### QUICK VIEW FOR BAKERS IN THIS COUNTY

**HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED?**

Yes (Must be produced in operator’s primary domestic residence home kitchen only. Secondary homes, vacation homes, or motor homes do not qualify. Only non-potentially hazardous foods permitted.)

**SEPARATE KITCHEN REQUIRED?**

No

**PETS ALLOWED?**

Not specified in state law; products must not be contaminated

**HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT?**

Conditional (Georgia state law does not preempt local zoning. Cottage food operators must check with Butts County and the City of Jackson, GA to determine if a home-based business is allowed in their zoning district and whether a home occupation permit is required.)

**ON-SITE / PORCH PICKUP?**

Yes

**INSPECTION REQUIRED?**

Upon-complaint (Complaint-based only under HB 398 (eff. July 2025). GDA may enter premises upon complaint or public health emergency.)

### Home kitchen rules

<b>HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED</b>	Yes — Must be produced in operator’s primary domestic residence home kitchen only. Secondary homes, vacation homes, or motor homes do not qualify. Only non-potentially hazardous foods permitted.
<b>SEPARATE DEDICATED KITCHEN</b>	No
<b>PET RESTRICTIONS</b>	Not specified in state law; products must not be contaminated
<b>WATER SUPPLY</b>	Potable water required; annual coliform testing required if using a private well
<b>HANDWASHING</b>	Standard sanitation practices required; ANSI-accredited food safety training required
<b>FOOD STORAGE</b>	Ingredients and finished products must be stored appropriately in the domestic residence

### Inspection & permitting

<b>INSPECTION REQUIRED</b>	Upon-complaint — Complaint-based only under HB 398 (eff. July 2025). GDA may enter premises upon complaint or public health emergency.
<b>HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT</b>	Conditional — Georgia state law does not preempt local zoning. Cottage food operators must check with Butts County and the City of Jackson, GA to determine if a home-based business is allowed in their zoning district and whether a home occupation permit is required.
<b>LOCAL BUSINESS LICENSE</b>	Varies

### Customer-facing rules

ON-SITE CUSTOMER PICKUP	Yes
ON-SITE SIGNAGE	Conditional
DELIVERY / PICKUP RULES	Under HB 398 (eff. July 2025): direct-to-consumer sales, online sales, sales to retail stores, restaurants, and interstate sales are all permitted. Events and farmers markets permitted.
MAX EMPLOYEES IN HOME	Unknown

### Relevant county code

O.C.G.A. §26-2-470 et seq.; local zoning must be checked independently

#### RESEARCH NOTES

Butts County is a small rural central Georgia county. County seat is Jackson, GA (not Jackson, MS). No county-specific cottage food ordinance variations found. Defaulted to GA state baseline (post-HB 398) with medium confidence.

## State context — Georgia cottage food law

Butts County’s rules sit on top of Georgia’s state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

<p><b>REGISTRATION REQUIRED</b> No</p>	<p><b>FOOD HANDLER CERT</b> Yes (specific course)</p>
<p><b>KITCHEN INSPECTION</b> Upon-complaint</p>	<p><b>DIRECT SALES ONLY</b> No</p>
<p><b>INDIRECT SALES</b> Yes — As of July 1, 2025 (HB 398), Georgia allows wholesale, online, retail store, restaurant, and mail-order sales; third-party sellers must display cottage food products separately and label the section as products from residential kitchens exempt from state inspection.</p>
