## QUICK VIEW FOR BAKERS IN THIS COUNTY

**HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED?**

Yes (Indiana home-based vendor law (IC 16-42-5.3, amended 2022 via HEA 1149) allows sales of non-TCS foods from primary residence. No routine inspection. State law preempts local food licensing and inspection ordinances. Local zoning for home-based business may still apply — contact White County Plan Commission.)

**SEPARATE KITCHEN REQUIRED?**

No

**PETS ALLOWED?**

No specific pet restriction in state cottage food law; good sanitary practices required.

**HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT?**

Varies (State HBV law preempts local food licensing and inspection requirements. However, local zoning ordinances for home occupations may apply. Contact White County Plan Commission (Monticello) to verify any home occupation permit requirements for a home-based food business.)

**ON-SITE / PORCH PICKUP?**

**INSPECTION REQUIRED?**

Upon-complaint (Indiana Department of Health may inspect upon complaint or food safety concern; local health department enforces.)

## Home kitchen rules

<b>HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED</b>	Yes — Indiana home-based vendor law (IC 16-42-5.3, amended 2022 via HEA 1149) allows sales of non-TCS foods from primary residence. No routine inspection. State law preempts local food licensing and inspection ordinances. Local zoning for home-based business may still apply — contact White County Plan Commission.
<b>SEPARATE DEDICATED KITCHEN</b>	No
<b>PET RESTRICTIONS</b>	No specific pet restriction in state cottage food law; good sanitary practices required.
<b>WATER SUPPLY</b>	No specific water testing requirement under state HBV law.
<b>HANDWASHING</b>	Proper handwashing required as part of sanitary procedures per IC 16-42-5.3.
<b>FOOD STORAGE</b>	Non-TCS (shelf-stable) foods only; proper sanitary storage required.

## Inspection & permitting

<b>INSPECTION REQUIRED</b>	Upon-complaint — Indiana Department of Health may inspect upon complaint or food safety concern; local health department enforces.
<b>HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT</b>	Varies — State HBV law preempts local food licensing and inspection requirements. However, local zoning ordinances for home occupations may apply. Contact White County Plan Commission (Monticello) to verify any home occupation permit requirements for a home-based food business.
<b>LOCAL BUSINESS LICENSE</b>	Varies

### Customer-facing rules

ON-SITE CUSTOMER PICKUP	Yes
ON-SITE SIGNAGE	Conditional
DELIVERY / PICKUP RULES	Direct-to-consumer only. Sales allowed in person, by phone, online, or via third-party carrier within Indiana. No interstate shipping. No wholesale or retail resale.
MAX EMPLOYEES IN HOME	Not specified in state statute.

### Relevant county code

No specific White County cottage food ordinance identified. State law (IC 16-42-5.3) preempts local food licensing. Local zoning may apply.

#### RESEARCH NOTES

Indiana IC 16-42-5.3 (HEA 1149, 2022) governs statewide. State law explicitly preempts local food licensing and inspection ordinances (Sec. 12). Food handler certificate (ANSI-accredited) required. No sales cap. White County is a northwest Indiana county (Indiana Beach area); no county-specific cottage food ordinance identified. Local zoning home occupation rules may still apply.

## State context — Indiana cottage food law

White County's rules sit on top of Indiana's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

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### STATUTE

Ind. Code §16-42-5.2

### ANNUAL SALES CAP

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### REGISTRATION REQUIRED

No

### FOOD HANDLER CERT

Yes (specific course)

### KITCHEN INSPECTION

Upon-complaint

### DIRECT SALES ONLY

Yes

### INDIRECT SALES

No — Sales to restaurants, retail stores, and wholesale are prohibited; producers may sell at events, farmers markets, home, online, and roadside stands only.
