HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED?

Yes (Must register with local health department (Kendall County Health Department) up to \$50/year. Food Safety Manager certification (CFPM-level) required. Online sales allowed for non-perishable items shipped within Illinois only.)

SEPARATE KITCHEN REQUIRED?

No

PETS ALLOWED?

Not specifically prohibited; kitchen must maintain sanitary conditions.

HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT?

Varies (Kendall County zoning ordinance applies in unincorporated areas. Yorkville and other municipalities (Oswego, Plano) have their own ordinances. Kendall County is in the Chicago exurban area (fastest-growing Illinois county). Local home occupation permits may be required.)

Home kitchen rules

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED	Yes — Must register with local health department (Kendall County Health Department) up to \$50/year. Food Safety Manager certification (CFPM-level) required. Online sales allowed for non-perishable items shipped within Illinois only.
SEPARATE DEDICATED KITCHEN	No
PET RESTRICTIONS	Not specifically prohibited; kitchen must maintain sanitary conditions.
WATER SUPPLY	Potable water required.
HANDWASHING	Required; dedicated handwashing facilities must be available.
FOOD STORAGE	Shelf-stable non-perishable products required for shipped items. Many categories allowed for direct in-state sales. Stored in sealed food-safe containers.

Inspection & permitting

INSPECTION REQUIRED	Upon-complaint — Kendall County Health Department may inspect upon complaint. No routine pre-operational inspection required.
HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT	Varies — Kendall County zoning ordinance applies in unincorporated areas. Yorkville and other municipalities (Oswego, Plano) have their own ordinances. Kendall County is in the Chicago exurban area (fastest-growing Illinois county). Local home occupation permits may be required.

ON-SITE SIGNAGE	Conditional
DELIVERY / PICKUP RULES	Direct sales statewide. Online sales allowed for non-perishable items shipped within Illinois only.
MAX EMPLOYEES IN HOME	Not specified.

State baseline (IL) confirmed. Kendall County is the fastest-growing county in Illinois historically; rapidly suburbanizing exurban Chicago. No county-specific URLs in input. County follows state baseline. Confidence medium.

State context — Illinois cottage food law

Kendall County’s rules sit on top of Illinois’s state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

STATUTE 410 ILCS 625/4 (Food Handling Regulation Enforcement Act, §4)	ANNUAL SALES CAP —
REGISTRATION REQUIRED Yes	FOOD HANDLER CERT Yes (specific course)
KITCHEN INSPECTION Upon-complaint	DIRECT SALES ONLY Yes
INDIRECT SALES No — Illinois prohibits sales to restaurants, retail stores, and wholesale; direct in-state sales are allowed anywhere including home, online, farmers markets, events, and roadside stands; non-perishable items may be shipped within Illinois only.
