HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED?

Yes (Kentucky home-based processor law (KRS §217.136) allows direct-to-consumer sales of non-TCS foods from a home kitchen. Registration with CHFS is required (\$50/year). Annual sales cap of \$60,000. Direct sales only — farmers markets, farm stands, home pickup, and events permitted. No more than two non-commercial ranges/ovens and three refrigerators permitted.)

No specific pet restriction in state statute, but good manufacturing practices expected.

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED

FOOD STORAGE

Non-TCS shelf-stable foods only. No more than three refrigerators for storage.

Inspection & permitting

INSPECTION REQUIRED

Upon-complaint — No routine inspection; complaint-driven only per state baseline.

HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT

No — Carter County is a northeastern Kentucky county. No county-specific cottage food or home occupation ordinance beyond the state registration requirement was identified. CHFS registration (\$50/year) is the primary permit requirement.

No specific Carter County cottage food ordinance identified.

RESEARCH NOTES

Carter County is a northeastern Kentucky county (pop. ~26,850). No county-specific cottage food ordinance was found. Defaulting to Kentucky state baseline.

State context — Kentucky cottage food law

Carter County’s rules sit on top of Kentucky’s state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.
