- ☐ **1. Menu** — Confirm each product under Idaho cottage food rules (county cannot expand a state ban).
- ☐ **2. Pickup & zoning** — Home occupation and porch pickup cells above; HOA/lease may still block customer traffic.
- ☐ **3. Local tax / license** — Business license or sales tax certificate if your city/parish requires it (common even with no state food permit).
- ☐ **4. Training** — Food handler or state registration before market day.
- ☐ **5. Labels** — Disclaimer, allergens, ingredients, net quantity, producer info.
- ☐ **6. Call if unclear** — County health and planning for your exact address.

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED?

Yes (Must operate from primary residence kitchen. No registration or inspection required at state level. Only non-potentially hazardous foods are allowed (no acidified foods such as pickles/salsas). Direct sales only to end consumers in Idaho. No wholesale, retail store, or restaurant sales permitted.)

Home kitchen rules

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED

Yes — Must operate from primary residence kitchen. No registration or inspection required at state level. Only non-potentially hazardous foods are allowed (no acidified foods such as pickles/salsas). Direct sales only to end consumers in Idaho. No wholesale, retail store, or restaurant sales permitted.

SEPARATE DEDICATED KITCHEN

PET RESTRICTIONS

No specific state-level pet restriction for cottage food, but good manufacturing practices recommend excluding pets during production. Idaho's 7 health districts may have additional guidance.

WATER SUPPLY

Potable water required. No additional testing requirements specified at state level.

HANDWASHING

Standard good hygiene practices expected; no specific statutory handwashing infrastructure requirement for cottage food.

FOOD STORAGE

Products must be stored at producer's primary residence; safe handling guidelines apply to prevent adulteration.

DELIVERY / PICKUP RULES	Idaho cottage food allows direct sales to consumers; pickup at home is permitted. Customer visits that generate significant traffic may require a home occupation use permit from the City of Twin Falls Planning & Zoning. Delivery to consumers is permitted. No mail order or internet sales allowed under state law (direct sales only).
MAX EMPLOYEES IN HOME	Not specified in state law. City of Twin Falls home occupation rules may restrict non-resident employees.

Relevant county code

City of Twin Falls Zoning Code Title 10, Chapter 6 (Home Occupation); Twin Falls County Zoning Ordinance (unincorporated areas).

RESEARCH NOTES

Idaho has no registration, inspection, or training requirement for cottage food at the state level. Twin Falls city FAQ confirms that home-based businesses generating traffic require a Zoning Use Permit (\$250) under Title 10-6 (adopted January 1, 2026). The City of Twin Falls is the county seat; unincorporated areas would follow Twin Falls County zoning. Idaho cottage food is governed by IDAPA 16.02.19, the Idaho Food Code framework, not a standalone statute. Direct sales only; no acidified foods allowed. Confidence is medium: state law is clear but county-level planning rules not fully verified from official county code text.

State context — Idaho cottage food law

Twin Falls County's rules sit on top of Idaho's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.
