists for their

activism efforts.

Harris praised activists for their work, acknowledging they may be tired, but stressed their civic engagement



efforts weren't about just one election "We still have agency," he said. "The road ahead will be tough."

#### Searching for strategies

Katherine Boyles attended the con-

Katherine Boyles attended the conference hoping to learn how best to strategize if there are major changes in federal policies or budget cuts for programs that provide food aid.

"We have to figure out how to navigate," said Boyles, community nutrition and food policy coordinator for the Office of Public Health and Safety in Indianapolis. Part of her work is trying to improve food equity in the city.

Boyles said that in the wake of the election, there needs to be more focus on ramping up local and community-hased strategies.

It "will be very difficult if there are in fact cuts," she said.

Trump officials have said they will cut or eliminate some federal programs to reduce costs.

cut or eliminate some tederal programs to reduce costs.

Jarvis Williams of Augusta, Georgia, said he expects Trump's win will impact the work of many grassroots activists.

"They will have to think about how their work can flourish within a new global context," said Williams, director of race and democracy at Horizons





Project, which he described as a group of national organizers trying to address the fallings of democracy.

But it's not something we never faced before, "Williams said. "It's just a new day with new characters with the same racial justice fight."

Speakers and organizers also pointed
to what they called victories, including
some down-ballot elections of progressive candidates in Missouri and some
union-backed candidates in New York.
"Elections are not just about the
president," said Maurice Mitchell, national director of Working Families Party.

Mitchell praised the work of activists, particularly Black women, who he
and others credited with helping lead
civic engagement efforts across the
country.
Still, Mitchell said, it may take years

to undo some of the expected changes.

"We're not getting out of here in one election cycle," he said.

Eric Ward, executive vice president of Race Forward, agreed.

"This will be agenerational struggle," he told reporters. "This will not be solved in four years or eight years or 10."

#### Keep our eyes on the movement

Conference organizers said they rec-ognize that some activists are still griev-ing the loss of the presidential election and provided offers to help, including a session called, "Finding my wellness and well-being and gathering strength for the road ahead."

the road ahead. "We need to grieve, whatever people

for the road ahead."
"We need to grieve, whatever people need to do to re-center themselves," said Harris. "We cam mourn, but we need to get back to remembering who we are, where we come from and what debt we owe to our ancestors."
Kim Desmond, chief equity officer for the International City/County Management Association, said the work of activists will continue.

"Let us keep our eyes on the movement," Desmond said.

Among others, there were sessions on combating systemic racism, navigating the post-election landscape, empowering community through climate intitatives and using equity tools in communities. There was also a call for more polite accountability during a panel on the 10th anniversary of Brown's death.

It's important for activists to be prepared to build, block and protect their communities for whatever changes come, conference organizers said.

"In times like these, sometimes we just have to remind ourselves, remind ourselves of our power, remind ourselves that we have strength in our community," said Karia Bruce, chief of staff for Race Forward, "and sometimes, in the immortal words of the poet Kendrick Lamar, we kust have to poout and show Lamar, we just have to pop out and show

'em.
"Don't be mistaken. We are doing the most important work there is to do – ad-vancing racial justice."

On October 15, 2024, Virginia Electric and Power Company ("Dominion" or "Company") filed with the State Corporation Commission ("Commission") the Company's 2024 Integrated Resource Plan ("IRP") pursuant to § 58-599 of the Code of Virginia ("Code").

An IRP, as defined by Code § 56-597, is "a document developed by an electric utility that provides a forecast of its load obligations and a plan to meet those obligations by supply side and demand side resources over the ensuing 15 years to promote reasonable prices, reliable service, energy independence, and environmental responsibility." Pursuant to Code § 56-599 A, Dominion files its IRP in each year immediately preceding the year the utility is subject to a biennial review of rates for generation and distribution services filing. Pursuant to Code § 56-599 E, the Commission determines whether an IRP is reasonable and in the public interest.

As indicated in its IRP, Dominion is a member of PJM Interconnection, L.L.C. ("PJM"), a regional transmission organization in the Mid-Atlantic region of the United States. The Company states that the IRP was prepared for its service territories in Virginia and North Carolina, which are both within the PJM region. Dominion states that it serves approximately 2,7 million electric customers in Virginia and North Carolina, and that the Company's combined service territory in these two states covers approximately 30,000 square miles.

According to the Company, the IRP presents multiple potential portfolios ("Portfolios") that Dominion could use to meet customers' capacity and energy needs over the next 15 years. Dominion forecasts a 5.5% annual increase in demand over the next decade, and for demand to double by 2039 in the Company's delivery zone within PJM, the Dominion Energy Zone ("DOM Zone"). Dominion asserts that the Company's IRP "highlights the need to address significant demand growth through resource adequacy across all functions of the utility, the balance between clean energy priorities and the paramount requirement of service reliability, and maintaining rates that continue to be affordable for [the Company's] customers..." Dominion also recognizes that the IRP is a "snapshot in time" and not a request to approve any specific resource or Portfolio.

Dominion states in its filing that two dynamics within PJM since the last IRP filing have underscored the need for additional power generation and electric transmission resources within the Company's delivery zone. First, the Company states the most recent PJM capacity auction in July 2024 yielded the highest capacity price ever for the DOM Zone. The DOM Zone, according to the Company, has the highest forecasted load growth of any area within PJM. Dominion represents that the capacity price within the DOM Zone was 65% higher than the capacity price for PJM generally, and more than 15 times the prior year's clearing capacity price for the rest of PJM in this most recent capacity auction.

Second, PJM adopted an approach called effective load carrying capability ("ELCC") in January 2024, which measures how much capacity may be provided by different generation resources at different times. Compared to PJM's prior approach, Dominion states that the ELCC methodology results in significant discounting of the capacity value of resources that cannot produce electricity upon demand (such as solar or wind) and higher capacity value of resources that can run on demand (including nuclear or gas units). According to Dominion, "[t]his shift further supports the proposition that serving [the Company's] customers reliably requires a balanced and effective mix of resources, and not over-reliance on any single generation technology or category."

Dominion states that the Company conducted a Stakeholder Process, pursuant to Code § 56-599 D, in preparation for filing its IRP. Dominion represents that the Stakeholder Process consisted of: (i) a kickoff meeting providing stakeholders an overview of the IRP; (ii) small group meetings between stakeholders and facilitators; (iii) topic-specific workshops for more in-depth conversations; and (iv) summary pre-filing meetings to review collective input and recommendations that were integrated into the IRP, and post-filing meetings for an overview of final information.

On October 11, 2024, the Commission ordered the Company to provide the following additional information by way of a supplemental filing by November 15, 2024:
