DELIVERY / PICKUP RULES	Direct sales only; no wholesale or retail sales. Internet sales within Kentucky allowed.
MAX EMPLOYEES IN HOME	No employees may assist in production (sole operator required)

RESEARCH NOTES

Kentucky KRS §217.136 is the standard home-based processor law with \$60,000 cap, \$50/year registration. Restrictive food list (no acidified foods, pickles, salsas). Pulaski County is a mid-size central KY county. No specific county overrides found. No county URLs in input.

State context — Kentucky cottage food law

Pulaski County's rules sit on top of Kentucky's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

STATUTE KRS §217.137	ANNUAL SALES CAP 60000
REGISTRATION REQUIRED Yes	FOOD HANDLER CERT No
KITCHEN INSPECTION Upon-complaint	DIRECT SALES ONLY Yes
INDIRECT SALES No — Sales limited to direct-to-consumer only within Kentucky — from home (pickup or delivery), markets, roadside stands, community events, and online; shipping outside Kentucky is prohibited, and sales to restaurants or retail stores for resale are not allowed.
