**HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED?**

Conditional (Minnesota two-tier system: Tier 1 (up to ~\$7,665/year) requires free MDA Cottage Food Producer Registration Training. Tier 2 (up to \$78,000/year, CPI-indexed from July 2025) requires \$50 Cottage Food Producer Training Course renewed every 3 years plus \$30 annual registration fee. Allowed foods: non-potentially hazardous items. Local ordinances are not preempted; producers must verify Pine County and Pine City zoning for home occupation rules.)

**SEPARATE KITCHEN REQUIRED?**

No

**PETS ALLOWED?**

No specific state prohibition; standard food safety practices apply.

**HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT?**

Varies (Pine County may require a home occupation permit under local zoning. No county-specific cottage food overlay identified. Producers should verify with Pine County and Pine City planning.)

**ON-SITE / PORCH PICKUP?**

Conditional

**INSPECTION REQUIRED?**

No (No routine inspection. Complaint-based enforcement possible by MDA.)

### Home kitchen rules

<b>HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED</b>	Conditional — Minnesota two-tier system: Tier 1 (up to ~\$7,665/year) requires free MDA Cottage Food Producer Registration Training. Tier 2 (up to \$78,000/year, CPI-indexed from July 2025) requires \$50 Cottage Food Producer Training Course renewed every 3 years plus \$30 annual registration fee. Allowed foods: non-potentially hazardous items. Local ordinances are not preempted; producers must verify Pine County and Pine City zoning for home occupation rules.
<b>SEPARATE DEDICATED KITCHEN</b>	No
<b>PET RESTRICTIONS</b>	No specific state prohibition; standard food safety practices apply.
<b>WATER SUPPLY</b>	No specific requirement under state cottage food law.
<b>HANDWASHING</b>	Standard food safety sanitation practices apply.
<b>FOOD STORAGE</b>	Non-PHF products only; proper storage to prevent contamination required.

### Inspection & permitting

<b>INSPECTION REQUIRED</b>	No — No routine inspection. Complaint-based enforcement possible by MDA.
<b>HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT</b>	Varies — Pine County may require a home occupation permit under local zoning. No county-specific cottage food overlay identified. Producers should verify with Pine County and Pine City planning.
<b>LOCAL BUSINESS LICENSE</b>	Varies

**Customer-facing rules**

ON-SITE CUSTOMER PICKUP	Conditional
ON-SITE SIGNAGE	Conditional
DELIVERY / PICKUP RULES	Direct sales to consumers in person, at farmers markets, roadside stands, on-farm, community events, online (within MN only). No interstate sales for home-canned category. No third-party retail distribution.
MAX EMPLOYEES IN HOME	Not specified by state law; local home occupation rules may apply.

Pine County Zoning Ordinance; Minn. Stat. §28A.152 Subd. 6

**RESEARCH NOTES**

Rural east-central Minnesota county. State baseline governs; no Pine County-specific cottage food ordinance found. MDA administers registration. The 2025 amendment raised the cap to \$78,000 (CPI-indexed). Local zoning compliance required.

## State context — Minnesota cottage food law

Pine County's rules sit on top of Minnesota's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

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<b>STATUTE</b> Minn. Stat. §28A.152	<b>ANNUAL SALES CAP</b> 78000
<b>REGISTRATION REQUIRED</b> Yes	<b>FOOD HANDLER CERT</b> Yes
<b>KITCHEN INSPECTION</b> No	<b>DIRECT SALES ONLY</b> No

### INDIRECT SALES

No — Sales are limited to direct-to-consumer channels: community events, farmers markets, from the producer's home, online (in-state delivery by the producer personally or by mail/commercial delivery), and fundraising donations. Restaurants, retail stores, roadside stands, mail order wholesale, and catering are prohibited. All deliveries must be made by the producer personally unless shipped by mail or commercial delivery upon a prior online sale. Home-canned products in the pH/water-activity exemption category (Subd. 1(a)(2)) may not be sold outside of Minnesota.
